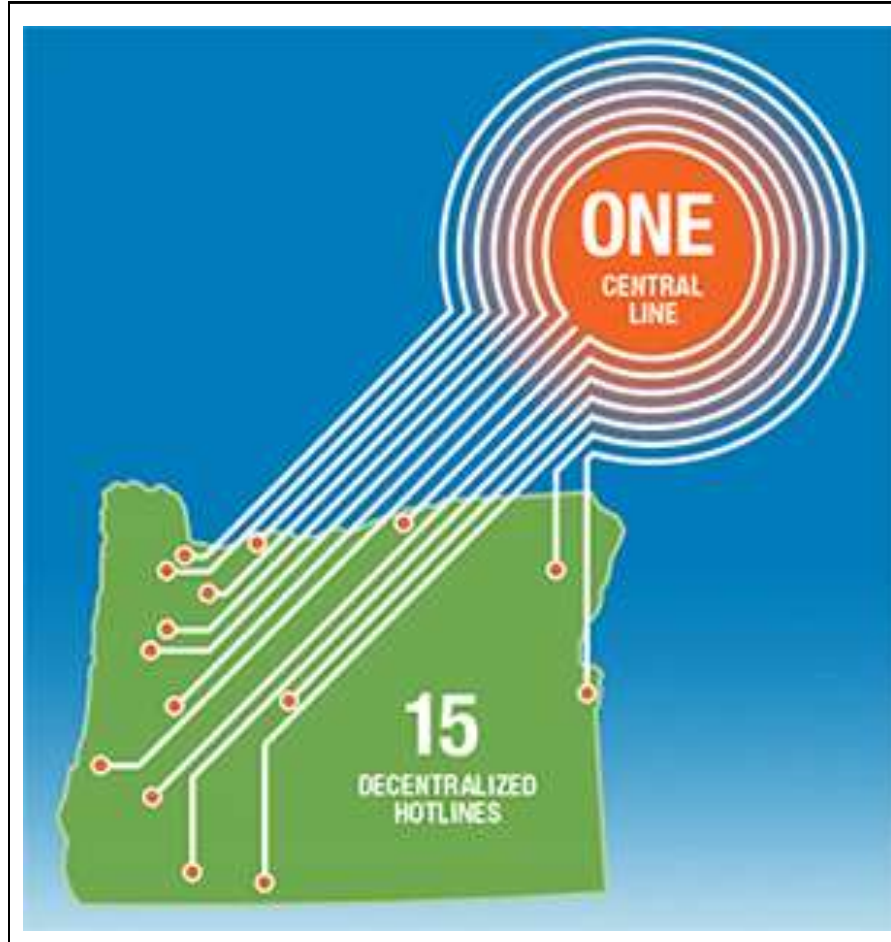

Oregon Child Abuse Hotline First Year Report

(Salem, Ore.) – Since it launched in August 2018, the statewide Oregon Child Abuse Hotline has made significant progress in protecting Oregon’s children by implementing a system that ensures the best possible safety decisions, that calls are handled consistently, and callers are respected and responded to in a timely manner. Dropped call rates have decreased, average call waits have gotten shorter, and 98,404 calls reporting concerns of child safety were screened by hotline staff. This data is available in the recently released Oregon Child Abuse Hotline Annual Report. “As the Hotline reflects on progress made during its first year, we also acknowledge that there is still much room for improvement,” said DHS Director Fariborz Pakseresht. “We will continue to use data, customer feedback, predictive analytics, and training to better serve and protect the children in our communities.” The statewide hotline resulted from the centralization of 15 previously independent, regional hotlines in order to improve consistency in how rule and procedure were applied, including screening reports of child abuse. When



someone calls the Hotline, a screener gathers sufficient information to assess whether the allegation meets the criteria of suspected abuse and whether there is

imminent danger to the safety of the child. Calls can remain anonymous. Over the last year, DHS partnered with Action for Child Protection, Portland State University, and other community partners to develop a 56-hour training for DHS screeners. This training, along with the centralization, has increased screening consistency, decreased the potential for bias, and integrated robust and intentional data in the Hotline’s ef-

forts to keep children safe. Along with predictive analytics and access to past reports from multiple sources, screeners now have more information in assessing safety for children at their fingertips. The management consulting firm hired to assist DHS through Governor Brown’s Executive Order on Child Welfare performed significant work to track and analyze hotline call data to improve screening outcomes. The Hotline will also soon be adding an additional queue for more general child welfare questions, so that screeners can focus on calls that require immediate attention. Screeners also can now receive reports of child abuse and neglect in multiple languages. By adding an additional queue for Spanish speakers to speak with Spanish speaking screeners this summer, more children are now represented and protected. Other highlights of the hotline’s first year include the final hiring and training phase of 18 staff expected in November and newly created advanced screener training modules on Tribal Engagement, Commercial Sexual Exploitation, Substance Abuse Disorder, and Domestic Violence. While great progress has been made, the Hotline is still facing challenges. For example, in September as children returned to school and interfaced with more mandatory reporters, the Hotline saw average wait

times increase to approximately 7 minutes. Still, even with the spike in September, more than 60 percent of the calls were answered within 2 minutes. The maximum wait time in September was 100 minutes, an outlier in the month's average data, and an issue DHS is addressing. Report child abuse to the Oregon Child Abuse Hotline by calling 1-855-503-SAFE (7233). This toll-free number allows you to report abuse of any child or adult to the Oregon Department of Human Services, 24 hours a day, seven days a week and 365 days a year. You can also report child abuse by calling a local police department, county sheriff, county juvenile department, or Oregon State Police.

