6 Impaired drivers arrested by Coos Bay Police in June

CBPD release - During the month of June, the Coos Bay Police Department arrested 6 drivers for Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants (DUI). Five arrests were made during regular patrols. On June 9th the Coos Bay Police Department participated in a DUI enforcement operation sponsored by Oregon Impact and ODOT. One arrest was made during the operation. The Coos Bay Police Department will have additional officers out periodically throughout the month of July for DUI enforcement.

NBPD report

Report to the North Bend City Council July 13, regarding Police activities from City Administrator David Milliron. Responded to 504 calls for service for the two weeks ending July 8, 2021, including: Seven Department of Human Services referrals; 22 disorderly conduct or disturbance complaints; Three assaults; Five burglaries; 18 driving complaints; Ten mental health-related calls; 59 reported suspicious persons or vehicles; 16 welfare checks; 15 warrants served; One robbery.

Walking in the Roadway

NBPD release - On 07/12/2021 at approximately 9:51 PM, The North Bend Police Department received a report of a male wearing dark clothing and walking in the middle of the roadway in the 3200 block of Tremont Avenue (Highway 101 North Bound). An officer arrived at approximately 9:53 PM and located the male laying in the middle of the roadway who had just been struck by a semi-truck. The male, 70-year-old Michael Petrie of Portland, was transported to Bay Area Hospital where he later succumbed to his injuries. The Coos Coun-

ty Crash Team was activated and assisted in the investigation. Per the Coos County District Attorney's Office, no charges will be filed against the driver of the semi-truck.

Nicholson's Rampage Claims Fourth Victim

The male who turned the Bay Area upside down June 18th when he killed three people in North Bend, added one more victim to his tally Friday, July 9. According to Coos Co. District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, 73-year old Linda Oyster, of Florida, who along with her husband attempted to stop Olen Evan Nicholson

from leaving the Mill RV Park after he allegedly killed his father but was run over, died at Riverbend Hospital in Springfield. Nicholson then allegedly shot and killed a clerk at a marijuana dispensary before fleeing town. He turned himself in four-days later in Wisconsin after abducting a woman in Springfield and forcing her drive him across the country. Nicholson has stated he will fight extradition back to Oregon. DA Frasier says it is his "intent to file additional criminal charges against Nicholson pertaining to the death of Mrs. Oyster."

Gas Line Ruptured in North Bend

Report from City Administrator David Milliron – July 20, 11:53 a.m. - Gas Leak in North Bend - Please avoid the area of Madrona Street and Virginia Avenue in North Bend as a construction crew has hit a natural gas line. North Bend Police and Fire are on scene. (Tuesday, July 20, 2021 @ 10:42 am). 11:52 am UPDATE: The natural gas provider is onsite and is working to shut off the gas. This process could take as long as an hour. Meanwhile, police and

fire have evacuated the immediate area and opened the North Bend Community Center Building for staging. Residents in the area may smell a foul odor in the immediate area. Natural gas has no odor. Gas companies add a harmless chemical called mercaptan to give it its distinctive "rotten egg" smell.

Probation Violation, South Powers Rd.

CCSO release - On July 14, 2021, at about 6:14 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office responded to South Powers Road, mile post 1, in response to a single vehicle motor vehicle accident. Upon

arrival, it was determined the operator of the vehicle had rolled the vehicle after leaving the roadway and going up an embankment. The operator, 32 year old Remington Siegrist admitted to having consumed alcohol. After conducting Standardized Field Sobriety Test(s), it was determined Siegrist was not impaired to a noticeable and perceptible degree and was therefore not arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants. However, Siegrist is on parole and one of his stipulations is that he is not to consume alcohol. Siegrist was ultimately arrested for Probation Violation per his parole officer and transported to the Coos County Jail. Siegrist provided a breath sample which showed him to have a BAC of .05%.

Domestic Strangulation, Fat Elk Rd.

CCSO release - On July 8, 2021, at about 2300 hours, the Coos County Sheriff's Office responded to Fat Elk Road in Coquille in response to a third hand report of a disturbance which had

occurred. Upon arrival, the Deputy initially made contact with the victim. During the course of the investigation it was learned that the victim's husband, 47 year old Roberto Ortiz had strangled her. Roberto Ortiz was taken into custody without incident on the singular charge of Strangulation (Domestic) and transported to the Coos County Jail.

