## Guilty Involving Child's Death

Following a seven-day trial and two-and-a-half hours of deliberations, a Coos County Circuit Court Jury found a 47-year old male guilty of Manslaughter in the First Degree, Assault in the First Degree and Criminal Mistreatment in the First Degree Thursday, July 25, involving the death of his four-month old baby boy. According to a news release from District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, "These charges stem from an incident that came to light on March 30, 2015, when then four month old Dilliam Bowman was brought to the emergency room at Bay Area Hospital in critical condition." Doctors discovered the infant had "extensive and severe brain injury along with an old subdural hematoma and a new subdural hematoma." The baby was transferred to Doernbecher Children's Hospital in Portland where doctors discovered more injuries. The boy passed away July 11, 2017. Michael Dean Bowman and Christine Bush, the biological parents, were both indicted by a Grand Jury on March 27, 2018. Bush pled guilty to Criminal Mistreatment in the First Degree and sentenced to 18-months in prison. Bowman will be sentenced August 2, 2019. The family who adopted Dillian has started a project in his memory. A park designed for handicapped children will be built in the North Bend area in Dillian's memory.

### Guilty of Murder

A 36-year old Coquille male is facing a mandatory Life Sentence following a Coos Co. Circuit Court Jury Trial that found Manuel Daniel Delgado Jr. guilty of Murder & Assault in the First Degree, Wednesday, June 26, at Coquille. According to a news release from District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, Delgado will be sentenced July 5, 2019 for killing 45-year old Gregory Durham and severely injuring 51-year old Michael Lucas. "The charges arose from a police inves-

tigation that began at approximately 1:30 AM on June 23, 2018" when Lucas was brought to Coquille Valley Hospital with severe blunt force trauma. He also had two knife wounds. The suspect in the assault was identified as Delgado. He was reportedly staying with Durham on SE 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave. Police obtained a search warrant to enter the residence after no one responded to repeated attempts at contact. "When they gained access to the home they found Manuel Delgado Jr. in bed in a bedroom next to the bathroom of the residence." The body of Durham was found in the bathroom. He died from stab wounds.

### Life in Prison

Life in prison with the possibility of parole after 25-years for Manuel Delgado of Coquille after he was found guilty of murdering Gregory Durham back in June of 2018. According to a news release from Coos Co. District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, Judge Martin Stone on Friday, July 5, also order Delgado to \$5,000 to "reimburse funeral expenses paid by the state crime victim's assistance funds." Delgado was additionally sentenced to 90-months in prison on an Assault charge. He was transferred to the custody of the Department of Corrections.

### Scam Warning

CCSO release - The Coos County Sheriff's Office has been receiving numerous calls about various scams. In one scam, a person chats with a profile that appears to be someone over the age of 18. They ask for explicit photos, then after sent the victim gets a reply that they are the parents of the minor child that they were sent to and want money to not press charges. **\*\*THIS IS A SCAM\*\*** as well as a reminder not to send any images to someone you do not know. The other one's making the rounds again is the Social Security scam, where they tell you that your Social Security is in jeopardy if you don't pay them in gift cards, and the Microsoft Scam, stating that your computer firewall needs renewal to the tune of \$499.00 They are attempting to get account numbers, or gift cards.

ANYONE that calls on the phone asking for payment in gift cards is a scam. ANYONE that calls and wants account numbers is a scam. So, how can you fight this? Set your cell phone to not accept blocked numbers. Home telephones may be able to be programmed the same way through your phone company. Screen all your calls if you have a landline and let the answering machine pick them up. Do not answer ANY number that you do now know, let them go to voice mail if you have a cell phone. Report any scam calls to: <http://www.doj.state.or.us/finfraud/engexplanation.shtml> Or 877-877-9392. This is the Oregon Department of Justice. Please, be careful and do not give any personal information out by phone.

### Missing patient from Coos Co.

A 35-year-old Oregon State Hospital psychiatric patient, Troy Irick, was reported missing Thursday, July 11. Anyone seeing Irick should call 911 or the

Oregon State Police at 800-452-7888. Please reference OSP Case Number SP19-246525. Irick is not considered to be an imminent danger to himself or others. He is accused of unauthorized departure. The OSP is conducting an investigation to help locate him. Irick should not be approached. Irick was admitted from Coos County to the Junction City campus of Oregon State Hospital Sept. 9, 2017. Irick was found guilty except for insanity on the charges of unlawful use of a weapon and menacing. He was last seen at approximately 1:45 p.m., on the grounds of the Laurel Hill Center, 2145 Centennial Plaza, Eugene, where he was attending a group activity. Irick asked to use the restroom and left the immediate area. Hospital officials, who reported the missing patient to state and local law enforcement agencies, described Irick as a male, 5 feet 7 inches tall, 156 pounds, with short brown hair, a brown beard and blue eyes. When last seen, he was wearing gray sweat pants and a hooded sweat shirt.