Warrant Service

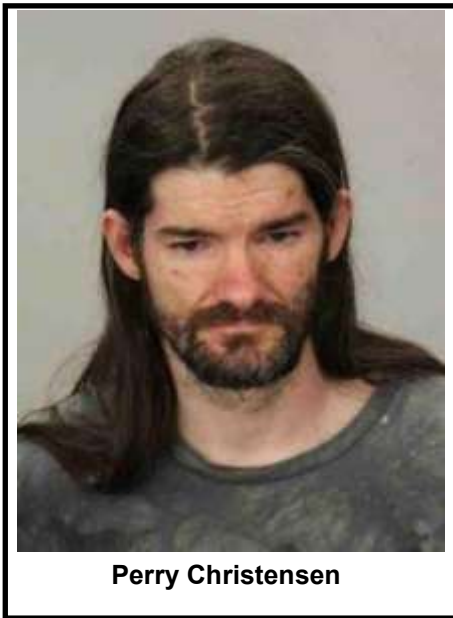

Warrant Service

Airport Hts., CCSO release - April 20th, 2019 local law enforcement received information from neighboring Curry County that Curry County resident Joel C. Jones III 31 YOA, was wanted on several outstanding Parole Violation warrants and was attempting obtain a firearm. Curry County further advised Mr. Jones was extremely violent and would actively resist any Law Enforcement attempt to take him into custody. Deputies from the Sheriff's Office and other agencies have followed tips over the past several months and checked locations where it was reported Mr. Jones was hiding, without success. On October 15th, 2019 at about 3:30 p.m. Parole and Probation Officer observed Mr. Jones outside of their North Bend Office located near the intersection of Maple Leaf Street and Oak Street inside the City limits of North Bend. The Officer attempted to place Mr. Jones under arrest and a physical fight ensued. Mr. Jones was able to fight his way free of the probation officer and fled on foot into the residential area known as, "Airport Heights. A perimeter was set up spanning several blocks from Maple Leaf Street to Virginia Ave, and Sheriff's Office K-9 Odin was called to track Mr. Jones. K-9 Odin and his handler arrived on scene and tracked for approximately 2 hours. During this time K-9 Odin located Mr. Jones' underwear and narrowed down the search area substantially. It was evident Mr. Jones continued to move from location to location to evade capture. During this time the Sheriff's Office requested the assistance of air assets from the United States Coast Guard. Near the end of the track, police agencies were advised Mr. Jones was hiding in a garage on Oak St. Mr. Jones subsequently fled from the garage and continued to run through numerous privately owned properties as he actively fled from the police. During this time,

police received several 911 calls stating they observed the suspect, one individual actually stated the suspect now no longer was wearing a shirt. K-9 Odin continued to diligently work the area and eventually located Mr. Jones hiding in a hole on the side of a sand hill with a plywood board over the top of him, as to not be seen by the Coast Guard helicopter. Upon contact, Mr. Jones stuck K-9 Odin several times in the head with a closed fist and was able to break free from Odin. Mr. Jones continued to flee down the steep sand embankment where he was encountered by a State Trooper and physically fought with the State Trooper. Eventually, due to the actions of K-9 Odin and this State Trooper, Mr. Jones was taken into custody at this location without further incident or threat to the public. Mr. Jones was transported to the Coos County Jail on several outstanding warrants for his arrest. Mr. Jones will be charged additionally with Burglary II, Interfere With a Public Safety Animal, Resisting Arrest, Escape II, Escape III, and several counts of Criminal Trespass stemming from this incident. The Coos County Sheriff's Office would like to thank the Citizens of North Bend who assisted us, The Oregon State Police, Confederated Tribal Police Department, Parole and Probation, The North Bend Police Department and The United States Coast Guard for their assistance in brining Mr. Jones to justice. This capture marks Odin's 90th capture! The Sheriff's Office would also like to remind the public of their 2nd annual K-9 Fundraiser being held at the Egyptian Theater on **Nov 16** beginning at 5pm with all proceeds going to towards, operation, and upkeep of these elite K-9 Deputies who serve in our community.

Sitkum Ln. Fatal

CCSO report -On October 15, 2019 at 03:38 am, the Coos County Sheriff's Office was contacted regarding an overturned vehicle near mile post 22 on Sitkum Lane east of Myrtle Point. A single occupant in the vehicle was found to be partially entrapped under the vehicle, a green, 1994, four door, Saturn automobile. Sheriff's Deputies responded to the scene as well as first responders from Myrtle Point Ambulance and Dora Sitkum Fire. Upon investigation it was determined the operator, a local resident identified as 70 year old Michael R. Digby of Myrtle Point, had struck the embankment and overturned his vehicle. Mr. Digby was partially ejected from the vehicle and pronounced deceased at the scene.

ATV Fatal

ODNRA, CCSO report - On Wednesday October 15th at about 1:42pm, the Coos County Sheriff's Office responded to a 911 call from a citizen reporting an ATV accident they discovered at Razor Back

Hill near Hauser in the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area. The single occupant/operator was slumped over in the driver's seat and not responsive. The citizen's conducted CPR until Bay Cities Ambulance arrived with Hauser Fire & Rescue. Alan R. Paulsen, age 64, of Grants Pass, Oregon was operating a Can Am Maverick at the time of the accident. He was wearing a seatbelt harness and helmet. Alan was declared deceased at about 2:26pm while at the scene.

Search & Rescue

Sunset Bay, CCSO release - On October 16, 2019, The Coos County Sheriff's Office received information of a subject who failed to return from mushroom



picking East of Norton Gulch near Sunset Bay State Park. Missing was Harriet Sagar 59 years of age of Coos Bay. The Coos County Sheriff's Office Learned of the missing person after a friend reported that Harriet had gone out mushroom picking on the 15th of October and had failed to return. The Sheriff's Office activated its Search and Rescue (SAR) team shortly after being notified and sent out Hasty Teams in the direction that Ms. Sagar had last been seen. The teams located Sagar at approximately 1:40 pm about two miles from where she had last been seen. She was cold and wet but otherwise unharmed. The Sheriff's Office once again expresses gratitude to the dedicated volunteers of the Sheriff's Search and Rescue, and the other many

organizations in the county that support life-safety missions. We would also like to recognize the accomplishment of K9 Augie who located Sagar. Nice work!

