2020 Oregon Law **Enforcement Memorial** Ceremony

To the families, co-workers, and friends of Oregon's fallen law enforcement officers, Each year at the beginning of May, Oregon pauses to honor and remember 187 fallen law enforcement officers, and the families and co-workers they left behind. The Oregon Fallen Law Enforcement Officers' Memorial Ceremony is a significant event that the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST) is proud to host each year in partnership with the Oregon Law Enforcement Memorial Fund, Oregon Concerns of Police Survivors (C.O.P.S.), Oregon Fallen Badge Foundation, and Oregon's various statewide law enforcement associations. The memorial honors 187 fallen Oregon law enforcement officers who have died in the line of duty since the 1880s. This includes officers from city, county, state, tribal and federal law enforcement agencies who have served as law enforcement officers, corrections officers, and parole and probation officers. The current COVID-19 crisis that our state, nation and the world is facing has resulted in the cancelation of public gatherings. The Oregon law enforcement community wants you to know that this crisis will not deter us from honoring Oregon's fallen. On Tuesday, May 5, 2020, we plan to honor our fallen as planned, but through a modified ceremony that



will be closed to the public. Oregon Dept. of **Revenue &** COVID-19 Scams

The Oregon Department of Revenue is warning taxpayers of calls and email phishing attempts related to the novel coronavirus, or COVID-19, pandemic and federal government relief payments. These scams can lead to tax-related fraud and identity theft. Taxpayers should watch not only for emails but text messages, websites, and social media attempts that request money or personal information. "Oregon taxpayers should take extra precaution to guard their personal information from these unscrupu-lous scam attempts," said Oregon Department of Revenue Director Nia Rav. "Most people who qualify to receive a stimulus check do not need to sign up, We can outfit you and your boat from head to toe!





apply, or verify any personal information, online or else where." The Oregon Department of Revenue and the IRS remind taxpayers that scammers may: Emphasize the words "stimulus check" or "stimulus payment." The official term is economic impact payment. Ask the taxpayer to sign over their economic impact payment check to them. Ask by phone, email, text, or social media for verification of personal and/or banking information saying that the information is needed to receive or speed up their economic impact payment. Suggest they can get a tax refund or economic impact payment faster by working on the taxpayer's behalf. This scam could be conducted by social media or even in person. Mail the taxpayer a bogus check, perhaps in an odd amount, then tell the taxpayer to call a number or verify information online in order to cash it. Taxpayers should look out for phishing emails asking them to verify their personal information in order to receive an economic stimulus check from the government. While talk of economic stimulus checks has been in the news cycle, government agencies are not sending unsolicited emails seeking taxpayers private information in order to send them money. Phishing emails may also claim to be related to: Charitable contributions; General financial relief; Airline



Beach Trespassing

On 04/20/2020 at about 1:32 pm, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office received a report from residents of Otter Rock that two adult men were disregarding the park closed signage and chain link fencing erected to block the public beach access area due to the Covid-19 closure. The two unidentified subjects were observed climbing over the chain link fence, passing over their surfboards then proceeding down to the beach. 



Cold Water Drownings

SEATTLE — The Coast Guard reminds recreational boaters and paddlers to be aware of the risks involving cold water drownings. Even as the Pacific Northwest heads into warmer weather, it can still take many months for the rivers, lakes, and waterways to catch up. The water may be significantly colder than the outside ambient temperature. Always wear a life jacket while out on the water. There is no time to don a life jacket when an accident or emergency occurs. The best vest is the one you wear. "While hypothermia is a real concern, the true cause of most drownings this time of year is the rapid loss of one's ability to swim or tread water due to cold water immersion," said Capt. Nathan Coulter, chief of incident management for the 13th Coast Guard District. "Water temperatures in lakes and rivers are still near 50 degrees. If you enter water at those temperatures without a wet-suit or personal flotation de-