### Missing Oregon State Hospital patient found

The Eugene Police Department has located the patient reported missing by Oregon State Hospital Thursday, July 11. On July 11 at 9:25 p.m., a Eugene police officer took Troy Irick, from Coos Co., into custody. The patient is currently awaiting transport back to the hospital in Junction City.

## CCSO 4th of July Coverage

Agencies inside Coos County worked in cooperation this past 4th of July weekend in an attempt to maximize the safety of our citizens as part of a saturation aimed at preventing or catching Drivers Under the Influence of Intoxicants. On the 4th, Oregon State Police had staged their mobile DUII processing unit, and assisted in patrols in Charleston and the Bastendorff beach area. On the 5th and 6th, Oregon State Police had the mobile DUII trailer in Powers. In conjunction with the Powers Police Department and several Troopers, the Coos County Sheriff's Office provided over 16 hours of overtime enforcement. This enforcement opportunity was provided through a grant by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). The preventive nature of the high-visibility enforcement allowed for multiple contacts as White Cedar Days occurred, before people made the decision to drive while intoxicated. Thankfully, only one DUII driver was caught, and no crashed occurred oin the city or surrounding areas. This 4th of July weekend was a testament to a noted increase in safety and family oriented recreation in Coos County. In addition to enforcement patrols, the DUII trailer served as a focal point for the gathered celebrants. The trailer handled and coordinated many complaints, as well as several medical emergencies, initiating at least two trans-

ports to local hospitals. The Sheriff's Office would like to thank the citizens of Coos County for their responsible actions over this holiday while celebrating our great nation!

### Unlawful Use of a Weapon

Cape Arago Hwy., CCSO release - On July 4, 2019, at approximately 10:22 PM, A Coos County Sheriff's Deputy was notified of an intoxicated man shooting a gun from his trailer door toward other occupied trailers at 91904 Cape Arago Highway in Coos Bay. It was reported the man was firing his weapon multiple times. When the Deputy arrived at the trailer park, the Deputy could see the trailer door partially open

with lights on inside. The Deputy knocked on the door and announced his presence and informed the individual inside he was a Sheriff's Deputy. When the Deputy did not hear a response, the Deputy looked into the trailer through the partially opened door and observed the man hiding his rifle under a pillow on the bed and gathering up ammunition and placing it into a bedside drawer. When the man finally came to the door, he identified himself as 54-year-old Kris Henriksen of Coos Bay, Oregon. The Deputy asked Kris if he had been firing this weapon in the direction of occupied trailer in park. Kris admitted to discharging his weapon in this manner but failed to see the safety risks with doing so. Subsequently, Kris Henriksen, was arrested for unlawful use of a weapon and transported to the Coos County Jail without further incident. Upon arrival at the Coos County Jail, Kris was given a chance to measure his blood alcohol concentration (BAC) in order to be released from the jail on his own cognizance. Kris Henriksen blew a 0.293% BAC at 11:48 PM. Kris Henriksen was subsequently held until he reached the legal limit of below 0.08% BAC and no signs of impairment.

### Probation Violation

Newmark Ave., CCSO release - On July

7, 2019, at approximately 12:24 AM, A Coos County Sheriff's Deputy observed a male subject doing pushups and one-handed cartwheels in the middle of the roadway on the corner of Newmark Avenue and South Empire Boulevard, Coos Bay, Coos County, Oregon. The man approached the Deputy's patrol vehicle and began engaging in small talk. The man identified himself as 31 year old Thomas A. Sears of Coos Bay. The Deputy inquired about the welfare of Thomas. Thomas informed the Deputy he was high on methamphetamines and had

drank of a couple of beers. The Deputy ran a records check through Dispatch with the information provided by Thomas and was informed 31-year-old Thomas Sears was a probation client with stipulations of no drugs or alcohol use. The Deputy contacted an on-call probation officer who placed a detainer on Thomas. Subsequently, Thomas A. Sears, was arrested on a probation violation and transported to the Coos County Jail without further incident.

two locked gates closing off two separate Coos County properties. Sjogren was arrested for two counts of Criminal Trespass II, Theft III and Burglary II. Sjogren was transported to the Coos County Jail where he was booked and lodged on those charges. The Coos County Sheriff's Office was assisted by the Bandon Police Department.

