Move Over applies to all vehicles on side of the road showing lights or distress

SALEM - Construction season is in full swing, and most everyone knows that when you see orange barrels, cones or signs, you're coming up on a work zone and you need to slow down. But not everyone knows about our Move Over law. In Oregon, you must move over to a non-adjacent lane - or slow down by at least five miles under the speed limit - when approaching the rear of any vehicle stopped and displaying warning or hazard lights or otherwise indicating distress, not just emergency vehicles. Maintenance crews, utility companies and other firms are often working alongside the road with warning or hazard lights on, and this would also signal that motorists need to move over. The fine for this violation is \$265 (or \$525 if the location is within a safety corridor, school zone or work zone). Takeaway: be alert, motorists - your job when you are behind the wheel is to drive safely. That means following the laws, and now you can say you know about, and follow, this one: always Move Over, if you can do so safely, or slow down 5 MPH below the posted speed.

Unsolicited Seeds from China

The Oregon Department of Agriculture

(ODA) is aware that people across the country, including Oregon, are receiving unsolicited packages of seed from China in recent days. Often the package is labeled as jewelry and the recipients say they did not order jewelry or seeds. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is warning Americans not to plant the unsolicited package of seeds. ODA is working closely with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspections Service (APHIS) and the Department of Homeland Security's Customs and Border Protection on this issue. The goal is to collect the seeds and test them to determine if they are a concern to agriculture or the environment. Anyone who receives an unsolicited package of seeds from China should immediately contact their state department of agriculture or the APHIS state plant health director and follow these steps: Save the seeds and the package they came in, including the mailing label. Do not open the seed packets. Do not plant any of the seeds. If the packets are already opened, place all materials (seeds and packaging) into a zip lock bag and seal it. If the seeds have been planted, leave the seeds/plants in the ground until you receive further instruction from your state department of agriculture or APHIS. In Oregon, if you have received a package of seeds that you did not order, please include the packaging that includes the return address and send the shipment to: Oregon Department of Agriculture, Plant Protec-

tion and Conservation, 635 Capitol Street NE, Suite 100, Salem, Oregon 97301. If you have already opened the seed package, please place the entire package in a plastic bag and seal it and then send it to ODA. Do not plant any of the seeds. If you already planted the seeds, please contact Dr. Helmuth Rogg, ODA Plant Programs Director at 503-986-4662 or hrogg@oda.state.or.us.

Public Safety in North Bend

City of North Bend release - The ballot measure recently approved by the citizens of North Bend cut \$785,000 from the Public Safety budget. The ballot measure combined with a currently pending lawsuit against the City of North Bend over the Public Safety Fee resulted in the City considering a limitation of police services at the beginning of this new fiscal year to the hours of 7:00 am to 11:00 pm, seven days a week in North Bend. This move would have eliminated police services in North Bend from 11:00 pm to 7:00 am. The City has consulted with other law enforcement agencies in the county and with the Coquille Indian Tribe about ways to provide police coverage in North Bend from 11:00 pm to 7:00 am. As a result of those consultations, and a contract for Public Safety services between the City and the Coquille Indian Tribe, the City has determined that it will be able to continue to provide coverage from 11:00 pm to 7:00 am on a daily basis to the citizens of North Bend.

Public Safety in North Bend II

City of North Bend release - City Staff would like to explain the actions taken to begin the 2020-21 fiscal year in rela-

tion to public safety in the City of North Bend. It was clear going into the new fiscal year that the current levels of staffing were not sustainable due to the results of ballot measure 6-177. It was also clear that there were uncertainties in future funding created by: • The Coquille Tribe's desire to renegotiate its contract with the City for the provision of public safety services due to the COVID-19 restrictions causing loss of revenue at the casino. • A pending lawsuit filed by Douglas and Debra Bankler and Lois McPherson against the City of North Bend challenging the legality of the public safety fee. • The Expiration of the current collective bargaining agreement with the Police Teamsters Union on June 30, 2020. • The inability of property taxes to fund public safety. The City has been working to resolve these issues going into the start of the new fiscal year. There is still work to be done. The City and the Tribe are in negotiations over the changes that may be made to the existing contract for the provision for public safety services to the Tribe. The lawsuit filed against the City is set for trial in early September. Negotiations have already begun with the Teamsters in relation to the formation of a collective bargaining agreement to cover the next three years. Impacts on revenue and expenses surround-

ing COVID-19 and PERS are out of the control of the City nonetheless cause the City great concern. In the meantime, the City can fund round the clock coverage for the beginning of this fiscal year with the help of contingency funds. The City had hoped to avoid using contingency funds by appealing to other local law enforcement agencies to provide mutual aid to cover the 11:00 pm to 7:00 am shift until the issues with the Tribe, the lawsuit, and the Union were resolved. The City was unable to reach an agreement amenable to all of those agencies. As a result, the City will rely on contingency funds to continue around the clock service to its citizens while the issues surrounding public safety funding are resolved. At this point, the City has eliminated five positions in the police department, four officer positions and one dispatch position. The City has never wavered in its commitment to provide safety to its citizens. The 24-hour service is currently being provided by the remaining NBPD personnel until a more sustainable plan can be developed. Terence O'Connor, City Administrator.

