## 2020 Oregon Law Enforcement Memorial Ceremony

To the families, co-workers, and friends of Oregon's fallen law enforcement officers, Each year at the beginning of May, Oregon pauses to honor and remember 187 fallen law enforcement officers, and the families and co-workers they left behind. The Oregon Fallen Law Enforcement Officers' Memorial Ceremony is a significant event that the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST) is proud to host each year in partnership with the Oregon Law Enforcement Memorial Fund, Oregon Concerns of Police Survivors (C.O.P.S.), Oregon Fallen Badge Foundation, and Oregon's various statewide law enforcement associations. The memorial honors 187 fallen Oregon law enforcement officers who have died in the line of duty since the 1880s. This includes officers from city, county, state, tribal and federal law enforcement agencies who have served as law enforcement officers, corrections officers, and parole and probation officers. The current COVID-19 crisis that our state, nation and the world is facing has resulted in the cancelation of public gatherings. The Oregon law enforcement community wants you to know that this crisis will not deter us from honoring Oregon's fallen. On Tuesday, **May 5, 2020**, we plan to honor our fallen as planned, but through a modified ceremony that



will be closed to the public. During the closed ceremony we will have a live reading of names of the 187 fallen Oregon officers and honor guard members will place flowers at the memorial. While this year's ceremony may be closed to the public, you have our commitment that Oregon's fallen will not be forgotten. Oregon's Law Enforcement Memorial Wall will be available for visitation as soon as the Oregon Public Safety Academy Campus is re-opened to the public. We extend our heartfelt thanks to all of you for your understanding and to each of our active law enforcement officers who continue to risk

their own health and wellbeing for the safety and wellness of others.

### Oregon Dept. of Revenue & COVID-19 Scams

The Oregon Department of Revenue is warning taxpayers of calls and email phishing attempts related to the novel coronavirus, or COVID-19, pandemic and federal government relief payments. These scams can lead to tax-related fraud and identity theft. Taxpayers should watch not only for emails but text messages, websites, and social media attempts that request money or personal information. "Oregon taxpayers should take extra precaution to guard their personal information from these unscrupulous scam attempts," said Oregon Department of Revenue Director Nia Ray. "Most people who qualify to receive a stimulus check do not need to sign up,

apply, or verify any personal information, online or else where." The Oregon Department of Revenue and the IRS remind taxpayers that scammers may: Emphasize the words "stimulus check" or "stimulus payment." The official term is economic impact payment. Ask the taxpayer to sign over their economic impact payment check to them. Ask by phone, email, text, or social media for verification of personal and/or banking information saying that the information is needed to receive or speed up their economic impact payment. Suggest they can get a tax refund or economic impact payment faster by working on the taxpayer's behalf. This scam could be conducted by social media or even in person. Mail the taxpayer a bogus check, perhaps in an odd amount, then tell the taxpayer to call a number or verify information online in order to cash it. Taxpayers should look out for phishing emails asking them to verify their personal information in order to receive an economic stimulus check from the government. While talk of economic stimulus checks has been in the news cycle, government agencies are not sending unsolicited emails seeking taxpayers' private information in order to send them money. Phishing emails may also claim to be related to: Charitable contributions; General financial relief; Airline

### Dept. of Justice makes funds Available to Safety Agencies

PORTLAND—The Department of Justice announced that it is making \$850 million available to help public safety agencies respond to the challenges posed by the outbreak of COVID-19. State, local and tribal law enforcement agencies in Oregon are eligible to receive nearly \$10 million in supplemental funding. The Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding program, authorized by the recent stimulus legislation passed by the Congress and signed by President Trump, will allow eligible state, local and tribal governments to apply immediately to receive these critical funds. The department is moving quickly to make awards, with the goal of having funds available within days. "In a matter of weeks, I have seen countless examples from across our state and country of law enforcement officers and other public safety professionals going far above and beyond their regular duties to serve our communities in this time of great need," said U.S. Attorney Billy J. Williams. "I'm pleased to join the department in announcing this much needed funding and will do everything in my power to expedite its distribution to eligible law enforcement agencies here in Oregon."