**Warrant Arrest**

Russell Rd., CCSO release - On July 12, 2019, at approximately 12:01 AM, A Coos County Sheriff's Deputy was dispatched to a possible assault on 65375 Russell Road, North Bend, Coos County, Oregon. It was reported that the caller, identified as 56-year-old Emma M. Nelson, had an active warrant out of Coos County for felon in possession of a firearm. When the Deputy arrived at the residence, he found and spoke to Emma (who was seated in her car), informing her she was under arrest for an active warrant. Upon hearing the news, Emma attempted to start the vehicle and drive away. The Deputy opened the driver's door and pulled Emma from the vehicle before she could place the vehicle into gear and drive away. Once the Deputy had Emma away from the vehicle and on the ground, Emma continued to resist arrest. Emma continued to resist by flailing around and tucking her arms beneath her body. After numerous attempts of commanding Emma to lie on her stomach and place her hands behind her back went unanswered, the Deputy had to resort to control measures to gain compliance. Subsequently, Emma was arrested for her outstanding warrant and resisting arrest. Bay Cities Ambulance was called to the scene to evaluate Emma. Emma refused treatment and was

Upon a warrant check of Wills, it was determined he had a valid and confirmed warrant for his arrest for Failure to Appear. Both subjects were transported to Coos County Jail where they were lodged.

**Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle**

mother told Deputies that while arguing and yelling at her, he threatened to kill her while standing within an inch to an inch and a half of her causing her to be in fear of her safety. The suspect's girlfriend also showed Deputies text messages she had received from the suspect while he was talking to Deputies. These messages were threatening her and telling her to confirm his story about damage to her vehicle. The suspect later confessed to Deputies of causing the damage to the vehicle that night during the argument. After talking with the suspect's mother and girlfriend Deputies developed probable cause for Menacing Domestic, and Criminal Mischief in the Second Degree. Frank Vincent Nelson was arrested and lodged at the Coos County Jail for Menacing – Domestic, and Criminal Mischief in the Second Degree.

**Assault**

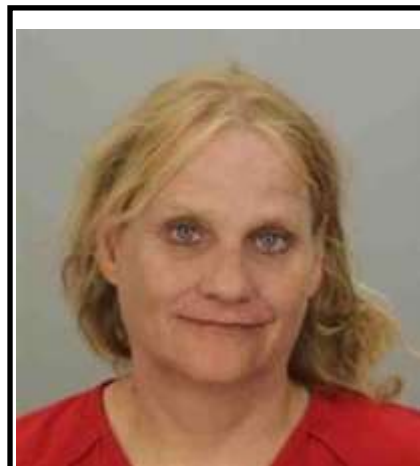

The Coos County Sheriff's Office activated its Search and Rescue team and on July 20, 2019 at approximately 10 AM deputies and Search and Rescue personnel located the missing man. The subject was contacted by voice and then later located by K-9 Jager, an air scent canine. The missing man had been injured and unable to walk out on his own. 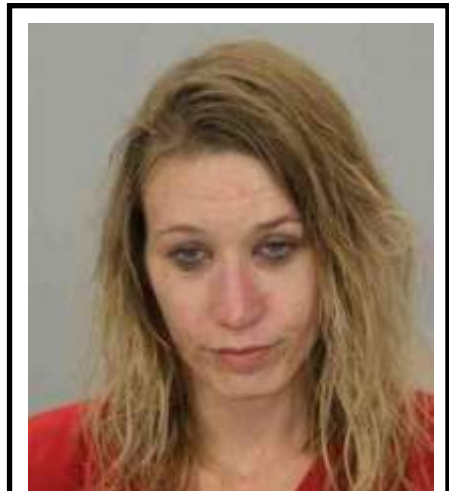

