Homicide in North Bend

Coos Co. DA news release - On August 2, 2021, at approximately 3:27 AM, the North Bend Police Department received a 911 call indicating that there was some sort of a medical emergency at 3721 Stanton Avenue in North Bend, Oregon. Police and medical personnel responded to the scene. Upon arrival the police found a deceased adult male inside. The person has injuries indicating he had died from homicidal violence. The person is identified as 45 year old Craig Joshua Jackson, who was a physician at Bay Clinic in Coos Bay. The Coos County Major Crimes Team was activated. Personnel from the North Bend Police Department, Coquille Police Department, Coos County Sheriff's Office, the Oregon State Police, and the Coos Bay Police Department responded. North Bend Police will be the lead agency on this case. Currently the police, with the assistance of the Oregon State Police Forensic Laboratory and the Eugene Police Department, are processing the scene. The police are currently interviewing the spouse of Dr. Jackson, who is identified 37 year old Yen Zhou. Preliminary information from Ms. Zhou is that two unknown males entered the home and engaged in a physical confrontation with Dr. Jackson resulting in his death. They then fled the scene. We have no further information as to their description or identity at this time. Anyone with information about this case is encouraged to call the North Bend Police Department.

Targeted Home Invasion

An autopsy completed Tuesday afternoon, August 3rd, by the Coos Co. Medical Examiner determined that Dr. Craig Joshua Jackson, 45, died as a result of a "gunshot wound to the head," according to a news release from Coos Co. District

Attorney R. Paul Frasier. "The evidence so far suggests that Dr. Jackson was the victim of a targeted home invasion. We do not believe the public is in any danger." Dr. Jackson was killed during the early morning hours of Monday, August 2nd in his home on Stanton St. in North Bend. His 37-year old wife was at home but not injured. The Coos Co. Major Crime Task Force is investigating.

Nicholson back in Coos Co.

The male accused of killing four people in North Bend in June has been returned to Oregon from Wisconsin and will appear in a Coos Co. courtroom Friday afternoon, Aug. 6, in Coquille. According to a news release from Coos County District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, "The extradition warrants issued by the Governor of Oregon and the Governor of Wisconsin were served upon Oen Evan Nicholson on July 23, 2021. Mr. Nicholson made a court appearance in Wisconsin on July 26, 2021 and at that time he indicated that he no longer wished to contest extradition back to Oregon. Accordingly the court in Wisconsin ordered that Mr. Nicholson be returned to Oregon no later than August 9, 2021. Officers from Coos County law enforcement traveled to Wisconsin and returned Mr. Nicholson to Coos County" on Thursday, Aug. 5. The 30-year old is lodged in the Coos Co. Jail at Coquille. He is scheduled to appear before Judge Martin Stone at 1 p.m. Nicholson is accused of killing his father, a husband and wife, and a clerk in a marijuana dispensary before fleeing the South Coast and kidnapping a woman in Springfield forcing her to drive across country to Wisconsin where he eventually surrendered.

Nicholson

The individual allegedly responsible for four homicides in North Bend on June 18, was arraigned in a Coos Co. Court-

room at Coquille Friday afternoon, Aug. 6. According to District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, 30-year old Oen Evan Nicholson faced "a secret sixteen (16) count indictment returned by the Coos County Grand Jury on July 28, 2021. The indictment charges Mr. Nicholson with twelve (12) counts of Murder in the First Degree, two (2) counts of Failure to Perform the Duties of a Driver to Injured Persons and two (2) counts of Recklessly Endangering Another Person. A not guilty plea was entered on behalf of Mr. Nicholson." A status conference has been set for **Oct. 1**. Nicholson is being held under a bail of \$8 million dollars in the Coos Co. Jail at Coquille. He is accused of killing his 83-year old father Charles Nicholson, a husband and wife 74-year old Anthony Oyster and 73-year old Linda Oyster 73, and a clerk in a marijuana dispensary, 47-year old Jennifer Davidson, before fleeing the South Coast. He reportedly kidnapped a woman in Springfield before forcing her to drive him across the country to Wisconsin where he eventually surrendered to authorities.