Empire Incident Folo

CBPD release - On June 27th at approximately 6:15 pm., the Coos Bay Police Department released a press release detailing an incident that occurred in the Empire Area on the 23rd of June. The press release provided information about an incident involving a disturbing video of a male subject being harassed and followed by other subjects. At the time

of the press release, the Coos Bay Police Department urged anyone with additional information to contact them. Officers continued investigating the incident by checking with businesses for video surveillance and interviewing citizens who might have witnessed the incident. On June 30th at approximately 1:00 pm the Coos Bay Police Department's dispatch center received a phone call from the male subject who had created the video of the incident. The male subject requested to speak with an officer about the video and the incident that had occurred in the Empire area of Coos Bay on the 23rd. A Coos Bay Officer responded to his location and the subject provided his account of the incident. During the interview, he explained that no one was physically assaulted and that no physical contact was made between any of the subjects. During the time of the interview, he wasn't able to provide the officer with any additional names of the others involved. With the additional information provided by witnesses and through obtained video surveillance, officers believe they have identified two additional involved subjects, whom they are attempting to locate for their statements. At this time, the incident is still under investigation. The Coos Bay Police Department is still asking for anyone who may have additional information about the incident to please contact the Coos Bay Police Department at 541-296-8911 or Coos Stop Crime at 541-267-6666.

Graffiti in Downtown CB

CBPD release - Over the past several weeks the Coos Bay Police Department has seen an increase in graffiti and criminal mischief calls. The graffiti has been found on various buildings, fences, sidewalks, and business signs. This morning, July 8, 2020 at approximately 0830 hours, Coos Bay Police Department was notified of new graffiti that had occurred sometime during the night between the hours of 6:30pm and 8:00am. The new graffiti was found at The World Newspaper business located on Commercial Ave. in downtown area of Coos Bay. The graffiti covered the front sidewalk and was also found on their business sign. The graffiti made several offensive comments regarding The World Newspaper, as well as, city staff and city officials. At this time no suspect(s) responsible for this act has been identified. At approximately 12:00pm the Coos Bay Police Department received another report of graffiti at Sunset Middle School in the Empire area of Coos Bay. The graffiti showed a painted peace sign and referenced "All Lives Matter." Officers responded to the area and photographed the graffiti. At this time no suspect(s) responsible for this act has been identified. The Coos Bay Police Department is asking for the assistance of the com-

munity by reporting these types of activity immediately. This type of criminal activity is unacceptable in our community and will not be tolerated. Also, we are asking that if anyone has information on who might be involved in these crimes to immediately call Coos Bay Police Department at 541-269-8911 or Coos Stop Crime at 541-267-6666.

Empire Graffiti

CBPD release - On July 15th at approximately 8:03 am the Coos Bay Police Department responded to a report of graffiti in the Empire area of Coos Bay. The graffiti was located on a privately owned fence, and was reported to the police by a neighbor, as well as, the property owner. Several additional calls from citizens were received by the Coos Bay Police Department dispatch center reporting the graffiti. The graffiti contained offensive language toward an individual and displayed an offensive symbol. A Coos Bay Police Officer arrived on scene at approximately 8:14 am and made contact with the property owner. The property owner was already in the process of retrieving material, such as paint and brushes to remove the graffiti. As the property owners were preparing to remove the graffiti several other citizens arrived at the location with intent to remove the graffiti themselves.

City of Coos Bay release - Sadly, we are once again compelled to reiterate our conviction that the City of Coos Bay will not tolerate racism in our community, while also reinforcing our commitment to zero tolerance when faced with crimes targeting any individual or group, particularly those based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, religion or sexual identity. With the recent incidents involving graffiti, it is important that the greater Coos Bay community

understand that the swift repair of defaced property and identification of those responsible is of the utmost priority, while simultaneously addressing all protocols involving private ownership and maintaining the integrity of damaged entities. The City of Coos Bay is offering a \$5,000 reward to residents who report information that leads to the identification, arrest and conviction of those committing hateful graffiti vandalism. McGuffin Sues Law Enforcement

He claims the law enforcement officers with the Coquille Police Dept., Coos County Sheriff's Office and the Oregon State Police violated his constitutional rights when he was arrested for the murder of his 15-year old girlfriend, Leah Freeman, back in June of 2000. Nicholas McGuffin, who was 18 that summer in the Coquille Valley, is now 38 and released from his prison sentence last December after a judge ruled that police failed to disclose that it had found another male's DNA on Freeman's shoes.

That disclosure could have led the jury to acquit McGuffin according to his Federal Civil Rights Lawsuit filed Monday, July 20. A Coos County jury found him guilty of Manslaughter in 2011.

Secret Grand Jury Indictment

A 36-year old Coos Bay male who brandished a weapon at protestors has been indicted by a Coos County Grand Jury. Coos County District Attorney R. Paul Frasier says Brandon Dean Moore was arraigned on a secret indictment July 20. The Grand Jury met June 30 and heard testimony from nine witnesses. Moore has been charged with Unlawful Use of a Weapon with a Firearm, a Class C Felony; Menacing, a Class A Misdemeanor, and Disorderly Conduct in the Second Degree, a Class B Misdemeanor. "The office did ask the Grand Jury to consider charging Mr. Moore with a Bias Crime. After hearing evidence, the Grand Jury declined to indict Mr. Moore on a Bias Crime." His next Court appearance has been set for August 24, 2020. Moore was released on his own recognizance with special conditions

that he not possess any firearms and no contact with the alleged victim.