Coos County Sheriff's Office was dispatched to Pleasant Valley Lane in Myrtle Point in response to a disturbance. Upon arrival, it was learned 29 year old Shawna Schaeffer had deployed pepper spray into the face of her step-father and then fled the scene on foot. 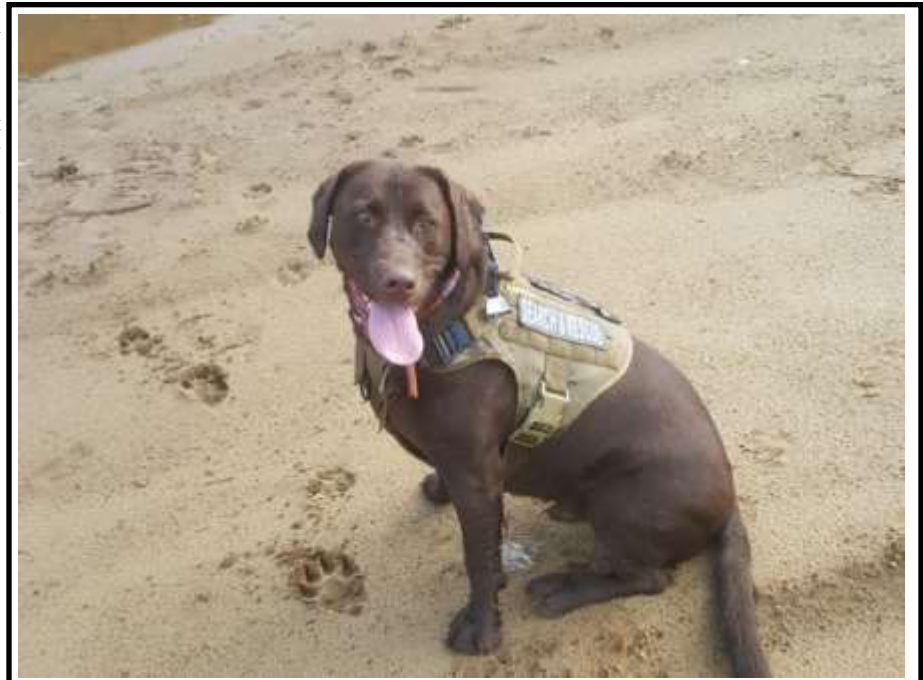
County Jail, where he was booked and lodged.

While the area of origin was easily identified, the cause of the fire is still being investigated. Witness statements from the occupant that was hospitalized is needed before the official cause can be reported. The estimated damage to the building is roughly 80,000.

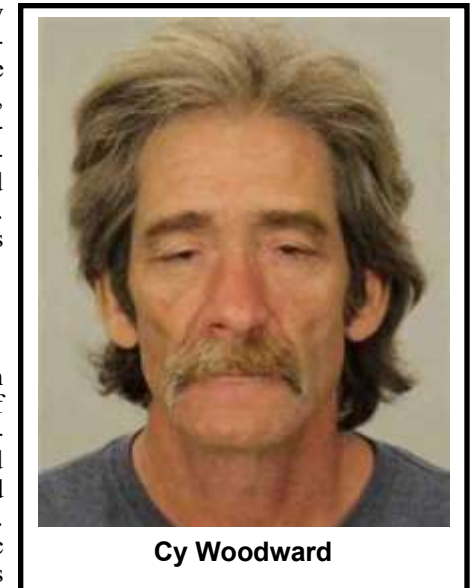
### Coos Co. Park Procedures

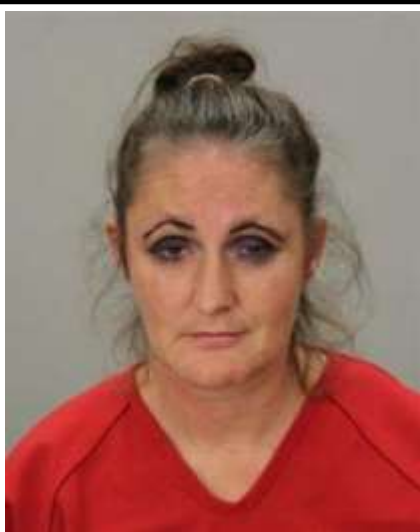

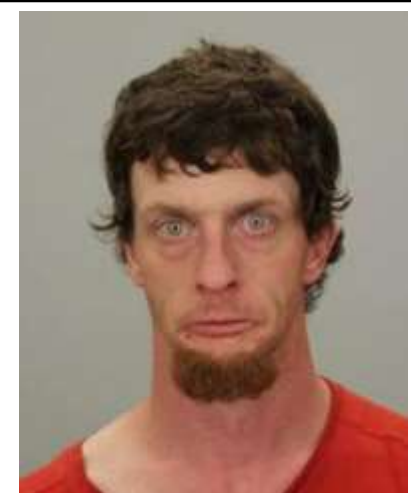

### Child Struck by Vehicle

The child was flown to Good Samaritan Hospital in Corvallis, OR and was reported to be in stable condition with injuries to her leg. The injuries are not considered life threatening at this time. Mr. Jans fully cooperated with the investigation and no criminal charges are being sought.

