Fentanyl Warning

CCSO release - Coos County Deputies, in conjunction with the South Coast Interagency Narcotics Team (SCINT) recently handled an overdose case where illegal drugs were laced with fentanyl. Fentanyl is 50 to 100 times more powerful than Morphine, and presents a serious risk to anyone using the drug illegally. Fentanyl has been tied to an increase in overdose rates since 2013. Law enforcement authorities have seen a rise in illegal drugs being laced with fentanyl, unknown to the users. Overdose deaths have been reported throughout the country due to the increased potency of the laced drugs. In May of 2021, Deputies seized the pictured pills in Curry County. Similar mentioned pills, known as "blue oxy" were mentioned in Coos County after responding to an overdose that required administration of naloxone (Narcan). The two involved individuals would likely have died had the naloxone not been administered. If you encounter these pills or any drug that could be laced with fentanyl, please call authorities and do not touch the drugs with bare hands. Fentanyl can be absorbed through skin, and presents a health hazard.

Ocean Blvd. Fatal

CBPD release - On 05/05/21, at 0743 hours, the Coos Bay Police Department dispatch center received numerous 911 calls reporting an injury vehicle accident involving two vehicles in the 2800 block



of Ocean Blvd. near 28th Street. It was reported that the accident involved a smaller car and a box truck. It was reported that someone had been struck and was under the box truck. Further, callers reported that a female associated with the smaller car had run from the area. She was described as a white, female, adult, wearing a black hooded sweat-

shirt. Her whereabouts and identity are currently unknown. Medical personnel and law enforcement were dispatched to the scene. Once on scene, medical personnel tended to the injured man, later identified as 43-year-old Rex Lawton of Coos Bay. Officers diverted traffic and due to the severity of the crash, shut down through traffic on Ocean Blvd. and taped off the scene. The Coos County Crash Team was activated. Lawton was transported to Bay Area Hospital by Bay Cities Ambulance where he later died as a result of his injuries. The driver of the box truck, 50-year-old Joseph Gayewski of Coos Bay, remained on scene. From witness statements, investigators learned that the small vehicle, a 1996 Mazda Protégé had been stopped or stalled in the outside westbound lane. Lawton was outside of the vehicle when it was struck from the back by the box truck, a 2018 Chevrolet. The Coos County Crash Team was notified and representatives from the Oregon State Police, Coquille Tribal Police Department, Coos County Sheriff's Office, Coos County District Attorney's Office, and the Coos County Medical Examiner's Office responded to the scene to assist. City of Coos Bay Public Works assisted with traffic control. Coos Bay Fire Department and Coos Bay Police Department Drone pilots assisted with the investigation as well. The crash is still currently under investigation by the Coos Bay Police Department and Oregon State Police. Fatal Vehicle Crash on Ocean Blvd Update

CBPD release - The Coos Bay Police Department responded to a fatal traffic crash on 05/05/21, at 0743 hours, in the 2800 block of Ocean Boulevard near 28th Street. Thanks to information provided by the public and further investigative leads, Coos Bay Police learned, 43-year-old Rex Lawton of Coos Bay, pushed his vehicle from North 28th Street onto Ocean Boulevard just prior to being struck by the vehicle operated by 50-year-old Joseph Gayewski of Coos Bay. Based on the information and evidence obtained, it appeared Mr. Gayewski was unable to react in time to avoid the collision. No criminal charges are being pursued against Mr. Gayewski related to the traffic crash. The Coos Bay Police Department is still trying to identify the female passenger who was with Mr. Lawton at the time of the crash. the Barview district of Charleston contacted the Coos County Dispatch Center as their home was on fire. Fire personnel from Charleston Fire and Coos Bay Fire responded rescuing one of the occupants in the home from the upper story of the house. Upon investigation of the cause of the fire, fire personnel began to suspect arson due to the odor of fire accelerants around the home. The Oregon State Fire Marshall, and investigators from Oregon State Police, Charleston Fire and Coos Fire Protection Agency and Coos County Sheriff's Office responded. Video of the suspect was captured on security cameras on the home. While the suspect's face is not visible, he is a husky male wearing a hoody. Elude North of McCullough Bridge