"This is an unprecedented moment in our nation's history and an especially dangerous one for our front-line law enforcement officers, corrections officials, and public safety professionals," said Office of Justice Programs Principal Deputy Assistant Attorney General Katharine T. Sullivan. "We are grateful to the Congress for making these resources available and for the show of support this program represents." The solicitation, posted by the Bureau of Justice Assistance in the Justice Department's Office of Justice Programs (OJP), will remain open for at least 60 days and be extended as necessary. OJP will fund applicants on a rolling basis as applications are received. Funds may be used to hire personnel, pay overtime costs, purchase protective equipment and supplies, address correctional inmates' medical needs and defray expenses related to the distribution of resources to hard-hit areas, among other activities. Grant funds may be applied retroactively to Jan. 20, 2020, subject to federal supplanting rules. 2019 State and Local Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program recipient agencies are candidates for direct emergency funding. ### Boaters still required to stop at aquatic invasive species inspection stations

SALEM, Ore. – While the state of Oregon is currently not recommending out-of-state residents visit the state for recreation due to the Governor's Stay Home, Save Lives order, all watercraft entering Oregon are still required to be inspected at an aquatic invasive species station when the stations are open. This includes commercial watercraft, which, will account for most of the inspections while the stay-at-home order remains in

effect. Located throughout Oregon, stations are open if large, orange "Boat Inspection Ahead" signs are posted on highways followed by "Inspection Required for All Watercraft." Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife inspection stations in Ashland and Ontario are open year-round. Seasonal stations open May 12 in Brookings, Klamath Falls, Lakeview and Umatilla. Inspections for aquatic invasive species typically take five to 10 minutes. ODFW staff working at the stations are taking necessary precautions to protect themselves and others against the spread of COVID-19 by wearing proper protective equipment and maintaining physical distance from others. We would ask that drivers please turn off their vehicles when they pull into the inspection station. This will make it easier for the inspector and driver to hear each other and maintain physical distance. Drivers are not required to get out of their vehicle at the inspection station and ODFW encourages all people riding in the vehicle to stay within the vehicle and to communicate through their window if they have questions about the inspection. Watercraft found

with aquatic invasive species attached are decontaminated on the spot. Both boat inspections and decontaminations, if needed, are free. Inspecting boats coming into the state is the first line of defense in keeping aquatic invasive species such as zebra or quagga mussels, snails and aquatic plants out of Oregon. These invaders can cost millions in damage to water delivery systems and serious environmental damage to our rivers, lakes and native aquatic species. "It's important for boaters to stop at these stations, get a free boat inspection, and help keep aquatic invaders out of Oregon and Pacific Northwest waters," said Rick Boatner, ODFW Invasive Species Supervisor. "People who stop at these stations are directly contributing to our success in keeping aquatic invasive zebra and quagga mussels, snails and aquatic plants out of Oregon," added Boatner. All vehicles towing or carrying motorized or non-motorized boats, including canoes, kayaks, paddleboards and sailboats must stop. Anyone hauling a boat who doesn't stop at an open station could receive a \$110 fine. Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Permits are also

required for most boaters in Oregon. Both resident and non-resident non-motorized boats (paddlecraft) 10 feet and longer require a permit and all non-resident motorized boats. Resident motorized boat permits are included in their Oregon boater registration fee. Permits can be purchased on-line at either the Oregon State Marine Board website or with ODFW Electronic License system. Permits may not be obtained in-person at ODFW offices which are closed to the public due to COVID-19 social distancing measures. Permit sales provide funding for the six boat inspection stations throughout Oregon. "Everyone who boaters needs to make sure they always practice "Clean, Drain, and Dry" before putting their boat in at another water body. All boaters and anglers should be vigilant about cleaning and drying all their gear after each use," Boatner said. ODFW technicians are specifically trained to inspect for aquatic invasive species such as zebra and quagga mussels that can range in size from microscopic to up to two inches and attach themselves to many areas on boats that are hard to see. They can also

live as long as 21 days out of water. New Zealand mud snails are just three to six millimeters long and easily attach themselves to boots, waders and fishing gear. In 2019, technicians inspected 26,875 watercraft coming into Oregon and found 400 with aquatic invasive species. Aquatic vegetation, marine and freshwater organisms contaminated 384 of those boats and the remaining 16 had quagga or zebra mussels attached. Contaminated boats came from Arizona, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada, Ohio, Texas and Utah. For boat safety inspections, contact your local county sheriff marine patrol or the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary.