### Mayor of Newport Crashes on Beach

On July 8, 2019 at 5:10 PM, Oregon State Police and emergency personnel responded to a plane crash, on the beach, north of the Jetty in Newport. The preliminary investigation determined the plane was a Cessna 172 Skyhawk II and was flown by Dean Sawyer, age 66, from Newport. Sawyer had two passengers, on the four seater plane, and they were identified as Deborah Reasoner, age 61, from Molalla and a seven year old juvenile also from Molalla ( the relationship between the juvenile and Reasoner is unknown). Sawyer departed from the Newport airport approximately 4:30 PM and flew around the Depoe Bay area. Near Newport, Sawyer started to notice there was a mechanical problem with the plane and attempted to return to the Newport airport. Sawyer realized the plane did not have enough altitude to fly to the airport so he planned for an emergency landing on the beach. ### Central Coast Bank Robber Arrested

On the morning of 7-1-2019, 72-year-old Jack Palmer Van Eaton, last known as being from the Portland area, was arrested in connection with the robbery of the Lincoln City Bank of the West that occurred on 06-14-2019. Through investigation and after receiving multiple tips from citizens and other law enforcement agencies, Lincoln City Police Department Detectives were able to identify Jack Palmer Van Eaton as a suspect in the Bank of the West robbery that occurred on 6-14-19. On 07-01-19 at about 7:57 AM members of the Lincoln City Police Department, assisted by officers from other law enforcement agencies, conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle Van Eaton was driving in the 1900 block of NW 33RD Street and took him into custody without incident. A search warrant was served on the vehicle Van Eaton was driving, and on a hotel room Van Eaton was staying in, as well as on Van Eaton himself. Van Eaton was initially transported to the Lincoln City Police Department and held for a short time before being transported to the Lincoln County Jail and lodged there on charges of Robbery 2, Menacing, and Aggravated Theft 1. The members of the Lincoln City Police Department would like to thank the Newport Police Department, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Of-

fice, the Albany Police Department, the Astoria Police Department, the Oregon State Police, and the FBI for their assistance with this investigation and arrest. In addition, we would like to thank Chinook Winds Casino Security for their assistance with the investigation. While this investigation is still ongoing, we would also like to thank the community and the other law enforcement agencies for providing multiple tips that assisted us in solving this crime.

### ATV Fatality in Curry Co.

A California woman was killed Tuesday, July 2, following an ATV accident on the Winchuck River Road in Curry Co. According to reports, 47-year old Gina Theising, Simi Valley, CA, was operating the ATV with several juveniles riding on it when it went over backwards on a gravel road and dropped about 27-feet into the drainage. Two of the four passengers were injured and one was transported to Sutter Coast Hospital in Crescent City, CA.

### High Speed Pursuit on Hwy. 20

On June 26th at approximately 2:25 AM Lincoln County Deputies were notified Philomath Police Department and Benton County Sheriff's Office were in a pursuit of a vehicle failing to yield west bound on Hwy 20 at speeds reported

near 100 MPH. Lincoln County Deputies monitored rapidly changing updates as the pursuit continued west on Hwy 20. Officers from Newport Police Department and Toledo Police Department began a response setting up possible spike strip locations along the suspected route. The suspect turned onto Elk City Road off of Hwy 20 near mile post 15. The suspect continued west until Sunnyridge Rd in Toledo. ## Former Bandon Coach Sentenced

U.S. Attorney Billy J. Williams announced today that former Bandon School District educational assistant and coach Sean Jeffrey Haga, 33, was sentenced to 360 months in federal prison and a life term of supervised release for sexually abusing a 2-month-old infant and distributing photos of the abuse on the internet. "Mere hours passed between FBI agents first discovering the photographic evidence of Sean Haga's abuse online and their rescue of the infant victim assisted by local law enforce-

ment. Unfortunately, Haga's victimization of this child did not stop with his arrest. These images will continue to be circulated on the internet forever, a heartbreaking fact this child will one day come to understand," said U.S. Attorney Williams. "We believe the sentence imposed will prevent Haga from abusing other children and hope that it brings some measure of solace and comfort to the victim's family and community." "The sexual abuse of this victim—an infant—is reprehensible. Sean Haga's further exploitation of this baby as he shared that abuse with other pedophiles is unconscionable. I want to thank the FBI agents and local partners at the Bandon Police Department and Coos County Sheriff's Office who worked around the clock to rescue this child and arrest Haga," said Renn Cannon, Special Agent in Charge of the FBI in Oregon. On June 17, 2016, Haga shared photos depicting the sexual abuse of children online with an undercover FBI task force officer using Kik Messenger, an instant messaging mobile application. Haga told the undercover officer that he wanted to travel to have sex with the officer's minor daughter and that he possessed photos of himself sexually abusing a minor victim. Haga sent multiple pictures depicting this abuse to the undercover officer. The FBI worked through the night to identify the person associated with the Kik account and the location from which

