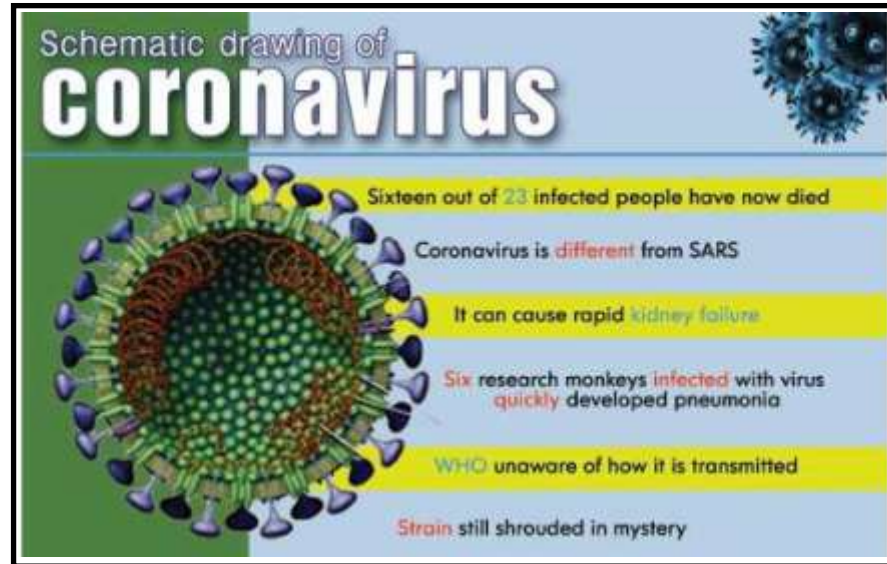

## FBI Reports... Rise in COVID-19 Fraud Schemes

Scammers are leveraging the COVID-19 pandemic to steal your money, your personal information, or both. Don't let them. Protect yourself and do your research before clicking on links purporting to provide information on the virus; donating to a charity online or through social media; contributing to a crowd-funding campaign; purchasing products online; or giving up your personal information in order to receive money or other benefits. The FBI advises you to be on the lookout for the following: **Fake CDC Emails** - Watch out for emails claiming to be from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or other organizations claiming to offer information on the virus. Do not click links or open attachments you do not recognize. Fraudsters can use links in emails to deliver malware to your computer to steal personal information or to lock your computer and demand payment. Be wary of websites and apps claiming to track COVID-19 cases worldwide. Criminals are using malicious websites to infect and lock devices until payment is received. **Phishing Emails** - Look out for phishing emails asking you to verify your personal information



in order to receive an economic stimulus check from the government. While talk of economic stimulus checks has been in the news cycle, government agencies are not sending unsolicited emails seeking your private information in order to send you money. Phishing emails may also claim to be related to: Charitable contributions; General financial relief; Airline carrier refunds; Fake cures and vaccines; Fake testing kits; Counterfeit Treatments or Equipment. Be cautious of anyone selling products that claim to prevent, treat, diagnose, or cure COVID-19. Be alert to counterfeit products such as sanitizing products and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE),

including N95 respirator masks, goggles, full face shields, protective gowns, and gloves. More information on unapproved or counterfeit PPE can be found at [www.cdc.gov/niosh](http://www.cdc.gov/niosh). You can also find information on the U.S. Food and Drug Administration website, [www.fda.gov](http://www.fda.gov), and the Environmental Protection Agency website, [www.epa.gov](http://www.epa.gov). Report counterfeit products at [www.ic3.gov](http://www.ic3.gov) and to the National Intellectual Property Rights Coordination Center at [iprcenter.gov](http://iprcenter.gov). If you are looking for accurate and up-to-date information on COVID-19, the CDC has posted extensive guidance and information that is updated frequently. The best sources for authoritative information on COVID-19 are [www.cdc.gov](http://www.cdc.gov) and [www.coronavirus.gov](http://www.coronavirus.gov). You may also consult your primary care physician for guidance. The FBI is reminding you to always use good cyber hygiene and security measures. By re-

membering the following tips, you can protect yourself and help stop criminal activity: Do not open attachments or click links within emails from senders you don't recognize. Do not provide your username, password, date of birth, social security number, financial data, or other personal information in response to an email or robocall. Always verify the web address of legitimate websites and manually type them into your browser. Check for misspellings or wrong domains within a link (for example, an address that should end in a ".gov" ends in ".com" instead). If you believe you are the victim of an Internet scam or cyber crime, or if you want to report suspicious activity, please visit the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center at [www.ic3.gov](http://www.ic3.gov).

ficer observed the stolen van leaving the parking lot of Cascade Farm and Outdoor. The stolen van was towing behind it the stolen "PJ" trailer and Polaris Razor. Officers conducted a Traffic stop and two subjects inside of the van were detained. ### COVID-19 Coos Bay Police Department's Temporary Modification in Police Services