Animal Abuse

CCSO release - On July 6, 2021 the Coos County Sheriff's Office took a report of animal cruelty that occurred inside a RV parked on Shinglehouse Road. Based on an investigation conducted by the Sheriff's Office with assis-

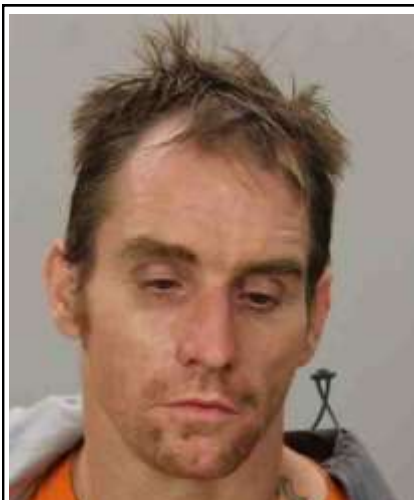
tance from Coos County Animal Control, evidence was found that 47 year old Jeffery Abbott caused the death of his pit bull in a cruel manner and induced unnecessary suffering upon the dog. Abbott was located in his RV at the David Dewitt Veterans Memorial where he was taken into custody. Abbott was charged with one count of Animal Abuse I. Abbott was transported to the Coos County Jail where he was booked and lodged.

Attempt to Elude

CCSO release - On July 23, 2021, at about 0209 hours, A deputy from the Coos County Sheriff's Office was contacted by a construction flagger at the intersection of Highway 101 and S. Johnson Street. The flagger pointed out a vehicle and told the Deputy a construction flagger had nearly been hit when the vehicle did not stop for the stop flag. Based upon that information, the deputy attempted to stop the vehicle. The vehicle failed to yield, and proceeded north despite efforts to stop him. Douglas County Sheriff's Office successfully deployed spike strips in the Lakeside area. However, the vehicle still failed to yield continuing north bound until the pursuit was terminated due to safety concerns near Gardiner in Douglas County. The driver was identified as 65 year old Russell Surkamer. Surkamer had just been convicted of Attempting to Elude a Police Officer in Douglas County on June 26, 2021. Surkamer was arrested by the Florence, Oregon Police Department and transported to the Coos County Jail alleging the crimes of Attempting to Elude a Police Officer, Recklessly Endangering a Highway Worker and Reckless Driving. The Coos County Sheriff's Office was assisted by the Coos Bay Police Department, Douglas County Sheriff's Office and Reedsport Police Department.

Felon Arrest, Beach Lp. Rd., Bandon

CCSO release - On July 24, 2021 at about 8:00 PM, the Coos County Sher-

iff's Office responded to a report of a disturbance which had occurred at 87576 E. Beach Loop Road, Bandon. It was reported there had been a verbal altercation between a man riding a dirt bike and a citizen who had yelled at the rider to slow down. The incident was witnessed by at least two other people at the scene. The suspect, who was later identified by law enforcement as 36 year old Jonathan Windhurst, left the scene in a blue Dodge Durango. The vehicle was located by a Bandon Police Officer off of Rosa Road. During the course of the investigation, a firearm was observed in the Dodge Durango. A search warrant was applied for and granted by the courts and three firearms were located in the vehicle as well as several rounds of ammunition. Jonathan Windhurst, a convicted felon, was arrested for three counts of Felon in Possession of a Firearm, one count of Felon in Possession of a Restricted Weapon, Two counts of Driving While Suspended - Misdemeanor, Harassment and Disorderly Conduct II. Windhurst, who is on probation, also had a probation violation assessed against him. Windhurst was transported to the Coos County Jail, where he was

year old Ray Brown had assaulted his wife Jessica Brown, then menaced the juvenile reporting party by threatening to hit her and taking steps to do so. Ray Brown was arrested for Assault IV Domestic Felony and Menacing Domestic and transported to the Coos County Jail. The Coos County Sheriff's Office was assisted by the Bandon Police Department.