ODNRA ATV Accident

CCSO release - On Monday, June 29th at about 7:34pm, the Coos County Sheriff's Office, Hauser Fire Department and Bay Cities Ambulance responded to a two vehicle ATV accident in the ODNRA near Hauser. The accident occurred when a motorcycle operated by 21 year old Conner Main and a passenger, 21 year old Nathaniel Rowan, were travelling south bound over a small dune and went over a small drop off. The motorcycle operator crashed because of the extra weight of the passenger pushing him forward, causing him to lose control. The second vehicle involved, a quad, being operated by 20 year old Jared Dubos, was following about 20' or 30' behind and in the same path of travel went over the same drop off and ran into the back of the riders that had just

crashed. Conner Main and Nathaniel Rowan were transported off of the sand by Hauser Fire and then transported to Bay Area Hospital by Bay Cities Ambulance. Rowan was then life flighted to a larger hospital because of the seriousness of his injuries. Jared Dubos was uninjured and issued a citation for DUI. Both other parties were allegedly intoxicated and the investigation is continuing.

Accidental Death - Charleston

CCSO release - On 07/08/20 at approximately 2:30 p.m. the Coos County Sheriff's Office Dispatch center received several reports of a subject who had fallen into the bay at the docks in Charleston and was unresponsive. Personnel from Charleston Fire Department, Bay Cities Ambulance, the U.S. Coast Guard, and the Sheriff's Office responded to the scene. The victim was removed from the water and life saving efforts were unsuccessful. The victim has been identified as 64 year old Lyle G. Marlington of Brookings. Family notifications have been made, and the family is thankful for the response of all first responders to the scene. The Sheriff's Office would like to thank the several citizens who were extremely helpfully during this incident.

Attempted Escape

CCSO release - 27 year old suspect Dallas Bradley-Olson was lodged in the Coos County Jail for charges which included Aggravated Theft, Felon in Pos-

session of a Firearm, Unlawful Use of a Vehicle, ID Theft and Unlawful Possession of a firearm. Unknown to the Sheriff's Office, Bradley-Olson had been indicted in federal court by the ATF for additional charges on the 23rd. At about 9:15 PM on the 23rd, Bradley-Olson was on a cleaning crew, and was able to break out the glass of the front door of the jail, briefly escaping into the streets of Coquille. With the assistance of Coquille PD, Sheriff's Office Deputies and Myrtle Point PD, Bradley-Olson was subsequently captured within three blocks of the jail. He was treated for minor injuries at the hospital, and has been lodged in the high custody block, where he will await trial. The Sheriff's Office would like to thank the Coquille PD and Myrtle Point PD for their prompt response, and Coquille PD for finding and apprehending suspect Bradley-Olson.

Medical Issues at Crown Point

CCSO release - On July 23, 2020 at approximately 2:00 P.M. Deputy Levi Noel from the Coos County Sheriff's Office was dispatched to a report of a suspicious vehicle at the end of Crown Point Road. Upon arrival Deputy Noel identified the single occupant of the vehicle was having a serious medical issue. Deputy Noel attempted to render aid to the man and was subsequently assaulted, due to the medically altered mental state of the man inside the vehicle. The man

locked himself inside the vehicle at this time and refused any further interaction with first responders. Officer Matthew Parrish from Coquille Tribal Police Department, members from Charleston Fire Department and Bay Cities Ambulance also responded to the scene for assistance. As a result of fast thinking by these first responders the man (name intentionally withheld) was successfully removed from the vehicle and given necessary medical attention, likely saving his life. The Coos County Sheriff's Office would like to thank the concerned citizen who called in the suspicious vehicle, and all of the first responders who assisted in saving this gentleman's life.

Oregon Coast

Seven Arrested at Central Coast Beach

On Saturday, July 4th, 2020 at about 9:33 PM, Lincoln City Police were dispatched to the ocean beach area in front of the Inn at Spanish Head on a report of group of people shooting off illegal fireworks and causing a disturbance with other citizens on the beach. The initial officers arriving on scene in one of the Lincoln City Police Department's beach ATV's were immediately surrounded by this group of about 10 people who began taunting and challenging the officers for seizing illegal fireworks. Several other officers arrived on scene and learned that this same group of white people had been taunting and challenging a family of black persons by yelling racial slurs at them, insulting them and using Nazi salutes towards them. The black family advised they felt intimidated by the actions this group had displayed towards them. The on scene officers formed a line between the group of white persons and the black family allowing the black family to safely leave the beach and return to their room. During this time several in the group of white persons continued to taunt the officers, trying to challenge them to fight. Other members from the group of white persons then began shooting off multiple large illegal aerial fireworks in front of the officers. After several more officers arrived on scene, they moved in on the confrontational and highly intoxicated group and began placing them under arrest for a variety of criminal charges. Gennadiy Kachankov (30), Antoliiy Kachankov (28), Andrey Zaytsev (28), Oleg Saranchuk (45), Ruslan Tkachenko (22), all of Clark County Washington were charged with the following crimes, Riot, Interfering with Police, Disorderly Conduct II, Harassment, Possession of Illegal Fireworks, and Offensive Littering. They were cited and later released. An

additional male, who refused to identify himself and who had no ID on his person, was transported to the Lincoln County Jail for fingerprint identification and charged with the above listed crimes. In addition Yuriy Kachankov (30) of Clark County Washington was also charged the above listed charges along with Resisting arrest. He was also cited and later released.