Message from the Coos Bay Police Department - The Coos Bay Police Department recognizes that COVID-19 may impact the City of Coos Bay. The Coos Bay Police Department remains fully operational, staffed, and ready to respond to the needs of the community. Coos Bay Officers will continue to respond to all emergencies, in-progress calls, and other priority responses. The Coos Bay Police Department is committed to providing high quality law enforcement services to our public. In an effort to minimize possible exposure and to protect essential emergency services,

we will be implementing a temporary modification in call response and services. The Coos Bay Police Department will authorize their patrol officers to handle all non-priority calls via phone whenever possible. This means, in most cases unless you are reporting an in-progress crime or a crime serious in nature, i.e. felony person crimes, the dispatcher in whom you are reporting your crime to will have an officer call you back to take the report and answer any questions you may have. The case officer will then conduct any further investigation as needed. In addition to our modified call response, we will be temporarily suspending some of our low

priority services to include: station tours, ride-a-longs, and public engagement programs. The Coos Bay Police Department Administration's priority is to keep our staff healthy so that we are able to deliver quality emergency services when needed. We want to thank the citizens of Coos Bay for their understanding and support with our temporarily modified services. We look forward to returning to normal operations soon.

### Coos Co. Sheriff's Office

### Burglar Caught Inside Boys and Girls Club

### Criminal Trespass

NBPD release - On 03/01/2020 at 2:45 PM, North Bend Police Dispatch received a report of a Female Victim in distress asking the Reporting Party to call the police for her. The Reporting Party advised Dispatch the Victim had a Male Suspect inside of her residence in the 1900 block of Broadway Avenue. The Reporting Party said the Victim told her the Suspect was armed with a "gun" and "nun chucks" and was "freaking her out". Police Officers arrived in the area and made contact with the Reporting Party. After a short time, the Officers on scene were able to make phone contact with the Victim. The Victim was able to get out of the residence and met with the Officers. The Victim said the Suspect had just showed up to her house the night before and refused to leave. The Victim said she did not know who the Suspect was and could not provide his name. The Victim said she knew the Suspect had at least one "hunting rifle" on the front porch and possible had more inside. The Victim said the suspect also

had nun chucks in his back pocket. The Victim told the Officers that no other persons were in the residence besides the Suspect. Officers had observed the Suspect exit the house onto the front porch multiple times but waited for the Suspect to create distance between the porch and the reported weapon. Officers were able to take the Suspect into custody without incident. The suspect did have nun chucks sticking out of his back pocket when he was arrested. The reported hunted rifle was located on the front porch and was discovered to be a BB gun rifle. The Suspect was later identified as John McCafee DOB:10/05/1963. McCafee was transported to and logged in the Coos County Jail on charges of Criminal Trespass 1. The Investigation is continuing.

### Crash

No one was injured when a VW crashed into a vehicle in downtown Coos Bay Saturday, March 7, and ended up in a local restaurant. According to reports, the driver had a medical issue and lost control of the vehicle while driving south on So. Broadway Ave. (Hwy. 101) and crashed into Shark Bites Restaurant.

No citations were issued and the restaurant remained open while repairs were made.

### Stolen Vehicle

CCSO release - On February 28, 2020, at about 1236 am, Coos County Deputies were dispatched to State Hwy 101 near Hackett Lane in Coos Bay for a vehicle parked on the railroad tracks. The vehicle was identified as having been reported stolen. Upon the Deputies arrival, the Deputies found a silver 2011 Chrysler Regal sitting on top of the railroad tracks with significant damage to the vehicle. The vehicle had been traveling southbound on State Highway 101, when the driver lost control of the vehicle and crossed over the oncoming lane and continued until the vehicle struck the railroad tracks. The driver then attempted to drive the vehicle southbound

on the railroad tracks before ultimately abandoning the vehicle. Attached is a photograph of the individuals who had been driving the vehicle. The Coos County Sheriff's Office would like help identifying the two individuals in the photo.

### Stolen Vehicle Update & Arrest

CCSO release - On February 28, 2020, at about 12:36 am, the Coos County Sheriff's Office responded to a report of a vehicle on the railroad tracks near the intersection of Hackett Lane and State Highway 101, Coos bay, Oregon. Deputies discovered the vehicle had been traveling south bound on State Highway 101, when the vehicle crossed over the oncoming North bound lane and left the roadway. After the vehicle left the roadway, the vehicle struck the railroad tracks. Despite significant vehicle damage, the driver attempted to continue to drive the vehicle southbound on the railroad tracks. Deputies located receipts inside the vehicle and obtained video footage of the driver and passenger of the vehicle from multiple McDonalds in