ture of a Wing reflect what it is designed to do. In our case, we are fortunate to have a Special Warfare Mission, and a Fighter Aircraft Mission. When a Wing has multiple mission areas, the proper designation is "Wing" which reflects both the Special Operations, and the Fighter mission." Sitler went on to clarify that the name change does not change the unit's mission. "We are still fully committed to flying fighters, and we'll continue to excel in that mission area. We are fortunate to have one the two Air National Guard Special Tactics Squadrons. The 125th Special Tactics Squadron will continue to thrive, now, and into the future." A ceremony planned for April 5, 2020 was canceled due to considerations with Oregonians practicing health and safety standards regarding the ongoing COVID-19 response. **Coos Bay Man Arrested on Multiple Charges**  
 CBPD Release - On Sunday, April 5,

2020, at about 5:06 PM police arrived at the Coos Bay Bi-Mart after employees called and reported they were struggling with a shoplifter. During the investigation, police learned that 21-year-old Blayne Stone, of Coos Bay, stole several items and then became confrontational with employees when they stopped him as he was leaving the store. Stone punched one employee in the face and tried to pull a hatchet to fend off the employees who were trying to recover the stolen merchandise. Luckily, the hatchet was knocked away from Stone's grasp and picked up by another employee. All the employees fled back into the store to get away from Stone. Stone followed the employees back into Bi-Mart and continued to threaten them as he kept trying to get the hatchet. Police arrived and took Stone into custody. One employee suffered minor injuries during the confrontation. Stone was transported to the Coos County Jail for the charges of robbery in the first degree, menacing, unlawful use of a weapon, harassment, theft in the third degree and disorderly conduct in the second degree.

**Shooting at John Topits Park**

The area around John Topits Park in the Empire District of Coos Bay was locked down Wednesday, April 15, following a report of a shooting. The incident unfolded about noon-time at the park just off Ackerman St. when police received a report that a man had

been shot. Coos Bay Police, North Bend Police, Oregon State Police, Coquille Tribal Police and Confederated Tribal Police all converged on the park just west of the campus at Southwestern Oregon Community College. Those involved were contacted and the injured individual was transported to Bay Area Hospital with non-life threatening inju-

## Coos Co.

### Burglary – Occupied Dwelling

East Bay Rd., Coos Bay, CCSO release - On April 2nd, 2020, at approximately 4:23 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office was dispatched to the report of a Burglary of an occupied residence off of East Bay Road in Coos Bay. Deputies arrived at the location and made contact with one of the victims. The male victim informed the deputies the suspect had forced entry into the front of the residence, stole multiple firearms, tactical gear and other miscellaneous items. The male told Deputies his wife was inside the residence during the incident but the suspect did not enter the room she was laying in and unable to move or leave. After clearing from the first residence on East Bay, Deputies were dispatched to a Criminal Trespass just down the road from the Burglary residence. The owner of the second property had a male, later identified as 27 year old Dallas Bradley-Olson, on surveillance video driving on to the property, taking items and then leaving. It was later discovered the vehicle Dallas was driving was a stolen Volvo Station Wagon out of North Bend. North Bend Police Department was notified. On April 4th, 2020, the stolen vehicle was located in the Englewood area of Coos Bay by a concerned resident. Dallas was in the driver seat of the vehicle and was placed into custody. The vehicle was located by a combined effort from the Coos County Sheriff's Office, North Bend Police Department, Coos Bay Police Department and the Oregon State Police. The search of the vehicle found some of the stolen items and narcotics. The stolen property, including the vehicle, was returned to the owners on scene. Deputies and Officers on scene were able to connect Dallas to the Burglary, Trespass and Stolen Vehicle. Dallas was later transported to the Coos County Jail where he was booked and housed on the above

charges, as well as other charges from other agencies.

### Murder North of Bandon

An adult male and an adult female are dead and a 33-year old female has been arrested on a double homicide charge following an incident at a residence in the Weiss Estates north of Bandon Saturday, April 11. Coos Co. District Attorney R. Paul Frasier has identified the deceased as 55-year old Michael Ray Lambert, the owner of the home, and 28-year old Jasmine Mae Moon. Taken into custody was 33-year old Ashley Margaret Webber. Webber, who was reportedly staying at the residence, has been lodged at the Coos Co. Jail in Coquille on two-counts of Murder in the First Degree. **Initial news release from the DA - April 11, 2020 -** This morning at approximately 6:36 AM a 911 call was received by the Coos County 911 Center in Coquille. In that phone call the police learned that a male adult was reporting that he had been shot and stabbed. This individual is identified as Mike Lambert (we have no further identifying information on Mr. Lambert at the moment). Mr. Lambert had gone to a neighbor's house to report his injuries. Mr. Lambert indicated that he had been attacked in his residence located at 88577 Weis Estates, which is in the unincorporated area of the county north of the City of Bandon. Medical personnel and police responded.

