Spirit of Oregon adorns North Bend helicopters

Southern Oregon has been home to tribal nations of Native Americans long before America became known as "the land of the free and the home of the brave." In honor of Native American Heritage Awareness this past November, the command of Coast Guard Sector North Bend adorned the MH-65 Dolphin rescue helicopters with original artwork modeled after cultural references from the confederation of local tribal nations. To symbolize the close partnership and respect between the groups, the Thunderbird was designed jointly between the Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua, and Siuslaw Indians and the 13th Coast Guard District. In traditional tribal stories, the Thunderbird was father of the ocean, father of the food, giver of the tides and bringer of the storms. His favorite people were the Salmon People. If the Salmon People, or any other water peoples, were shown disrespect, then fishing could suffer, great storms could form, or tsunamis could strike. The "salmon with waves" in the wing of the design, references a traditional tribal story that warns against such disrespect. The "way up above road" on the tail of the design, represents the trail to the creator, and the "scallops" (triangles) featured throughout are commonly

found on traditional tribal basketry. "I think the public should remember that these symbols have existed in this area for thousands of years," said Jesse Beers, the cultural stewardship manager for the Confederated Tribes. "And that they speak to the need for stewardship and respect for our foods, lands and waters." "As a sovereign nation with a strong canoe culture, the Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua, and Siuslaw Indians respect the Coast Guard for their abilities on the water, and we are grateful for them being available, if ever we should get into a dangerous situation." It's traditional for a Coast Guard aircraft to carry a symbol that is unique to its region, but the air craft at this air station have been without one for more than a decade. "Some stations just place the unit patch on the side," said Cmdr. Winston Wood, the executive officer at Sector North Bend. "There are several air stations with separate and distinct tail art. To name a few, Traverse City has the cherry wings, Detroit has the old English "D," New Orleans has the fleur-de-lis, Savannah has the clover leaf, and Houston has the longhorn. I wanted something that spoke to the region in which we operate." Prior to 2007, North Bend's tail-art was "The Guardians of the Mist." As the newer MH-65C helicopters started replacing the older HH-65B helicopters, North Bend had been rotating helicopters with other units every three to six months. With that kind of turnaround time, the engineers stopped

adding tail art to the aircraft. Later, the Coast Guard permanently assigned five MH-65D Dolphin helicopters to Sector North Bend. "It has been too long since North Bend aircraft had a symbol of unit pride," said Wood. "We seized the opportunity of a blank slate, and I think it faithfully represents the heritage of the community where we live and work." These markings also help to designate an aircraft during situations of mass mobilization, where seamless operational cohesion is integral to mission success. The Coast Guard has implemented a doctrine of training standardization that allows for air crews to be assembled from all different units during a state of emergency. For example, when the Coast Guard responds to a major hurricane, aircraft from air stations all over the United States will be flown in. Regardless of where a service member is permanently stationed, they can expect to jump into any similar aircraft and perform the same duties and responsibilities they would at home, often relieving someone exhausted from search and rescue missions. "We all travel and train together," said Wood. "So it's nice to be able to look up and see that the spirit and culture of Oregon is being carried with us." "We hope that by including our traditional stories and honoring of the Thunderbird and the Ocean, through this tail-art, we are helping to bless the helicopters and crew members of the Coast Guard and to keep them safe, as they help keep us all safe, on our waters," said Beers.

The ice house provides ice to the commercial fishing fleet. **CBFD Hazmat Team update:** 12/20/19 as of 11:30 HRS: Coos Bay Fire/ Regional Hazmat advised that all precautions, such as shelter in place and evacuations, regarding the Hazmat response in Charleston have been lifted. There is still an active fire, but there are no longer any ammonia readings per units on scene. White smoke will still be visible, but only due to the fire. The toxic plume has either dissipated or is high enough up that there should be no further impact on citizens.

commercial fishing vessel Thursday, Dec. 26, that sank in Coos Bay. The 40-foot Darean Rose capsized and sank shortly after leaving the fuel pier at the Charleston Marina with four people aboard who reported sustaining minor injuries. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector North Bend were notified at 2:54 p.m. that the vessel had run aground and capsized right after departing the pier. A Coast Guard Station Coos Bay 29-foot Response Boat-Small crew responded to the scene and rescued the four individuals from the vessel in ten minutes. The survivors were transferred back to the pier and treated by emergency medical service technicians for minor scrapes and bruises. The vessel has an estimated maximum potential of 1,200 gallons of diesel fuel on board. Coast Guard personnel from the Sector Columbia River Emergency Management Division have responded to the potential for environmental pollution by deploying hard boom and absorbent pads. The vessel's owner is working through insurance to contract commercial salvage for the cleanup process. The cause of the incident is under investigation.

Stabbing in NB

A 25-year old female has been arrested on a charge of Second Degree Murder

after law enforcement officers responded to a 911 call about a stabbing at a residence Monday night, Dec. 30, 7:40 p.m., on the 2500 block of Ash Street in North Bend. According to a news release from Coos Co. District Attorney R. Paul Fraser, "Upon arrival police and paramedics found inside the residence a 58 year old woman who was the victim of multiple stab wounds." She was pronounced deceased. Alexis Marie Berquist was taken into custody without incident. She was transported and lodged in the Coos Co. Jail at Coquille.