They Brought it to the Coast

An ugly incident on a Central Oregon Coast beach the Fourth of July brought a response from the District Attorney of Lincoln Co. Seven individuals were taken into custody, including two male juveniles, following a report of illegal fireworks in front of the Spanish Head Resort at Lincoln City. Responding officers were met with taunts "and ended with the suspects yelling racial slurs." DA Jonathan H. Cable commented in a news release July 6, 2020, that in order to prove a Bias Crime "several criteria must be met. Unfortunately using racist or derogatory language is not in itself criminal under Oregon Law." He adds there must be offensive physical contact, destruction of property, or threat of serious physical injury to prove Criminal Bias. The suspects, all from Clark Co. Washington, were also allegedly involved in harassing a family on the beach with racial slurs. Officers had to assist the victims to safety. "The suspects are not in custody due to the Lincoln County Jail's policy related to COVID-19, which has limited the number of charges for which a suspect can be incarcerated pretrial." The suspects

LCPD on Beach Disturbance

The Lincoln City Police Department has an update regarding subjects arrested during a disturbance on the ocean beach area in front of the Inn at Spanish Head on July 4th. A group of seven subjects were arrested as a result of the incident. At the time of the arrests, one of those in the group refused to identify himself. That subject was transported to the Lincoln County Jail and lodged there pending his identification. Once the subject was down at the jail he was identified to be Oleg Saranchuk (45) of Clark County Washington. It was determined that due to a language barrier and some lack of cooperation the subject originally identified as Oleg Saranchuk (in the original mug shot photo spread) had been misidentified, and was in fact Andrey I. Leonchik (41) of Clark County, Washington. Both men were charged with the following crimes: Riot, Interfering with Police, Disorderly Conduct II, Harassment, Possession of Illegal Fireworks, and Offensive Littering. Andrey Leonchik was cited and released from the Lincoln City Police Department. Oleg Saranchuk was later released from the Lincoln County Jail. The case investigation is being referred to the Lincoln County District Attorney's Office for further review and determination of charges. The Lincoln City Police would like to thank the community members and other citizens for their support and positive encouragement.

Hwy. 101 Fatal, Pacific City

On Saturday, July 4, 2020 at approximately 9:13 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to the report of a single vehicle crash on Hwy 101 at milepost 91, south of Pacific City. Preliminary investigation revealed that a white 2020 Freightliner rental truck was being driven northbound on Hwy 101 when for unknown reasons the Freightliner crossed the southbound lane, went off the road, and struck a tree. The operator sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. The name will be released when we ensure family has been notified. Hwy 101 traffic was slowed at this location but remained open during the investigation. The Freightliner operator is being identified as Christopher Parks (31) of Portland.

K9 Captures Hit & Run Suspect

On July 4, 2020 at approximately 1:49 PM the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office, Newport Police Department, and Oregon State Police responded to a hit and run vehicle accident near the north end of the Yaquina Bay Bridge in Newport. Multiple 911 calls were received reporting a maroon Chevrolet pickup had struck multiple vehicles in the area injur-

ing 2 juveniles and 1 adult. As the event unfolded bystanders observed the driver of the suspect vehicle flee from Chevrolet pickup into dense foliage nearby. Deputy Akin and his K9 partner Bonni deployed to assist Newport Police officers in locating the suspect. K9 Bonni successfully tracked, located, and apprehended the suspect identified as Dylan A. Johnston age 26 of Toledo. Johnston was transported to Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital where he was treated for minor injuries sustained during the K9 apprehension. Johnston was charged with two counts of Assault III, Hit and Run, Assault on a Public Safety Officer, Possession of a Concealed Weapon, and DUII. His bail was set at \$330,000.

Wanted Felon Drops Handgun During Pursuit

On Sunday, July 5, 2020, Lincoln City Police responded to a report of possible identity theft by two suspects at the Shearwater Inn. Officer Tolzman arrived in the area a few minutes later and located the male suspect. The Officer asked the suspect to stop, but the suspect instead started running away. During the foot chase, the suspect dropped a handgun from his waistband. When the Officer caught up to the suspect, the suspect continued to fight the Officer and resist arrest. The struggle continued into

the parking lot, where the suspect was able to create distance between himself and the Officer. The suspect then tried to swing at the Officer's head with a fist. The Officer attempted to use a Taser to stop the suspect, but the suspect's girlfriend was nearby and punched the Taser out of the Officer's hand and then hit the Officer in the chest. Officer Craig arrived to assist Officer Tolzman and Officer Tolzman was able to retrieve his Taser from the ground and deploy the Taser after the male suspect continued to disobey commands. The Taser deployment was successful and the male suspect was detained in handcuffs without serious injury. The male suspect refused to identify himself, but was later identified as 40-year-old Daniel Lloyd Howton Jr of Salem and Portland. Howton also had warrants for his arrest out of Marion County and Multnomah County. The female suspect/girlfriend was identified as 28-year-old Emily Ruth Huse of Vancouver, WA. During the investigation, Officers learned the handgun dropped by Howton was reported as stolen from Portland in March of 2020. the two warrants. His bail was set at \$262,500.00. Huse was lodged at the Lincoln City Police Department for Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument. There will be other pending charges for interfering with the apprehension of Howton. The Lincoln County Jail denied entry to Huse due to COVID-19 procedures and she was issued a criminal citation and released later on 7/5/20.