the Coos County area. Deputies contacted the registered owner, who advised the Deputies he had been attempting to sell the vehicle. He said a female by the name of Tiffany, whom he had met at the Casino, had come to his residence and said she knew a buyer for the vehicle. The registered owner said on about January 28, 2020, Tiffany left with his vehicle to show the buyer and Tiffany said she would be right back, but never returned. The registered owner stated he had not reported the vehicle as stolen due to him being under the impression it had become a civil issue, because he allowed her to leave with the vehicle to show the buyer. The registered owner was advised he could report the vehicle as stolen. After posting photographs of the individuals on social media, Deputies received a call from a Citizen who believed he knew who the male and female were in the photographs. The Deputy asked the Citizen if he knew a Tiffany who was often at the Casino. The Citizen stated Tiffany Zierke, who is 31 years old, could be involved. On March 14, 2020, Deputies contacted Tiffany Louise Zeirke at her residence, located on West Beaver Hill in Bandon. After Tiffany was shown the photographs of her in the stolen vehicle, Tiffany admitted she was the female in the photographs in the passenger seat. Tiffany was transported to the Coos County Jail, where she was booked in on the charge of Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle. The Coos County Sheriff's Office would



like to thank everyone who assisted in identifying the suspect and in resolving this issue.

### Probation Violation

Red Dyke Road & Hobby Lane, CCSO release - On March 6, 2020, at about 1911 hours, a Sergeant from the Coos County Sheriff's Office responded to the area of Red Dyke Road and Hobby Lane in Coos Bay, Coos County, Oregon. The Coos County Dispatch Center had received a report that 33 year old David Edgerton was at a residence near the location. Edgerton was transported to the Coos County Jail.

### K9 Odin

On March 5th 2020, a Coos County Sheriff's Deputy contacted two vehicles parked in the middle of the entrance road to the South Slough Estuary. During the contact one of the individuals, 21 year old Alexis A. Carstensen of Coos Bay was arrested on outstanding warrants. Also during the investigation it was learned the one of the vehicles blocking the road, a ford pick-up was stolen. The man who was seated in the driver's seat upon contact identified as 35 year old Kyle L. Golden of Coos

Bay, fled from deputies on foot after the status of the vehicle was revealed by the Coos County Sheriff's Office Dispatch Center. K9 Odin was called to conduct a criminal apprehension track for Mr. Golden on the charge of Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle. During the track for Mr. Golden, K9 Odin sustained an injury in his back left leg. The track was immediately suspended and probable cause was placed out for Mr. Golden's arrest. K9 Odin was immediately transported to Hansen-Meekins Veterinary Hospital for treatment and evaluation. K9 Odin was diagnosed with a torn Anterior cruciate ligament injury which is similar to the (torn ACL) in humans. Odin was has been prescribed the appropriate medications and rest pending his evaluation at the Oregon Veterinary Referral Associates on March 25th, with surgical repair likely following a short time later. The Coos County Sheriff's Office would like to thank everyone for their outpouring of support for Odin and want to ensure you we believe he will have a successfully surgery and be back to duty in no time. We have been asked about donations for Odin's medical care and are providing the following in response to these requests. 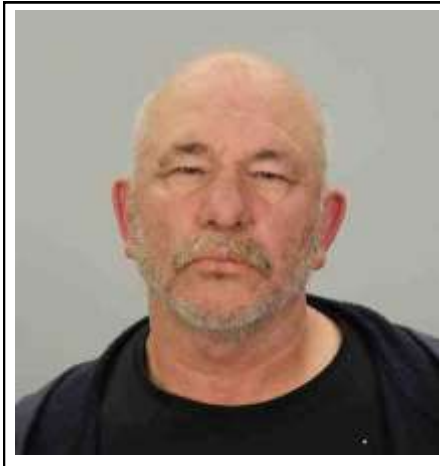

Libby Ln., Coos Bay, CCSO release - On March 4th 2020 at approximately 4:16 p.m. a Coos County Sheriff's Deputy responded to 91031 Libby Lane, Coos Bay, Coos County, Oregon to a report of a violation of a restraining order. Upon arrival the deputy located 56 year old Geronimo Waldorf near 91031



Libby Lane. A record check revealed Mr. Waldorf was the respondent on a restraining order, preventing him from being within 150 feet of 91031 Libby Lane. Between this and other violations of the restraining order, Mr. Waldorf was subsequently arrested. Mr. Waldorf was transported to the Coos County Jail where he is being held on bail.

**Domestic Disturbance**

Lakeside, CCSO release - On March 12, 2020 at about 7:04 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office received the report a Domestic Disturbance involving two males allegedly pointing firearms at each other in the area of N 11St in Lakeside. Deputies arrived on scene and during the investigation it was found that Mr. Champagne was wielding a firearm at another family member. The firearm was seized for evidence. Further investigation revealed that Mr. Champagne was a Felon from another state. Deputies located two more firearms inside Mr. Champagne's residence. Family members stated they knew he was a Felon and could not have firearms in his possession. Mr. Champagne was arrested and booked into the Coos County Jail for Felon In Possession-Firearm x 3. Mr. Champagne will also be referred to the

District Attorney's Office for Unlawful Possession of Firearms.

