41st Infantry Brigade Combat Team to Kosovo

CLACKAMAS, Ore. - Task Force Jungleer consisting of approximately 400 soldiers from the 41st Brigade Headquarters and Headquarters Company, with elements of 2nd Battalion, 162nd Infantry Battalion, 41st Infantry Brigade Combat Team (IBCT) were honored in a ceremony Saturday, Jan. 11, 2020 at the Oregon Convention Center, as they prepared to deploy to Kosovo. The 41st IBCT Commander Col. Eric Riley invites supporters and the media to recognize and honor the Soldiers of Task Force Jungleer and their families in preparation for their deployment to Kosovo. "The 41st is honored to represent the state of Oregon in this NATO's Kosovo Force mission, contributing to a secure environment and ensuring public safety and order to the people of Kosovo," Said 41st IBCT Commander Col. Eric Riley. Speakers at the mobilization ceremony included Oregon Governor Kate Brown and Oregon National Guard Maj. Gen. Michael E. Stencel, The Adjutant General, Oregon. Task Force Jungleer is the last of the 41st units to mobilize. The total deployment is the second-largest deployment of the brigade since WWII, following the 2009 Iraq deployment commanded by then Col. Daniel Hokanson, now a Lieutenant General and Director of Army National Guard, who spoke at the event as well. The 41st IBCT is an organization made up of

3,000 Soldiers consisting of five Oregon battalions and two out of state battalions from New Mexico and Washington. The Brigade has already deployed four separate task forces around the globe starting in September of 2019, with a total numbering approximately 2,300 Soldiers, with 1,400 hailing from Oregon. The 41st Brigade has a rich history protecting its community and country, tracing their lineage back to the 41st Division of WWI and WWII. Soldiers of the brigade are dedicated to accomplishing the assigned missions with the same courage and competence it has always had.

USCG Responds to Coos Bay Capsizing

NORTH BEND, Ore. — A Coast Guard aircrew and two boat crews were searching for three fishermen near the entrance to Coos Bay after finding a capsized vessel Tuesday evening, Jan. 14, on the jetty tips. (Update: The three fishermen were located and rescued from inside the capsized vessel by local fire personnel.) The capsized vessel is the 38-foot fishing vessel Pacific Miner, which reportedly had three men aboard when it capsized. A Coast Guard Sector North Bend MH-65 Dolphin aircrew, flying on a routine training flight, spotted the capsized fishing vessel and immediately reported it to the Sector North Bend Command Center. Shortly after receiving the report the Coast Guard received an electronic position indicating radio beacon transmission that was

automatically activated when the EPIRB was submerged in water. The EPIRB was registered to the fishing vessel Pacific Miner. Two 47-foot Motor Life Boat crews from Coast Guard Station Coos Bay were launched to assist in search efforts. The Pacific Miner reportedly had approximately 300 crab on board. The Coos Bay bar is currently restricted to recreational vessels 40-feet and below. The reported conditions include 8 to 12-foot breaking waves with low winds. There is four miles of visibility. The owner of the vessel has been notified of the incident.

On Board Assault Leads to Prison

EUGENE, Ore.—Brandon Michael Vanderploeg, 39, of Winchester Bay, Oregon, was sentenced today to 18 months in federal prison and two years' supervised release for assaulting his then-girlfriend aboard a fishing vessel in August 2018. According to court documents, on August 16, 2018, members of the U.S. Coast Guard were dispatched to a situation at sea involving the report of a woman who had been assaulted by her boyfriend onboard a commercial fishing vessel. A coast guard helicopter located the vessel 17 nautical miles off the Oregon Coast. Two members of the coast guard boarded the vessel and made contact with Vanderploeg and the victim. The victim reported that Vanderploeg had assaulted her on several occasions since leaving Winchester Bay. She specifically reported that Vanderploeg held her down, punched her repeatedly in the face, head-butted her in the nose, and slammed her head down on a tool box. The assault resulting in a three-inch laceration to her right cheek, a depressed nasal fracture, multiple contusions to her

knees and arms, and a cervical strain. During the investigation, the coast guard crew who boarded and conducted a sweep of the vessel, immediately noted a strong smell of alcohol coming from Mr. Vanderploeg, who admitted to drinking. Mr. Vanderploeg tested positive for alcohol, registering a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .183. An individual operating a commercial vessel is consid-

ered intoxicated at a BAC of .04 or more. On September 30, 2019, Vanderploeg pleaded guilty to assault within the maritime jurisdiction of the U.S. and operating a commercial vessel under the influence of alcohol. As part of his plea agreement, Vanderploeg agreed to pay restitution in full to his victim as ordered by the court. A restitution hearing will be held at a later date. This case was investigated by the U.S. Coast Guard Investigative Service (CGIS) and prosecuted by Gavin W. Bruce, Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon.