Homicide Victim Identified

Coos Co. District Attorney R. Paul Fraser has released the name of the woman killed in a stabbing attack Monday night, Dec. 30th in North Bend. According to the DA, 58-year old Ramona Matthews died of multiple stab wounds at her home on the 2500 block of Ash St. The assailant was identified as her daughter 25-year old Alexis Marie Berquist. Berquist has been charged with Murder in the Second Degree and is in the Coos Co. Jail at Coquille. She appeared before a judge on Thursday, Jan. 2, 2020, at the Courthouse in Coquille.

Heroin Bust in CB

On 12-30-2019 SCINT Detectives received a tip from a concerned citizen regarding Braxton Bush selling heroin from the South Sider Motel. At approximately 11:45 am SCINT Detectives, assisted by Coos County Community

Corrections and the Coos Bay Police Department, contacted Braxton Bush at the South Sider Motel room #5. During the investigation, SCINT Detectives applied for and received a search warrant for narcotics inside the motel room rented by Braxton Bush. Detectives seized methamphetamine, heroin, marijuana, a vial of suspected steroids, and a commercial quantity of Psilocybin Mushrooms. Additional items to include packaging material and \$1,200.00 in US Currency were also seized. Braxton Bush was arrested and taken to the Coos County Jail for Probation Violation. Bush will be referred to the District Attorney's Office for the above listed charges.

Coos Bay Male in Fatal Curry Co. Accident

On Monday, December 30, 2019 at approximately 9:10 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to the report of a single vehicle crash on Hwy 255 near milepost 361. Preliminary investigation reveals that a Ford F350, operated by Chester Mayer (50) of Coos Bay, was northbound on Hwy 255 when he failed to negotiate a curve, crossed the southbound lane, and left the roadway. Mayer sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Mayer was last seen

leaving a residence in Brookings on the evening of December 28, 2019 and was reported as a missing person to Brookings Police Department on December 29, 2019.

Police Dispatch obtained a description and the female, later identified as 37 year old Melissa Lucas, was located on Center Road near Highway 101 in Bunker Hill. The investigation revealed Lucas had been found stealing a cooler from a yard. When confronted, Lucas dropped the cooler and obtained a small aluminum baseball bat. It was reported Lucas was standing in the road and swinging the bat while yelling at the owner of the cooler telling him to "come on!". Based upon the investigation, Lucas was arrested for Disorderly Conduct II and Theft III. Lucas was transported to the Coos County Jail where she was booked and released to the jail staff.

Coos Co. Pedestrian Fatal

On Saturday, December 29, 2019 at approximately 12:05 A.M. Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near mile post 241. Preliminary investigation revealed that a Ford Focus, operated by John Shorb (27) of Myrtle Point, was northbound on Hwy 101 when he struck a pedestrian, Daniel

Fowers (74) of Coos Bay, which was crossing Hwy 101. Fowers sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased.

Illegal Harvesting of Forest Products

Lampa Ln., CCSO report - On December 20, 2019 at approximately 12:30 pm, a Coos County Timber Deputy received multiple phone calls and text messages from Moore Mill Timber and Roseburg Resources regarding a subject who was seen by a neighbor unlawfully taking cedar from Roseburg Resources property on Lampa Lane near Lampa Creek Road. Two Deputies responded to the area but the suspect had left prior to their arrival. The Sheriff's Office received information that the suspect was on Highway 42 S near Sturdivant Park with a disabled vehicle. Coquille Police responded to the disabled vehicle and contacted the suspect. Upon the arrival of Deputies, the investigation revealed that 36 year old Wayne J. Resendez had unlawfully taken approximately 1/3 cord of Cedar Bolts from Roseburg Property. The Cedar was seized and Resendez was

cited for Unlawful Harvest/Transport of a Forest Product. Later in the investigation, it was determined the Cedar had a retail value of \$133.33. Resendez will be referred to the District Attorney's Office for Theft II in addition to the Unlawful Harvest/Transport charge. Coquille Po-

lice cited Resendez for Driving while suspended and Resendez' vehicle was towed from the scene.

House Fire in Eastside

CBFD release - At roughly 9:15 p.m. Sunday evening the Coos Bay Fire Department received a report of a house fire at 409 9th Avenue in the Eastside District. Firefighters were able to contain the fire to the attic space, and the fire was extinguished by 10 pm. An investigation found a faulty light fixture to be the cause of the fire. The homeowner was able to turn off the power before the Fire Department arrived. There was moderate fire damage to the roof structure and some smoke and water damage to the living area of the home. The Fire Department was again called to the home around 4:20 a.m. this morning. An ember from the initial fire had likely been smoldering in a piece of the cedar siding. The secondary fire was contained to an area of the siding near the gable of the roof. While this type of secondary fire is extremely rare, it is an example of the sometimes-unpredictable nature of fire behavior. During this season of the year, it is common to have

Attempted Robbery

Lakeside, CCSO release - On December 14, 2019, at approximately 3:08 P.M., Coos County Deputies were made aware of a robbery that had just occurred at 200 S 8th Street in Lakeside (McKay's Market). The victim (name withheld) was threatened with a knife when he confronted a customer for shoplifting.