Mr. Lambert was then transported to Bay Area Hospital. He has had emergency surgery but is in critical condition. We anticipate that he will be transferred to a Portland hospital later today. Police responded to the residence located at 88577 Weis Estates. Upon arrival they discovered the body of a female adult who has died by means of homicidal violence. We will not release a cause of death until after an autopsy has been performed. We are not releasing any further information about the deceased

until we have positively identified her and have notified her next of kin. Two other individuals (a male adult and a female adult) were located inside the residence and are being interviewed by the police at this time. One of these persons has been identified as the suspect in this matter. I do not believe that there is any danger to the public from this incident at this time. The Coos County Major Crime Team has activated. The Coos County Sheriff's Office is the lead agency on this matter. Currently personnel from Coos Bay Police, North Bend Police, Oregon State Police, Bandon Police, Myrtle Point Police, the Oregon State Police Crime Lab, the Coos County Medical Examiner's Office and my office are assisting in this investigation. Anyone with information about this case is asked to contact the Coos County Sheriff's Office. **Release #2 - April 11, 2020-** We have received information that Mr. Lambert passed away at 1:32 PM at Bay Area Hospital as a result of the wounds he suffered earlier today. The Coos County Major Crimes Team is continuing its investigation. Again, anyone with information regarding this case is asked to call the Coos County Sheriff's Office. **Release #3 - April 11, 2020 -** I have the following information to release regarding the incident at 88577 Weiss Estates Lane earlier today. The female adult found deceased at the scene

is identified as 28 year old Jasmine Mae Moon. We have not definitively ascertained her permanent residence at this time. The male adult who died this afternoon at Bay Area Hospital is more fully identified as 55 year old Michael Ray Lambert who was an occupant of the 88577 Weiss Estates Lane residence. We have arrested 33 year old Ashley Margaret Webber. She has been lodged at the Coos County Jail. She will be charged with two counts of Murder in the First Degree. We believe she was staying in the Weiss Estates residence where the incident occurred. She was one of the two adults found in the residence when police responded as a result of the 911 call. The male adult that was found at the residence has been interviewed by the police and has been fully cooperative. I am not releasing his name at this time. Our information is that he was not a resident of the home and had been visiting at the residence. At this time we have no evidence indicating he was involved in the deaths of Mr. Lambert or Ms. Moon. Again we encourage anyone who has information about the case to contact the Coos County Sheriff's Office.

### Double Murder Suspect Arraigned

The 33-year old female accused in a double homicide north of Bandon Saturday night, April 11, was arraigned in a Coos County Circuit Court Monday in Coquille. Ashley Margaret Webber was officially charged with two-counts of Murder in the First Degree and her bail was set at \$2 million. She is scheduled to next appear in Court on Monday, April 20, 2020, 8:3 a.m. Coos Co. Dis-

trict Attorney R. Paul Frasier says he anticipates the case will go to the Grand Jury before the end of the week. Autopsies on the two victims "will be conducted in near future." The Coos Co. Major Crime Team is continuing the investigation. Police found two victims, 28-year old Jasmine Mae Moon and 55-year old Michael Ray Lambert when they arrived at the residence owned by Lambert in the Weiss Estates north of Bandon.

### Autopsies

Autopsies were performed Wednesday afternoon, April 15, on the male and female victims of a double homicide north of Bandon Saturday, April 11. According to Coos Co. District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, 55-year old Michael Lambert, who owned the residence at Weiss Estate where the attack occurred, "suffered a gunshot wound to the neck, which was not a fatal wound." However, he also suffered multiple stab wounds to the back and neck. "Several of the stab wounds pierced his left lung causing massive internal bleeding." Twenty-eight year old Jasmine Moon "suffered multiple gunshot wounds to her torso resulting in fatal injuries to her lungs and heart." Thirty-three year old Ashley Margaret Webber has been arraigned on two-counts of Murder in the First Degree and is lodged in the county jail at Coquille.