Warrant Service/Escape

Arson Investigation Bandon

On Saturday, September 28, 2019, at approximately 8 P.M. emergency personnel from the Bandon Police Department and Bandon Fire department were dispatched to a structure fire at Harbor Lights Middle School. Due to the suspicious nature of the fire detectives from the Oregon State Police Arson Unit were requested to assist with the investigation. A joint investigation was conducted involving the Oregon State Police and the State Fire Marshal's Office, Bandon Police Department, and Bandon Fire department. Members of the Harbor Lights Middle School cooperated with and assisted in the investigation. The investigation revealed that two fires were intentionally set at the school on the evening of August 28. Only one fire caused severe damage to the school but didn't prohibit the school from continuing the following week. The majority of the structural damage was in the boys locker room and damaged all of the football equipment. A juvenile male, who attended the school, was identified and admitted to setting these fires. The school was notified of the investigations results and is planning to take appropriate administrative actions. The investigation will also be sent to the Coos County District Attorney's Office for potential criminal charges.

Possession of Firearm

Libby Ln., CCSO release - On 09/26/19 at approximately 4:30 PM, a Coos County Sheriff's Deputy contacted a suspicious vehicle on Libby Lane near mile post 2. After an investigation, 47 year old Troy E. Harris of Coos Bay was arrested on the charges of Felon in Possession of a Firearm and Possession of Short-Barreled Shotgun. Mr. Davis was charged additionally with unlawful harvest of minor forest products from tribal lands and a probation violation. Mr. Harris was transported to the Coos County Jail where he was held without bail on the probation violation.

Public Assist

Isthmus Slough Bridge, CCSO release - On 10-7-19 at 10:04 AM, Coos County Dispatch received a call from an off duty Bandon Police Officer. He had witnessed a female sitting on the railing of the bridge, and when he returned to check on her, noted she had jumped into the slough. One lane was blocked before the female was recovered from the water. The female was noted to be conscious and breathing, and appeared unharmed by the fall as she clung to a pylon. ed to the Coos County Jail where he was booked and lodged on the above mentioned charges.

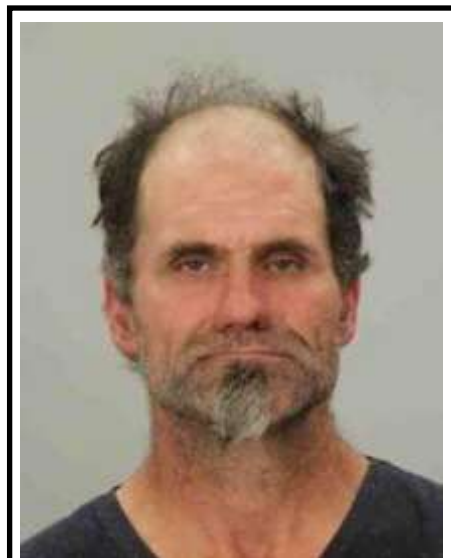
Theater Fire

An estimated 200 people had to be evacuated from the Pony Village Cinema's Saturday afternoon, Oct. 6, after a fire broke out within a wall near the ticket booth entrance shortly after 5 p.m. Twelve firefighters from NBFDF responded within two-minutes of the call. The fire caused an estimated \$5,000 in damage to the structure.

Office along with the Coos Bay Police Department, North Bend Police Department and the Oregon State Police assisted Coos County Community Corrections with a saturation. The saturation was put in place to locate individuals that had warrants and/or were detainable through Coos County Community Corrections. Approximately 20 residences were visited and approximately 60 people were contacted in total. There were approximately 15 Law Enforcement Officers and 6 PO's dedicated to this saturation. Central Coast investigators are reporting the death of a 34-year old female, whose body was found in Newport Sunday, Oct. 27, as "suspicious." The victim's name is being withheld while the investigation continues. Police responded Sunday to a report of a burglary/missing person report on the 500 block of Olive St., near the Lincoln Co. Courthouse. The investigation led to the body of the Newport female.

Keiski Ln. Van Fire Central Coast

At 5:03pm the evening of 10/18/19, Central Oregon Coast Fire was dispatched to a fully involved car fire. We were on scene at 5:10pm, 7 minutes later and immediately went into action extinguishing a fully involved camper van, concentrating first on the trees immediately next to and above the van to protect the houses and outbuildings in the area. When the exposures were out we then shifted our full attention on the van. Within 50 minutes of the initial call, at 5:43pm, we had the fire completely out and headed back to our station at 6:07pm. We were assisted on scene by Seal Rock Fire District, Yachats Rural Fire Protection, Pacific West Ambulance and Lincoln County Sheriff's Office - Oregon.

Unlawful Selling of Shark Fins

On September 13, 2019 members of the Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife Division with assistance from Agents of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration completed an investigation into the unlawful selling of shark fins. Agnes Yu (52) of Happy Valley, OR. was issued a citation to appear into the Multnomah County Circuit Court on the charge of Unlawful Selling/Distribution of Shark Fin, which is a Class A Misdemeanor. The investigation revealed YU unlawfully sold dried shark fin out of Wing Ming Herbs located at 2738 SE 82nd Ave. in Portland, OR. The 2011 Oregon Legislature passed HB 2838 which prohibited the possession, selling, offering for sale, trading, or distributing shark fins. It is estimated upwards of 100 million sharks are killed globally each year for their fins.

Central Coast School Safety

On September 26th, 2019 at about 9:00pm, Taft 7-12 administration notified the Lincoln City Police Department of reported social media posts, which included indirect statements made by an unidentified individual concerning school safety. The Lincoln City Police school resource officer and detectives opened an investigation into this matter, subsequently identifying the juvenile responsible for creating the social media posts. This subject was taken into custody by LCPD detectives at about 1:30am and Lincoln County School District staff were notified of the arrest. The juvenile was charged with one count of Disorderly Conduct in the First Degree and later lodged at the Lincoln County Juvenile detention facility. Through LCPD's investigation it was determined that the involved juvenile was not a student of Taft 7-12, and there is no longer a concern for safety.