it was being used. Based on the information collected, FBI agents from the Medford Resident Agency were able to obtain search and arrests warrants for Haga who was arrested on June 18, 2016 without incident. On April 25, 2018, Haga pleaded guilty to one count of sexual exploitation of a minor. This case was investigated by the FBI and prosecuted by Judi Harper and Amy Potter, Assistant U.S. Attorneys for the District of Oregon. This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. ### Multi Drug Seizure Douglas Co.

On Monday, July 22nd, 2019, detectives with the Douglas Interagency Narcotics Team (DINT) served a search warrant at a residence in the 300 block of SE Pine Street in Roseburg. The search revealed approximately 1141 grams (2.5 lbs) of methamphetamine, 639 grams (1.4 lbs) of heroin, 30 grams of cocaine, and 7 grams of psilocybin mushrooms. In addition to the various drugs, detectives found firearms, cash, and other evidence of drug related crimes. This is a huge amount of meth and heroin, usually possessed only by very high level dealers. At the scene, detectives located 47 year old Galen Trigg of Portland, Oregon. Trigg had a warrant for his arrest from the United States Marshal's Service. In addition to being held on the warrant for the US Marshal's Service, Trigg was lodged at the Douglas County Jail on the following charges: Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine; Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine; Unlawful Possession of Heroin; Unlawful Delivery of Heroin; Unlawful Possession of Cocaine; Unlawful Delivery of Cocaine; Felon in Possession of a Firearm (2 counts). Also located at the scene was 40 year old Matthew Shields of Roseburg. Shields was found to be in possession of user quantities of methamphetamine and heroin. He was cited and released on the charges of Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, and Unlawful Possession of Heroin.

Grim was purchased by an anonymous donor in the community and the Sheriff's K9 program is supported by the Friends of Umpqua Valley Police K9 Programs, a nonprofit organization.

### Oregon-based Coast Guard cutter returns home after \$311 million cocaine seizure

USCG release - ASTORIA, Ore. — The crew of the Coast Guard Cutter Steadfast (WMEC-632) returned home Tuesday to Astoria following a 56-day counternarcotic patrol to the Eastern Pacific Ocean. The crew interdicted five suspected smuggling vessels, including three pangas, a fishing vessel and a sailboat, and the crew recovered floating bales of contraband yielding more than 23,000 of cocaine. The Steadfast crew offload more than 26,000 pounds of seized cocaine in San Diego Friday, which was a

result of the cutter's five interdictions, bale recovery and an interdiction case by the Coast Guard Cutter Robert Ward (WPC-1130). The cocaine, worth an estimated \$350 million, was seized by the crews while the cutters were patrolling international waters off the coasts of Mexico, Central and South America between late June and mid-July. "This was 26,000 pounds of cocaine that will not make it to the main streets of the USA, and it also gives us the opportunity to make sure we can continue to combat transnational criminal organizations who transport this cocaine deep in the Pacific every single day," said Rear Adm. Peter Gautier, the 11th Coast Guard District commander. "Because we know that with a supply chain of illegal narcotics, at every single step there's violence, instability and despair." Steadfast's seizure of more than 23,000 pounds of cocaine marks the largest amount of cocaine seized by crews aboard a 210-foot Reliance-class medium-endurance cutter during a single counternarcotic deployment in the service's history. Many of the medium-endurance cutters in service today are more than 50 years old. The Coast Guard's medium-endurance cutters represent 70% of the services' counterdrug interdiction fleet. These cutter's are approaching the end of their service life. Replacing the aging fleet of medium-endurance cutters with the offshore patrol cutter is one of the Coast Guard's top priorities. Even though medium-endurance cutters are still highly effective, as shown by the 26,000 pounds of cocaine Steadfast's offloaded, they can be difficult and expensive to maintain and operate. As these cartels become more advanced in their methods at sea, the Coast Guard is recapitalizing the fleet with modern assets equipped to detect, interdict and disrupt the growing flow of illegal drugs, weapons and people in the Eastern Pacific. The offshore patrol cutter will provide a critical capa-