Robbery Wilshire & Libby

CCSO release - On July 23rd, 2021 at about 8:45 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office received the report of a Yellow Cab Driver that had been robbed at gunpoint, resulting in a fight inside the cab. Deputies quickly arrived on scene

but the Suspect had left the area. The cab driver was able to get the supposed gun away from the suspect and quickly realized it was a BB Gun. As the investigating Deputy was speaking with the victim, the suspect, 25 year old Shawn Libercajt, called Dispatch stating he had committed a crime and gave his location. Deputies were able to bring Libercajt into custody, as he confessed to the crime. Libercajt was arrested on scene for Robbery in the Second Degree, Menacing and Harassment. Libercajt was transported to the Coos County Jail where he was booked and lodged.

Carrying a Concealed Weapon

CCSO release - On July 28, 2021 at about 10:20 PM, the Coos County Sher-

iff's Office responded to a report of a possible overdose victim located at 67575 East Bay Road in North Bend. It was reported a man was slumped over inside of a vehicle and had a knife or razor blade in his hand. Upon arrival, Deputies checked on the man, startling him awake. When the man awoke, Deputies observed a handgun tucked between the seats next to the man's leg. The suspect, 26 year old Kyle Vanalstine, was arrested for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm. User amounts of Methamphetamine, Heroin, OxyCodone and Buprenorphine were also located in Vanalstine's vehicle. Per Measure 110, Vanalstine was cited for Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Possession of Heroin and Unlawful Possession of Oxycodone with a fine of \$100 per each alleged possession amount. Vanalstine was transported to the Coos County Jail where he was booked for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.

Reckless Driving/Gun/ Multiple Agencies/K9 Arrest

CCSO release - On 07/29/21 at about 1:30 PM, a Coos County Deputy was traveling on Seven Devils Road near mile post 13 to an unrelated call near Charleston. At this time a black Honda car came around a sharp corner fully in the deputies' lane and travel and at excessive speed. The deputy had to drive into a ditch on the side of the road to avoid being struck head on. The Deputy immediately turned around to conduct a traffic stop and a vehicle pursuit ensued. After a short pursuit the driver of the suspect vehicle conducted an illegal u-turn and attempted to crash into the deputy's patrol vehicle head on for a second

time. The suspect stopped prior to impact, put his vehicle in reverse and fled from the deputy in reverse for a short time until the deputy could park his patrol vehicle in a manner which kept the suspect from putting the public in further vehicular harm. The suspect, identified as 29 year old Chance M. Hollingsworth of Coos Bay exited his vehicle and fled from the location on foot. The deputy chased Mr. Hollingsworth on foot advising him to stop, and that he was under arrest several times. Near the address of 62634 Seven Devils Road, Mr. Hollingsworth attempted to get into a vehicle occupied by an unrelated female. At this time the Deputy caught up with Mr. Hollingsworth and told him again he was under arrest and to show his hands. Mr. Hollingsworth then reached for a cargo pocket on the right side of his pants, gripped the handle of a black firearm and began to draw it on the Deputy. The Deputy also drew his firearm and gave commands for Mr. Hollingsworth to drop the gun. Mr. Hollingsworth drooped the gun back into his pocket and again fled from the location on foot into dense brush. The deputy, now knowing Mr. Hollingsworth was armed with a pistol chose to wait for other responding officers to set up perimeter for a potential K9 Track. Coos County Sheriff's Office K9 Cena was used and tracked for the suspect for about two hours and over four miles of rugged terrain. Ultimately locating Mr. Hollingsworth hiding in a blackberry bush near Sunset Golf Course. The Coos County Sheriff's Office was assisted by members of North Bend PD, the Oregon State Police, Bandon PD, Coos Bay PD, Parole and Probation and Oregon State Parks. Mr. Hollingsworth was transported to the Coos County Jail where he is being held on the following charges:

Winchester Bay Fire

Nine coastal fire agencies responded Thursday, July 1st to a fire in Winchester Bay that burned three-structures. According to reports, the fire was reported shortly after 1 p.m. and spread quickly. It took firefighters about two-hours to declare it under control. No one was injured and the cause of the fire is under investigation.