8 Impaired drivers arrested by Coos Bay Police in December

CBPD release - In December the Coos Bay Police Department arrested 8 drivers for DUII. All 8 arrests were made during regular patrols. On December 29th the Coos Bay Police Department participated in a Christmas/New Years Holiday DUII enforcement operation sponsored by Oregon Impact and ODOT, however no arrests were made. The Coos Bay Police Department will have additional officers out periodically throughout the month of January for DUII enforcement.

Coos Bay Police Department Safety Belt Enforcement Blitz

"proper use" of the entire seatbelt system; lap belt placed low across the hips and a shoulder belt over the collarbone and crossing the center of the chest. Belts should be free of slack and lying flat with no twists or knots. If necessary, slide the attachment on the door post up or down to fit the size of you or your passenger. Shoulder belts should not be placed under the arm or behind the back as this can cause serious internal injuries or ejection in the event of a crash. Safety belts used correctly can reduce the risk of major crash injury or death by up to sixty- five percent. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading nationwide cause of death for children ages one through twelve years old. In 2017, 1,906 children under twelve were injured in Oregon traffic crashes, 9 percent were reported not using a child restraint system. It is estimated that car seats may increase crash survival by 71% for infants under one year old and by up to 59% for toddlers aged one to four. Booster seats may reduce the chance of nonfatal injury among four to eight year-olds by 45% compared to safety belts used alone. For help selecting or in-

Empire District Fire

CBFD release - The Coos Bay Fire Department was dispatched to a house fire in the Empire District of Coos Bay at 4:00 a.m. this Thursday morning, Jan. 2, 2020. Arriving on scene less than two minutes later, firefighters found heavy smoke coming from multiple locations around the house but found heavy fire involvement primarily on the south end of the house. Firefighters were able to quickly knockdown the main area of fire involvement, but they remained on scene for a couple more hours locating and extinguishing areas of attic space and an adjoining structure where the fire had spread. The property was insured, and the estimated value of the structure is approximately \$195,000. It is considered a total loss. No injuries to occupants or firefighters occurred; however,

three family pets died due to smoke inhalation. The cause of the fire is believed to be electrical in nature, and it is not considered intentional. Coos Bay Fire Department was assisted on scene by Charleston Rural Fire Protection District and North Bend Fire Department through the Coos County Mutual Aid System. Also assisting was Bay Cities Ambulance and Pacific Power. The Coos Bay Fire Department would like to remind its citizens that they offer a free smoke alarm installation program. Manufactured Home Fire

CBFD release - On Saturday, January 18, 2020, at 11:04 pm, the Coos Bay Fire Department responded to the report of a house fire at 472 Shorepines Place. The fire was reported to 911 by the resident as a single-wide manufactured home with a fire in the bedroom. When fire crews arrived they found flames coming from the bedroom window. The two residents escaped the building safely along with their dog. Firefighters were

able to contain the fire to the one bedroom and quickly extinguished the blaze, but the home did have smoke damage throughout the 50 year old mobile home. The fire investigation found a butane torch, used for lighting smoking material, had been left too close to combustible materials before it had cooled down.