The victim was in fear of his life when the unknown suspect told him he was going to "stick him" with the knife as the suspect cocked his hand back and raised the knife. Seeing the weapon, the victim separated himself from the suspect and called 911. The Coos County Sheriff's Office is asking for assistance in identifying the individual whose photo is attached. Any assistance would be greatly appreciated. If you know the identity of the suspect, please contact the Coos County Sheriff's Office at 541-396-2106, and reference case # S1932795. The investigation is being led by Deputy Jon Vinyard. Update: Narrative: Within five hours of asking for the public's assistance, the Coos County Sheriff's Office received more than a dozen anonymous phone calls, who all identified the same individual responsible for the Robbery in Lakeside over the weekend. Deputies were informed that 27 year old Seanpatrick G. Maloney was taken to a residence on Broadway Ave. in North Bend. North Bend Police detectives located Maloney exiting the residence, and noted he matched the description and clothing description given. Maloney was contacted and detained approximately two blocks away by Officers of the Confederated Tribes, where he was briefly questioned. Incident to arrest, Maloney was found with a weapon that matched the description of the weapon used in the Robbery. Deputies transported Maloney to the Coos County Jail without further incidence. Maloney will

be charged with Robbery I, Unlawful Use of a Weapon, Menacing, Theft III and Possession of a Controlled Substance. The Coos County Sheriff's Office would like to thank all the citizens that were instrumental in the capture of a potentially dangerous suspect, as well as the Officers of the North Bend Police Department and the Confederated Tribes.

Warrant Service

Lakeside, CCSO release - On 12-16-19 at about 9:47 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office received a report of a suspicious vehicle parked at 71588 Kokes Rd in Lakeside. At about 10:14

PM, Deputies located the vehicle and contacted 27 year old Seth Schuler of North Bend. Deputies were notified by Dispatch that Seth had an active warrant out of Douglas County for Failure to Appear. At about 10:22 PM, Seth was taken into custody without incident. Seth was transported to Coos County Jail where he was booked and lodged on the Douglas County warrant.

Emergency Equipment

Just in time for winter weather, a second round of equipment being distributed to communities throughout Oregon has arrived, thanks to the State Preparedness and Incident Response Equipment (SPIRE) Grant Program. The SPIRE grant is a result of HB 2867, which became effective in August 2017, establishing a grant program to distribute emergency preparedness equipment to local governments, and other recipients, to be used to decrease risk of life and property resulting from an emergency. This equipment may include vehicles or other property. One of the awardees, the City of Stayton, Ore. received a 56kW mobile-power generator that can be used for emergency power at the Emergency Operations Center in Stayton. The generator may also be redistributed other locations during emergencies, said to Stayton Public Works Supervisor Thomas Etzel.

"This is an important piece of equipment for our community. Trying to purchase this out of our own funds would take away from something else, so it was beneficial to get this with the grant," Etzel said. Awardees for this round include: City of McMinnville, Portable Power Generator 30kW Dora-Sitkum Rural Fire Protection District, Portable Power Generator 30kW; City of Reed-sport, Portable Power Generator 56kW; City of Stayton/Stayton Police, Portable Power Generator 56kW; City of Gaston, Portable Power Generator 56kW; City of Winston Public Works, Portable Power Generator 56kW; Rainbow Water District, Portable Power Generator 108kW; Eddyville Charter School, Portable Power Generator 108kW; City of Clatskanie, Portable Power Generator, 108kW; Yachats Rural Fire Protection District, Power Generator, 108kW. In all, 80 grant jurisdictions around the state will receive SPIRE-funded equipment. Eligible equipment covers the four priorities of saving/sustaining lives, obtaining/maintaining situational awareness, incident stabilization, and initiating recovery. SPIRE Grant Coordinator Jim Jungling said he believes the program makes sense for Oregon bringing practical equipment to communities that can save lives and property during emergencies. A total of \$5 million has been allotted to procure emergency preparedness equipment to help Oregon communities prepare, respond and recover from emergencies.

Deputies were dispatched to an address on State Highway 42 for a domestic disturbance. The Caller had stated her husband Robert had grabbed her, hit her and threw her against a work bench. Upon the Deputies arrival, the Deputies found the Caller locked in a car in the garage and the suspect, 56 year old Robert Frank Schaffer, in the home with their children. Upon concluding the investigation, it was determined a verbal argument had occurred which ended in Robert chasing the Caller outside, grabbing her arm, throwing her against a work bench and punching the Caller in the back. The Caller stated she was uninjured but did want to pursue charges for the Harassment. Robert was placed under arrest for Harassment and transported to the Coos County Jail.

Robbery North Bend

Early this morning, Wednesday, December 11, 2019 at 4:47 AM, a 50-year-old man arrived early for a work-crew pickup at the North Bend Annex and fell asleep in the alcove at the front doors. Two North Bend men, 21-year-old Michael McKinney and 34-year-old Richard Nolan, approached the man, struck him in the head with an unknown object, and tried to take his bicycle. They fled the scene without the bike. The victim dialed 911 for help. Night-shift officers, Sergeant Ryan Doyle and Officer Patrick Kinney, both seasoned officers and investigators, quickly arrived on scene to take the report. The victim refused medical attention. An expedient neighbor-

hood canvas identified a nearby home where the suspects fled. Physical evidence and positive identification by the victim led to the arrest of the two men, who later admitted their involvement to officers. The two men were taken to the Coos County Jail on charges of robbery in the second degree, a Measure 11 felony.

McGuffin Conviction Overturned

A judge has overturned the Manslaughter conviction of Nicholas McGuffin, Green Acres, involving the 2000 death of Leah Freeman, Coquille. McGuffin has already served nine of his ten year sentence. The judge ruled that the Oregon State Police Crime Lab failed to disclose a trace amount of DNA from an unknown male found on one of Freeman's shoes. The State of Oregon can appeal the ruling; however, Coos County District Attorney R. Paul Frasier says a retrial may be too expensive for taxpayers. The Forensic Justice Project led the appeal on McGuffin's behalf.