Addressing the Transient Problem

City of Coos Bay newsletter, Aug. 6th - Chris Chapanar, Coos Bay Chief of Police - City Council Approves New Camping Regulation Ordinance: Effective **September 3**, On August 3, 2021, the Coos Bay City Council met and held a public hearing to discuss and consider a newly proposed Camping Regulation (Ordinance 545). This was done in response to several court cases and opinions issued by the U.S. Department of Justice, which concluded that any local ordinance making camping a crime, in all places, at all times when shelter space is unavailable, would violate a person's Eighth Amendment right: Prohibition against cruel and unusual punishment. In addition, during Oregon's most recent

legislative session, House Bill 3115 and 3124 were introduced and ultimately adopted, making it an Oregon law requiring Oregon counties and municipalities to adhere to the courts cases and opinions issued by the U.S. Department of Justice. However, what was also included in House Bill 3115 was the ability for Oregon counties and municipalities to implement time, manner, and place regulations within their camping ordinances. In a nutshell, recent case law and the new law in Oregon (HB 3115) makes it lawful for unsheltered to sleep on any public property which is open to the public, unless a local governing body enacts reasonable restrictions. The **City's Homeless Workgroup** has assembled proposed ordinance which meets all those objectives. It will ensure that each citizen's rights are protected, while providing specific objectively reasonable guidelines to regulate the use of publicly owned property by establishing time, manner, and place restrictions. The new ordinance recognizes the Martin V. Boise ruling, as well as the newly adopted Oregon laws (House Bill 3115 and 3124) and makes it legal to camp overnight on publicly owned property which is open to the public in Coos Bay between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

This does NOT include park areas, public property located within Low Density Residential (LDR), Small Lot Residential (SLR), Medium Density Residential (MDR), and some other areas specifically noted in the ordinance. **Here are just a few more facts about the new ordinance:** It is now legal to camp on most publicly owned property within the city limits between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. It is now legal to use camp paraphernalia on most publicly owned property between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m., including tents, tarps, sleeping bags and temporary huts that are not attached to the ground. It is now legal to sleep in cars parking on most public property between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. This does not include park areas, publicly owned or maintained parking lots, and public property located within an area zoned for residential use. It is now legal to use outdoor cooking utensils and similar equipment. It is against the law to store camp paraphernalia, such as tents, tarps, sleeping bags and other equipment, on the publicly owned property during the day (6 a.m. to 8 p.m.). It is against the law to camp on private property without the property owner's permission or as outlined in the ordinance. Obstructing pedestrians or vehicle travel is against the law (ORS 166.025). This means that people may not: Sit or lay in a manner that blocks passage of another person or vehicles or requires another person or driver to take evasive action to avoid contact. It is against the law to litter. All property should be treated with respect, regardless of the value of the property and, as a community, we have a right to keep the

city beautiful by requiring citizens to pick up after themselves. The City's Parking Code will continue to be enforced under Ordinance 10.15. As well as enforce the 72-hour parking limit on public right of ways. At the conclusion of the public hearing and after much discussion by the City Council, the new ordinance was voted-on and passed unanimously. The new ordinance will go into effect 30 days from their decision, making it effective **September 3, 2021**. As we implement the new ordinance there will be a period of time set aside to provide both education and outreach in an attempt to gain voluntary compliance. This is perhaps the most important piece of the overall plan. It is and will remain the goal of the Coos Bay Police Department and the City of Coos Bay staff to gain voluntary compliance of the ordinance and use enforcement and penalties as a last resort. The education piece will consist of notifying campers with flyers which will provide detailed information about the ordinance, the time frame for compliance, and available outreach services. This type of education to the campers will be constant and consistent, happening daily if possible and will include our outreach partners to remind individuals how to come into compliance with the ordinance. We plan for the education only, resulting in no violation penalties to span for 30 days. After the 30-day education phase, education will be our first step toward compliance, however, given the new ordinance, Law Enforcement will have the ability to take lawful enforcement actions. This could result in seizing property, the issuance of cita-

tions, and additional penalties if compliance isn't achieved. The Coos Bay Police Department is excited about this new ordinance and believes the ordinance will protect the rights and interests

of all citizens and business owners within the City of Coos Bay.