CCSO release - On the early morning hours of May 24th Coos County Deputies along with Officers from the North Bend Police Department and Troopers from the Oregon State Police responded to the Hauser area to locate and assist in pursuing a vehicle that reportedly eluded officers from both the Florence and Reedsport Police Departments. Upon entering Coos County, the vehicle, a large truck which was dark in color towing a flatbed trailer with a white sedan in

it, was located by an Oregon State Police Trooper who attempted to flatten the tires of the truck using a set of spike strips. These strips missed, and the truck continued southbound on Hwy. 101 reaching speeds over 90 miles per hour. A Deputy from the Sheriff's Office was able to locate and pursue the truck as it continued toward North Bend. A sergeant from the North Bend Police Department was able to successfully deploy a set of spike strips on the vehicle, prior to it reaching the McCullough Bridge, deflating most of its tires and rendering it inoperable. The truck veered off into a nearby property belonging to the North Bend Coos Bay water board, and the occupants of the truck fled on foot. The truck, trailer, and car being towed were all discovered to be stolen out of Washington State. Makeshift weapons, suspected Methamphetamine, suspected Heroin, several stolen credit cards, debit cards, mail, and checks were all located in the two vehicles. A search of the area, including the use of Coos County Patrol Canine's Raven and Odin, lasted approximately eight hours. Ultimately people in the area where the vehicle was abandoned called in suspicious subjects, who later turned out to be the driver and passenger of the truck. These subjects were arrested by North Bend Police Officers, and later transported back to Florence with the assistance of the Oregon State Police. The suspects will be charged in other counties with crimes including multiple counts of identity theft and Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle (UUMV). The Coos County Sheriff's Office would like to thank the Florence Police Department, Reedsport

Police Department, Oregon State Police, North Bend Police Department, and the multiple citizens who assisted in locating these individuals.

Addressing Dangerous Individual Concerns at BAH ER

Report to the North Bend City Council from City Administrator David Milliron Tuesday, May 25, regarding safety concerns at Bay Area Hospital's Emergency Room. "Chief Kappelman & Capt. Bennett had a meeting with Bay Area Hospital's Emergency Department and Security Staff. The meeting was held at their request to discuss dangerous individuals brought in by law enforcement to their E.R. Hospital staff indicated that they have been experiencing a dramatic increase in the number of violent subjects being brought to the hospital. Representatives of the Coos County Sheriff's Office, Coos Bay Police, and North Bend Police were invited. We discussed the possible formation of a co-response team staffed with all disciplines and discussed the value of a sobering/crisis center. The group will reconvene in about six weeks to continue this work."

Old Wagon Road Assault

CCSO release - On May 4, 2021, at approximately 3:50 AM, A Coos County Sheriff's Deputy was advised of a disturbance at a residence on Old Wagon Road in Coos Bay. It was reported a female's ex-husband had strangled her dog. It was also reported she was locked in the bathroom after being repeatedly hit in the head. Prior to arrival, the suspects had fled the scene. Once at the residence the Deputy conducted an investigation and discovered the victim had been attacked and multiple phones stolen from her home by the suspects in an attempt to prevent her from call the police. The Deputy also found evidence of the dog being tied up to dangle by its throat and leg to the back of a motor home ladder. After crawling through thick brush to locate the injured dog without success, the Deputy was assisted by members from Sumner Fire Department. Ultimately the dog was rescued and the ligatures that were still tightly tied around its neck and leg were removed. The dog was taken to a local veterinarian for treatment. After tending to the victim and the injured dog, the Deputy contacted the two suspects at their residence with the assistance from a Myrtle Point Police Officer. After conducting an investigation, it was learned the suspects, 64 year old Curt H. Miller and 38 year old Curt A. Miller had been at the victim's residence where Curt H. Miller had admitted to tying the dog up to the motor home. It was also discovered that upon Curt H. Miller's instructions, Curt A. Miller entered the victim's home and stole three landline phones as well as an Apple iPhone. All the phones were recovered and returned to the victim. Subsequently, Curt H. Miller and Curt A. Miller were arrested and transported to the Coos County Jail without incident. Curt H. Miller was booked into the Coos County Jail for Domestic Assault 3, Conspiracy to Commit Burglary 1, Theft 1, Criminal Mischief 1, Interference with Making a Report and Aggravated Animal Abuse 1. Curt A. Miller was booked into the Coos County Jail

for Domestic Assault 3, Burglary 1 and Theft 1.