**Coast**

**Boating Fatal on Devils Lake**

On March 21, 2020, at approximately 1:00pm witnesses on the shores of Devil's Lake in Lincoln City called 911 to report a person in the water and a boat attempting to retrieve them. Witnesses described the subject as being in distress prior to seeing him go under the water. North Lincoln Fire, Lincoln City Police and the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office Marine Patrol responded to the scene. North Lincoln Fire arrived and deployed their rescue skis. Rescuers contacted two occupants in the boat and determine Steve Ton, 60, of Seattle WA, was missing and last seen going under the water. Rescuers located Ton approximately 15 feet under water and were able to retrieve him. Ton was transported to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital where he was pronounced deceased. Lincoln County Sheriff's Office Marine Patrol conducted an investigation and learned a 17 foot Alumacraft boat operated by Michael Mascio, 57, of Lincoln

City, was operating offshore from Holmes Park when the boat made a turn and crossed its own wake. During the maneuver, Ton, who was seated near the transom of the boat, fell overboard. Investigation revealed Mascio turned the boat around and motored over to Ton. Mascio left the controls of the boat and dove into the water. Mascio was unsuccessful in his attempts to rescue Ton. Mascio was also transported to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital with non-life-threatening injuries sustained during the rescue attempt. During the investigation it was revealed there were two type III life jackets on board the vessel, but none in use during the incident. Mascio was issued a violation citation for insufficient number of personal flotation devices. The investigation determined there was no criminal conduct during the incident.

**Plane Flips on Emergency Landing**

The pilot was not injured after a single-person prop airplane flipped over during an emergency landing Feb. 22<sup>nd</sup> near Tenmile Creek in the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area (ODNRA) near the Coos-Douglas county lines. According to a report from the Oregon State Police, troopers used ATV to reach the plane after the pilot hiked out of the wreck area and called for help about

5:30 p.m. The plane was recovered during daylight hours.

**Stuck in the Mountains**

A 26-year old San Jose male, who went exploring on the North Oregon Coast in his 2008 Toyota Highlander, got stuck in the mud of the Tillamook County wildlands and spent Sunday night, March 8, in his SUV. According to reports, Brian Werst followed a Google Map course along the top of a muddy mountain ridge with washouts. He got stuck and walked out the next day until he found cellphone service and contacted the authorities. Werst was not in any physical or mental distress and had food and water with him. However, it took a tow truck more than an hour to pull his vehicle free of the mud.

**Armed Robbery Otis**

On March 30, 2020 at approximately 7:40 PM the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office received a report of a fight in progress near the 1400 block of North Bank Rd in Otis. The caller who was not involved in the fight reported 4-6 subjects fighting on the side of the road. The caller reported that there appeared to be two silver colored vehicles associated with the fight. The caller heard someone yelling "call the cops". Sgt. Karl Vertner was on patrol less than a mile from the location at the time of the reported incident. Upon his arrival, he determined both silver vehicles had left

the scene. Sgt. Vertner contacted a group of three young adults. The group reported they had been robbed of their silver Toyota Camry at gunpoint. The group reported the suspects fled the scene eastbound on North Bank Rd. The victims reported that there were four suspects in total however only two of the suspects forced them out of their vehicle at gunpoint. Sgt. Vertner broadcasted an Attempt To Locate for the silver Toyota Camry and a silver Dodge Challenger. During the course of this investigation law enforcement officers learned both parties were acquainted, and this was not a random act. At approximately 8:02 PM Officers with the Lincoln City Police Department located the stolen Toyota Camry traveling on SW Bard Road in Lincoln City. Officers conducted a high risk traffic stop of the vehicle and apprehended Nicholas Allen Wright age 30 of Otis. Inside the vehicle officers located a loaded .22 caliber rifle. This rifle matched the description of the gun used in the crime. On March 31, at approximately 3:41 PM Deputy Dowty with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office located the outstanding suspect vehicle traveling southbound on Hwy 101 near Cape Foulweather. Deputy Dowty conducted a high risk traffic stop on the vehicle. The driver, Ruben Zamudio Jr. age 30 of Newport was taken into custody for his role in the robbery. On April 1, 2020, at approximately 9:30 PM Deputies with the Yamhill County Sheriff's Office, assisted by Polk County Sheriff's Office and Grand Ronde Tribal Police, located and apprehended the third outstanding suspect, Kimmia Kay Whittlinger, age 26 of Lincoln City. She will be transported to Lincoln County Jail and lodged



on Robbery charges. Nicholas Allen Wright is currently lodged at the Lincoln County Jail on Robbery and related Weapon charges. Ruben Zamudio Jr. is currently lodged at the Lincoln County Jail on Robbery charges. The fourth outstanding suspect, Jacob Leeland Lunstedt, age 27, should be considered armed and dangerous. ### USCG Icebreaker back