Empire District House Fire

CBFD release - January 26, 2020 – Coos Bay Firefighters were dispatched to 312 S. Wall St in the Empire District of Coos Bay early this morning for a reported house fire. The first fire engine arrived two minutes after the dispatch and found a vacant and boarded up house with fire on the south end of the structure. The fire was quickly knocked down and firefighters transitioned into the interior to assure no fire extension had occurred. The fire was contained to an exterior shed that was attached to the main house and minimal additional damage occurred to the main structure. Coos Bay Fire Department responded for a structure fire to this same residence three weeks

Missing Person Located

According to a news release from the North Bend Police Dept. for Monday, Jan. 13, 2020, NBPD was contacted about noon regarding the possible location of John Hepburn's bicycle on the Cape Arago Hwy. The 54-year old North Bend resident was reported missing on Jan. 2, 2020 after leaving his home during the early morning hours on his bicycle. His bike was located off of a steep embankment, and during a search of the area, Hepburn's body was located. There were no signs of foul play, but an investigation is continuing.

Homicide Victim Identified

Coos Co. District Attorney R. Paul Fraser has released the name of the woman killed in a stabbing attack Monday night, Dec. 30th in North Bend. According to

the DA, 58-year old Ramona Matthews died of multiple stab wounds at her home on the 2500 block of Ash St. The assailant was identified as her daughter 25-year old Alexis Marie Berquist. Berquist has been charged with Murder in the Second Degree and is in the Coos Co. Jail at Coquille. She is expected to appear before a judge on Thursday, Jan. 2, 2020, at the Courthouse in Coquille.

Threat at MHS Not Viable

Deceased Male Found Alongside Hwy. 101

On Monday, January 27, 2020 at approximately 9:21 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers were dispatched to the

report of a deceased person beside Hwy 101 near milepost 278 (Two Mile Lane). Preliminary investigation revealed the deceased male, identified as William Schippert (44) of Bandon, had been struck by a vehicle hours before his body was discovered. Investigators from the Oregon State Police, Bandon Police Department, Coos County Sheriff's Office and the Coos County District Attorney's Office are continuing the investigation. The operator of the vehicle has been identified and is currently cooperating with the investigation.

Cease & Desist Order Issued to Bandon Resident

(Salem) – The Oregon Division of Financial Regulation is warning people to avoid investing with Robert Lee Adams, also known as Bob Adams, and his business, SimTradePro Inc. The division issued a cease-and-desist order against Adams and his business for operating as a state investment adviser without a license, and he may still be soliciting Oregon consumers. Adams, a Bandon resident, formed a related company, Winning Investments, LLC, in 2017 allegedly to pool investor funds and invest them in the foreign currency exchange market. Four investors who participated lost more than \$279,000 in less than a year. An elderly victim lost most of her retirement savings. Adams charged each investor a \$3,000 origination fee, offered the group investment strategies he selected, and pooled the investors' funds in a local bank account. Adams then allegedly invested their funds in foreign currency trading programs that operated offshore. Adams and SimTradePro have never been licensed with the division as an investment adviser or investment adviser representative. "Investments in foreign currency trading programs are extremely risky, and they are not for everyone," said Andrew Stolfi, division administrator. "Before investing money you cannot afford to lose, and certainly before parting with your life savings, learn as much as you can about the firms and individuals you are considering. Make sure your investment adviser is licensed by the division and works with registered, reputable industry professionals." The division encourages everyone to protect their money. Ask questions to learn about your adviser's registration status, disciplinary record, and complaint history. The first step before making an investment is to carefully choose a financial professional by checking their licensing status and background. Oregonians are also encouraged to contact the division's advocates at 888-877-4894 (toll-free) with questions or concerns about a financial adviser or product. Burglars Held at Gunpoint

Terramar Rd., Coos Bay, CCSO release - On January 4th, 2020, at about 4:36 pm, The Coos County Sheriff Office responded to a reported burglary in progress on Terramar Road in Coos Bay. The caller reported she and her husband had found two males in the detached garage of their residence and the caller reported her husband was currently holding the two burglars at gunpoint. Upon the Deputies' arrival, the two males, identified as 36 year old Philip Raymond Nerpel and 27 year old Jordan James Duval, were taken into custody. The caller's husband said after he located Jordan and Philip inside his garage, and verbally gave them commands. The caller's husband said both men complied and exited the garage and sat down. A pistol was located inside the garage, which Jordan later admitted to belonging to him. Philip also admitted to attempting to enter the residence on the property but Philip said he was unable to enter the home due to the locked dead bolt. Philip