Van Duzer Corridor Child

OSP report - On December 10, 2020, the Oregon State Police recovered the remains of a female child in the forest immediately adjacent to the H.B. Van Duzer Forrest State Scenic Corridor rest area. Her body was inside a duffle bag that had been concealed in the forest near the rest area. Based on the condition of the remains, little was known about the deceased's race, appearance, or other identifying characteristics. In an attempt to identify the deceased, the Oregon State Police and Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office used a specialty lab to extract DNA information to

aid in her identification. With the assistance of Parabon Nanolabs, investigators now know more identifying details which will hopefully assist in her identification. The following new information is being released: · Age: 7 – 9. · Eye color: Hazel / Brown; · Hair color: Brown / Black; · Skin color: Light Brown / Fair with no freckles; · Race: She has been identified as mostly Caucasian with some Central American ancestry; · She was wearing a pull-up diaper. The Oregon State Police has been working in partnership with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) since the discovery of the child's remains. Over the past six months, detectives have definitively ruled out more than 60 potential missing kids from information provided by NCMEC and tips from the public. While investigators continue to work in partnership with NCMEC, there

is a strong likelihood this child has not been reported missing. Investigators would like the public to know, we are already considering all children listed on the NCMEC website and therefore, there is no need to contact the Oregon State Police to highlight those names. This child would likely not have been seen since November 2020. If you have any information that might help investigators in identifying this child, please call 800-442-0776 or *OSP (*677).

Rescue Drone

Drones have become more popular and coastal rescue teams are deploying them. On the North Coast June 28, a kayaker was in trouble on Tillamook Bay. According to witnesses, he was offshore about 300-feet at 6:12 p.m. and struggling to hold onto his kayak. Garibaldi Fire personnel deployed their rescue drone which delivered an orange life ring within minutes. A rescue swimmer was then able to reach the victim and assist him back to shore during an outgoing tide and two-foot white cap breaking waves. It's the first time Garibaldi Fire Department has used the heavy-lifting drone out of six water rescue calls this Summer.

Hwy. 101 Fatal, Clatsop Co.

On Thursday, July 1, 2021 at approximately 4:11 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near milepost 14. Preliminary investigation revealed a Toyota Camry, operated by Sandra Harrington (68) of Gearhart, was southbound when it crossed into the northbound lane and collided with a Chevrolet Suburban op-

erated by Raymond Yehle (45) of Boise ID. Harrington sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Yehle had minor injuries and was not transported.

Entangled Fur Seal

An endangered species Guadalupe Fur Seal was rescued on the North Oregon Coast Saturday, July 3rd after it became entangled in a nylon fishing net. Members of the Seaside Aquarium captured the seal and transported it to a licensed rehabilitation facility for a full veterinary health assessment, and removal of the netting. It will be released back into the

Pacific Ocean when deemed healthy. Anyone who comes across a marine mammal in trouble is advised to contact the West Coast Marine Mammal Stranding Network for assistance at 1-866-767-6114.

ride along the Oregon's coast an amazing journey – but it can also lead to busier roadways for all road users. This summer, ODOT is ramping up safety messaging focused on bicycling safety along the Oregon Coast Bike Route. The safety tips of the campaign include reminders to "Look out for each other" and "Give bicyclists plenty of room." Drivers should be aware that people riding bicycles – anywhere in Oregon – may take a full lane, especially when there is little to no shoulder, no bike lane, or if there is debris on the side of the road. As a driver, you should only pass a person riding a bicycle if you can safely do so by giving them at least 3 feet of room between your car and them. If the person riding the bicycle has taken a full lane, slow down and stay behind them until it is safe to pass them. Also stay focused on driving until you are safely parked at a viewpoint or your destination. "The coast highway offers so much that can distract people – whether they're driving, riding or walking – so we are putting special emphasis this summer on this route," said ODOT Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Program Manager Heidi

Manlove, whose program is helping fund the effort. ODOT Pedestrian and Bicycle Program Manager Jessica Horning has ridden the coast route and knows how important safety is for everyone. "It is an amazing ride, but there can be scary moments," she said. "If we could get RVs, for example, to give us at least three feet when they pass, then the cars behind them tend to do the same thing, and that could be a lifesaver." Brochures, social media posts and even billboards will share the same messages, such as: People bicycling can use the full lane, so wait until there's a safe place to pass. When passing someone on a bicycle, give at least 3 feet – enough so that if they fell over into the lane, you would avoid them. (This is Oregon law.) Slow down and be patient. "Our goal is to blanket the coast with our safety messages," Manlove said.