No New Trial for McGuffin

He's already served nine-years of a ten-year sentence. Coos County District Attorney R. Paul Frasier has announced that he will not pursue a new trial for Nick McGuffin who was earlier convicted

on Manslaughter involving the death of his former girlfriend Leah Freeman of Coquille. That conviction was overturned and the judge ordered a new trial. Frasier says he made his decision to not retry after consulting with members of the original investigating team and the family of the victim. Once the order to dismiss is signed, McGuffin, who lived in Green Acres, will be released from custody.

Powers Police Chief Fired

By a vote of 4-2, the Powers City Council fired their only law enforcement officer Tuesday night, Dec. 3. Robert Baker had been on the job since 2018. Powers Mayor Robert Kohn said issues and directives were given to Baker during a prior disciplinary session; however, they were reportedly not met. The Coos County Sheriff's Office and Oregon State Police will provide some law enforcement coverage for the small timber town.

Heroin Arrest North Bend

SCINT release - Crime(s): Unlawful Delivery/Possession of Heroin - Persons Involved: Mangine, Jedidiah Caine (29 YOA North Bend Resident). Narrative: On December 3rd of 2019, members of SCINT served a search warrant at 2193

Ohio Street, North Bend, Coos County, Oregon. For several weeks, SCINT Detectives had been investigating Jedidiah Caine Mangine for the distribution of Heroin. Through the investigation SCINT learned Jedidiah was selling Heroin from his home and vehicle. During the search warrant, Jedidiah was located at the residence and detained. A search of the residence and vehicle turned up a substantial quantity of Heroin (representing more than 120 individual doses), \$8,000.00 in US Currency, scales and packaging material.

Warrant Service

Charleston, CCSO release - On December 3, 2019 at 9:09 AM, the Sheriff's Office responded to the Seaport RV Park on Boat Basin Drive in Charleston, to follow up on a theft investigation. Deputies contacted 40 year old Jack P. White of Coos Bay. Mr. White was arrested on a failure to appear warrant and a probation violation at Space number #16 at the Seaport RV Park. While at the location, an additional subject fled the location. This subject was later apprehended and identified as 47 year old Scott M. Todd. Mr. Todd had valid misdemeanor and felony warrants out of Douglas County for his arrest. While at the location, suspected stolen property from a burglary which occurred on Boat Basin Drive on November 26, 2019 was located and seized. During the November

theft, over \$5,000.00 in contracting tools were taken from two contractors working at Bandon Pacific, a Seafood processing plant on Boat Basin Drive. Information lead to the execution of a search warrant on December 4, 2019 at 1:53 PM, at a travel trailer belonging to Jack P. White on Tarheel Lane. Located pursuant to the warrant were items from three separate burglaries to include items from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Office on Boat Basin Drive. Deputies also seized drug paraphernalia used to ingest methamphetamine. The Sheriff's Office was assisted by the Coos County Parole and Probation Department and the Coquille Tribal Police Department. Harbin was lodged at the Lincoln County Jail for, Delivery / Possession / Manufacturing of Methamphetamine, Delivery / Possession / Manufacturing of Heroin, Possession of a Schedule II Controlled Substance, Possession of a Schedule III Controlled Substance, Possession of a Schedule IV Controlled Substance, Theft I – By Receiving, and Felon in Possession of a Firearm. His bail was set at \$500,000.00. Chadwick was lodged at the Lincoln County Jail for, Delivery / Possession / Manufacturing of Methamphetamine, Delivery / Possession / Manufacturing of Heroin, Possession of a Schedule II Controlled Substance, Possession of a Schedule III Controlled Substance, Possession of a Schedule IV Controlled Substance, and Theft I – By Receiving. Her bail was set at \$500,000.00. Brown was lodged at the Lincoln County Jail for Theft I and Frequenting a Place Where Controlled Substances Are Used. His bail was set at \$75,000. LCPD Receives Traffic Safety Grants

The Lincoln City Police Department, working in partnership with Oregon Impact, is pleased to announce they have recently been awarded three traffic safety grants for 2019-2020. The grant funds in the amount of \$6500.00 are for Enhanced DUII Enforcement, Distracted Driving Enforcement, and Pedestrian Safety Enforcement. The Enhanced DUII Enforcement funds, in the amount of \$2,500.00, will be utilized to put extra officers on patrol specifically to seek out drivers who are operating their vehicles while impaired and remove them from the roadways. The enforcement operations will occur in conjunction with the National High Visibility Enforcement event time periods, which are designed

to increase the number of patrol officers on the streets nationwide with an emphasis on seeking out drivers impaired by alcohol or drugs. DUII's continue to be a leading cause of motor vehicle crash deaths and injuries throughout the nation. DUII grant funds were last used in August 2019 during the Labor Day weekend time period. During those enhanced DUII enforcement operations two DUII arrests were made. The Distracted Driving Enforcement funds, in the amount of \$2,000.00, will be utilized to put extra officers out on patrol specifically looking for drivers who are using their cell phones or other electronic devices while operating their vehicles. The goals of these operations are to raise awareness to the dangers of distracted driving, and to reduce distracted driving by enforcement action and education. The effort is to change the behaviors of drivers and make distracted driving unacceptable. The end goal is to increase the safety of everyone on the roadways and reduce crashes caused by distracted driving. The Pedestrian Safety Enforcement funds, in the amount of \$2,000.00, will be utilized to conduct specific operations where a decoy pedestrian will cross the roadways in a designated crosswalk while an officer acting as an observer will watch for violators of the applicable pedestrian-related crosswalk laws. The observing officer will notify other officers in chase vehicles, who will then conduct a traffic stop on the violator of the crosswalk law and take the appropriate educational or enforcement action. The primary focus of the operations is to raise pedestrian safety awareness in motorists with an emphasis on enhancing the safety for pedestrians crossing our roadways. The members of the Lincoln City Police Department are committed to the safety of our citizens and visitors and these grants will assist us in taking proactive steps towards improving the traffic safety in our community. These grant funds were made possible through Oregon Impact and the Oregon Department of Transportation.