Warrant arrest/Heroin

Hwy. 101, CCSO release - On 12/30/19 at approximately 3:01 PM, Deputies were dispatched to a disturbance in progress occurring at 62905 Highway 101 in Coos Bay, OR. Prior to the Deputies arrival, witnesses stated they observed a

female suspect, later identified as 27 year old Jessica Lee Scott, forcefully take money from her father and shove him to the ground. Jessica then left the scene in the passenger seat of a tan Ford pickup along with a male driver. Upon checking Jessica's warrant status, it was also determined she had a valid warrant for her arrest out of the Coos Bay Police Department for Failure to Appear in the 1st Degree. Deputies located the pickup

Canadian Pleads Guilty to Drug Charges After Maritime Arrest off Oregon Coast

PORTLAND, Ore.—John Philip Stirling, 65, a Canadian citizen, pleaded guilty in federal court Wednesday, Jan. 29, to one count of possession with intent to distribute methamphetamine under the Maritime Drug Law Enforcement Act (MDLEA). According to court documents, on April 9, 2019, while on a routine patrol, the U.S. Coast Guard Cutter Alert detected a sailing vessel traveling north 225 nautical miles from

Newport, Oregon. The vessel, named Mandalay, had a home port of Seattle, Washington and visible U.S. registration numbers. When Coast Guard personnel attempted to communicate with Stirling, he went below deck and would only respond via VHF radio. Once Coast Guard personnel determined the Mandalay was a vessel within the jurisdiction of the U.S., they boarded and found Stirling to be the vessel's sole occupant. Stirling stated he did not have vessel documentation and refused to produce identification. Upon further questioning, Stirling's speech began to deteriorate and he displayed signs of a possible drug overdose. Coast Guard personnel administered medical aid to Stirling and evacuated him by helicopter to Astoria, Oregon. He was later transported by ambulance to Adventist Health Portland for additional treatment. Coast Guard personnel conducted a search of the Mandalay and discovered 28 seven-gallon jugs containing liquid methamphetamine. Under the MDLEA, Stirling faces a maximum sentence of life in prison, a \$10 million fine and five years of supervised release. Pursuant to the plea agreement, the government will recommend Stirling be sentenced to 87 months in prison. He will be sentenced on April 20, 2020 before U.S. District Court Judge Michael W. Mosman. As part of the plea agreement, Stirling has agreed to forfeit the Mandalay. This case was investigated by the U.S. Coast Guard Investigative Service (CGIS) and Homeland Security Investigations (HSI).

Unlawful Entry Central Coast

On January 28th, 2020, at about 10:10 PM, the Willamette Valley Communications Center (Lincoln County Dispatch) received a 911 call from a residence on 9th Street in Yachats. The line was open - the caller was not communicating with the call taker, but voices could be heard in the background. The call taker deter-

mined the nature of the conversation heard in the background sounded as though someone was in distress. The

call taker requested Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputies respond to the location. Upon arrival, deputies located a male subject in the home of the caller. The male, 43-year-old Brandon Ryan Holve of Springville, California, was taken into custody by the deputies. An investigation revealed Holve entered the residence unlawfully, but did not attempt or commit any additional crimes. Holve was charged with Criminal Trespass in the First Degree and lodged at the Lincoln County Jail. His bail was set at 15,000. Deputies assisted in trespassing Holve from businesses in Yachats earlier in the shift. Holve's conduct did not warrant criminal charges during those instances and was attributed to his erratic, but non-criminal behavior. It is likely Holve is associated with unreported incidents of a similar nature in and around Yachats on the evening of January 28th. Sex Abuse Charges in Del Norte

Two employees of the Del Norte Unified School District in Crescent City, CA have been placed on Administrative Leave following allegations of sexual abuse involving a child. According to reports, 60-year old Kathleen Mary Fuson and 43-year old Katlin Janice Nole were taken into custody Jan. 17 on charges of suspicion of Continuous Sexual Abuse of a Child. Nole faces an additional charge of Suspicion of Sexual Intercourse with a Child 10 years old or younger. The alleged conduct was not related to their employment with the Unified School District and did not occur on District Property, according to the District's superintendent. Nole's husband 49-year old Jody Nole and another

individual, 48-year old Edward Bert Steel are also named in the case.