Hwy. 101 Fatal - Clatsop Co.

On Wednesday, July 8, 2020 at approximately 7:11 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near milepost 19, in Gearhart. Preliminary investigation revealed a northbound Honda motorcycle, operated by Matthew Elinsky (53) of Manzanita, collided with the back of a Jeep Cherokee, operated by Sydney Villegas (21) of Seaside, that was stopped due to traffic ahead. Elinsky sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Villegas was not injured.

Second Oregon fisherman cited for guiding illegally

SALEM, Ore.—A second Oregon fishing guide was cited for illegally guiding clients in western Oregon. This follows a similar citation issued last month to a guide in Tillamook County. Carl Burge, 40, of Carlton, had several clients ready to fish the lower Willamette River when he was approached by Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife Troopers on March 31 at Fred's Marina on the Multnomah Chanel. Burge did not have the license and certification required of

guides. He was charged with Guiding or Offering to Guide without a license, which is a Class A Misdemeanor. Charges came after complaints to OSP Fish and Wildlife Troopers that Burge frequently behaved in an unprofessional manner toward other guides and their clients while on the water. Further, he did not have the appropriate inspection decals on his boat. When OSP F&W Troopers investigated Burge's practices as a guide, it became clear that he was not following Oregon laws regarding licensing and certification. Licenses and registrations prove that guides have passed competencies like first aid, and that they are able to protect their clients in case of an accident or mishap. Decals indicate a boat has passed an official annual inspection. Both are designed to ensure the safety of Oregonians recreating on the water, according to the Oregon State Marine Board website. "Standards set out for fishing and other guides help keep Oregonians safe. If you are thinking of becoming a guide, make sure you do your research and find out what licenses and permits you need before accepting payment for guide services," said Lieutenant Ryan Howell, Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife Division. "People need to do their homework and guide safely and legally." Yvonne Shaw of the Stop Poaching campaign agrees. "The rules for guides create a level playing field and help make fishing safe in Oregon," said Shaw. "When people skirt the rules, it impacts those who do go through the correct process." To Report Poaching, Call the Turn In Poachers (TIP) Line by dialing *OSP or 800-452-7888. The Stop Poaching Campaign is a legislative

mandate to educate the public on how to recognize and report poaching. This campaign is a collaboration among hunters, conservationists, land owners and recreationists. Our goal is to increase reporting of wildlife crimes through the TIP Line, increase citing by increasing the number of OSP Fish and Wildlife Troopers and increase prosecution through the Department of Justice. This campaign helps to protect and enhance Oregon's fish and wildlife and their habitat for the enjoyment of present and future generations.

Hwy. 101 Fatal - Tillamook Co.

On Thursday, July 9, 2020 at approximately 1:52 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two-vehicle crash at the intersection of Hwy 101 and Long Prairie Rd. Preliminary investigation revealed that a blue Hyundai SUV, operated by Miriam Wolfe (90) of Netarts, was crossing Hwy 101 traveling west from Long Prairie Rd onto Gienger Rd. She pulled into the path of a Jeep Cherokee, operated by Alan Mulvaney (38) of Cannon Beach, that was southbound on Hwy 101 and it was unable to avoid the crossing Hyundai. Both drivers were injured and transported by ambulance to the Tillamook Hospital. Wolfe was pronounced deceased at the hospital. Mulvaney was then transported to Legacy Emanuel Medical Center in Portland.

Suspect Arrested in Drive-Thru

On Sunday, July 12th, 2020, at about 3:40 PM, LCPD Officers received information regarding a welfare check re-

quest dispatched to the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office on a subject at the Otis Store area. Officers learned that prior to the welfare check being done, the involved subject left the area driving a white Ford sedan bearing Oregon license plate 317 LDE. The vehicle was last reported to be west bound on Hwy 101 headed toward Lincoln City. Officers further learned that the license plate on the white Ford sedan indicted it was listed as a stolen vehicle out the Albany area. At the time the information was broadcast, Sergeant Randy Weaver was investigating an unrelated incident in the McDonald's restaurant parking lot. During that investigation, Sergeant Weaver looked up and saw a vehicle matching the description of the stolen vehicle entering the drive through lanes of the restaurant. Sergeant Weaver confirmed the license plate on the vehicle matched the listed stolen vehicle and he requested additional assistance before attempting contact. Other LCPD officers arrived on scene, as well as a Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputy and an Oregon State Police Trooper. As the stolen vehicle started pulling out of the drive through after picking up its order, officers conducted a high risk vehicle stop on it. Officers ordered the male driver, who was the lone occupant, out of the vehicle. The driver complied and was taken into custody. The driver was subsequently identified as 28-year-old Roman Ashford Carney of Portland, Oregon. During the officer's contact with Mr. Carney he appeared to have some mental health and possibly drug use issues, so he was transported to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital for further medical evaluation. After being cleared from the hospital, Mr. Carney

Hwy. 101 Fatal - Lincoln Co.