### Grand Jury Indicts Double Murder Suspect

The Coos Co. Grand Jury met Friday, April 17, and voted to indict 33-year old Ashley Margaret Webber on two-counts of Murder in the First Degree. Webber was arrested in the home owned by 55-year old Michael Lambert on Weiss Es-

tate Drive north of Bandon. He was one of the victims along with 28-year old Jasmine Moon. The homicides occurred on Saturday, April 11. According to District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, Webber is scheduled to be in Court Monday, April 20, 8:30 a.m. She is currently lodged in the County Jail at Coquille.

### Bunker Hill Fire

A Coos Bay family was displaced Tuesday, April 14, when a fire broke out at a residence on Ellen Road in the Bunker Hill area. The cause of the fire is under investigation. The multi-dwelling unit only had one occupant. The American Red Cross was assisting the family.

### New Emergency Services Director

Coos Co. Sheriff's Office veteran Capt. Gabriel Fabrizio has added the office of Coos Co. Emergency Management to his list of responsibilities. Capt. Fabrizio fills the void created by the retirement of Mike Murphy last year. The Emergency Services Management Program is a department within the Coos Co. Sheriff's Office. Adding the responsibilities of the department along with Capt. Fabrizio other duties will reportedly save the County about \$81,000 a year. He will reportedly receive an additional monthly stipend for his new responsibilities.

Lincoln County Sheriff's Office responded to a report of a single vehicle traffic crash near mile post three on Yaquina Bay Rd. Upon arrival EMS personnel along with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office found a light green Ford Focus had left the roadway eastbound and struck a dirt embankment at a high rate of speed causing significant damage to the vehicle. Deputy Siscilee Gouge assisted in providing medical care to the injured driver and his K9 companion. The driver, Andrew Gullet, age 50 of Newport was transported to SPCH in Newport for injuries related to the traffic crash. During this time, no family or friends could be located and his K9 companion was taken to the Lincoln County Animal Shelter for observation and care. While at the hospital Deputies gained probable cause Mr. Gullet was driving impaired prior to the crash. Deputy Zachary Akin applied for and was granted a search warrant for further analysis of Mr. Gullet's blood. Mr. Gullet was cited and released for DUII, Reckless Driving, Criminal Mischief and Aggravated Harassment. Mr. Gullet was still receiving medical care for injuries from the traffic crash and could not be taken to the Lincoln County Jail.

Per Lincoln County Deadly Force Protocols, the Oregon State Police (OSP) was called in and is leading the investigation in cooperation with the Lincoln County District Attorney's Office. The involved officers have been placed on paid administrative leave as is standard practice for these events. This incident is under investigation and all future media releases on this incident will be from the Oregon State Police and the Lincoln County District Attorney's Office.

### Officer Involved Shooting Central Coast

On Thursday, April 2, 2020, at approximately 10:13PM, Officers from the Lincoln City Police Department (LCPD) contacted a man near the Rite Aid store in Lincoln City regarding a criminal trespassing investigation. During the course of the contact the man, identified as David A. Xantos, 40, of Payette Idaho, was shot by police after producing a knife and rapidly advancing toward police. The man, who was transported to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital in Lincoln City, was pronounced deceased by medical personnel. The involved officers and those present during the shooting are identified as: Sergeant Robert (Bobby) Bomar (56), 26 years of service; Officer Hayden Tolzman (26), 4 years of service; Officer Molly Wehrley (40), 2 years of service; Officer John Goodman (38), 8 years of service (present at scene); Officer Jeremy Mocek (24), 1.5 years of service (present at scene). The Lincoln County District Attorney's Office (LCDA), and Lincoln City Police Department, initiated a Major Crimes Team (MCT) call and requested the Oregon State Police lead the investigation, in cooperation with the Lincoln County District Attorney's Office pursuant to SB111 investigation protocols. OSP is being assisted by the Lincoln City Police Department (LCPD), Lincoln County Sheriff's Office (LCSO), Newport Police Department (NPD), Toledo Police Department (TPD), and the Lincoln County Medical Examiner's Office. The involved officers have been placed on paid administrative

leave pending the investigation as is standard procedure during these events.