Meth Bust Reedsport

REEDSPORT, Ore. - On Wednesday, January 22, 2020, at 9:30 pm, a deputy stopped a white 2000 Honda Accord on Highway 101 near milepost 219. He contacted the occupants of the vehicle and issued warnings for minor traffic violations. Following the traffic stop, the deputy learned the occupants had provided him with a false name for a male in the vehicle. across the driveway, making vehicular access impossible. Two troopers from the Oregon State Police responded to assist the deputies. Together, deputies and troopers checked the area around the yurt for evidence and the subject who had been occupying it. Inside, they found several edged weapons, a bow and arrow, and pellet gun. Deputies then learned the nearby Toyota Tacoma was a vehicle of interest in a recent officer safety bulletin from Santa Rosa, California. Deputies and troopers withdrew from the immediate area to await the arrival of LCSO K9 Nix and her handler. As they waited, deputies observed a man exit a nearby wooded area armed with a bow and arrow. The deputies recognized the man as the subject of the officer safety bulletin. Deputies began issuing commands for the man to drop the weapon and put his hands up. The man put down the bow and arrow, but deputies could see other weapons visible on his person and could not safely approach him. Deputies and troopers negotiated with the man for over fifteen minutes until he finally surrendered. The man, identified as 37 year-old Michael Gordon Richie of Forestville, CA, was taken into custody without further incident. Richie was transported to the Lincoln County Jail where he was lodged on charges of Burglary I, Felon in Possession of a Restricted Weapon, Carrying of Concealed Weapons, Criminal Trespass II, Theft III, and Criminal Mischief III. Richie's total bail was set at \$232,500.

Juvenile Bites Deputy on Central Coast

On January 25th, 2020 at 11:45 PM, a Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputy was dispatched to a disturbance at a residence on N. Echo Mountain Road in Otis. The caller reported a 16 year-old male juvenile was under the influence of a "acid" or another hallucinogen and acting violently. The caller reported the juvenile had already assaulted one person in the residence. The juvenile ran into the kitchen and began banging kitchen utensils together when the deputy attempted to speak to him. North Coast - Swept into the Ocean

Preliminary investigation revealed a adult male was holding two children, a 7 year old female and a 4 year old male, on the shore and they were all swept into the ocean by a wave. The adult male and father of the two children is being identified as Jeremy Stiles (47) from Portland.

Military Deserter Arrested on Oregon Coast

On January 9th, 2020 at 8:24 AM, Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputies were dispatched to a welfare check on a suspi-

cious person at the Cape Perpetua Visitor's Center. The caller reported the subject's name as Chris Gardner. Earlier in the shift, deputies were made aware of a state-wide bulletin regarding 32 year-old military deserter from Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington named Christopher Lee Gardner. Gardner was considered armed and dangerous by the US Army. The description and details surrounding Gardner's suspicious activity provided by the caller matched the information provided in the US Army bulletin. Members of the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office, assisted by two Oregon State Police Troopers, closed off access to the Cape Perpetua Visitor's Center and evacuated the area. Deputies observed Gardner and confirmed he was the subject of the bulletin. Deputies and troopers formed an arrest team and were able successfully take Gardner into custody without incident. After a brief medical evaluation, Gardner was lodged at the Lincoln County Jail on a Federal Detainer. Gardner's vehicle was located by the Oregon State Police at Neptune State Scenic Viewpoint in northern Lane County. A firearm was recovered from inside the vehicle. Gardner has not been charged with any local crimes.

sion northwest of Bremerton. The Port Angeles flight crew aboard the MH-65 Dolphin helicopter safely returned home after being indirectly illuminated for about one second and were checked out by the duty corpsman, who medically cleared the crew to resume duty. The laser strike was reported to Coast Guard Air Station Port Angeles, the Federal Aviation Administration and local police by the aircrew. The laser light came from the vicinity of the southwest corner of Naval Base Kitsap in Bangor. "These types of incidents can be very dangerous to the safety of our aircrews and disrupts our ability to respond as a search and rescue asset," said Cmdr. Scott Jackson, commanding officer at Coast Guard Air Station Port Angeles. "In this particular case, the aircrew was deemed fit to continue flying; however, we have had instances where our crews have been medically grounded. In these cases Naval Air Station Whidbey Island and Coast Guard Sector Columbia River are required to cover our area of responsibility until the Port Angeles aircrew is medically cleared. We need the public to understand the dangers of playing with laser lights goes beyond medical risks to our aircrews. It places all mariners at risk due to delayed response times should they become in distress." Laser pointers can cause great danger to aircrews due to glare, afterimage, flash blindness, or temporary loss of night vision. If a laser is shined in the eyes of an aircrew member, Coast Guard flight rules dictate that the aircraft must abort its mission. Aiming a laser pointer at an aircraft is a felony crime under 18 U.S. Code Section 39A, which states whoever knowingly aims the beam of a laser pointer at an aircraft in the special aircraft jurisdiction of the United States, or at the flight path of such an aircraft, shall be fined under