Domestic Assault on Shore Edge Drive

CCSO release - On May 8th, 2021 at about 10:33 am, Deputies were dispatched to the report of an assault that occurred off of Shore Edge Drive in Coos Bay, Oregon. Once Deputies arrived on scene, they observed evidence of a major assault that occurred on the property. The Deputies located the three victims and cleared for medical personnel to come on scene to render aid. During the investigation, it was discovered elderly victims were the parents of the suspect, 52-year-old Lee Huckabee, who fled on foot out the back door prior to the Deputies' arrival. It was reported he may have been in possession of some sort of hatchet or axe. All three victims had multiple lacerations to their faces and body, as well as believed to have been assaulted by an object on the front porch. It was also discovered the brother of the suspect received physical injury trying to defend his parents, whom were on the ground with severe injuries. Both victims were transported to Bay Area Hospital by Bay Cities Ambulance. While processing the crime scene, a tracking dog was dispatched and arrived to locate Huckabee in the vicinity. A passerby notified the Deputies they had seen the suspect in the Charleston area, by the visitor's center. Huckabee was located and placed into custody. While contacting him, Deputies observed blood on each particle of clothing. Huckabee was arrested for two counts for Domestic Assault in the Second Degree, Assault in the Fourth Degree and Unlawful use of a Weapon. Huckabee was transported to the Coos County Jail where he was booked and lodged. The Coos County Sheriff's Office was assisted by the Coos Bay Police Department for the search of the suspect.

Oregon Coast

Oregon's Aquatic Invasive Species Inspection Stations Open

ODFW release - SALEM, Ore. - All watercraft entering Oregon are required to be inspected at an aquatic invasive species station when the stations are open. Failure to stop at an open station could result in a \$110 fine. Inspection stations located in Ashland and Ontario are open year-round and seasonal stations in Brookings, Klamath Falls, Lakeview and Umatilla are now operational. All vehicles towing or carrying motor-

ized or non-motorized boats, including canoes, kayaks, and even paddleboards must stop. This includes commercial watercraft. Inspections for aquatic invasive species typically take five to 10 minutes and drivers are not required to get out of their vehicles. Please turn off vehicles during inspection to make it easier for the inspector and driver to hear each other and maintain physical distance. Watercraft found with aquatic invasive species attached to the vessel are decontaminated on the spot. Both boat inspections and decontaminations are free. "People who stop at these stations are directly contributing to our success in keeping aquatic invasive zebra and quagga mussels, snails and aquatic plants out of Oregon," said Rick Boatner, ODFW Invasive Species Supervisor. Inspecting boats coming into the state is the first line of defense in keeping aquatic invasive species such as zebra or quagga mussels, snails and aquatic plants out of Oregon. These invaders can cost millions in damage to water delivery systems and serious environmental damage to our rivers, lakes and native aquatic species. "Everyone who boats needs to make sure they always practice

Clean, Drain, and Dry. All boaters and anglers should be vigilant about cleaning and drying all their gear after each use," Boatner said. Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Permits or Waterway Access Permit are required for most boaters in Oregon. Both resident and non-resident, non-motorized boats (paddlecraft) ten feet and longer require a Waterway Access Permit. All non-resident motorized boats require an Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention permit. Resident motorized boat permits are included in the Oregon boater registration fee. Permit sales provide funding for the six boat inspection stations throughout Oregon. So far this year, crews have inspected 3,796 boats and intercepted 41 vessels with other types of bio-fouling besides quagga or zebra mussels. Inspectors have also hot-water decontaminated three watercraft with quagga or zebra mussels and one boat with Conrad false mussels. In 2020, the Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Program inspected 23,040 watercraft; intercepted 264 with other type of aquatic bio-fouling beside quagga or zebra mussel and performed 12 hot water decontamination on boats intercepted with quagga or zebra mus-