Central Coast Burglars Caught

On October 2nd, 2019 at approximately 10:22 PM, Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputies were dispatched to a possible burglary at a vacation rental in the 4000 block of NE East Devils Lake Rd. The caller reported the keys to her vacation rental had been stolen in the Portland area earlier in the week and she now believed the residence to be occupied. Deputies, assisted by the Lincoln City Police Department and Oregon State Police, responded to the residence

and located a stolen Porsche SUV in the driveway. Deputies and officers surrounded the residence and gave verbal commands for the occupants to exit. 34 year-old Sarah Marie Brausen of Beaverton, Oregon exited the residence and was found to be in possession of the caller's identification and credit cards. Assisted by LCSO K-9 Bonni, deputies searched the residence for other suspects. 36 year-old Anthony Troy Brausen, also of Beaverton, was located in the basement and taken into custody without incident. Sarah and Anthony Brausen were found to be in possession of several identity documents belonging to other victims, burglary tools, document counterfeiting equipment, numerous purses and suitcases, and a handgun. Sarah and Anthony Brausen were each charged with the following: Burglary in the 1st Degree, Possession of Burglary Tools, Theft in the 1st Degree, Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle, Possession of a Stolen Vehicle, Felon in Possession of a Firearm, Forgery in the 1st Degree, Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument in the 1st Degree, Criminal Possession of a Forgery Device, and Identity Theft. Their respective bails were set at \$565,000. The investigation is on-going, and the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office will be working with Portland area police agencies to identify additional victims. DINT Arrest

amphetamine; Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine; Unlawful Possession of Heroin; Unlawful Delivery of Heroin; Felon in Possession of Firearm; Parole Violation; Clackamas County Warrant for Unlawful Possession of Heroin; Kristin Morse was lodged at the Douglas County Jail and charged with a Parole Violation.

Reward Offered for Wanted Male in Douglas Co.

DOUGLAS COUNTY, Ore. - A \$1,500 reward is being offered for credible information which directly leads to the arrest of 34 year-old Jason Ryan Taylor. Taylor is known to law enforcement in both Douglas and Josephine Counties and thus far has avoided apprehension. Taylor travels between the two counties committing crimes and victimizing property owners. Additionally, he currently has active warrants out for his arrest. Both counties have partnered with the United States Marshal's Service to bring Taylor to justice. A \$1,500 reward is now being offered in hopes that anyone with information will step forward. Those who are harboring or assisting Taylor may also face criminal penalties, including arrest. Taylor is a white male adult described as 5'09", 150 lbs with brown hair and brown eyes. He is known to alter his appearance to avoid recognition and capture. Powers and Saben were ultimately booked and released at the Douglas County Jail on a charge of Depositing Trash Within 1000' of a Waterway (Class B Misdemeanor). Not A Shooting

SUTHERLIN, Ore. - On Tuesday, October 15, 2019, at 7:45 am, Douglas County 9-1-1 Dispatchers received a report of a vehicle that was in the ditch in the 200-block of Fort McKay Road in Sutherlin. Dispatchers were told by the reporting party that the female associated with the car was shooting out of the window of the car. Law enforcement from the Sheriff's Office, Sutherlin Police Department and Oregon State Police were dispatched to the scene. When Officers from Sutherlin Police Department arrived, the female driver was briefly detained. It was quickly determined the female had not fired any shots and the sound the caller was hearing were vineyard cannons intended to keep birds away from the vineyard. No actual shots had been fired. The female driver had turned too soon and accidentally missed the driveway and was not injured. No citations or arrests were made.

I-5 Fatal Douglas Co.

Oregon State Police (OSP) is continuing the investigation into this morning's fatal vehicle versus pedestrian crash on Interstate 5 near Myrtle Creek. On Sep-

tember 27, 2019 at about 6:10 AM, OSP troopers and emergency personnel responded to a Toyota Prius that was stopped for unknown reasons in the northbound left lane of Interstate 5 near milepost 112. Upon arrival of an OSP trooper and emergency personnel, the operator of the Toyota Prius, Balras Singh DHILLON (Male), age 35, from Lincoln, CA drove away northbound. DHILLON drove the Toyota Prius about a mile before crashing into the northbound center median guardrail and coming to rest on the outside shoulder of the freeway. After the crash, DHILLON exited his vehicle and for unknown reasons walked across the northbound lanes of traffic and down the center median. DHILLON continued walking towards the southbound lanes of Interstate 5 and walked into the side of a southbound Jeep Cherokee, operated by Britany GARATE, age 29, from Roseburg. DHILLON was hit by multiple other vehicles in both southbound lanes and was pronounced deceased at the scene. The southbound lanes of Interstate 5 were closed for over three hours during the investigation into the incident. Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) was able to set up a detour for southbound traffic. OSP was assisted at the scene by Myrtle Creek Police Department, Myrtle Creek Fire Department, Bay Cities Ambulance, Douglas County Sheriff's Office, Winston Police Department and ODOT. OSP troopers are continuing the investigation and are

requesting anyone that believes they may have been involved or witnessed the incident to call investigators at *OSP or (800) 442-2068 and reference case number SP19-347178.

Busy Night for Douglas Co. K9

K9 Grim assisted deputies twice in one night with the apprehension of two suspects. Shortly before 5:00 pm on Thursday, September 26, 2019, deputies received a tip that 23 year-old Christopher Binder of Glide had been spotted in the 200-block of Brown Street in Glide and had multiple active warrants for his arrest. Deputies and Oregon State Police Troopers arrived on scene along with K9 Grim. Grim began to track Binder from where he was last seen and eventually located him along the riverbank. Binder surrendered and was taken into custody without further incident. Binder was transported to the Douglas County Jail where he was lodged on the multiple felony and misdemeanor warrants. Around 8:30 pm that same evening, deputies were called to a residence in the 8000-block of Highway 42 in Tenmile for a report of a male hiding in a residence who was violating a restraining order. K9 Grim located the individual hiding under a bed in the home. The suspect, 42 year-old Kenny Allen Edwards of Tenmile, came out from under the bed after being located, but then began resisting deputies attempts to arrest him. K9 Grim was deployed and assisted

deputies in taking him into custody, despite Edwards attempt to harm the dog. Grim did not sustain any injuries. Edwards was transported to the Douglas County Jail where he was lodged on the following charges: Restraining Order Violation; Interfering with Police; Interfering with a Law Enforcement Animal; Resisting Arrest; K9 Grim, a 7 year-old German Shepherd, has been with the Douglas County Sheriff's Office since 2013. Grim was purchased by an anonymous donor in the community. The Sheriff's K9 program is supported financially by the Friends of Umpqua Valley Police K9 Programs, a nonprofit organization which holds fundraisers and receives donations from the community. Bailey's Veterinary Clinic provides medical care for K9 Grim while Coastal Farm and Home Supply provides Grim's food. A second patrol dog, K9 Zoro, was recently obtained to supplement the Sheriff's K9 program. K9 Zoro and his handler will begin training in mid-October to become a certified patrol team. Zoro, a German Shepherd, will be two years old in January.