Sailboat Rescue Mouth of Columbia River

Long Beach, Wash. — The Coast Guard rescued a man after his sailing vessel became disabled dangerously close to the surf near Peacock Spit Friday Jan. 3, about one mile from the shore near Cape Disappointment. The man contacted watchstanders at Coast Guard Station Cape Disappointment by cell phone at approximately 2:45 p.m. His 36-foot sailing vessel had lost power and the mast had fallen, causing the vessel to

become adrift in proximity of the waters of the Cape Disappointment bar. Coast Guard Sector Columbia River watchstanders were notified as crew members aboard a 47-foot Motor Lifeboat diverted from training operations nearby. An MH-65 Dolphin rescue helicopter crew from Coast Guard Sector North Bend was also transiting the area and diverted to render assistance.

The aircrew first located the distressed vessel at 3:35 p.m. and initially intended to provide on-scene weather information and vector-in the 47-foot MLB crew which was en-route. The sailing vessel's mast had fallen, preventing the man from entering the cabin to avoid the harsh elements. Additionally, the vessel's loss of power and inability to maneuver was deemed reason enough for the aircrew to hoist the man from the vessel rather than wait for the MLB crew to arrive. At 4:04 p.m. the rescue swimmer deployed and helped hoist the man from the vessel. The aircrew transported the man to Air Station Astoria where

further action to recover the disabled vessel is set to take place as weather conditions dissipate. The man is reportedly in healthy condition at Air Station Astoria. An incident management team is monitoring the situation to prevent or mitigate any environmental impact.

USCG Rescue at Pier 36, Astoria

ASTORIA, Ore. — A 26-foot Coast Guard Trailable Aids to Navigation Boat capsized Saturday, Jan. 4 with four crew members aboard near Pier 39 in Astoria. Four Coast Guardsmen were aboard the vessel conducting routine operations when the capsizing occurred. The vessel reportedly encountered a series of heavy wakes that came over the bow, which resulted in an unrecoverable starboard list that capsized the vessel. At 11:39 a.m., watchstanders at the 13th Coast Guard District command center in Seattle received four Personal Locator Beacon alerts registered to Coast Guard Aids to Navigation Team Astoria. The

beacons' positions correlated with multiple good Samaritans' reports of visual distress signals in the vicinity of Pier 39 in Astoria, Oregon. Correlating reports were also received by Astoria 911 dispatch. At approximately 11:50 a.m., watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Columbia River issued an urgent marine information broadcast (UMIB) and directed a Coast Guard Air Station Astoria MH-60 Jayhawk crew and a Coast Guard Station Cape Disappointment 47-foot Motor Lifeboat crew to respond. At 12:09 p.m., crew members aboard the Columbia Bar Pilot vessel Connor Foss contacted the Coast Guard reporting they had recovered the four Coast Guardsmen from the water after responding to the UMIB and were en route to awaiting medical personnel at the 17th Street pier. Clatsop County Sheriff Marine Unit assisted in the recovery by towing the capsized vessel to the 17th Street pier. All persons involved are reported to be in healthy condition after being evaluated at Columbia Memorial Hospital. The

USCG Rescue Olympic Mtns.