Robbery Menacing on Central Coast

On December 2, 2019 at about 10:53 AM Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputies

were dispatched to a reported armed robbery at the Rose Lodge Market in Otis, Oregon. The initial reports indicated that a male suspect had attempted to steal several packs of batteries from the store. When the clerk confronted the male regarding the batteries, the male menaced the clerk with what was described as a black handgun. The male suspect then fled the area eastbound on Highway 18 in a vehicle. A Sergeant from Grand Ronde Tribal Police spotted the vehicle traveling east on Highway 18 near Grand Ronde. Deputies from the Polk County Sheriff's Office and Yamhill County Sheriff's Office responded to assist, along with Troopers from the Oregon State Police. The vehicle was located parked in front of a residence in Grand Ronde a short time later and the male suspect was detained. Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputies responded to Grand Ronde to continue the investigation. The weapon was located and it was determined to be a black pellet gun that closely resembled a semi-automatic handgun. At the conclusion of the investigation, it was determined that the male had removed the batteries from his pocket prior to leaving the store and hid them in another part of the store. The male suspect was identified as 41 year old Jared R. May of Otis. May was taken into custody and lodged at the Lincoln County Jail for Unlawful Use of a Weapon and Menacing. His bail is set at \$65,000.

Roseburg Police K9 Nike and his handler were called to assist in tracking a wanted subject who fled from Douglas County Sheriff's Deputies. The male, 29 year old Trevor Hollenbeck of Dillard, had several warrants for his arrest, and had been wanted since 2018. During this incident K9 Nike tracked Hollenbeck for approximately 1 1/2 miles through blackberries, brush and in the South Umpqua river in the Dillard area. After crawling about 80 yards through blackberries and brush, K9 Nike found Hollenbeck concealed in the riverbank, covered in brush and a layer of dirt. Hollenbeck refused to come out, so K9 Nike made a biting capture and held Hollenbeck until Hollenbeck was placed in handcuffs. Hollenbeck was treated for minor injuries and lodged at Douglas County Corrections.

DIAMOND LAKE, Ore. - On Wednesday, December 25, 2019, at 8:11 PM, the Douglas County Sheriff's Office received information from Jackson County dispatch of an injury crash in the Diamond Lake area near the Jackson/Douglas county line. Burglary Suspects Sniffed Out

A witness observed a subject run from the property when he arrived at the home. Deputies began an investigation and determined a burglary had occurred. At the request of deputies, K9 Grim was dispatched to the scene to track the suspects. Once there, K9 Grim led deputies to an abandoned structure in

the 200-block of Prescott Avenue where he began to alert that the suspects were hiding nearby. Deputies announced the presence of the K9 and told the subjects to surrender. 35 year-old Christopher Robert Helm and 42 year-old Hondo Lee Kuntz, both of Yoncalla, complied and were taken into custody without incident. Both were transported to the Douglas County Jail and lodged on the following charges: Helm: Criminal Mischief I, Burglary I, Trespass II, Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine and Probation Violation. Kuntz: Burglary I, Trespass II, Criminal Mischief III. Sutherland Police Department assisted the Sheriff's Office in the investigation. K9 Grim, a 7 year-old German Shepherd, has been with the Douglas County Sheriff's Office since 2013. Grim was purchased by an anonymous donor in the community. The Sheriff's K9 program is supported financially by the Friends of Umpqua Valley Police K9 Programs, a nonprofit organization which holds fundraisers and receives donations from

the community. Bailey's Veterinary Clinic provides medical care for K9 Grim while Coastal Farm and Home Supply provides Grim's food. In August, the Sheriff's Office announced it would be adding a second K9 patrol division. Arrangements are currently underway to select the dog and equip the agency for the addition.

Fatal Fall at Umpqua Hot Springs

On September 8, 2019, at about 1:30 p.m., the 911 center received a call reporting a 20 year old female had fallen from a cliff in the 2000 block of Thorn Prairie Road, near Umpqua Hot Springs. This area is in the Umpqua National Forest near Toketee Ranger Station about 60 miles east of Roseburg. The female was reported to be injured and needing medical assistance. Additionally, it was reported that a male subject had also fallen from a cliff and appeared to be deceased. Sheriff's deputies, Search and Rescue Volunteers, US

Forest Service Personnel and Bay Cities Ambulance responded to the scene. 20 year old Azrael Maujean of Grants Pass was transported to Mercy Medical Center in Roseburg with serious injuries. Deputies and Search and Rescue volunteers recovered the body of 24 year old Christian Simmons, also of Grants Pass, who was deceased at the scene. Initial reports indicate that both subjects were in the Umpqua Hot Springs area the night of September 7th, 2019 and became lost. Both subjects fell approximately 70 feet from a rock cliff. Sexual Abuse Charge in Roseburg

In late November of 2019 the Roseburg Police Department received a report alleging a minor female was sexually assaulted by an adult male, 28 year old Danya Czernowski of Roseburg. The ensuing investigation revealed this incident occurred while the minor was visiting Czernowski's residence in Roseburg. On December 17th, 2019 Czernowski was arrested by Roseburg Police Detectives and lodged at Douglas County Corrections. Czernowski was charged with Sexual Abuse in the Second Degree.