Coast Guard searching for man missing near Lummi Island

SEATTLE — The Coast Guard is searching for a man reported missing between Bellingham and the San Juan Islands. Missing is Nick Saling, 53. At approximately 11:30 a.m., Monday, Oct. 21st, watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound were notified by the individual's sister that the man failed to return last night after a sailing trip to Cypress Island. Sector Puget Sound watchstanders issued an Urgent Marine Information Broadcast and launched multiple Coast Guard crews. The man's 25-foot yellow sailboat has been located northeast of Lummi Island.

Coast Guard rescues man from forest near Aberdeen

SEATTLE — A Coast Guard aircrew hoisted an injured man Saturday morning from a forest several miles east of Aberdeen, Washington. At 10 a.m., watchstanders at the Columbia River Command Center received a request for assistance from Grays Harbor dispatch reporting a man who had several injuries and was showing symptoms of hypothermia near Mox Chuck Slough. Ground personnel had been unable to reach the man's location by vehicle due to rough road conditions. A Coast Guard aircrew aboard an MH-60 Jayhawk was already airborne for train-

His current condition is unknown.

Sailboat Rescue off Central Coast

USCG release - SEATTLE — The Coast Guard rescued five adults aboard a disabled sailing vessel Wednesday, Oct. 17, 20-miles west of Yaquina Bay, Oregon. At approximately, 5:15 a.m. watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector North Bend received a distress call from a 50-foot sailing vessel that the individuals were struggling to make way to safe harbor and were unsure if they could cross the bar. At 7:30 a.m., a boatcrew aboard a 47-foot Motor Lifeboat from Coast Guard Station Depoe Bay arrived on scene and took the sailboat in tow. The crew towed the vessel to an area two miles west of the Yaquina Bay entrance, where they met with two other MLB crews from Coast Guard Station Yaquina Bay. The rescue crews assessed the situation and decided it would be best for the five individuals to enter the water after donning survival suits. Upon entering the water, a crew from Coast Guard Station Yaquina Bay aboard a MLB immediately picked the individuals up and brought them aboard. They were then transported to South Beach Marina with no medical conditions. At 5:30 p.m., the vessel was safely moored in Newport, Oregon. Sea conditions were reported as 10 to 20-foot seas offshore with winds of 35-40 knots.

Search Suspended off Central Coast

NEWPORT, Ore. — The Coast Guard suspended its search for a man early Monday morning, Sept. 30, after more than 11 hours of combined searches in the vicinity of Whale Cove near Depoe Bay. Coast Guard Sector North Bend coordinated eight combined searches, which were conducted by an MH-65 Dolphin aircrew from Air Facility Newport, a 47-foot Motor Lifeboat crew from Coast Guard Station Depoe Bay and Lincoln County Rescue. All searches resulted in negative results. Coast Guard watchstanders at Sector North Bend received a report at 11:42 a.m. Sunday from a source on land who sighted vessel debris in the vicinity of Whale Cove, approximately one-mile south of Depoe Bay. A 47-foot MLB crew and a Dolphin helicopter crew launched and arrived on scene to commence searching at 12:10 p.m. At 12:47 p.m. Lincoln County Rescue and a Station Depoe Bay ground party arrived at

Whale Cove and launched a drone to survey from above. The reported floating debris field was located by responders, and the debris found was confirmed to be from the overdue sailing vessel *Kiwanda*. The *Kiwanda* was last sighted by a bar tower watchstander at Coast Guard Station Yaquina Bay at approximately 7 p.m. Saturday in the vicinity of Cape Foulweather, with a northerly heading. Coast Guard crew members recovered several items from the area including: wood, a life jacket, part of a marine sanitation device, and a strobe light with the name of the vessel written on it.

Body of Missing Male Recovered from Ocean

On Tuesday, October 1, 2019 at approximately 10:30 A.M. Oregon State Police Troopers responded to the United States Coast Guard (USCG) Station Yaquina Bay on a report they had located a deceased person in the Pacific Ocean. The deceased individual is Hoang Minh Tran (58) of Clackamas. Family had reported Tran overdue from a sailing trip aboard the vessel "*Kiwanda*" on the evening of Saturday, September 28, 2019. Tran was found wearing a floatation device.

USCG release - PORT ANGELES, Wash. — A Coast Guard aircrew medically evacuated an ill man late Monday night, Oct. 7 off the cruise ship *Norwegian Joy*, which was operating 20 miles off the coast of Cape Flattery. An MH-65 Dolphin helicopter aircrew from Sector Field Office/Air Station Port Angeles hoisted a 71-year-old man reportedly suffering heart complications and transported him to Station Neah Bay where he was transferred to a Lifeflight Network aircrew. The man was then flown to Providence Hospital in Everett for further care. The initial call for assistance was received by Coast Guard 13th District Command Center watchstanders at 6:55 p.m. The watchstanders directed the launch of the Port Angeles aircrew at 7:40 p.m. after conferring with the duty flight surgeon. In the meantime the *Norwegian Joy* turned back toward Cape Flattery to reduce distance from emergency responders. The Coast Guard aircrew conducted the hoist at 9:25 p.m. leaving the Coast Guard aviation survival technician on board the cruise ship and taking the ship's doctor and patient to shore. The Lifeflight Network received the patient at 10:16 p.m. and transported the patient to Providence Hospital. The Coast Guard then retrieved the AST off the cruise ship. The condition of the patient is unknown at this time.