bility bridge between national security cutters like the Coast Guard Cutter Munro (WMSL 755), which offloaded 39,000 pounds of cocaine earlier this month, and fast response cutters like the Robert Ward, which seized more than 3,000 pounds of the cocaine offloaded Friday. The Robert Ward's interdiction was the first cocaine seizure made by a fast response cutter in the Eastern Pacific. "There are few closer relationships than those among the members of a ship's crew performing a dangerous, important mission," said Cmdr. Dan Ursino, the Steadfast's commanding officer. "Steadfast's crew has worked as a remarkable, dedicated team with a strong common goal – protecting their nation from the deadly, destructive effects of illegal drugs. I'm very proud of each and every one of them, and commend them for their hard work and dedication to keep themselves and their ship prepared for this vital work. Something that makes their achievement even more impressive, is that before leaving homeport on June 13th, nearly a third of this crew had never sailed before on Steadfast – a true testament to the emphasis we put on standards and training." The fight against drug cartels in the Eastern Pacific Ocean requires unity of effort in all phases from detection, monitoring and interdictions, to criminal prosecutions by U.S. Attorneys in districts across the nation. The Coast Guard increased U.S. and allied presence in the Eastern Pacific Ocean and Caribbean Basin, which are known drug transit zones off of Central and South America, as part of its Western Hemisphere Strategy. During at-sea interdictions, a suspect vessel is initially detected and monitored by allied, military or law enforcement personnel coordinated by Joint Interagency Task Force-South based in Key West, Florida. The law enforcement phase of counter-smuggling operations in the Eastern Pacific is conducted under the authority of the 11th Coast Guard District, headquartered in Alameda. Steadfast's missions include homeland security, search and rescue, marine environmental response, recreational boating safety, port safety and security, and law enforcement including: alien migrant

interdiction, pollution prevention, marine sanctuary protection, drug interdiction and fisheries enforcement.

**Coast Guard completes marathon tow to rescue disabled fishing vessel off Oregon coast**

USCG release - NEWPORT, Ore. — Coast Guard crew members aboard three separate vessels rescued a 50-foot commercial fishing vessel disabled 116 miles west of Newport Wednesday, July 31. The 41-ton vessel, Ruby Lily, which reported 6 tons of albacore tuna and three crew members aboard, was safely

moored in Yaquina Bay after a four-day operation. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Columbia River received notification at 4:35 p.m. Sunday from the crew of the Ruby Lily, who reported that the vessel's rudder was stuck. At 8 a.m. Monday, following essential preparations and fueling, the 110-foot Coast Guard Cutter Orcas launched from Astoria. The Orcas' crew arrived on scene at 6:07 p.m. and took the Ruby Lily into tow. The strain of the stuck rudder caused the metal-wire-towing bridle to part. The crew of the Orcas used a backup double-braided-nylon bridle to take the Ruby Lily into tow. That bridle then parted approximately 93 miles from the

coast. Due to the rudder's position, the crew had to trouble-shoot how to get the rudder amidships to effectively tow the vessel. There was a 600-gallon bait tank bolted over the lazarette that prevented access to work on the steering gear. The tank was unsafe to move in the current sea conditions. The crew of the Cutter Orcas waited on scene for backup. At 11 p.m. Monday, crew members aboard the 52-foot Motor Life Boat Victory launched from Coast Guard Station Yaquina Bay. The crew arrived on scene at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday. The crew members had to devise a plan to put the rudder of the Ruby Lily amidships. Two crew members from the Victory went aboard

the Ruby Lily to attach the Victory to a winch that the master of the Ruby Lily had rigged to the rudder the day before. By taking strain on the line attached to the winch, the crew of the Victory was able to force the rudder back to amidships. The crew of the Victory took the Ruby Lily into tow, and 13 hours later arrived at the Yaquina Bay Bar. Then, crew members aboard a Station Yaquina Bay 47-foot Motor Life Boat relieved the crew of the Victory from their 24-hour shift. The crew of the 47-foot MLB towed the Ruby Lily across the bar and moored it safely at the marina at 1:45 a.m. Wednesday. No injuries were reported. Each summer, the albacore tuna fleet arrives in the waters of the Pacific Northwest, often operating more than 100 miles offshore. "Responding to incidents that far from shore is a monumental task for a lifeboat crew and the team displayed exceptional fortitude, endurance, and a bit of ingenuity during their 24-hour tow," said Lieutenant Commander Scott McGrew, the Coast Guard Thirteenth District search

and rescue mission coordinator. The Coast Guard's four 52-foot Motor Lifeboats were purpose built for operations in the unforgiving environment of the Pacific Northwest and are necessary for operations year round. "They have three times the range of our newer 47-foot Motor Life Boats, which is essential for getting offshore to the tuna fleet in the summer and have unmatched sea-keeping ability, necessary for providing direct assistance while escorting fishing vessels across breaking bars in the winter," said McGrew. The Victory was built in 1956 and is the oldest small boat actively serving the Coast Guard.