SEATTLE — The 150-member crew of the U.S. Coast Guard Cutter Polar Star returned Wednesday, March 24, to their

homeport of Seattle following a 123-day deployment to Antarctica in support of Operation Deep Freeze. This mission marks the Polar Star's 23rd journey to Antarctica in support of Operation Deep Freeze, an annual joint military service mission to resupply the United States Antarctic stations, in support of the National Science Foundation – the lead agency for the United States Antarctic Program. This year also marks the 63rd

iteration of the annual operation. The Polar Star crew departed Seattle on Nov. 27, 2019, for their sixth deployment in as many years and traveled more than 26,350 miles through the North Pacific, South Pacific, Indian and Southern Oceans. In the Southern Ocean, the crew travelled through nearly 500 miles of pack ice and broke through 23 miles of fast ice in order to create a nearly 18-square-mile navigable channel to McMurdo Station, Antarctica. Because of the efforts of the Polar Star crew, two resupply vessels and one tanker travelled to McMurdo Station unescorted in order to refuel and resupply U.S. Antarctic stations. This year's operation required the construction of a temporary, modular mobile causeway to replace an ice pier, which disintegrated during Operation Deep Freeze 2018-2019. The modular pier required a three-day construction period prior to the offload of supplies, followed by a three-day deconstruction period at the conclusion of the mission. Three resupply ships required 23 days to offload 19.6 million pounds of cargo and 7.6 million gallons of fuel during this year's operation, more than doubling the operation duration and capacity as previous years. Together, the three ships delivered enough fuel and critical supplies to sustain NSF operations throughout the year until Polar Star returns in 2021. Among the cargo offloaded were construction materials for a five-year, \$460 million Antarctica Infrastructure Modernization for Science (AIMS) project to recapitalize McMurdo Station, South Pole Station and other American outposts on the continent. Additionally, the Polar Star crew also supported a team of U.S. government officials from the U.S. Department of State, National Science Foundation, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and U.S. Coast Guard who conducted a five-day inspection of foreign research stations, installations and equipment in Antarctica. The United States continues to promote Antarctica's status as a continent reserved for peace and science in accordance with the provisions of the Antarctic Treaty of 1959. The inspection serves to verify compliance with the Antarctic Treaty and its Environmental Protocol, including provisions prohibit-

ing military measures and mining, as well as provisions promoting safe station operation and sound environmental practices. The team inspected three stations: Mario Zucchelli (Italy), Jang Bogo (South Korea), and Inexpressible Island (China). This was the fifteenth inspection of foreign research stations by the United States in Antarctica and the first since 2012. Inspections emphasize all of Antarctica is accessible to interested countries despite territorial claims and reinforce the importance of compliance with the Antarctic Treaty's arms control provisions. The United States will present its report on the inspection at the next Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meeting in Helsinki, Finland, in May 2020. "I am very proud of the tenacity of this Polar Star crew," said Coast Guard Capt. Greg Stanlik, commanding officer of the Polar Star. "158 crew members earned the Antarctic Service Medal during Operation Deep Freeze 2020. The words inscribed on the back of the medal are Courage, Sacrifice and Devotion. Each and every one exhibited the courage to make this 123-day Antarctic voyage, sacrificed time away from their loved ones and devoted themselves to executing this nationally critical mission." Commissioned in 1976, the Polar Star is the United States' only operational heavy icebreaker, capable of breaking ice up to 21 feet thick. Reserved for Operation Deep Freeze each year, the ship spends the winter breaking ice near Antarctica, and when the mission is complete, returns to dry dock in order to conduct critical maintenance and repairs in preparation for the next Operation Deep Freeze mission. If a catastrophic event, such as getting stuck in the ice, were to happen to the Coast Guard Cutter Healy (WAGB 20) in the Arctic or to the Polar Star near Antarctica, the U.S. Coast Guard is left without a self-rescue capability. By contrast, Russia currently operates more than 50 icebreakers – several of which are nuclear powered. The

Pascagoula, Mississippi, a contract for the design and construction of the Coast Guard's lead polar security cutter, which will also be homeported in Seattle. The contract also includes options for the construction of two additional PSCs. "Replacing the Coast Guard's icebreaker fleet is paramount," said Vice Adm. Linda Fagan, commander of the Coast Guard's Pacific Area. "Our ability to clear a channel and allow for the resupply of the United States' Antarctic stations is essential for continued national presence and influence on the continent."