### Otis Robbery Update

On March 30, 2020 at approximately 7:40 PM the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office received a report of a fight in progress near the 1400 block of North Bank Rd in Otis. The caller who was not involved in the fight reported 4-6 subjects fighting on the side of the road. The caller reported that there appeared to be two silver colored vehicles associated with the fight. The caller heard someone yelling "call the cops". Sgt. Karl Vertner was on patrol less than a mile from the location at the time of the reported incident. Upon his arrival, he determined both silver vehicles had left the scene. Sgt. Vertner contacted a group of three young adults. The group reported they had been robbed of their silver Toyota Camry at gunpoint. The group reported the suspects fled the scene eastbound on North Bank Rd. The victims reported that there were four suspects in total however only two of the suspects forced them out of their vehicle at gunpoint. Sgt. At approximately 8:02 PM Officers with the Lincoln City Police Department located the stolen Toyota Camry traveling on SW Bard Road in Lincoln City. Officers conducted a high risk traffic stop of the vehicle and apprehended Nicholas Allen Wright age 30 of Otis. Inside the vehicle officers located a loaded .22 caliber rifle. This rifle matched the description of the gun used in the crime. **On March 31**, at approximately 3:41 PM Deputy Dowty with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office located the outstanding suspect vehicle traveling southbound on Hwy 101 near Cape Foulweather. Deputy Dowty conducted a high risk traffic stop on the vehicle.

### Central Coast Pursuit

Lincoln City Police arrest wanted felon, 27-year-old Jacob Leeland Lunstedt of Salem, Oregon after he led them on a short vehicle pursuit. On Tuesday, April 7, 2020 at about 11:30 AM, Lincoln City Police received information from another law enforcement agency that a wanted subject may be in route to Lincoln City in a black Nissan Altima sedan. LCPD Officers obtained additional information regarding the vehicle and the driver, who was identified to be Jacob Leeland Lunstedt. It was determined that Lunstedt had three active felony warrants issued for his arrest. One warrant was for Probation Violation on Burglary II and Criminal Mischief II charges, one warrant was Probation Violation on a DUII charge and one warrant was for a number of new charges including Robbery I, unlawful use of a weapon x 3, felon in possession of a firearm, pointing a firearm at another x3, menacing x3, theft I, and unlawful use of a motor vehicle. Lincoln City Police officers and detec-

tives as well as Lincoln County Sheriff's deputies began actively attempting to locate the subject and vehicle. At about 1:20 PM, LCPD Detectives in unmarked vehicles located the suspect and vehicle as it traveled west on Hwy 18 before turning south onto Hwy 101. Detectives followed the vehicle as it turned south onto East Devils Lake Road and began coordinating with marked patrol units to attempt to stop the vehicle. Before a stop could take place the suspect turned his vehicle off of East Devils Lake Road onto the 1726 Forest Service Road and began fleeing from the detectives following him. LCPD Detectives initiated a pursuit of the vehicle as it traveled on the gravel forest service road at speeds of 30 to 40 miles-per-hour. LCPD Detectives began coordinating with the Lincoln County Sheriff's deputies, who set up vehicle spike strips at the junction of the forest service road and Bear Creek Road. The Sheriff Deputies were able to successfully deploy the spike strip tire deflation system, resulting in three of the four tires on the suspect vehicle hitting the sticks. After hitting the spike stripes, the pursuit continued onto Bear Creek Road as the tires on the suspect vehicle where deflating. With three flat tires on the suspect vehicle the driver finely stopped his vehicle on Bear Creek Road, ending the pursuit. A felony car stop was conducted and Lunstedt was taken into custody without further incident. In addition to the above mentioned charges, Jacob Leeland Lunstedt was charged with felony Eluding, Misdemeanor Driving While Suspended, and Reckless Driving. Lunstedt was transported from the scene to the Lincoln County Jail by a Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputy. The vehicle was towed from the location by Car Care Tow Pro. vallis resident, hiding in a wooded area adjacent to the residence, Hummel resisted arrest as he was taken into custody on multiple charges. Callers will need to provide their name, address, phone number, date of birth, and pharmacy name. The person on the prescription must be at the drop-off address and present valid identification to receive the prescription. Anyone participating in the service will also need to wear a mask and stay six feet away from the officer or deputy dropping the medication off. There is no fee for this service.