Poachers rob spawning fish from traps, threaten steelhead populations

ODFW release -COQUILLE, Ore.—Poachers took spawning fish from the fish trap and destroyed surveillance cameras to hide their crimes during the winter steelhead run in Woodward Creek near Powers, Oregon according to ODFW and OSP officials. They request the public's assistance in identifying these individuals. Multiple people accessed the trap. One person, identified through surveillance footage, entered the trap to net fish, then shot one camera and stole another. Troopers caught up with Kaine M. Horner, 24, formerly of Myrtle Point, while he was fishing illegally in a closed section of the South Coquille River on Feb 22. They seized his rifle, net, and fishing gear. Charges include Criminal Mischief II, Unlawful Taking Steelhead, and Angling Prohibited Area, according to OSP Sergeant Levi Harris, who is leading the investigation. Harris is disappointed by this behavior. "These are not legal anglers," he said, "These are opportunistic people who have no respect for the vulnerability of these fish while they are in the traps. And they might not understand the importance of these traps to ODFW." ODFW biologists first discovered problems in early 2021 during the winter steelhead run. Several times they found the Woodward Creek trap empty after volunteers reported seeing fish, according to Mike Gray, who is the Coos-Coquille-Tennile District Fish Biologist. "We would get a

call from a volunteer saying there were six or seven fish in a trap," Gray said, "Then when we got there, the trap was empty, or there was only one fish in it. We found evidence that the trap had been damaged, so we knew someone was getting in there." District staff contacted OSP Fish and Wildlife troopers, and mounted trail cameras to monitor the traps and nearby waterway. The first night, they saw at least three people enter the area, access the trap and then use a net to remove fish. The thefts came during a shortage of spawning fish in the Bandon Hatchery breeding program. Woodward Creek is a tributary to the South Coquille River, located near the town of Powers. The fish trap is in an area closed to the public and not easily accessed. ODFW volunteers monitor fish traps daily and when they find fish, they contact the hatchery. Biologists collect the fish, spawn them, and raise smolts which are then released back into the river of origin. Gray rattles the numbers off by memory. "In the South Fork, our management goal is to release 70,000 smolts. With typical egg and fry loss, we need more than 120,000 eggs to do that. Every hen (female steelhead trout) has roughly 3,000 eggs. The math adds up to us needing about 40 pairs of fish for that waterway," he said. Biologists netted fish in the river to meet stock quotas after the traps were robbed. Poachers also likely removed fish left in broodstock boxes near area boat ramps, according to Gray. Broodstock boxes, which are anchored offshore and submerged in water, offer anglers an option to contribute live, healthy fish they catch

to the breeding program. Poaching fish from the broodstock collection program has the potential to cause a shortfall in hatchery steelhead production, affecting future catch opportunity. Hwy. 101 Fatal, Curry Co.

On Saturday, May 8, 2021 at approximately 8:50 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near milepost 342. Preliminary investigation revealed a Ford Flex, operated by Robert Pope III (53) from Brookings, was northbound and crossed into the southbound lane and collided with a Ford F250 operated by Robie Sell (56) of Coos Bay. Pope III sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Sell and his passenger, Robin Sell (62) of Coos Bay, received minor injuries and were not transported. OSP was assisted by Curry County Sheriff's Office, Gold Beach Fire Department, and ODOT.