ODOT is partnering with Oregon State Parks, Travel Oregon, local visitor centers and others to get the word out. ODOT's Transportation Options program is also joining the effort, one that aligns with ODOT's Strategic Action

Plan in prioritizing a modern, multimodal transportation system. "We want to amplify these safety messages," said Stephanie Millar, Transportation Options Program manager. "Helping people feel and be safe when biking and walking increases their interest in doing those activities."

Thirty-one year old Talon White, Newport, was sentenced in Federal Court, Portland, Friday, July 9, to 12 months and one day in prison after pleading guilty to copyright infringement and tax evasion charges. He will also serve three-years of supervised release. White reportedly had numerous websites that offered subscribers the ability to download copyrighted material. The Motion Picture Association of America sought and received a Cease and Desist Order against White in 2014, but he kept running his sites. Officials seized nearly \$4 million from his accounts, \$35,000 in cash and more than \$1 million in cryptocurrency. Judge Ann L. Aiken order White to pay more than \$4 million in restitution, forfeit money from his bank account and give up a home he bought in Newport.

Coast Guard medevacs man from fishing vessel near Newport

ASTORIA, Ore. – A Coast Guard aircrew medevaced a man Monday afternoon, July 19 from a 40-foot commercial fishing vessel after suffering a medical emergency 5 miles west of Newport. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector North Bend command center received a call from the vessel operator at 1:15 p.m., who reported that a 70-year-old male aboard had passed out and lost consciousness. An MH-65 Dolphin helicopter crew from Sector North Bend, already airborne conducting training in the area, diverted to the scene. At approximately 1:45 p.m., the rescue crew arrived on scene, hoisted the injured man, and proceeded to the Coast Guard Air Facility in Newport. The patient was transferred in stable condition

to awaiting emergency medical services personnel at the air facility just after 2 p.m. EMS brought the patient to a local hospital for a higher level of care. The patient's current medical condition is unknown.

Umpqua River Drowning

OAKLAND, Ore. - A Roseburg teen died in a drowning accident on the Umpqua River on Sunday evening. On Sunday, July 4, 2021, shortly after 6:30 p.m., 9-1-1 dispatchers received a report of a water rescue near the Yellow Creek Boat Ramp (13000-block Highway 138W) outside of Oakland. Responders arrived to learn that 15 year-old Aliya Yasmin Grizzard of Roseburg had been floating on an inflatable air mattress in the Umpqua River with her family. While paddling downstream, Aliya and

her air mattress were swept down through a rapid, causing Aliya to go into the water. She was not wearing a life jacket at the time of the incident. Bystanders and family members attempted to locate Aliya after summoning responders. Aliya was eventually located by a bystander and brought to shore where lifesaving efforts were attempted, but were ultimately unsuccessful.

Motorcycle Fatality Douglas Co.

RIDDLE, Ore. - A 25 year-old Riddle man died in a two vehicle crash on Monday. On Monday, July 5, 2021, at approximately 8:15 p.m., 9-1-1 dispatchers received reports of a two vehicle crash in the 3700-block of Canyonville-Riddle Road near Riddle. Barricaded Subject Eugene

The suspect in this incident has been safely taken into custody. There is no on-going threat to the public. Updates including charges and identity of the suspect will be provided as they become available. On 07/09/21 at around 11:30pm, deputies responded to a residence within the Ponderosa mobile home park in the 3000blk of Franklin Blvd. regarding a restraining order that was actively being violated. When deputies arrived the suspect barricaded within the residence and armed herself with a firearm. Deputies are on scene negotiating and attempting to de-escalate her. The protected party of the order was able to leave the residence. The community is asked to avoid the area if possible until this situation can be resolved.