### Hand Grenade Found in Otis

On Friday April 17th, at approximately 4:30pm, an Otis resident called the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office to report



finding a World War II era hand grenade in the garage of her late father's house. The complainant told deputies she and her husband were going through old boxes belonging to her now deceased father when they found what appeared to be an intact and live hand grenade. Deputies responded to the residence and evaluated the device. Deputies confirmed the device was an original World War II era, MKIIA1 fragmentation grenade. The grenade was fully intact and appeared to be packaged in its original container. Oregon State Police Bomb Squad was called to the scene and they secured the device. Oregon State Police Bomb Squad seized the device and will be conducting a more thorough investi-

### Beach Trespassing

The two unidentified subjects were observed climbing over the chain link fence, passing over their surfboards then proceeding down to the beach. On the same date at about 3:38 pm, Deputy Dunteman observed two adult males matching the earlier description climbing back over the fence from the beach area. Max Gause and Konnor Owens were both cited into the Lincoln County Circuit Court on the charge of

### High-Speed Pursuit Central Coast

Lincoln City Police arrested 28-year-old Brandon Franklin Pruett of Salem, OR after he led them on a high-speed vehicle pursuit through the city. As Pruett reached the north city limits, he reached speeds in excess of 90 mile-per-hour. After Pruett failed to slow for a curve in the highway near NE Highland Rd, he lost control of his vehicle and crashed over the embankment on the east side of the highway. Pruett's vehicle landed about 30 feet down the embankment on its top. Pruett was trapped inside his wrecked vehicle until extricated by responding North Lincoln Fire & Rescue personnel. Pruett was transported to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital ER by PacificWest Ambulance for medical evaluation and treatment. After being treated for minor injuries, he was released from the hospital and taken into custody by Lincoln City Police and transported to the Lincoln City Police Department.

the domestic disturbance determined that Pruett had assaulted his girlfriend earlier that night. It was also determined that Pruett had been involved in passing counterfeit currency at a business in Lincoln City the day before. Pruett was eventually transported to the Lincoln County Jail and lodged on the criminal charges of Domestic Assault IV, Attempting to Elude-Felony, Reckless Driving, Recklessly Endangering Highway Workers, Driving While Suspended-Misdemeanor, Forgery I, and Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument. In addition, Pruett was issued citations for several traffic violations including Failing to Obey a Traffic Control Device, Failing to drive on the right, Failing to drive within the lane, and Speeding. Pruett was determined to be on post-prison supervision in Marion County for Unlawful Use of a Motor Vehicle. His Marion County Probation Officer was notified of the incident and a detainer was placed on Pruett so he would be held until being transported back to the Marion County Jail. ### Cold Water Drownings

SEATTLE — The Coast Guard reminds recreational boaters and paddlers to be aware of the risks involving cold water drownings. Even as the Pacific Northwest heads into warmer weather, it can still take many months for the rivers, lakes, and waterways to catch up. The water may be significantly colder than the outside ambient temperature. Always wear a life jacket while out on the water. There is no time to don a life jacket when an accident or emergency occurs. The best vest is the one you wear. “While hypothermia is a real concern, the true cause of most drownings this time of year is the rapid loss of one’s ability to swim or tread water due to cold water immersion,” said Capt. Nathan Coulter, chief of incident management for the 13th Coast Guard District. “Water temperatures in lakes and rivers are still near 50 degrees. If you enter water at those temperatures without a wet-suit or personal flotation de-

vice you may have less than 10 minutes to survive. Stay safe by dressing for the water temperature, not the air temperature.” According to Frank Golden and Michael Tipton, internationally recognized experts in cold-water survival, water below 60-degrees Fahrenheit is immediately life-threatening, and many Washington waterways stay below 60-degrees Fahrenheit year round. Sudden cold-water immersion makes it difficult, if not impossible, for boaters to keep their heads above water and stay afloat. Boating fatality statistics have shown that wearing a life jacket gives boaters the best chance of survival in the event of an accident, especially in cold water. Small vessels such as kayaks, canoes, rafts, row boats, paddle boards, sailing vessels and open motorboats less than 21-feet long are the most vulnerable to capsizing. Wear personal protective clothing, including dry or wet suits, clothing appropriate for a swim in the water temperature where you are venturing. Boaters don’t just need to wear the proper gear but also need to equip their boats with required and recommended safety gear, such as a hand-held VHF-FM marine-band radio, a personal locator beacon and flares. File a float plan. Take the time to write your contact information, with a waterproof permanent marker, on your kayak, paddle board or other personal water craft. A name, address and phone number can assist first responders in locating you, should your vessel be found. New and inexperienced boaters should seek education before heading out on the water. Safety courses are offered through the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and other state and local agencies, which are often offered at little or no cost.