### Medevac off Florence

FLORENCE, Ore. — The Coast Guard medically evacuated a possible stroke victim off a boat Sunday afternoon, March 15, near the Siuslaw River entrance in Florence. A 47-foot Motor Lifeboat crew from Coast Guard Station Siuslaw River rendezvoused with a 24-foot recreational boat about 5 miles southwest of the river entrance and transferred a 55-year-old man onto the 47-foot MLB. The man was transferred to emergency medical services at Station Siuslaw and transported him to Peace Harbor Hospital. At 1:30 p.m., a watchstander at Coast Guard Sector North Bend answered a call for help from the operators of the recreational vessel via VHF-FM radio channel 16 and immediately directed the launch of the Siuslaw River boat crew and an MH-65 Dolphin helicopter aircrew from Sector North Bend. The 47-foot MLB crew arrived on scene and transferred the patient at 1:55 p.m. and returned to the dock at 2:08 p.m. The man was transferred to EMS at 2:24 p.m. The sea and wind conditions on scene were 4-foot seas and winds of 5 m.p.h.

### USCG Rescue off Oregon

SEATTLE — A Coast Guard aircrew hoisted two people and their dog early Saturday morning, Feb. 29 from their boat several miles off the coast of north-west Oregon. On Friday at 2:30 p.m., watchstanders at the Coast Guard Sector Columbia River Command Center received notification that a 56-year-old female and a 55-year-old male aboard a 44-foot recreational boat were beset by weather and had concerns about crossing the bar. A Coast Guard Station Cape Disappointment 47-foot Motor Lifeboat crew launched and arrived on scene at 3:45 p.m. and helped assess the situation. The rescue crew determined that it was unsafe to tow the vessel across the bar due to stability issues and deteriorating conditions. The crew instructed the boaters to don life jackets and remain offshore until weather improved. The rescue crew then returned to base. The boaters were kept on a communications schedule with the sector watchstanders.

Another rescue crew from Station Cape Disappointment aboard an MLB launched several hours later and arrived on scene at 2:45 a.m., Saturday. It was again determined too unsafe to tow the vessel. On scene weather conditions at the time were 25 mph winds, 12-foot seas, air temp of 42o F, and the sea temp at 48o F. A hoist was decided as the safest method to rescue the boaters. The MLB crew remained nearby to assist with the rescue. A Coast Guard aircrew aboard an MH-60 Jayhawk from Sector Columbia River launched and at 4:15 a.m., the crew arrived on scene. The rescue swimmer was lowered to the vessel and assisted the woman who was hoisted into a rescue basket. Due to worsening conditions, the rescue swimmer had the man and dog enter the water to be hoisted into the helicopter. The man and dog were then safely hoisted. At 5:45 a.m., the helicopter landed back at Sector Columbia River. The survivors declined medical services and were picked up by a relative. The abandoned vessel is currently offshore near the coast of Seaside, Oregon. A special marine information broadcast has been issued to alert boaters in the area.

### USCG Assist

US Coast Guard Sector North Bend is known for its rescues at sea and assistances along the Oregon Coast, but on Saturday night, Feb. 29, a helicopter crew went an extra step by assisting a young girl injured in a vehicle accident in Coquille. The six-year old was flown over 150-miles to Oregon Health Sciences University in Portland “to receive the highest level of care,” according to reports.

### Young Crash Victim Dies at OHSU

The six-year old girl evacuated by a U.S. Coast Guard helicopter to Oregon Health Sciences University in Portland following a two-vehicle accident in Coquille Saturday evening, Feb. 29, passed away Monday, March 2, due to her injuries. Madelyn Sokol was a passenger in one of the involved vehicles about 5:45 p.m. at West Central & Hwy. 42. Two other passengers were treated and released, while a driver and a four-year old were

treated for minor injuries. The Coos Co. Major Crash Team was activated to investigate the fatal accident. The USCG stepped in when other area ambulance services were not available.

### Fatal on Hwy. 138E, MP 8

On March 20, 2020 at about 6:00 p.m., Oregon State Police (OSP) troopers and emergency personnel responded to a reported two vehicle crash on Highway 138E near milepost 8. ### IRS: Do Not Fall Victim to a COVID-19 Scam

News Release from U.S. Attorney's Office - District of Oregon - Beware of scammers trying to get your personal information or your COVID-19 Economic Impact Payment! The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will begin to distribute COVID-19 Economic Impact Payments in a matter of weeks. For most Americans, this will be a direct deposit into your bank account. For the unbanked, elderly or other groups that have traditionally received tax refunds via paper check, they will receive their economic impact payments in this manner as well. With any good news story from the IRS, comes an opportunity for criminals and scammers to take advantage of the American public. Scammers may try to get you to sign over your check to them. Scammers may use this as an opportunity to get you to "verify" your filing information in order to receive your money, using your personal information to file false tax returns in an identity theft scheme. Between these two schemes, everyone receiving an economic impact payment is at risk. The Internal Revenue Service - Criminal Investigation (IRS-CI) is working tirelessly alongside our civil counterparts and law enforcement partners to identify scams and halt wrongdoers from taking advantage of the American people.