On Saturday, July 11, 2020, at about 9:20 PM, Lincoln City Police responded to a reported motor vehicle crash on Hwy 101 in the north 2700 block. Upon officers' arrival they initially found the crash involved a white 1992 Ford van and a small 2005 Chevrolet Aveo. As a result of the impact, the driver of the Chevrolet Aveo, identified as 21-year-old Julia Munson of Salem, Oregon, sustained significant injuries and was transported from the scene by Pacific West Ambulance to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital. From there she was transported by Life Flight helicopter to a Portland area hospital, but sadly succumbed to her injuries and died. The crash investigation revealed that the white Ford van had been traveling northbound on Hwy 101 and crossed over into the southbound lanes where it sideswiped another vehicle, a 2010 Honda Fit, which was traveling southbound. The driver of that vehicle tried to swerve away to avoid the collision with the van. The driver of the Honda was identified as Braden T. Drayton-Dunwoodie of Lincoln City, and he was not reported to be injured. After sideswiping the Honda, the van continued traveling northbound in the southbound lane where it collided head on with the southbound Chevrolet Aveo. The driver of the Ford van, identified as 27-year-old Alan M. S. Gates of Lincoln City sustained minor injuries and was also taken to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital for medical treatment of those injuries. After being treated for his injuries, Gates was taken into custo-

Vandalism leads to reduced services at Lorens Drift access site on Trask River

TILLAMOOK, Ore.—Ongoing trespassing and vandalism problems at the Lorens Drift public access site on the Trask River culminated in the destruction of a portable toilet at the site last weekend (July 11-12). In response, ODFW is removing the toilet from year-round service and will only provide and service the bathroom during peak use seasons for anglers—so from March-June, when nearby Lorens Pond is stocked with trout and peak spring Chinook fishing is happening on the Trask River. "It's a shame that it's come to this and that fishermen and other legitimate users of the site are losing a service due to the bad behavior of a few," said Robert Bradley, ODFW district fish biologist. "Unfortunately, the ongoing vandalism problems have forced us to

take this step." The Lorens Drift access site is managed primarily to provide fishing access, with ODFW holding an easement to the property. District staff including Trask Hatchery staff maintain the site, and local non-profit Tillamook Anglers funds the portable toilet. Users are also reminded that Lorens Drift is closed each evening from 10 p.m.- 3 a.m. and no overnight parking, camping or fires are allowed. Visitors should not be on the site for any reason during those overnight hours. Oregon State Police investigated the incident over the weekend and both state and county law enforcement has been notified of the vandalism problems and overnight camping issues. If you see illegal activity at the site, please contact law enforcement on non-emergency lines—OSP dispatch can be reached at (503) 842-4433 and the county non-emergency dispatch is (503) 815-1911.

Duffle Bag Stolen Firearms

Surfboard Thief Arrested

A group of golfers on the 3rd hole of the course advised that Kazunori Bessho was last observed standing near the waters edge in the area of the green on the 4th hole. have occurred where access was made through the roof-top, two officers and a sergeant responded to the location and confirmed there were three subjects on the roof of the business complex buildings. On Wednesday, July 1, 2020 at approximately 10:46 A.M., a Douglas County Deputy attempted a traffic stop on a vehicle south of Reedsport on Hwy 101. The vehicle fled and eventually crashed on Hwy 101 near milepost 217. The operator of the vehicle is deceased. What appeared to be explosive devices were located at the scene and the Oregon State Police Explosives Unit is

heading to the scene. Oregon State Police is investigating the crash. Hwy 101 will be closed for several hours with no detour available. **Update:** ODOT: SW Oregon: All lanes of U.S. Highway 101 are now open between Lakeside and Winchester Bay. The highway had been closed near Clear Lake (milepost 218) for more than four hours due to a car crash, vehicle fire and police investigation. Motorists should expect congestion and delays until traffic clears.

Missing Kayaker Diamond Lake

DIAMOND LAKE, Ore. - A Vancouver, Washington man is missing after taking his kayak onto the lake late Tuesday night, June 30. At approximately 10:20 PM, 9-1-1 dispatchers received reports of a man yelling for help from the water at Diamond Lake. No one was able to see the man, but reported he sounded as if he was in distress. Shortly after the initial report, dispatchers received a report of a missing person at Diamond

Lake. Deputies learned 37 year-old Jared Bruce Boria of Vancouver, Washington was camping at Diamond Lake Campground. Shortly before the 9-1-1 calls, Boria had put his kayak in the water and paddled into the lake. He was not wearing a life jacket at the time. Deputies spoke to several witnesses who reported hearing a male in distress yelling from the water, but were unable to see anyone. An initial search was conducted by Marine and Timber Deputies, Douglas County Fire District #2 and Diamond Lake First Responders, however they were unable to locate Boria or his kayak. On Wednesday, July 1, 2020, Marine Deputies, Sheriff's Office Divers, Search & Rescue Personnel from Douglas, Josephine and Coos Counties and Oregon State Police Fish and Game Troopers conducted an exhaustive search of the lake. Boria's kayak, paddle and his shoes were located during the search; however, Boria is still missing at this time. Boria is described as a hispanic male approximately 6'0"