### USCG & Canadian Vessel

SEATTLE --- U.S. Coast Guard and Canadian Coast Guard crews rescued a 60-year-old man from a capsized vessel near the Hoko River in Sekiu, Washington, Sunday night, July 28. The man was wearing a life jacket and was able to survive 45 minutes in the water before help arrived. Watchstanders from Coast

Guard Sector Puget Sound received a report at 5:42 p.m. of a capsized 12-foot aluminum rowboat. A U.S. Coast Guard Station Neah Bay 47-foot Motor Life Boat crew and an MH-65 Dolphin helicopter from Air Station Port Angeles assisted in the rescue. The Canadian Coast Guard Ship John P. Tully and crew diverted to assist and recovered the man at 6:36 p.m. The Canadian crew transferred the man to the 47-foot MLB crew, who then brought him back to emergency medical service technicians waiting at Olsen Marina. The man was reported to be alert, responsive and uninjured. "This rescue highlights the absolute necessity for mariners to always wear personal floatation devices while on the water," said Petty Officer Alexander Polyak, an operations specialist at Sector Puget Sound. "Additionally, our joint coordination with the Canadian Coast Guard demonstrates how maritime safety transcends national boundaries; this case provided a unique opportunity to work directly with our international partners for a rapid, successful response."

### Medevac Off Cruise Ship

PORT ANGELES, Wash. — The Coast Guard medically evacuated a 67-year-old woman off the cruise ship Ovation of the Seas Thursday evening 14 miles west of Port Angeles. A Coast Guard Air Station Port Angeles MH-65 Dolphin helicopter crew hoisted the woman safely after she reportedly suffered symptoms related to a heart attack. The aircrew transferred her to a LifeFlight Network aircrew at Fairchild Hospital in Port Angeles, who then transported her to a hospital in Seattle for further care. Watchstanders at the Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound command center received a phone call from the captain of the cruise ship at 8:26 p.m. and reported a medical emergency on the ship. The watchstanders diverted the Port Angeles aircrew from training in Neah Bay. The aircrew arrived on scene shortly after 9 p.m. and conducted the hoist. The condition of the woman is unknown at this time.

### Rescue at the Umpqua River Bar

USCG release - NORTH BEND, Ore. — The Coast Guard and good Samaritans rescued six people from a boat which sank at the jetty point of the Umpqua River Bar, Friday morning, July 5. Coast Guard Station Umpqua River crewmembers aboard a 47-foot Motor Life Boat rescued four survivors, two separate good Samaritan vessels each pulled one person aboard, and all survivors were transported to the pier for evaluation by awaiting emergency medical services. At 5:40 a.m., Coast Guard watchstanders received a radio distress call from a 24-foot aluminum pleasure craft taking on

water while trying to cross the river bar. The vessel reportedly took a hard wave across the bow which broke the windshield and flooded the boat, leading to its sinking. Five of the six survivors were able to don lifejackets, while one clung to a type-1 throw-able floatation device. Two pleasure vessels which were also crossing the bar, turned back to render assistance. They each acted to rescue a person from the 60-degree water. Coast Guard crewmembers aboard the 47-foot MLB had just completed a morning bar report and were refueling at the pier when they were diverted to assist. They arrived on scene 7-minutes later and found three survivors still clinging to the good Samaritan vessel, unable to get aboard. The survivor clinging to the type-1 floatation device, was drifting away, being unable to swim effectively while holding the device at the same time. "We were most worried about recovering that survivor in time," said Petty Officer 3rd Class Aaron Hadden, the coxswain of the 47-foot MLB. "When hypothermia takes over and a person loses consciousness, at least with a life jacket, their head would still be held above the water." The four survivors in the water were rescued by the Coast Guard crewmembers and were estimated to be in the water 10-minutes with no injuries reported. "It was an ebbing tide and the waves were very choppy," said Hadden "It can get really dangerous out there and every boater should be wearing a lifejacket when crossing the bar." The vessel sank at the tip of the Umpqua River Jetty and is deemed unrecoverable at this time.