“Taxpayers should be extra vigilant for unsolicited phone calls or emails concerning their economic impact payments,” said Justin Campbell, Special Agent in Charge of the Seattle Field Office for IRS-CI. “The IRS will not call or email you about your payment. IRS-



Criminal Investigation is stepping up our efforts in coordination with the Department of Justice to aggressively investigate anyone that seeks to defraud our community members during this crisis.” “We are aware of instances of consumer fraud stemming from the COVID-19 public health emergency. While Americans work to protect themselves and their loved ones from the threat of COVID-19, some individuals are actively trying to profit off of this emergency,” said U.S. Attorney Billy J. Williams. “If you or someone you know believe you’ve been the target or victim of an outbreak-related fraud scheme, please contact law enforcement immediately.” Top Line Message from the Internal Revenue Service - The IRS will deposit your economic impact payment into the direct deposit account your previously provide on your tax return (or, in the alternative, send you a paper check). The IRS will not call and ask you to verify your payment details. Do not give out your bank account, debit account, or PayPal account information – even if someone claims it is necessary to get your economic impact payment. Beware of this scam. If you receive a call, do not engage with scammers or thieves. Just hang up. If you receive texts or emails claiming that you can get your money faster by sending personal information or clicking on links, delete them. Do not click on any links in those emails. Reports are also swirling about bogus checks. If you receive a “check” in the mail now, it’s fraud – it will take the Treasury Department a few weeks to distribute the payments. If you receive a “check” for an odd amount (especially one with cents), or a check that requires

that you verify the check online or by calling a number, it’s fraud. Beware of Scams and Schemes - IRS-Impersonation Telephone Scams - An aggressive and sophisticated phone scam targeting taxpayers, including recent immigrants, have been making the rounds throughout the country. Callers claim to be employees of the IRS, but are not. Victims are told they owe money to the IRS and it must be paid promptly through a pre-loaded debit card or wire transfer. If the victim refuses to cooperate, they are then threatened with arrest, deportation or suspension of a business or driver’s license. Or, victims may be told they have a refund due to try to trick them into sharing private information. With COVID-19 scams, they may urge you to pay this fake “debt” with your economic impact check. For those who receive an actual check, they may ask you to endorse it and forward to them for “payment of past debts.” Remember: Scammer Change Tactics – Variations of the IRS impersonation scam continue year-round and they tend to peak when scammers find prime opportunities to strike – like the new economic impact check being sent. Surge in Email, Phishing and Malware Schemes - Scam emails are designed to trick taxpayers into thinking these are official communications from the IRS, tax industry professionals or tax software companies. These phishing emails ask taxpayers about a wide range of topics – related to refunds, filing status, ordering transcripts, and verifying PIN information – in order to steal your personal information or file tax returns. When people click on links from these phishing emails, they are taken to sites designed to imitate an official-looking website, such as IRS.gov. The sites may also carry malware, which can infect people’s computers to steal their files or record their keystrokes. Also be aware of email phishing scams that appear to be from the IRS and include a link to a bogus web site intended to mirror the official IRS web site. These emails contain the direction “you are to update your IRS e-file immediately.” The emails mention USA.gov and IRS.gov (without a dot between “IRS” and “gov”). Don’t get scammed. Among the items stolen was Oregon license plate number D64665. This is a yellow-colored permanent-issue disabled vehicle plate with dark blue lettering. Citizens are advised to use caution and should not approach or attempt to apprehend Mercier.

### \$3,500 reward for information on bighorn ram poached at wildlife area

March 30, 2020 - TROY, Ore.— The reward now stands at \$3,500 for information leading to a citation or arrest in the case of a bighorn sheep poached at Wenaha Wildlife Area in late January. The Oregon Hunters Association (OHA) would like the perpetrators brought to justice. Yamhill, Josephine, Bend, Umpqua, and Rogue Valley Chapters have contributed \$500 each to the Turn In Poachers (TIP) Fund to increase the reward to \$3,500. To provide information on this case or any poaching, call the Turn In Poachers (TIP) line by dialing \*OSP or 800-452-7888. The poaching was first announced by OSP in late January. A severed ear and damaged GPS collar were all that were found after the bighorn sheep was poached near Troy. The GPS collar transmitted that the animal had died on Sunday, Jan. 26.