Coos County

Reckless Driving/Gun/ Multiple Agencies/ K9 Arrest

CCSO release - On 07/29/21 at about 1:30 PM, a Coos County Deputy was traveling on Seven Devils Road near mile post 13 to an unrelated call near Charleston. At this time a black Honda car came around a sharp corner fully in the deputies' lane and travel and at excessive speed. The deputy had to drive into a ditch on the side of the road to avoid being struck head on. The Deputy immediately turned around to conduct a traffic stop and a vehicle pursuit ensued. After a short pursuit the driver of the

suspect vehicle conducted an illegal u-turn and attempted to crash into the deputy's patrol vehicle head on for a second time. The suspect stopped prior to impact, put his vehicle in reverse and fled from the deputy in reverse for a short time until the deputy could park his patrol vehicle in a manner which kept the suspect from putting the public in further vehicular harm. The suspect, identified as 29 year old Chance M. Hollingsworth of Coos Bay exited his vehicle and fled from the location on foot. The deputy chased Mr. Hollingsworth on foot advising him to stop, and that he was under arrest several times. Near the address of 62634 Seven Devils Road, Mr. Hollingsworth attempted to get into a vehicle occupied by an unrelated female. At this time the Deputy caught up with Mr. Hollingsworth and told him again he was under arrest and to show his hands. Mr. Hollingsworth then reached for a cargo pocket on the right side of his pants, gripped the handle of a black firearm and began to draw it on the Deputy. The Deputy also drew his firearm and gave commands for Mr. Hollingsworth to drop the gun. Mr. Hollingsworth drooped the gun back into his pocket and again fled from the location on foot into dense brush. The deputy, now knowing Mr. Hollingsworth was armed with a pistol chose to wait for other responding officers to set up perimeter for a potential K9 Track. Coos County Sheriff's Office K9 Cena was used and tracked for the suspect for about two hours and over four miles of rugged terrain. Ultimately locating Mr. Hollingsworth hiding in a blackberry bush near Sunset Golf Course. The Coos County Sheriff's Office was assisted by members of North Bend PD, the Oregon State Police, Bandon PD, Coos Bay PD, Parole and Probation and Oregon State Parks. Mr. Hollingsworth was transported to the Coos County Jail where he is being held on the following charges:

Parole Board Warrant, Reckless Driving, Elude by Vehicle, Elude by Foot, Escape II, Felon in Possession of a Firearm, Menacing, Unlawful Use of a Weapon, and Attempted Assault II.

Heroin Arrest

CCSO release - On July 25, 2021, Deputies with the Coos County Sheriff's Office and medical personnel responded to a residence within the county for a report of an overdose patient. The individual was transported to Bay Area Hospital, where they would ultimately pass away from the reported overdose. While on the scene, Deputies were able to obtain information that the drugs that caused the overdose had been purchased at 93548 Dover Lane in Coos Bay. The information was provided to SCINT, and a search warrant was obtained to search the above mentioned residence. On 7-28-21 at about 10:00 AM, Coos County Sheriff's Deputies, SCINT, Oregon State Police, Coquille Tribal Police and Coos County Parole and Probation responded to the residence and executed the Search Warrant. In the residence were 65 year old James Patterson, 33 year old Crystal Gardner, 31 year old Alyssa Bettis and

29 year old Gregory Kister. The residence was found to be in the control of James Patterson. A search of the residence was conducted and substantial amounts of Methamphetamine, Heroin and some LSD were located. James and Crystal were arrested for charges pertaining to the sale, Manufacture and Possession of Illicit substances, and were transported to the Coos County Jail. Gregory was arrested on outstanding warrants and was also transported. Alyssa will be referred to the District Attorney's Office for charges pertaining to possession of a controlled substance.

Criminal Mischief, Levi Bunch Rd.