He was then transferred to a Life Flight Network aircrew and flown to Sacred Heart Medical Center at Riverbend in Springfield for further care. Watchstanders at the 13th Coast

Guard District Command Center received the initial call for assistance at 12:40 p.m. from search and rescue coordinators at the Air Force Joint Rescue Coordination Center. The watchstanders directed the launch of the North Bend aircrew at 1:36 p.m. after conferring with the duty flight surgeon. The Dolphin aircrew arrived on scene with the *Norwegian Joy* at 2:04 p.m. and conducted a hoist. The aircrew landed in North Bend at 3:15 p.m. and transferred

Fishing Vessel Runs Aground on Yaquina River

No fuel or oil sheens could be seen in the Yaquina River after a 36-foot long commercial fishing vessel ran aground near Toledo, Sunday, Oct. 6. The U.S. Coast Guard dispatched a rescue vessel about 2 p.m. to assist the F/V Mickey. A man and a dog were rescued. There were no injuries. The owner of the vessel will reportedly work with the Port of Toledo to salvage the vessel.

Coast Guard rescues 3 adults off northern Washington coast

SEATTLE — The Coast Guard rescued three adults aboard a disabled sailing vessel 23 miles west of Cape Flattery,

Thursday morning, Oct. 3. Two Coast Guard 47-foot Motor Lifeboat crews from Station Neah Bay and an MH-65 Dolphin helicopter aircrew responded with one of the boat crews towing the disabled sailing vessel to Neah Bay. No injuries were reported. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound received a distress call at 3:15 a.m. from the operators of the 41-foot sailing vessel Legrega. The master of the vessel reported the loss of sails, storm jib, engine, and steering capability. The watchstanders issued an Urgent Marine Information Broadcast, which requests for any mariners in the vicinity to render assistance but no mariners responded to the broadcast. Watchstanders also used the Automated Mutual-Assistance Vessel Rescue System to locate commercial vessels in the area but calls to two vessels went unanswered. The Dolphin aircrew arrived on scene at 4:48 a.m. and the two MLBs arrived on scene at 6:40 a.m. Two MLBs were launched to mitigate safety concerns regarding a small-craft advisory. One of the MLBs crews hooked up a tow and towed the sailors to safety arriving in Neah Bay at 10:09 a.m. A post-search and rescue boarding was conducted and issued notices of violation for having no vessel documentation and expired flares. The sailors were attempting to sail from Olympia to Newport, Oregon. Sea conditions were reported as five to seven feet but the sailors reported experiencing 10 foot seas offshore.

Sunken Vessel Washington St.

SEATTLE — The Coast Guard is responding to a diesel spill in West Bay Marina near Olympia, Friday, Oct. 4 after a 92-foot recreational yacht sunk in the early morning hours. The Coast Guard has opened the Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund and contracted Global Diving and Salvage to clean up the spilled diesel and recover any remaining pollution within the vessel. The yacht named King's Way has a reported 1,200 gallons of fuel onboard. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound received notification of the spill at 7:30 a.m. from the National Response Center. Incident Management Division personnel alongside Washington State response person-

nel from Department of Ecology, Department of Fish and Wildlife and the Port of Olympia are on scene and working together to mitigate pollution impact. Containment and absorbent boom has been deployed, as well as, absorbent materials.

Ohio. Through the investigation investigators learned the marijuana and BHO extract was destined for Ohio. Schoenhofer was lodged at the Klamath County Jail for Exporting Marijuana, Exporting Extract, Possession of a Controlled Substance-Marijuana, and Distribution of a Controlled Substance-Marijuana, Possession of a Controlled Substance-Extract, and Distribution of a Controlled Substance-Extract. The OSP Domestic Highway Enforcement (DHE) team routinely conducts illegal narcotic trafficking saturations throughout the state of Oregon. Their mission is to identify and disrupt all criminal conduct on Oregon highways and identify elements of drug trafficking organizations for further investigation and dismantling in cooperation with numerous law enforcement agencies not only in Oregon but several other locations within the United States.

Guilty of Trafficking Marijuana from Oregon to Texas

PORTLAND, Ore.—On Wednesday, October 2, 2019, Jody Tremayne Wafer, 30, of Houston, Texas, pleaded guilty for organizing and leading a conspiracy to traffic marijuana grown in Portland to Texas. According to court documents, drug proceeds, in the form of bulk U.S. currency, were returned to Oregon via U.S. mail and passenger luggage on commercial airlines. As part of this investigation, federal authorities have seized approximately 11,000 marijuana plants, 546 pounds of processed marijuana, more than \$2.8 million in cash, 51 firearms, 26 vehicles, trailers, pieces of heavy equipment, a yacht, and three houses used as marijuana grow sites, all since August 2017. Wafer pleaded guilty to one count each of conspiring to manufacture, possess with intent to distribute, and distribute marijuana, maintaining drug-involved premises and using and carrying a firearm during and in relation to a drug trafficking crime. Conspiring to manufacture, possess with intent to distribute, and distribute mari-

juana and maintaining drug involved premises carries a maximum sentence of 40 years in prison, a \$5 million fine and a lifetime of supervised release. Using or carrying a firearm in relation to a drug trafficking crime carries a maximum sentence of life in prison with a mandatory minimum of seven years, a \$250,000 fine and five years' supervised release. Wafer will be sentenced on January 8, 2010 before U.S. District Court Judge Robert E. Jones. As part of his plea agreement, Wafer has agreed to forfeit any criminally-derived proceeds and property used to facilitate his crimes identified by the government prior to sentencing. Co-defendants Trent Lamar Knight, 31, and Brittany Lesanta Kizzee, 29, also of Houston; Paul Eugene Thomas, 39, and Raleigh Dragon Lau, 33, both of Portland; and Cole William Griffiths, 31, of Hood River, Oregon have all pleaded guilty on related charges. Knight and Kizzee with be sentenced on October 22, 2019 and January 7, 2020, respectively; Lau and Thomas will be sentenced on December 10 and 18, 2019, respectively; and Griffiths will be sentenced on November 20, 2019. This case was investigated by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration, IRS Criminal Investigation, Homeland Security Investigations and the FBI. It is being prosecuted by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Oregon. This case was brought as part of the Justice Department's Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force (OCDEF) program, the centerpiece of the department's strategy for reducing the availability of drugs in the U.S. OCDEF was

established in 1982 to mount a comprehensive attack on drug trafficking by disrupting and dismantling major drug trafficking and money laundering organizations. Today, OCDEF combines the resources and expertise of its member federal agencies in coordination with state and local law enforcement.