Burglars Attempt to Elude Roseburg PD

Around 0100 hours on the morning of December 12th, 2019 the Roseburg Police Department investigated a reported burglary at the 420 Club, 2576 NE Stephens in Roseburg. During that investigation they learned several suspects gained entry into the business by damaging a window, gaining entry, and stealing merchandise from inside. Officers were able to identify a description of a vehicle of interest in that incident, and they provided that information to local law enforcement agencies. Just before 0500 hours an off duty Douglas County Sheriff's Office Deputy found the vehicle traveling on NE Stephens, and reported the information to on-duty Officers. Officers located the vehicle traveling north in the 2600 block of NE Stephens. The vehicle, a red Volkswagen beetle, then suddenly accelerated away from Officers, continuing northbound on Stephens. Speeds reached between 65-80 MPH, and Officers backed off because they were approaching a construction area north of Costco on Stephens. The suspect vehicle pulled further away at that time, but quickly tried turning east on Taft, losing control and striking a utility pole. Several occupants fled from the vehicle. One suspect, a 16 year old male, was tackled by law enforcement as he was trying to flee the scene on foot. The other people who fled were not located. K9 Nike from Roseburg PD attempted to track the other suspects, but they were not located. The 16 year old male was found in possession of merchandise stolen from the 420 Club, and he was later lodged at the Juvenile Detention Center for Burglary, Theft and Criminal Mischief charg-

es. The vehicle sustained heavy damage during impact with the utility pole, and it was towed from the scene by Roseburg Towing. There is no evidence at this time that anyone was injured during the collision. The construction zone was also not active at the time of the incident. The investigation into the driver of the vehicle and other suspects involved in the burglary is still ongoing.

Child Sexual Abuse Charges Camas Valley

CAMAS VALLEY, Ore. - A Camas Valley man is in jail following a child sexual abuse investigation by detectives. In late November, the Sheriff's Office Investigations Division was contacted regarding possible sexual crimes against a child. Detectives conducted a thorough investigation and learned 37 year-old Jeffrey Aaron Herberger of Camas Valley had sexually assaulted a minor child known to him. On Wednesday, December 11, 2019, Herberger was interviewed by detectives and subsequently arrested. He was transported to the Douglas County Jail where he was lodged on charges of 3rd Degree Sexual Abuse and Harassment.

Missing Douglas Co. Male

ROSEBURG, Ore. - Deputies are still

seeking information as to the whereabouts of Samuel "Sammy" Elijah Davison. Davison was reported as missing person in September and hasn't been heard or seen since. 36 year-old Davison was last known to be in the Winchester area north of Roseburg on September 19th. It is believed he was possibly traveling to Wolf Creek area in Josephine County where he is known to frequent. The Sheriff's Office previously asked for assistance from the public, but his whereabouts remain unknown. Davison is described as 5'10" tall weighing 190lbs with brown hair and hazel eyes. patchers the female was hysterical and could not provide an accurate description of where she was located. During the investigation, deputies sent a reverse 9-1-1 to residents in the area asking them to call if they heard or witnessed any type of a disturbance. No additional information was received. Ultimately, law enforcement was unable to locate any victim. "If this incident was fabricated, those involved can be held criminally liable," said Sgt. Brad O'Dell. USCG Rescues Duck Hunters

MILLTOWN, Wash. — The Coast Guard and a good samaritan rescued three duck hunters after their vessel capsized Sunday near the Skagit River entrance. Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound watchstanders received an initial request for assistance from the Skagit County Sheriff Department as deputies were attempting to rescue the two men who remained stranded in mud flats roughly 200 yards from the Skagit River entrance near Milltown. A good Samaritan in the area rescued one of the three hunters and brought him to a nearby marina where he called 911. Sector Puget Sound watchstanders directed a Coast Guard Air Station Port Angeles MH-65 Dolphin rescue helicopter crew to respond at approximately 12 p.m. The aircrew had been conducting routine training operations nearby in the vicinity of San Juan Island. At 12:18 p.m. the aircrew arrived on scene and observed two men in knee-high water attempting to reach shore on foot. A rescue swimmer assisted the two men as they were hoisted into the aircraft. The men were transported to waiting emergency medical services at a nearby baseball field at

12:50 p.m.

"They stayed with the vessel, got out of the water as best they could, and used life jackets they had kept onboard," said Ensign Joshua Straits, pilot aboard the rescue helicopter. "These decisions limited the effects of hypothermia and helped us to locate them quickly." The survivors are reportedly in healthy condition.