CCSO release - On August 6, 2021, at about 9:26 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office received a report of property damage occurring at 56515 Levi Bunch Road in Coquille. 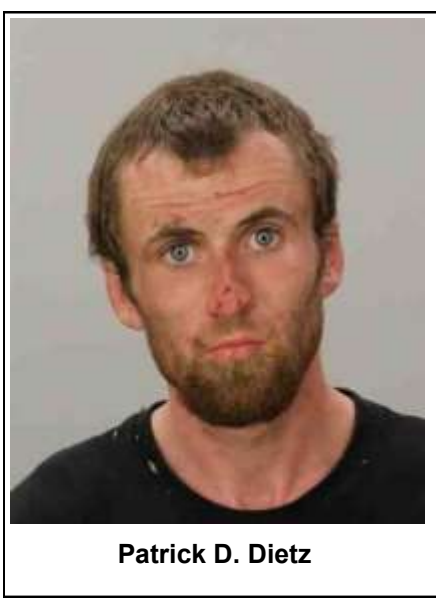

Theft, Howard Ln.

CCSO release - On August 11, 2021 at about 6:06 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office received a report of a theft which had occurred at 93722 E. Howard Lane, Apartment 3 in Coos Bay. A deputy responded, and upon conducting an investigation it was learned 50 year old Kimberly Barnes had been a guest of the victim for dinner. went to retrieve a garden hose and discovered a second fire under the crawl space on the back of the house. The resident was able to extinguish the fires before the house caught fire. The suspect attempted to stop the resident multiple times from extinguishing the fire. The suspect walked away from the scene, but was followed by Powers Fire Department until deputies arrived and contacted the suspect. The suspect was identified as Kimberly Sturman, 54 years old of Powers. Sturman admitted to being at the property, but denied any knowledge of the fires. 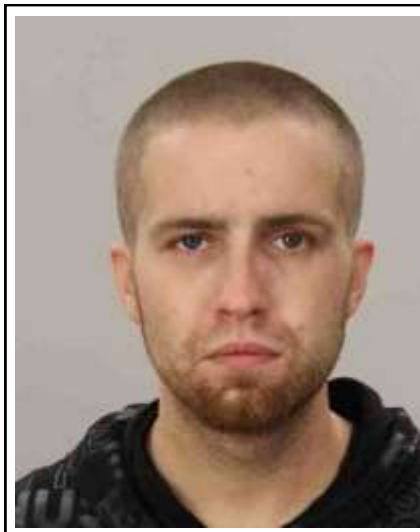

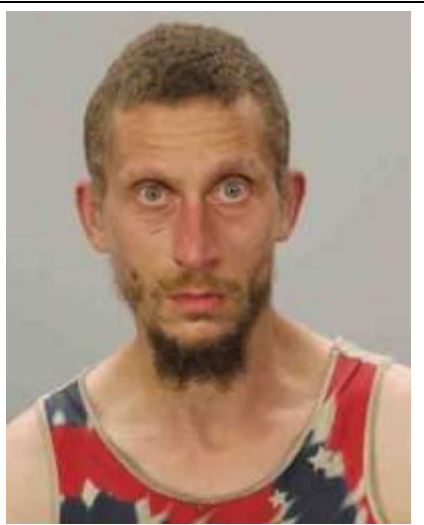

USCG Rescue SW Washington

SEATTLE — The Coast Guard rescued a man in an emergency life raft Saturday, July 31, offshore of Grays Harbor. At 11:39 a.m., Friday, watchstanders at the 13th Coast Guard District Command Center received an emergency position indicating radio beacon activation alert for the fishing vessel Ruby Lily approximately 132 miles from Grays Harbor. Watchstanders launched crews from Coast Guard Air Station Astoria, Coast Guard Air Station Sacramento and the Coast Guard Cutter Alert to respond. A U.S. Navy P-8A Poseidon in the vicinity of the vessel self diverted to respond to the scene and reported one person aboard the life raft. The man aboard, who was also the owner of the Ruby Lily, reported he was safe in the rigid hull life raft with two weeks of food and water. A good Samaritan vessel in the area offered assistance, but the man on the life raft reportedly refused