Continued Search at Diamond Lake for Missing Kayaker

DIAMOND LAKE, Ore. - The search for Jared Bruce Boria, a missing kayaker presumed drowned, is still underway. The 37 year-old went missing Tuesday, June 30, 2020, after he launched his kayak from his camping space at Diamond Lake Campground and paddled out onto the lake. At approximately 10:20 PM, dispatchers began receiving reports of a male yelling for help from the water. Boria was later reported as missing by his wife. Search efforts are in the fourth day since the initial report. Searchers have located his kayak, his paddle and shoes, but have not found Boria. "There are factors which make this a difficult search mission. The primary difficulty we are currently facing is that no one observed where Jared was on the lake when he was calling for help," said Sgt. Brad O'Dell. "Searches usually begin at the point where the individual was last seen. In this case, it was too dark and witnesses could only hear requests for help, therefore we are making assumptions as

to where he may have become distressed". The Sheriff's Office is grateful for the assistance which has been provided to help locate Boria. Efforts to locate him have included marine deputies and searchers with specialized underwater scanning capabilities, dive team efforts, Search and Rescue crews from multiple counties and air assets. The following agencies have assisted in the search. DCSO Marine Division; DCSO Dive Team; Douglas County Search and Rescue; Coos County Search and Rescue; Klamath County Search and Rescue; Jackson County Search and Rescue; Diamond Lake Resort; Oregon State Police - Fish and Game Division; United States Forest Service Law Enforcement; REACH Air Medical Services. Search efforts are expected to continue over the holiday weekend. Anyone recreating in the area is asked to report any possible signs of Boria by dialing 9-1-1.

Body of Kayaker Located Diamond Lake

UPDATE #2 07/09/2020 6:45 PM - DIAMOND LAKE, Ore. - The body of Jared Bruce Boria was located in Diamond Lake on Thursday morning. At approximately 11:20 am, on Thursday, July 9, 2020, 9-1-1 dispatchers received a report that the body of a deceased male was located in the lake. Marine Deputies along with the Douglas County Medical Examiner responded to the scene and recovered the body of 37 year-old Jared Bruce Boria of Vancouver Washington. His family has been notified. Boria had previously been presumed drowned after he went missing on Tuesday, June 30, 2020. Boria had launched his kayak from his camping space at Diamond Lake Campground and paddled out onto the lake after 10:00 PM. At approximately 10:20 PM, dispatchers began receiving reports of a male yelling for help from the water. Boria was later reported as missing by his wife. "The Sheriff's Office extends its deepest condolences to the family of Jared", Sgt. Brad O'Dell said. "There were numerous man hours and resources spent searching for Jared so his family and friends could have some answers. Our hearts go out to them." An extensive search was made of the lake and various areas by multiple entities including: DCSO Marine Division; DCSO Dive Team; Douglas County Search and Rescue; Coos County Search and Rescue; Klamath County Search and Rescue; Jackson County Search and Rescue; Diamond Lake Resort; Oregon State Police - Fish and Game Division; United States Forest Service Law Enforcement; REACH Air Medical Services. Resources included Marine Deputies and searchers with specialized underwater scanning capabilities, dive team efforts, Search and Rescue crews from multiple counties

providing ground teams, K9 teams and air assets from both Jackson County SAR and REACH Air Medical Services. The Douglas County Sheriff's Office would like to extend its thanks to all of the agencies and personnel involved.

Glide Shooting Investigation

GLIDE, Ore. - Detectives are investigating an incident where a man shot another man in the head Wednesday night. Shortly before 10:00 pm on Wednesday, July 1, 2020, 9-1-1 dispatchers received a call that a male had been shot in the head by 65-year-old James Thomas Crayton of Glide, at a residence in the 1500-block of Bar L Ranch Road in Glide. Five Arrested on Assault Charge

On Friday, July 3, 2020 at approximately 2250 hours, Douglas County Emergency Communications Center (911) received a call that Kenneth Hale (63 yoa, Roseburg) had been assaulted by the neighbors while at Hale's residence located at 4355 Depriest Street, Roseburg. Kenneth Hale was transported to Mercy Medical Center with facial injuries and a severe injury to his eye. Hale was alert and responsive and stated that Aaron Pfannenstiel (31 yoa male, Roseburg) walked onto his porch and banged on the door after a verbal argument regarding fireworks. Hale said Pfannenstiel reached inside Hale's home and grabbed Hale by the throat. Hale took Pfannenstiel to the ground to protect himself. Pfannenstiel yelled for assistance and Lynzey Pier (39 yoa female, Roseburg), Gaige Jackson (21 yoa male, Roseburg), and 2 juvenile males ran over

and began striking Hale in the face and body. After the assault the individuals involved fled to their residence and would not respond to law enforcement. On Saturday, July 4th, Detectives executed a search warrant at 4364 Depriest Street, Roseburg. During the execution of the warrant Detectives arrested Aaron Pfannenstiel, Lynzey Pier, Gaige Jackson, and one of the juvenile males in conjunction with the assault to Kenneth Hale. The second juvenile male was arrested away from the residence. Aaron Pfannenstiel was charged and lodged on Burglary I and Assault II charges. Lynzey Pier and Gaige Jackson were charged with Assault II and lodged at the Douglas County Jail. The two male juveniles were arrested for Assault II and lodged at the Douglas County Juvenile Detention Center.