US & Canadian Coast Guards

SEATTLE — The U.S. Coast Guard and the Canadian Coast Guard celebrated the 40th anniversary of the Cooperative Vessel Traffic Services (CVTS) in Seattle on Thursday evening, Dec. 19. The CVTS provides a system of shipping traffic management in the waters from Puget Sound to as far north as Prince Rupert, British Columbia. This coopera-

tive allows for safe and expeditious movement of vessel traffic while minimizing the risk of pollution to the marine ecosystems. "The region, the people and the relationship we have with Canada is what makes this partnership so unique," said Rear Adm. Jack Vogt, commander, 13th Coast Guard District. "This team works tirelessly to ensure the safe movement of maritime traffic throughout this pristine environment." The Ports of Seattle and Tacoma are the fourth largest in North America. fisherman off a Canadian-flagged commercial fishing vessel operating 50 miles west off Neah Bay Saturday afternoon, Dec. 14. A Coast Guard Sector Field Office/Air Station Port Angeles MH-65 Dolphin rescue helicopter crew safely hoisted the 19-year-old man into the helicopter and transferred him to emergency medical services at the Coast Guard base for transport to Olympic Medical Center for further care. The fisherman reportedly suffered a knife wound in the leg, which needed more extensive medical care than the boatcrew could provide. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound in Seattle received the medevac request from the captain of the 110-foot fishing vessel Ocean Pearl at about 1 p.m. The watchstanders then directed the launch of the aircrew. The aircrew arrived on scene at 2:14 p.m. and conducted the hoist. The aircrew transferred patient care to EMS at 3:23 p.m. The fisherman was transferred in stable condition.

USCG Steadfast Returns

ASTORIA, Ore. — The Coast Guard Cutter Steadfast returned to homeport Thursday following a 60-day counter drug patrol in the Eastern Pacific Ocean. The Steadfast crewmembers steamed

over 10,500 miles, conducted over 100 readiness drills, enforced maritime safety and security and deterred illicit narcotics movements in the region. The 210-foot cutter provided maritime domain awareness and served as an on scene law enforcement asset while patrolling the Eastern Pacific Ocean. During patrol breaks, crewmembers volunteered for a number of community service projects. Crewmembers partnered with the community and the local Navy League to paint and refurbish the exterior of the local elementary school for children with special needs in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. Crewmembers also teamed with the Bacaanda Foundation to assist in the construction of a retaining wall that supports access to a primary school, creating a safe-walking path for children in Huatulco, Mexico. Steadfast crewmembers also represented the Coast Guard, among several other U.S. and Australian navy vessels, during the 2019 San Francisco Fleet Week Parade of Ships, and hosted more than 1,500 public tours. For the parade's grand finale, in front of more than three million viewers, members of the Coast Guard's Maritime Security Response Team repelled from a Coast Guard helicopter to the Steadfast's

flight deck just after the cutter passed under the Golden Gate Bridge. Steadfast is a Reliance Class cutter that has been home ported in Astoria since 1994. Previously, based in St. Petersburg, Florida, where the cutter earned the nickname "El Tiburon Blanco," or "White Shark," from drug smugglers for its notoriously effective law enforcement operations in the Caribbean. WASHINGTON — The U.S. Coast Guard has designated the cities of Cordova, Alaska, and Westport, Washington, as Coast Guard Cities through 2024. A "Coast Guard City" designation highlights an enduring relationship a community has with its local Coast Guard facility and personnel. The Coast Guard values these connections and is proud to highlight the efforts these communities make to support the service members and their families. The cities' mayors were notified about their Coast Guard

City designations by their respective Coast Guard district commanders. Cordova and Westport are scheduled to have events celebrating their designations in early 2020. Cordova, Alaska, in Coast Guard District 17, is a community of 2,205 year-round residents located in Prince William Sound and is the largest commercial fishing port in the region. The Coast Guard has been in Cordova since 1937 with the Coast Guard Cutters Sorrel, Sweetbrier, Sycamore and Fir. Coast Guard Base Kodiak established a housing complex for Coast Guard personnel there and Air Station Kodiak has had an Aviation Support Facility in Cordova since 1980. Westport, Washington, is located in Coast Guard District 13, and the service's relationship with the town goes back to 1897 when the U.S. Lifesaving Service and the U.S. Lighthouse Establishment were there. Both entities were critical components to the region as local lumber shipping and fishing industries grew. When the U.S. Lifesaving Service became the Coast Guard in 1915, Westport had already enjoyed making the service a core fixture of the local community for almost 20 years. There are currently 28 Coast Guard Cities and Coast Guard Communities. The Standing Board for the Coast Guard Cities program welcomes new cities, counties and municipalities to apply for Coast Guard City status. The designation remains effective for five years. After that time, the city must provide an updated application for recertification. Search for Missing JC Girl

There has still been no sign of 17 year old Mildred Grace Sweaney who was reported missing from her Junction City, Oregon Home on Saturday, December 7th. While information of her disappearance has begun to flood social media channels and news media outlets, relatively little new information has been developed other than Mildred may have some connections in the state of Idaho. Information regarding Mildred, along with two new photos has been entered into the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) Database. NCMEC case workers have created, and widely distributed, a poster with Mildred's information nationwide, including sending automated faxes to businesses in the Eugene, Springfield, and Junction areas. This is an active investigation; anyone having any information (new or old) on or about Mildred is requested to immediately contact the Junction City Police Department at 541-998-1245.

JC Teen Found Safe in Idaho

Mildred Grace Sweaney, the youth that was reported missing on December 7th has been located and is safe. Junction City Police Department investigators located a number of leads pointing to an acquaintance in the state of Idaho. The FBI and Boise Police detectives located Mildred when they responded to the residence of the acquaintance. There is no evidence that Mildred was taken or being held against her will. However, this is an active an ongoing investigation and further details will be released when possible. Anyone having any information (new or old) on or about Mildred is still requested to immediately contact the Junction City Police Department, at 541-998-1245, for the purpose of completing this investigation. The Junction City Police Department wants to thank the community for their concern and efforts in helping locate Mildred.