Rescue at Agness

Three adults and one seven year old boy were rescued from the cold rushing waters of the Rogue River near Agness Tuesday night, May 12, after their boat became stuck on rocks above Foster Bar. A fourth person, identified as 32-year old Justin Aires, of Newport, reportedly swam to shore to seek help. The Curry Co. Sheriff's Office launched a marine

boat about 8:22 p.m. It was able to get close enough to use a long line to secure the stuck vessel. Rescue swimmers were able to safely retrieve the boy back to the marine boat. However, it became stuck as well and a third vessel was summoned to the scene. Deputy Walter Scherbarth and SAR members were able to get the marine boat unstuck and the remaining two people off the stranded vessel and back to the Foster Bar Campground.

Hwy. 101 Fatal, Lincoln Co.

On Wednesday, May 19, 2021 at approximately 11:24 pm, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near milepost 128. Preliminary investigation revealed a Ford F350, operated by Jesus Perez (25) of Salem, was northbound when it crossed into the southbound lane and collided with a Kia Spectra operated by George Linden III (46) of Toledo. Linden sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Perez was transported to Salem Hospital.

Hwy. 20 Fatal, Lincoln Co.

On Monday, May 24, 2021 at approximately 9:44 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a multiple vehicle collision on Hwy 20 near milepost 3. Preliminary investigation revealed a Ford F250 truck towing a 16 foot fully enclosed trailer, operated by Devin Shrum (32) of Lebanon, was eastbound when it lost control crossed into the westbound lane and collided with a Ford Fiesta operated by Kayla Rhoades (29) of Toledo. The trailer came loose and struck a westbound Dodge Magnum operated by Jeremy Lacewell (43) of Tole-

do. Rhoades sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Shrum and his passenger, Lonnie Shrum (64) of Lebanon, were transported to Samaritan Pacific Hospital. Lacewell and his passenger, Jimmy Short (36) of Toledo, were not injured.

Coast Guard urges boating safety this summer across PNW

SEATTLE —The Coast Guard urges boaters to be ready this National Safe Boating Week as summer nears the Pacific Northwest. National Safe Boating Week promotes safe boating practices for recreational boaters in order to reduce preventable accidents and deaths. The Coast Guard encourages boaters to become safer, always ready boaters this 2021 boating season. As air temperatures rise with the arrival of summer, be advised that water temperatures in the Pacific Northwest remain dangerously cold. In 2019 in the U.S., 86% of drowning victims who died were not wearing a life jacket. Alcohol use is the leading known contributing factor in fatal boating accidents. Where the primary cause was known, alcohol was listed as the leading factor in 23% of deaths. Factors that contributed most to fatal accidents were: failure to wear a life jacket, operator inattention or inexperience, alcohol and drug use, hazardous waters, weather conditions, and navigation rule violations. Don't forget: life jackets are required by law to be on all vessels, including kayaks, canoes and paddleboards. Federal law requires that all children ages 13 and under wear a life jacket. Below are steps you can take to ensure a fun time out on the water this boating season: Take a boating safety course. Research show that boaters believe they are boating safely if they have proper equipment and training, though statistics show that safe boating is really a matter of their own behavior. Take It! Get the U.S. Coast Guard Mobile App. The self-contained app was mainly designed to provide additional boating safety resources for mobile device users, so personal information is stored on the phone and is not sent to the Coast Guard unless the user chooses to send it. The Coast Guard does not track a user's location, and the app does not track a user's location unless the app is being used. Get It! by searching in your app store for the U.S. Coast Guard Mobile App. File a float plan - Before you leave, create a plan and let someone staying behind know your itinerary. The plan should include the contact information for all individu-

als going out, the intended route, and what to do in case of emergency or non-arrival at the estimated return time. File It! with a Float Plan. Have a portable device with watertight protection to communicate an emergency on the water. Mariners should have signal flares, a whistle, an emergency position-indicating radio beacon (EPIRB), or a personal locator beacon (PLB) to alert first responders. Use Digital Selective Calling and VHF-FM radios. Cell phones may lose signal offshore or run out of battery power. They are helpful but are not reliable for emergencies that occur on water. Channel 16 is the marine emergency channel to signal distress while on the water. It should only be used for emergencies. Use It! Always wear a life jacket. Donning a life jacket is more difficult in the event of a capsizing incident or if knocked unconscious. Wear It! Always boat sober. Never boat under the influence. It is illegal to operate a boat while under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Alcohol use is the leading known contributing factor in fatal boating accidents. Help us locate YOU! Take responsibility for your paddle craft by labeling with an 'If Found' sticker. This label allows responders to confirm if someone is actually in trouble and collect information to help search efforts. Mark It! These simple steps can ensure you are prepared to enjoy the

water safely and responsibly.