PORT ANGELES, Wash. — A Coast Guard aircrew rescued a hiker after he fell into the Hoh River Friday evening, Jan. 17, and became unable to finish his hike in the Olympic Mountains. A Coast Guard Air Station/Sector Field Office Port Angeles MH-65 Dolphin helicopter aircrew hoisted the 39-year-old hiker, who was reportedly suffering from symptoms related to hypothermia and frostbite, and transported him to Olympic Medical Center for treatment. Watchstanders at the 13th Coast Guard District Command Center received an agency assist request from the Air Force Rescue Coordination Center and the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office at 7:28 p.m. The AFRCC had limited communication with the hikers due to a bad connection but were able to triangulate the man's position by using the cell phone towers. A woman that was hiking with the man called for help after realizing that the man's medical condition would not allow him to finish the hike. The helicopter aircrew launched at 8:16 p.m. and began the hoist at 8:55 p.m. The aircrew transferred the patient to Olympic Medical Center personnel at 9:41 p.m. The man was in stable condition at the time of transfer to medical personnel.

USCG Warns of Hazardous Conditions

SEATTLE - The Coast Guard advises all mariners of the dangers related to crossing hazardous bars in the Pacific Northwest. Recent incidents have highlighted the challenges of attempting to cross waterway bars in heavy weather and at night. The marine casualty of a commercial fishing vessel on the Coos Bay bar resulted in the loss of a vessel, but miraculously all three crew members were saved. Unfortunately, in a similar incident on the Yaquina Bay bar, both the crew and the vessel were tragically lost. The Coast Guard previously established regulated navigation areas for specific locations on the Oregon and Washington coasts and created guidance for these locations. When conditions become hazardous, the Captain of the Port (COTP) for the Coast Guard, having jurisdiction over a particular area, will either restrict or close the bar. See Title 33 CFR Part 165.1325 for additional information. Bar closure - As determined by the COTP, when the environmental conditions exceed the operational limitations of the relevant Coast Guard search and rescue resources, the bar will be closed and no vessels can cross the bar unless specifically exempted by the COTP. Restricted bar - The COTP will restrict a

bar for vessels of a specified length as follows: -Recreational vessels - Vessels of the prescribed length or less cannot cross the bar; -Uninspected passenger vessels - Vessels of the prescribed length or less cannot cross the bar; Night-time bar operations - The Coast Guard typically reports bar conditions from first light to last light, meaning bar reports become outdated as conditions change during the night. Vessel operators should exercise extreme caution when transiting a restricted bar between sunset to sunrise. If there is any doubt as to conditions on the bar, vessel masters should consider staying outside in deep water until updated conditions can be determined. When the bar is restricted to vessels of a specified length, masters of commercial fishing vessels up to and including that length, shall contact the Coast Guard on VHF-FM channel 16 or 22A prior to crossing the bar and report the vessel's name, location or position, the number of persons aboard and destination. Rough bar escorts - At times, the Coast Guard may determine that the safest option is to escort vessels across a hazardous bar. While the variability of each bar and given conditions require flexibility in how the Coast Guard will undertake an escort, typically two Coast Guard Motor Life Boats will be on scene. Guidance from the on-scene Coast Guard units is always advisory in nature, and at no time are vessel masters relieved of their responsibility for the safe operation and navigation of their vessel. Bar reporting and guidance - The Coast Guard has released guidance on the following regulated navigation areas. You can access these guidance documents at <http://www.fishsafewest.info/Rlegs.asp> then open the "Bar Crossing Guidance" folder. Outreach - Vessel masters unfamiliar with local bar conditions, bar reporting methods or Coast Guard escort techniques are strongly encouraged to contact their local Coast Guard station. Commanding officers and officers-in-charge of local stations can provide an overview of their bar reporting areas and discuss in detail how their unit will conduct rough bar escorts. SEATTLE — The Coast Guard rescued a man adrift on his dingy in Bellingham Bay Thursday, Jan. 23 after he was beset by weather. The 26-year-old Ferndale man was rowing his 7-foot wooden-watercraft across the bay to an anchored sailboat, which he claimed to be working on, when he lost his oars and had no other means of propulsion. The man had no life jacket, possessed no means of