I-5 Fatal – Douglas Co.

On Sunday, July 12, 2020 at approximately 8:39 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a single vehicle crash on Interstate 5 near milepost 144. Preliminary investigation revealed that a 1998 Dodge pickup, operated by Ruth Youngblood (71) of Sutherlin, was southbound on I-5 when it left the roadway and struck a tree. Youngblood sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. One male juvenile passenger sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. A second male juvenile passenger was flown by air ambulance to Springfield with serious injuries.

Log Truck Fatality Loon Lk. Rd.

REEDSPORT, Ore. - A log truck crash claimed the life of a 54 year-old Lakeside man on Thursday. On July 16, 2020, around 9:30 am, 9-1-1 dispatchers received a report of an injury log truck crash approximately a half mile up Loon Lake Road. When deputies arrived on scene, they located a 1989 Freightliner over an embankment and mostly submerged in Mill Creek. The driver was identified as 54 year-old Rhett Michael Curran of Lakeside. Curran was declared deceased at the scene. The log truck was recovered from the water by Mast Brothers Towing. The investigation indicates speed was a contributing factor in the crash.

Douglas Co. K9 Tracks Suspect

CANYONVILLE, Ore. - K9 Ozzy located an assault suspect hiding in a shed on Sunday evening, July 19. Shortly before 4:30 pm, deputies were dispatched to a reported assault which took place at the Masonic Cemetery in Canyonville (700 N Main Street). Deputies contacted the victim who stated she had been struck in the head from behind by 33 year-old Canyonville resident Robert Matthew

Frieler. The victim also stated Frieler had a knife in his hand at the time of the assault, and believed she could have been stabbed. The victim was bleeding and had a visible injury to her head. She was transported to Mercy Medical Center by ambulance for a non-life-threatening injury. Deputies responded to a residence in the 400-block of Carlisle Court in Canyonville where Frieler was reported to have been. K9 Ozzy conducted an area search for the suspect and found Frieler hiding in a shed on the property. Frieler gave up when he was made aware the K9 was on scene and had found him. Frieler was also found to have a knife on his person. Frieler was taken into custody and transported to the Douglas County Jail where was lodged for Assault II and Assault IV. The investigation is ongoing at this time. K9 Ozzy is a 3 year-old German Shepherd, has been with the Douglas County Sheriff's Office since the Spring of 2020. K9 Ozzy was purchased by an anonymous donor in the community and the Sheriff's K9 program is supported private donations, the Friends of Umpqua Valley Police K9 Programs, a nonprofit organization, Bailey Veterinary Clinic and Coastal Farm and Ranch.

Gunfire in Myrtle Ck.

MYRTLE CREEK, Ore. - A California man who burglarized a Myrtle Creek gun shop and stole several firearms is in custody after a pursuit. On Sunday, July 19, 2020, shortly before 9:00 pm, 9-1-1 dispatchers received a report of a male who had broken into a gun shop in the 100-block of Storage Way in Myrtle Creek and was loading his vehicle with firearms and ammunition. As deputies were responding, a Myrtle Creek Police Officer observed the suspect vehicle leave. Deputies attempted to stop the driver, when he accelerated and entered Interstate 5 southbound. The suspect lead law enforcement on a pursuit and briefly got away. A short time later, the suspect vehicle was observed in a pullout near milepost 97. Sebastian was charged and lodged in the Douglas County Sheriff's Office on the following charges: Burglary II x2 (C Felony); Theft I x4 (C Felony); Attempt to Elude Police - Vehicle (C Felony); Reckless Endangering (A Misdemeanor); Attempt to Elude Police - Foot (B Misdemeanor); Disorderly Conduct (B Misdemeanor). Deputies identified four firearms which were stolen from the gun shop. The Sheriff's Office was assisted by Myrtle Creek Police Department, Roseburg Police Department and the Oregon State Police.

Whistler's Bend Park Incident

ROSEBURG, Ore. - The Douglas County Sheriff's Office is unable to substantiate that a crime occurred in the reported noose incident found at Whistler's Bend Park in late June. On June 22, 2020, the Douglas County Sheriff's Office became aware of a post on social media where an individual reported finding a noose outside of his yurt during a weekend trip to Whistler's Bend Park. The Sheriff's Office immediately launched an investigation. The patrol and detective's division put an extensive amount of time and effort into the case. Additionally, the Sheriff's Office enlisted the assistance of the FBI. At this time, the investigative portion of the case has concluded, based upon all leads available to investigators. "A tremendous amount of resources and effort was put into investigating this incident," Sheriff John Hanlin said. "We take these cases very seriously and conduct thorough investigations based on the facts available to us. At this time, we are unable to substantiate that a crime occurred". Should new information become available, the Sheriff's Office will continue to investigate to the fullest extent.