assistance from the good Samaritan. At 1:46 p.m., a MH-60 Jayhawk from Air Station Astoria arrived on scene and deployed a rescue swimmer. It was reported that the man refused to depart the life raft to be hoisted into the helicopter and insisted on a surface asset recovery. At 3:53 p.m., watchstanders diverted the Coast Guard Cutter Blue Shark and crew for recovery. Prior to departing the scene, the Coast Guard helicopter supplied the man with flares and a Coast Guard position locating beacon. An HC-27J Spartan from Air Station Sacramento arrived on scene at approximately 9:31 p.m. to keep visual on the life raft. Blue Shark reported on scene at approximately 2:36 a.m., with the Alert arriving shortly after. Blue Shark conducted a well-fare check on the man aboard the life raft and reportedly requested to be transferred off the life raft. Once transferred off the life raft, Blue Shark conducted a medical assessment. The man was reported to be in stable condition. The man reported that Ruby Lily had begun taking on water at a fast rate and completely sank. The Alert recovered the survival craft and intends to transfer the life raft to Coast Guard Aids to Navigation Team Astoria. At 8:10 a.m., Blue Shark moored in Westport to transfer the recovered man. "This case was a success because the mariner had a registered beacon, and it was activated, allowing crews to get on scene quick," said Scott Giard, the Coast Guard 13th District Search and Rescue Program Manager. "In this case, the subject was further offshore, so VHF-FM radio and cell phone coverage is scarce or scant. Reporting distress early gives rescue crews valuable time to get on scene fast, every second counts during any search and rescue case. This mariner's EPIRB saved his life. Having a registered beacon can be the difference between locating a person in distress within minutes or days."

Medal of Honor Awarded, Roseburg

RPD release - On February 22, 2021 at 2:56 pm, Roseburg Police Officers responded to a report of a shooting at the Budget 16 Motel, at 1067 NE Stephens. Off duty Patrol Sergeant Doug Walton was across the street at the OK's Auto Supply gas station getting fuel for his personal vehicle. Upon witnessing the shooting, Sgt. Walton immediately called to report the incident. Sgt. Walton remained on the phone and provided

updated information that was shared with responding Law Enforcement. The investigation later revealed Spring Mack and Jessica Ashley both sustained serious gunshot injuries. Michael Benson was pronounced deceased at the scene and it was determined he succumbed to a gunshot wound. Sgt. Walton observed Devin McNamara fleeing the motel parking lot, armed with a handgun but seemingly out of ammunition. Sgt. Walton observed McNamara flee to a nearby residence and then return, armed with two rifles that he pointed at passing motor vehicles. McNamara then entered Sgt. Walton's pickup and another vehicle at the gas station. Sgt. Walton continued to provide Douglas County Emergency Communications with updated information. After exiting the second vehicle, McNamara was no longer in possession of the rifles. McNamara made his way to the fuel pumps where he grabbed a pump nozzle and began to release gasoline. Fortunately, an employee at OK's Auto Supply, Tony MacDonald, recognized what McNamara was doing and shut off the emergency fuel switch. When the opportunity presented itself, Sgt. Walton tackled McNamara to the ground and kept him physically restrained until Patrol Officers arrived and took him into custody. Throughout this chaotic event, Sgt. Walton exercised excellent judgement and decision-making. Sgt. Walton was the first to report the incident to on-duty police, and he did so while communicating to those around him what was happening and helping them remain safe. He followed department procedure and remained a "professional witness" until he recognized an opportunity to bravely detain McNamara. "Sgt. Walton's actions during this incident were heroic, and very likely saved lives; his selfless actions showed outstanding and exemplary courage to uphold the very oath he swore upon, to protect and serve others," said Chief Klopfenstein. Chief Klopfenstein additionally met with Tony MacDonald and presented him with a Letter of Gratitude and a department challenge coin for his actions.

Manslaughter Charge, Oakland

DCSO release - OAKLAND, Ore. - An Oakland man has been arrested and charged with the death of his 81-year-old stepfather. On Saturday, August 14, 2021, shortly after 5:30 p.m., 59-year-old Anthony Catrell Wadley-Wright of Oakland turned himself in at the Sutherlin Police Department. He reported he had assaulted his 81-year-old stepfather, Albert Bertrand Carrington, at the family home in the 300-block of Brad Road.