communication, and was not wearing adequate clothing for the conditions. At 9:03 a.m., watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound received a call from a good Samaritan on the shore who reported spotting a man on a dingy waving his arms and calling for help. A Coast Guard Station Bellingham 45-foot Response Boat-Medium crew launched at 9:12 a.m., arrived on scene in about 20 minutes, and took the man aboard. He reportedly suffered from the early stages of hypothermia and was immediately taken to emergency medical service technicians from Bellingham Fire Department waiting at Station Bellingham. The boat crew returned to the scene shortly after in an attempt to recover the dingy, but it could not be located. "He is incredibly lucky that we reached him in time," said Petty Officer 2nd Class Alexander Franzese, a 45-foot RB-M crew member of Station Bellingham. "He was drifting toward rougher waters, and it would have totally swamped his boat. Considering how cold the water was and his lack of safety equipment, he narrowly avoided tragedy today." Franzese recommends that boaters pay attention to weather warnings, keep a waterproof marine radio with them, use oar-locks in row-boats, and above all, never go out on the water without wearing a life-

jacket. There was a small-craft advisory in effect at the time of the incident. The Coast Guard recommends all mariners heed these critical warnings from the national weather service and take into account the affects that winds and waves will have on their boat prior to getting underway and throughout their voyage.

USCG Rescues Stranded Female

SEATTLE — An aircrew from Coast Guard Air Station Port Angeles rescued a stranded 57-year-old woman Sunday, Jan. 26 from the Waatch Point Beach near Neah Bay. The uninjured woman was airlifted to safety and reunited with family. At 11:58 a.m., watchstanders at Sector Puget Sound received a report of a hiker who had climbed down a beach cliff via a rope and became stranded there by the tide. At 12:11 p.m., a Coast Guard aircrew aboard an MH-65 Dolphin helicopter launched from Air Station Port Angeles to assist Neah Bay Fire and Police departments. The aircrew arrived on scene at 1:18 p.m. and deployed a rescue swimmer to hoist her off the beach. The air crew transferred the woman to Coast Guard Station Neah Bay to awaiting emergency medical service technicians. She reported no medical concerns and refused treatment and was released to family. "This was a dif-

The equipment utilized in this rescue was made possible by the diligent efforts and support of the Douglas County Board of Commissioners. Sgt. Brad O'Dell said, "The equipment proved to be invaluable in this rescue. We would like to extend our thanks to the Board of Commissioners for their support of SAR and their mission." Most Dangerous City?

Roseburg PD release - Recently there was an article published in several Oregon media outlets that indicated the City of Roseburg is the, "Most Dangerous," city in Oregon. As with any report that involves numbers and percentages, oftentimes those numbers can be presented to support something, or make it appear unfavorable. In this instance those numbers and percentages were taken at face

value, without clear explanation. The article is referring to crime statistics that were reported to the FBI by Oregon law enforcement agencies. Those crime statistics are broken down into several different crime categories, and they are also totaled. Based on the numbers reported by an agency there is a determined, "crime index" and a "crime rate", for that jurisdiction. The Roseburg Police Department takes pride in the fact that we respond to every call for service - thus, taking reports for crimes that many other agencies do not. For example, there are many agencies around the State that do not respond to calls for minor thefts, car break-ins, or vandalism. Additionally, some agencies will refer victims to an online reporting system, potentially making victims feel, "why bother" making a report if an Officer isn't going to investigate it. Ultimately, not responding to, or not taking reports on minor crimes can lead to an inaccurate picture of crime for a particular jurisdiction, especially if it is based on crime data. We at the Roseburg Police Department knew that accurate record keeping could potentially lead to something like this, but we feel responding to all of our communities' requests for service, and

accurately documenting crimes that have occurred in our jurisdiction is the appropriate way to conduct our business. We will continue to operate in this manner, despite the possibility of this making it appear our crime statistics are higher. The chart in the published article is what produced the rankings that were released. If you look at that article and the attached chart(s) you will see our "Larceny (theft)", "Property Crime (vandalism, etc.)" and "Burglary" rates are higher than the State and U.S. averages. Those categories are the ones that contain petty thefts, theft from motor vehicles, criminal mischiefs, theft from unoccupied buildings, etc. that many agencies don't investigate, thus giving the appearance that their crime rates are lower. Conversely, our rates for most major person crimes are all lower than the U.S. average and only one is higher than the State average. Significantly, our violent crime rate is almost a full point lower than the State of Oregon average and almost 2 points lower than the U.S. average. We felt it was necessary to send this out to educate the community and media as to how these rates and numbers are created, and what it really means.