She also had a Warrant out of Coos Co.

Lane Co. SO release - The suspect in this Saturday morning’s incident, July 10, has been identified as 45 year old Christine Bush. Deputies responded to contact her as the suspect in an in-progress restraining order violation. Bush threatened to kill others, armed herself with a handgun, and refused to come out of the residence. The restraining order was granted by a judge and prohibited her front being in this residence that she had barricaded herself in. Bush also had access to a 12-gauge shotgun inside of the residence. Bush came to the window of the residence multiple times armed with the handgun. Her behavior was menacing and unpredictable. On at least one occasion she stood in the window of the residence with the firearm held to her own head and demanded that deputies kill her. The residences in this park are very close together and deputies were extremely concerned that Bush would follow through with her threats to harm other members of the community. Additionally Oregon law dictates that violation of court issued domestic violence protection orders, such as the order related to this incident, require a mandatory arrest by law enforcement personnel. Deputies remained on scene all through the night negotiating and attempting to de-escalate the situation. Negotiators from the Lane County Sheriff’s Office

Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) were eventually able to convince Bush into peacefully surrendering and she was taken into custody at approximately 6:49am. Bush was transported to the Lane County Jail where she was lodged on charges including Violation of a Restraining Order and Felon in Possession of a Firearm. A warrant was sought and served by deputies regarding Bush’s criminal violation of the restraining order. Bush also had an outstanding arrest warrant out of Coos County. The Negotiations Operations Center (aka ‘NOC’) is a specialized vehicle outfitted with state-of-the-art communications equipment. This vehicle was recently acquired by the sheriff’s office with the assistance of funds from the Department of Homeland Security grant along with a Department of Justice grant. This mobile operations center was utilized by negotiators and played a vital role in the peaceful resolution of this incident. Many area residents were displaced overnight due to this incident. The Lane County Sheriff’s Office recognizes the tremendous impact incidents like these have on the community. We are very thankful for the support and understanding that these residents displayed during this very dangerous and dynamic situation.

Hwy. 126W Fatal

On Friday, July 2, 2021 at approximately 8:00 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a three vehicle crash on Hwy 126W at the intersection of Husted Rd. Preliminary investigation revealed a Chevrolet Equinox, operated by Kathleen Bauchereau (59) of Veneta, was northbound on Husted Rd. when it failed to stop for the stop sign at the intersection of Hwy 126W and Husted Rd.. The Equinox entered Hwy 126W and struck an eastbound Ford F-150 pulling a utility trailer, operated by Amado Hernandez-Vernegas (49) of Veneta. The impact forced the Ford F-150 into the westbound lane where it collided with a Chevrolet Suburban pulling an RV trailer, operated by Randy Holcomb (52) of Eugene. Bauchereau was transported to River Bend Hospital with injuries. Hernandez-Vernegas and the passenger sustained fatal injuries and were pronounced deceased. Passengers name will be released when appropriate. Holcomb and the juvenile passenger were transported to River Bend with injuries.

Pedestrian Struggles with Deputies

On 07/01/21 at approximately 9:58am Lane County Sheriff’s Deputies responded to what was initially reported as a vehicle vs. pedestrian crash in the 400blk of Hunsaker Ln. in Eugene. on scene at which time they reported that the pedestrian fled on foot towards River Rd. When deputies arrived they located the injured male in the middle of River Rd. On Sunday July 25th, Deputy Couch, a deputy with the Lane County Sheriff's Office, was recreating with her family on Foster Reservoir when she accidentally drowned. She was paddle boarding and attempting to help a young child when she fell in the water and did not resurface. Bystanders found her and brought her to the surface and into the hands of Linn County Sheriff's deputies and paramedics. Life-saving procedures were quickly given, but tragically she did not survive. Courtney was a veteran of the United States Army and had been a deputy with the Lane County Sheriff's Office for seven years. She served in a multitude of assignments including Corrections Security, Court Transport and Patrol. Despite her professional successes, Courtney's number one priority was raising her young son. Courtney has many friends and family that are devastated by her loss. Courtney was a very

loved member of the Sheriff's Office family. Her sudden and tragic death has knocked the wind out of us.