More on the JC Teen

Robert William Havery, 39, of Boise Idaho was arrested Thursday morning, December 12, 2019, and lodged in the Ada County Jail on felony charges stemming from his involvement with Mildred Sweaney, a 17-year old girl missing from Junction City, Oregon. Mildred was originally reported missing from her Junction City home on Saturday, December 7, 2019 when she failed to return

from a walk around the neighborhood. The Junction City Police Department immediately launched an intensive media campaign concurrently with an aggressive investigation to locate any possible leads. During a lengthy interview of many family and friends on Sunday night, Havery's name was identified as a possible person of interest. Upon making phone contact with Havery investigators found him to be uncooperative and later determined he had actually provided a false address. With further investigation Havery's complete identity was determined, as was his true address. Investigators from the Boise Police Department Special Victim's Unit responded to Havery's residence early Tuesday morning, found Mildred, and took her into protective custody. By this morning investigators developed sufficient probable cause to take Havery into custody. During the ensuing investigation Havery admitted, in addition to other details, to driving to Junction City where he met Mildred and then the two drove back to his Boise house. Havery was lodged at the Ada County Jail on two (2) counts of Sexual Battery on a minor [Idaho State Code 18-1508A], and one (1) count of 1st degree Kidnapping [Idaho State Code 18-4502]. However, the investigation is ongoing both in Oregon and Idaho and additional charges may be forthcoming.

Wildlife Abuse Arrest

On December 6, 2019 Oregon State Police (OSP) Fish & Wildlife Troopers received information from the Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife regarding a disturbing video shared via social media. The video displayed what appeared to be a young adult male climbing onto, and eventually riding on the back of a live and exhausted mule deer buck while it was contained within a fenced enclosure. Throughout the video, the mule deer buck can be heard grunting and/or bleating and after escaping the rider, the buck jumped into a linked fence, multiple times, attempting to escape the enclosure. After reviewing the video, OSP Fish & Wildlife Troopers conducted further investigation and identified two suspects from Riley, OR. The primary suspect, identified as Jacob Belcher (18) from Riley, OR., was located on a rural ranch in Harney County where he was interviewed by Troopers. The investigation and interviews revealed that the buck mule deer had entrapped itself within a fenced feeding enclosure, before being ridden by Belcher. The buck was eventually freed and its status at this time is unknown. Following interviews, Belcher was arrested and lodged at the Harney County Jail on charges of Wildlife Harassment and Animal Abuse II. Another suspect, who was responsible for filming the incident, was identified and interviewed as

well. Charges of Aiding in a Wildlife Offense will be referred to the Harney County District Attorney's Office.

Deer Attack Jacksonville

On November 30, 2019 at approximately 11:06 P.M. cameras at Jacksonville Elementary recorded two dogs attacking a small deer on school grounds. A female is seen in the video (still photos attached) attempting to and eventually gaining control of the two dogs. Approximately 20 minutes later one of the dogs returns and attacks the deer again for approximately 12 minutes before the deer appears to die. Oregon State Police would like to talk with the female in the photo. If you have seen the dogs or know the female please contact Oregon State Police at 1-800-442-2068 or *OSP and leave information for Trooper Brittany Hanigan. **Update:** The owner of the dogs has contacted the Oregon State Police. OSP would like to thank the public and the media for their assistance. Investigation is continuing and no further information is available for release at this time.

Oregon National Guard Youth Challenge Program

REDMOND, Ore. - The Oregon National Guard Youth Challenge Program (OYCP) class 2019-02 graduated 154 cadets Dec. 18, from the five month physical and academic training program. OYCP's mission is to provide opportunities for personal growth, self improvement, and academic achievement among 16-18 year old Oregon high school drop outs, teens no longer attending and those failing in school, through a highly structured non-traditional environment; integrating training, mentoring and diverse educational activities. OYCP is Oregon's only accredited statewide alternative high school. The program is tuition free, and eligible individuals are accepted from all 36 counties in Oregon. The school is a non-traditional model that operates similar to a military academy. The program is guided by military principles, structure and self-discipline, and is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission (NWAC) and approved by the Oregon Department of Education (ODE).

Corrections Officer Indicted

PORTLAND, Ore.—Richard Steven Alberts, II, 31, an Oregon Department of Corrections Officer and resident of Sherwood, Oregon, made an initial appearance today in federal court before U.S. Magistrate Judge John Jelderks. The court unsealed a 3-count indictment charging Alberts and co-conspirator Joseph Lucio Jimenez, 27, of Gresham, Oregon, with conspiracy to distribute controlled substances and distribution of

heroin. Alberts and Jimenez are alleged to have conspired with one another and others to distribute methamphetamine and heroin into the Coffee Creek Correctional Facility in Wilsonville, Oregon, where Alberts is employed. The Oregon Department of Corrections previously placed Alberts on administrative leave pending this investigation. Alberts was

released pending trial. A jury trial is scheduled for February 25, 2020 before U.S. District Court Judge Michael H. Simon. Jimenez was in pre-trial custody on an unrelated felon in possession of a firearm charge when he was indicted in this case. He will remain in custody and make his first appearance on these new charges at a later date. This case was investigated by the FBI, Oregon State Police, and Oregon Department of Corrections Office of Inspector General, and is being prosecuted by Craig Gabriel and Scott Bradford, Assistant U.S. Attorneys for the District of Oregon. An indictment is only an accusation of a crime, and defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.

Standoff in Aurora