Coast Guard announces new law requiring use of engine cut-off switches

USCG release - SEATTLE — The Coast Guard will implement a new law this boating season that requires operators of recreational vessels less than 26 feet in length to use an engine cut-off switch (ECOS) and associated ECOS link (ECOSL). Each year, the Coast Guard receives reports of recreational vessel operators who fall off or are suddenly and unexpectedly thrown out of their boat. During these incidents the boat continues to operate with no one in control of the vessel, leaving the operator stranded in the water as the boat continues on course, or the boat begins to circle the person in the water eventually striking them, often with the propeller. These dangerous runaway vessel situations put the ejected operator, other users of the waterway, marine law enforcement officers, and other first responders in serious danger. "Emergency cut-off switches protect all members of the boating public," Lt. Collin Gruin, the Coast Guard Sector Columbia River boarding team supervisor. "In the Pacific Northwest in 2019, 26 boating accidents involved boat operators being ejected from the vessel or falling overboard. An engine cut-off switch, when used proper-

ly, prevents a runaway vessel from causing more harm in these types of accidents." The ECOS and ECOSL prevent runaway vessels and the threats they pose. The ECOSL attaches the vessel operator to a switch that shuts off the engine if the operator is displaced from the helm. The ECOSL is usually a lanyard-style cord that attaches to an ECOS either in close proximity to the helm or on the outboard motor itself if the vessel is operated by a tiller. When enough tension is applied, the ECOSL disengages from the ECOS and the motor is automatically shut down. Wireless ECOS have recently been developed and are also approved for use. These devices use an electronic "fob" that is carried by the operator and senses when it is submerged in water, activating the ECOS and turning the engine off. Wireless devices are available on the aftermarket and are beginning to become available as manufacturer-installed options. Section 503 of the Coast Guard Authorization Act of 2018 required manufacturers of covered recreational vessels (less than 26 feet in length, with an engine capable of 115 lbs. or more of static thrust) to equip the vessel with an ECOS installed as of December 2019. Owners of recreational vessels produced after December 2019 are required to maintain the ECOS on their vessel in a serviceable condition. It is recommended that recreational

vessel owners regularly check their existing ECOS system to ensure it works properly, following manufacturer's instructions. Section 8316 of the Elijah E. Cummings Coast Guard Authorization Act of 2020 requires individuals operating covered recreational vessels (less than 26 feet in length, with an engine capable of 115 lbs. or more of static thrust, which equates to about 3 horsepower or more) to use ECOS "links" while operating on plane or above displacement speed. Using the ECOSL is not required when the main helm is installed within an enclosed cabin. Common situations where ECOSL use would not be required include docking/trailing, trolling, and operating in no-wake zones. Boaters are encouraged to check the U.S. Coast Guard website for additional information on this new use requirement and other safety regulations and recommendations: <https://uscgboating.org/recreational-boaters/engine-cut-off-switch-faq>.

USCG release - GRAYS HARBOR, Wash. — The Coast Guard suspended the search Friday, May 14 for a 47-year-old man who reportedly fell overboard while underway fishing for halibut

28 miles northwest of Grays Harbor. Missing is Jason LaBrie of Oregon City, Oregon. Fishermen aboard the 26-foot vessel Defiance II activated an emergency position indicating radio beacon after realizing LaBrie was missing. Coast Guard watchstanders at the 13th District command center received the alarm at 12:39 p.m. and contacted the vessel crew by telephone to gather more information. At 12:50 p.m., the Coast Guard initiated an urgent marine information radio broadcast notifying all mariners in the area. A Coast Guard Station Grays Harbor 47-foot Motor Lifeboat crew responded, and a Sector Columbia River MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew diverted from other flight operations. At 1:10 p.m., Coast Guard search and rescue crews were on scene. A Coast Guard Air Station Sacramento HC-27 Spartan airplane crew was airborne and en route, and the Coast Guard Cutter Elm and crew diverted from a living marine resources mission at approximately 3:30 p.m. to assist with the search. The Coast Guard saturated an area of approximately 244 square miles, completing 18 searches over more than 22 hours.