Fatal Hwy. 126W near Walton

Oregon State Police (OSP) is continuing the investigation into Saturday morning's single vehicle fatal crash on Highway 126W near Walton. On Saturday October 26, 2019 at about 10:12 AM, OSP troopers and emergency personnel responded to a single vehicle fatal crash on Highway 126W near milepost 35. Preliminary investigation revealed that a Chevrolet pickup, operated by Olivia Jean Minniear, age 26, from Elmira, left the roadway for unknown reasons impacting multiple trees before rolling over and coming to rest on its top in a small creek. Minniear was pronounced deceased at the scene by EMS personnel.

Officer Involved Shooting

On Thursday October 17, 2019 at about 7:39pm, Oregon State Police and the Lane County Sheriff's Office responded to an emergency request for assistance from an officer with the Oakridge Police Department who responded to a domestic disturbance. The Oakridge officer reported shots were fired and was requesting emergency assistance. Troopers and Deputies arrived on scene and preliminary investigation revealed the suspect in the domestic disturbance was deceased after being shot by the officer. The officer was not injured. The Lane County Inter-Agency Deadly Force Investigation Team (IDFIT) was activated and detectives with the Oregon State Police, Lane County Sheriff's Office, Eugene Police Department, Springfield Police Department, Cottage Grove Police Department, and the Florence Police Department responded to conduct the investigation. Additional assistance was provided at the scene by Oakridge Fire, Lane County Medical Examiner's Office, and the Lane County District Attorney's Office. **Update:** The deceased male suspect involved in the officer involved shooting is identified as follows: Marcus Phillip HARTSFIELD, age 27, from Oakridge. The location of the incident was in the 76000 block of Rainbow Road, Oakridge.

Wilderville Assault

The Oregon State Police is attempting to identify and locate the pictured individual as a possible suspect to a shooting and stabbing that occurred on Monday September 30, 2019, on Wilderville Lane. According to the victims the individual is approximately 18 years old, goes by the name "KYLE" and has a

possible last name of "HARDING" or "HANDING". KYLE is described as approximately 5'9", short hair, medium build and baby faced. He has a strong Chicago accent, slumps at his shoulders and isn't very talkative. The firearm was left on scene but the knife used in the attack was not located. It is described as an automatic switchblade with a camouflage handle. He should be considered armed and dangerous. KYLE was not known to drive and is not associated with any vehicles. Wilderville Assault Update

Oregon State Police is continuing their investigation into an assault that occurred at approximately 8:40 P.M. on Monday, September 30, 2019. Two people were assaulted, one male was flown to OHSU with serious injuries and a female was transported by ground to an area hospital with serious injuries. There is currently no suspect in custody, however OSP does not feel there is an ongoing threat to the general public as the suspect was known to the victims.

Each of these platforms represent a growing and pervasive influence in the lives of our children. Much of the time, these devices serve an important purpose. Sometimes, though, they become a virtual gateway for real-life consequences. With the start of the school year, the FBI is launching its #StopSextortion education campaign to help families and schools understand more about the growing problem of sextortion and how to protect young students from these predators. cases involving sextortion, particularly of young kids... sometimes as young as seven or eight years old. The extortionist finds children and teens on social media, through gaming apps, or through other online platforms. He will either find victims who respond to attention from an adult, or he will pretend to be another child. Either way he will groom the vic-

tim, using flattery or gifts. Those gifts could be real or something as simple as virtual tokens or extra progress in a game. Eventually, he convinces the child to send a naked photo—and one is all it takes. If the child tries to pull away, the extortionist will threaten the victim with exposure, telling the child that he will send the photo to friends and family or post online. Over time, the extortionist continues to threaten while escalating demands, which can include the production of more explicit photos. He may even command that the child perform sex acts alone or with siblings and friends. For too many parents, the thought is that it can't happen to my child, and it can't happen here. Unfortunately, it can on both counts. What can parents do to protect their children? Often children and teens are so concerned that they will get in trouble or lose their devices, that they are reluctant to come forward. It's up to you—the parent—to develop that open, honest line of communication. Start with some short conversations, and ask: When you are online, has anyone you don't know ever tried to contact you? What would you do if they did? Why do you think someone would want to talk to a kid online? Why do you think adults sometimes pretend to be kids online? Has anyone you know ever sent a picture of themselves that got passed around school? What do you think can happen if you send a photo to anyone—even a friend? What if that picture were embarrassing? Finally, consider using what you've just learned to start the conversation. "Hey, I heard this story on the news today about kids getting pressured to send pictures and videos of themselves to people online. Have you heard anything like that before?" What to do if sextortion has already taken place: If your child discloses that he or she is the victim of sextortion, report it to the FBI by calling 1-800-CALL-FBI or online at <https://tips.fbi.gov>. If you are a victim and not ready to talk to the FBI yet, go to a trusted adult. Tell that adult that you are being victimized online and need help. Remember - you are not the one in trouble. Criminals will try to make you feel unsure, scared or embarrassed. Your willingness to talk to a trusted adult, though, may just be the key to keeping this predator from hurting someone else.

Oregon State Police (OSP) is continuing the investigation into this morning's hit and run vehicle versus pedestrian crash on Highway 46 (Caves Highway) near the intersection of Laurel Road in rural Josephine County. On October 30, 2019 at about 1:49 a.m., OSP troopers and emergency personnel responded to the report of a vehicle crash on Highway 46 (Caves Highway) near the intersection of Laurel Road. Preliminary investigation revealed that a black 1999 Mercedes

C28 was traveling eastbound on Highway 46 (Caves Highway) when it struck a pedestrian in the roadway. The driver of the vehicle fled the scene prior to the arrival of first responders. The unidentified pedestrian was transported by air ambulance to Rogue Regional Medical Center with serious injuries.