### Steadfast Returns to Port

ASTORIA, Ore. – The crew of the Coast Guard Cutter Steadfast (WMEC 623) returned home Friday to Astoria following a 65-day counternarcotic patrol to the Eastern Pacific Ocean. The cutter

tels in the Eastern Pacific Ocean requires unity of effort in all phases from detection, monitoring and interdictions, to criminal prosecutions by international partners and U.S. Attorneys in districts across the nation. The law enforcement phase of counter-smuggling operations in the Eastern Pacific Ocean is conducted under the authority of the 11th Coast Guard District, headquartered in Alameda. Reliance-class cutters are 210-foot long, 34-foot wide and have a 1,100 long-ton displacement. The ships hold a crew of 76 and have served the nation for more than 50 years.

and determined she was deceased. Firefighters continued to work to fully extinguish and overhaul the fire. The house sustained heavy damage throughout the structure. The white vehicle was last seen headed east bound on Row River Rd. near Dorena Dam. Law enforcement officers have been searching the area along with K9 Teams but have not located the involved or the white vehicle. The Lane County Sheriff's Office is asking anyone who has information on this incident, including the whereabouts of the drivers of both vehicles and the location of the white vehicle, to call 541-682-4150 then press 1. Road Closure: Row River Rd. is temporarily closed between MP 0.5 and MP 1.5 as the investigation continues. We will provide updates as this case progresses, including when the road is reopened.

### Search for Missing Driver

The Lane County Sheriff's Office is seeking the public's assistance locating 35 year old Jonathan Eli Moore (Oakland, OR) who was involved in vehicle crash on 4/7/2020 on Row River Road (Lane County) where it is believed at least one shot was fired at Moore's 2001 Dodge Dakota. The Dodge was located at the crash scene unoccupied, and Moore's cell phone was found nearby. The second vehicle involved in the crash has also been located, and deputies are continuing to investigate to determine all of the details of the incident. Moore is believed to have left the scene on foot, and damage to the Dodge indicates that Moore may have suffered injuries from the crash. Law enforcement searched the area of the incident but have not been able to locate Moore. Moore's family reported him as missing to Sutherlin Police Department on 4/10/2020 after not hearing from him since April 7th when he left for Cottage Grove to visit a friend. Moore is described as a white male standing 5 feet 8 inches tall and weighing approximately 165 pounds with brown hair and blue eyes. He is known to have a short beard and mustache, and sometimes wears an earring in his left ear. Lane County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue has continued to search the area of the crash looking for Moore but have not found anything indicating where he went, and all leads to his whereabouts have been exhausted. Anyone who has seen Jonathan Eli Moore since April 7th, or knows his whereabouts, is asked to contact the Lane County Sheriff's Office at 541-682-4150 then press 1, and refer to Case # 20-2318, or contact the Sutherlin Police Department at 541-459-2211 and refer to Case #20-360.

land, arrested John W. Lubow last week based on federal charges out of Oregon for a series of three bank robberies that happened in Portland on February 14, 2020. According to the federal criminal complaint filed by the FBI, Lubow, age 55, robbed three banks in less than 40 minutes: 1:52 p.m. – Bank of the West, 419 NW Broadway, Portland; 2:17 p.m. – OnPoint Community Credit Union,

2011 W. Burnside Street, Portland; 2:29 p.m. – HomeStreet Bank, 22 NW 23rd Avenue, Portland. According to the charging document, Lubow threatened that he had a weapon in each of the robberies. Portland Police Bureau officers responded to each of the three robberies, and media attention generated by PPB caused multiple witnesses and tipsters to contact PPB and the FBI. Lubow is currently in custody in Maryland awaiting extradition to Oregon. A criminal complaint is only an accusation of a crime, and all defendants should be presumed innocent until proven guilty. The U.S. Attorney’s Office for the District of Oregon is prosecuting this case.