CG Cutter Steadfast back in Oregon



USCG release - ASTORIA, Ore. — The Coast Guard Cutter Steadfast (WMEC 623) returned to their Astoria homeport after completing a 10,000-mile, 49-day counter-narcotics patrol in the Eastern Pacific Ocean. The cutter served as an on-scene law enforcement asset in support of U.S. Southern Command's Joint Interagency Task Force South and Coast Guard District 11, with primary missions

of drug and migrant interdiction, search and rescue, and international relations. While the cutter patrolling international waters of the Eastern Pacific Ocean, Steadfast intercepted a vessel suspected of smuggling illicit narcotics. The interdiction resulted in the seizure of over 2,400 pounds of cocaine worth an estimated \$33 million, and the detainment of three suspected traffickers. Coast Guard cutters operating in the Eastern Pacific push U.S. borders over 1,500 miles offshore which is critical to confronting drug cartels and enhancing national security. Additionally, Steadfast completed biennial Aviation Standardization Training near the coast of Southern California with a Coast Guard MH-65 helicopter. This training is designed to increase the operational proficiency of the ship and helicopter crews. "This patrol reinforced the maxim that people, not platforms, are the most important key to operational success," said Cmdr. Craig Allen, commanding officer of the Steadfast. "Despite encountering some significant equipment and logistics challenges, the Steadfast crew rose to the occasion time and again and achieved remarkable results. We were fortunate to sail with several members filling key positions from other Coast Guard units, including USCGC Waesche, Maritime Safety and Security Teams LA/LB and San Francisco, Sector Field Office Southwest Maine, and Coast Guard Headquarters. All were superb additions to the Steadfast team. Additionally, we had the opportunity to work with a fellow Pacific Northwest 210' cutter, CGC Active, who helped us out on multiple occasions with time-sensitive logistics support." To ensure the safety of Stead-

fast's crew during the COVID-19 global pandemic, the crew conducted pre-deployment COVID-19 testing, followed by a 7-day monitoring period. Throughout their patrol, Steadfast's crew maintained strict health precautions during all interactions with the public, including wearing N95 masks at all times and undergoing intensive health screenings prior to each boarding. Steadfast is a 53-year-old Reliance Class 210-foot medium endurance cutter that has been homeported in Astoria since 1994. Steadfast's primary missions include search and rescue, counter-drug, migration interdiction and homeland security operations.

Coast Guard halts illegal use of "paper captains" in WA-based tuna fishing operation


SEATTLE — The Coast Guard, Customs and Border Protection and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration fisheries law enforcement teams investigated and ceased the use of illegal foreign nationals on a fleet of commercial tuna fishing vessels that operate out of the State of Washington during the summer months. Since 2019, Coast Guard personnel, working collaboratively with CBP and NOAA agents, detected eight separate "paper captain" violations operating in the Pacific Northwest. Paper captain is a term applied to an individual listed on documents as a U.S.-flagged vessel's captain but in actuality serves as a deckhand or in a similar lower-level capacity. It is the law (46 USC §12131) that a documented vessel be under the command of a U.S. citi-