Poaching Case Arrest

On October 16, 2019, an OSP Trooper responded to a complaint of suspicious hunter activity within the city limits of Ashland. A local resident reported observing a male loading a deer into a pickup while parked on a city street. The reporting party approached the male to inquire about the deer but the male then drove off. A license plate and make of pickup was obtained. The Trooper arrived on scene and contacted multiple neighboring residents. The Trooper found a short blood trail leading from a bush, which was against a neighboring house, that lead to a row of hedges along the city street. This evidence along with the reporting party's observations, showed that the suspected deer may have been shot while bedded down next to a house and loaded into the pickup while parked on the street. With the help of another Trooper, the suspect was located and interviewed. Faced with the evidence and resident observations, the male hunter admitted to shooting the buck deer as it laid in its bed under a large bush against a house. The male stated he shot from inside his vehicle while knowingly parked on a city street in Ashland. The male had dumped the buck deer and rifle on the Tiller/Trail Highway after the incident, which the Trooper recovered. The deer was found to be a trophy class 4x4 buck. Further investigation found where the bullet exited the buck deer and penetrated the house above the front door. The suspect was charged with Hunting Prohibited: Within City Limits, Unlawful Take/Possession of Buck Deer, Unlawful Use of Weapon, and Criminal Trespass II. He was warned for Hunting on Public Roadway and Fail to Validate Tag. A second male passenger will also be charged with Aiding in Wildlife Offense and Criminal Trespass II. The buck deer and rifle were seized as evidence. The meat was salvaged and donated to a local charity.

Update: Use of Force Investigation

Oregon State Police and Linn County Major Crimes Team (MCT) investigators are continuing an investigation into the death of an Albany man this morning and are asking anyone who may have witnessed the incident or who may have been with the man during in the preceding 24-48 hours to please contact them. The deceased man, identified as James F. Plymell III, 45, of Albany, was contacted by Albany Police Department

personnel near Santiam Road and Denver Street in Albany. During the course of the interaction, officers attempted to take Plymell into custody and a physical altercation ensued. At some point in the altercation, Plymell lost consciousness and officers transitioned to performing Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) with the aid of an Automated External Defibrillator(AED) until medical personnel arrived on-scene and pronounced Plymell deceased. The officers involved in this incident are identified as Officer Emily Schroff, Officer Gina Bell, Officer Thomas Roten and Community Service Officer Gerry Morris, all of the Albany Police Department. Pursuant to standard protocols relating to these incidents, all have been placed on paid administrative leave as indicated in the Linn County Use of Deadly Physical Force Plan. Information relating to the cause or manner of death in this matter is being coordinated through the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office. This investigation is ongoing and investigators are asking anyone who may have been in contact with Plymell during the preceding day(s) or anyone who may have witnessed or obtained video footage of the incident to contact Oregon State Police Detective Casi Hegney at 503-375-3555.

I-5 Fatal near Woodburn

Oregon State Police (OSP) is continuing the investigation into this morning's multi-vehicle fatal crash on I-5 near Woodburn. On Saturday, October 26, 2019 at about 4:09 am, OSP troopers and emergency personnel responded to the report of a four vehicle crash on I-5 at milepost 269. Preliminary investigation revealed that a black 2019 Mazda sedan, operated by Valeria Villaseñor-Sibrian, age 23, from Salem, was traveling southbound on I-5 when it rear-ended a silver 2013 Toyota Scion, operated by Artemio Jaen Davila, age 24, from Beaverton. Davila's vehicle left the roadway, went underneath the cable barrier in the median, and was struck by a northbound gray 2013 Hyundai Santa Fe, operated by Vanessa Underwood, age 55, from Salem. Davila suffered fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased at the scene. A passenger in Davila's vehicle left the location on foot and was not located. A fourth vehicle, a white 2017 Dodge Ram pickup, operated by Theresa Peters, age 52, from Salem, was traveling northbound and struck the Hyundai Santa Fe. Five passengers were transported to the Salem Hospital, three with serious injuries. I-5 northbound and one lane of I-5 southbound were closed for approximately six hours. OSP was assisted by the Marion County Sheriff's Office, Marion County Fire, Woodburn PD, Keizer PD and ODOT.

Heroin & Meth Trafficking Bust in So. Central Oregon

MEDFORD, Ore.—Five people have been charged for their roles in a conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine and heroin manufactured in Mexico in and around Klamath Falls, Oregon, announced Billy J. Williams, U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon. Rogelio Gomez-Arias, 23, Irving Beas Ceballos, 34, Alexis Chavez-Franco, 22, and Domingo Matias-Hernandez, 36, are each charged by indictment with conspiring

to distribute and possess with intent to distribute methamphetamine between May and October 2018. Additionally, Ceballos is charged with possessing methamphetamine and heroin with the intent to distribute and Gomez-Arias, Chavez-Franco and Matias-Hernandez are charged with distributing methamphetamine. Juan Rodriguez-Ramirez, 62, is charged by criminal complaint with conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute methamphetamine. All defendants are known to reside in and around Klamath Falls and Dorris, California. On October 9, 2019, a coordinated, multi-agency law enforcement opera-

tion was conducted to dismantle the drug trafficking organization. Five federal search warrants were executed in Klamath Falls and Dorris. Investigators seized more than 37 pounds of metham-

phetamine, 440 grams of heroin, 14 firearms, and nearly \$50,000 in cash and arrested all five defendants. All five defendants made their first appearances in federal court today before U.S. Mag-

istrate Judge Mark D. Clarke and were detained pending further proceedings. Conspiring to distribute and possessing with intent to distribute methamphetamine carries a maximum sentence of life in prison with a 10-year mandatory minimum. This case was investigated by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), the Basin Interagency Narcotics Enforcement Team (BINET) and the Siskiyou Unified Major Investigation Team (SUMIT). It is being prosecuted the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Oregon. An indictment and criminal complaint are only accusations of a crime, and defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty. This case was brought as part of the Justice Department's Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force (OCDETF) program, the centerpiece of the department's strategy for reducing the availability of drugs in the U.S. OCDETF was established in 1982 to mount a comprehensive attack on drug trafficking by disrupting and dismantling major drug trafficking and money laundering organizations. Today, OCDETF combines the resources and expertise of its member federal agencies in coordination with state and local law enforcement.