The severed ear, which has an identification tag, is from an adult ram. The GPS tracking collar, which was programmed to indicate mortality if it didn't move for nine hours, had been cut loose from around the animal's neck. Both were found lying on the ground near a feeding station. Forensics evidence indicates the animal was shot, according to Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife Sergeant Chris Hawkins. Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife staff provide winter feed for a variety of animals at the Wenaha Wildlife Area, where the crime occurred. Elk, deer, bighorn sheep and mountain goats all benefit from hay made available when snow cover limits winter grazing areas. However, the trek toward food makes the animals' presence predictable, which creates opportunities for poachers. When ODFW Wildlife Technician Sharon Curtis went to investigate a mortality signal from the GPS collar, she expected to find a sheep carcass. Instead she found the collar, which had been cut, and the ear with tag still intact. Melted snow had flattened the grass, but she could see where the carcass had been dragged toward the road. She found two spots of blood and several tufts of fur below the collar. In 2018, the most recent year for which statistics have been compiled, three bighorn sheep are known to have been poached. Others likely were poached but either were not found or lacked evidence of a crime. The Oregon's Stop Poaching Campaign is a collaboration among hunters, conservationists, land owners and recreationists to increase reporting of wildlife crimes through the TIP Line and protect reduce poaching.

### 31 Lbs. Meth Confiscated in Salem

A Salem woman, Maria Gallegos-Mendoza, age 45, faces federal drug distribution charges following an investigation by the Salem Police Street Crime Unit. On March 19, 2020, Salem Police Department Street Crimes Unit, with assistance from FBI and DEA task force partners – arrested Gallegos-

Mendoza and another suspect during the service of multiple search warrants in Salem. During the course of the search, the task force seized 31 pounds of methamphetamine and approximately \$50,000 in cash. The FBI charged Gallegos-Mendoza via a federal criminal complaint on March 24, 2020, with possession with the intent to distribute methamphetamine and conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine. According to the complaint, Gallegos-Mendoza told investigators that she had been selling methamphetamine for two years in

amounts of 3.5 grams to one pound. The complaint also details that Gallegos-Mendoza would sell pound quantities of methamphetamine for approximately \$2,500 each. On March 25, 2020, Gallegos-Mendoza made her first appearance in federal court. A criminal complaint is only an accusation of a crime, and all defendants should be presumed innocent until proven guilty. This case is being prosecuted by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Oregon.

### Two Canadians Sentenced over Bitcoin Scam

PORTLAND, Ore.— Karanjit Singh Khatkar, 23, and Jagroop Singh Khatkar, 24, residents of Surrey, British Columbia, Canada, were sentenced today to 24 months in federal prison and three years' supervised release for conspiring to commit wire fraud and money laundering in a scheme to steal bitcoin from an Oregon resident. According to the indictment, beginning in October 2017 and continuing until August 2018, the defendants used a Twitter account with the name @HitBTCassist to trick victims into thinking they were communicating with a customer service representative from HitBTC, a Hong Kong-based online platform used to exchange virtual

currency. HitBTC provides its customers with web-based “wallets” to store virtual currency and make transactions. Using the fraudulent Twitter account, the defendants responded to the Oregon vic-

tim’s questions about withdrawing virtual currency from her HitBTC account. The defendants convinced the victim to send information they could use to log on and take over her email, HitBTC and

Kraken accounts. Kraken is a U.S.-based online platform that offers services similar to HitBTC. The defendants initiated transfers of 23.2 bitcoins from the victim’s HitBTC account to Karanjit Khatkar’s Kraken account. Karanjit Khatkar in turn transferred approximately 11.6 in stolen bitcoins to Jagroop Khatkar’s Kraken account. Two days after illegally accessing the victim’s account, Karanjit Khatkar bought a Mercedes-Benz with \$56,598 in Canadian dollars. The Khatkars also traveled to casinos. Karanjit Khatkar gambled with tens of thousands of dollars while staying at high-end casinos in Las Vegas, Nevada. On July 18, 2019, Karanjit Khatkar was arrested upon arrival at the McCarran International Airport in Las Vegas and later ordered detained pending trial. Jagroop Khatkar appeared voluntarily for his arraignment and change of plea on December 16, 2019. On December 16, 2019, the Khatkars pleaded guilty to conspiring to commit wire fraud and money laundering. As mandated by their plea agreements, the Khatkars delivered a check of \$142,349 as a prepayment of restitution to their victim at their change of plea hearing. At sentencing, the Khatkars were ordered to pay an additional \$42,162 to their victim for a total restitution order of \$184,511. This case was investigated by FBI and prosecuted by Quinn P. Harrington and Julia E. Jarrett, Assistant U.S. Attorneys for the

### New Data on Human Trafficking in Oregon

(Portland, Ore.) – The State of Oregon identified 746 victims of human trafficking across Oregon in a 12-month period between October 2018 and October 2019. The new data was collected by the Oregon Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS). An awards ceremony, held in January, helped raise awareness about Oregon’s current intervention efforts and recognize the work of Oregonians who are taking a trauma informed and victim-centered approach to trafficking intervention.