zen. Many fishing vessels have engaged in a pattern and practice of hiring foreign nationals to serve on U.S. commercial fishing vessels in the capacity of captain, while U.S. nationals identified as captains on paper serve in subordinate roles. Many of these violations have been supplemented by underlying fraudulent documents designed to avoid detection and mask the illegal operation. "The employment of a foreign national as captain aboard a U.S.-flagged commercial fishing vessel is illegal," said Lt. Cmdr. Colin Fogarty, the enforcement chief at Coast Guard Sector Columbia River in Warrenton, Oregon. "The practice of utilizing 'paper captains' subverts U.S. laws and regulations designed to protect hard-working American fishermen and mariners." Specifically, the conspirators in violation listed the "paper" captain on their Notices of Arrival/Departure submitted to the Coast Guard and CBP, and produced fraudulent fishing agreement contracts to the Coast Guard. Providing fraudulent documents to the Coast Guard or other federal agencies is punishable by imprisonment for up to five years. Thus far, one Washington-based fishing fleet has paid \$9,150 in civil penalties and has been cited for \$140,000 in additional penalties still pending adjudication.

Search Underway for Missing Roseburg Male

IDLEYLD PARK, Ore. - The search efforts for Harry Burleigh who was reported missing on Friday, May 7, 2021, are continuing Monday, May 17. 69 year-old Burleigh failed to return from a fishing trip and was reported as missing by his wife. On Saturday, May 8, 2021, a deputy located Burleigh's vehicle at the Twin Lakes Trailhead. Burleigh had filled out a form and left it at the trailhead indicating he was entering the Twin Lakes area on Thursday, May 6, 2021 and intended to be out that evening. Searchers have been scouring the area for any signs of Burleigh and had come up empty handed until yesterday, Sunday May 16, 2021. Searchers located a makeshift shelter and a tackle box belonging to Burleigh in the Calf Creek area; however the man is still missing. The efforts continue today in hopes of finding additional clues. The Douglas County Sheriff's Office has been utiliz-

ing search teams and resources from multiple counties as well as partner agencies.

SAR Douglas Co.

IDLEYLD PARK, Ore. - After 17 nights in the wilderness, 69 year-old Harry Burleigh has been found alive and rescued by Search and Rescue crews who never gave up. On Sunday, May 23, 2021, Douglas County Search and Rescue conducted another mission in the area of Calf Creek after Burleigh's fishing gear was found last weekend. Additional SAR resources were called in from Jackson County, Lake County and Siskiyou County (CA) for Sunday's efforts. At approximately, 3:00 p.m., a team of searchers from Jackson County SAR located a shelter southwest of the original shelter found last weekend. The search crews called out to Mr. Burleigh who responded back. He was found to be walking and complaining of minor pain, but was in stable condition. A Brim Aviation helicopter was utilized to hoist Burleigh from his location and

transport him to a waiting Lifeflight helicopter. Lifeflight later transported him to an out of area hospital for evaluation. The Brim Aviation helicopter was utilized to extract the remaining Jackson County SAR team from their position. The other search crews were able to self-extricate. "This was the outcome we all have been looking for in this case. It is because of our determined Search and Rescue Teams and the partnerships we have with other SAR teams from around the state, that Mr. Burleigh has been reunited with his family this evening," Sgt. Brad O'Dell said. "The Sheriff's Office wants to thank everyone who was involved in this mission."

Meth & Heroin in DINT Bust

In the evening hours of Tuesday, May 11th, 2021, detectives with the Douglas Interagency Narcotics Team (DINT) executed a search warrant at a residence in the 2300 block of Cannon Avenue, in Roseburg (Green District). This resi-

dence is alarmingly close to the entrance of Sunnyslope Elementary School. DINT and the Douglas County Sheriff's Office have received multiple complaints in recent months about the obvious drug activity taking place at the residence. Due to those complaints, as well as the proximity to the school, DINT conducted a targeted investigation and developed information indicating both methamphetamine and heroin trafficking taking place at the residence. A search of the residence revealed more than a quarter pound of methamphetamine, approximately 18 grams of black tar heroin, a small amount of suspected fentanyl, a large amount of cash, a firearm, and a substantial amount of evidence of distribution. 42 year old Leah Wilkins, of Roseburg, was arrested and lodged at the Douglas County jail on charges of Unlawful Possession of Heroin, and Unlawful Delivery of Heroin within 1,000 feet of a school. DINT also arrested 43 year old Timothy Bond, of Roseburg, and lodged him at the Doug-
