Coos Bay House Fire

CBFD release - At roughly 11:30 Tuesday morning (August 11) the Coos Bay Fire Department was dispatched to a mobile home fire at 1952 Lawnridge Loop. Firefighters arrived to find thick, black smoke and flames spreading up the south side of the trailer. Crews were



Damage to the home is estimated at less than \$10,000. It is unknown at this time if the owner or occupant has insurance to cover the damages.

Vacant House Fire

CBFD release - At roughly 8 am Friday, Aug. 21, the Coos Bay Fire Department was alerted to the report of a fire in vacant house at 264 N. Schoneman Street. Firefighters found heavy black smoke pouring from the boarded-up structure. A fire company from North Bend was called to assist with the extinguishment, but the fire caused significant damage to the home. No injuries were reported. The fire was caused by someone that made an unauthorized entry into the building. It is unclear whether the fire was set intentionally or by accident, but it is similar to several other suspicious fires in that area over the past 6 months. The fire department is asking that if anyone has information about this fire or other recent fires in the Empire area, that they contact the Coos Bay Police Department at 541-269-8911.

CBPD adding Body Cams

City of Coos Bay report - New Tech Added to Police Uniform - Coos Bay Police Officers will soon begin wearing body cameras that can record their interactions with citizens during police calls, creating a higher level of transparency and help better record those interactions for evidence. The Coos Bay Police Department began utilizing digital in-car camera systems inside all patrol vehicles more than twelve years ago. The high definition in-car video systems provide a critical third-person point of view of incidents which has provided crucial evidence in a myriad of circumstances. Wanting to add to their arsenal of evidence gathering tools, the Department began testing various body worn cameras back in 2015, but it wasn't until 2019 when WatchGuard, the manufacturer of the Department's in-car camera systems, came out with a body worn camera which works as one integrated system with their in-car camera system to capture a single incident from multiple vantage points. In early 2020, the Department submitted their draft budget, which included a request to purchase 10 body worn cameras for this year's budget (began July 1, 2020). The draft budget

was reviewed and approved in May by the Budget Committee and later adopted in June by the City Council. On July 2, the new camera equipment was ordered. It is anticipated that the new equipment will arrive sometime in late August and be operational in early September. The 10 body worn cameras will enable all of our on-duty patrol officers and supervisors to be outfitted as well as our School Resource Officer, Community Resource Officer, and Detectives. We anticipate this new tool will help in capturing compelling and unbiased video evidence of our officers doing what they do best: protecting the citizens of our community.

Eyes in the Sky at Charleston

Port of Coos Bay report - The Oregon International Port of Coos Bay (Port) recently completed a security camera system upgrade project in the Charleston Marina Complex. The Port received a loan from Business Oregon to complete the upgrades, with a total project cost of \$82,550. The project included replacing the old system with new cameras and integration system, as well as adding additional camera locations to increase coverage capacity. A total of 39 new cameras were installed, with new camera locations added at the Distant Water Fleet dock, the new Ice Plant facility, Point Adams, the RV Park, storage units, and throughout the Marina Complex. The new system has modernized security at the Marina, with increased

options for programmability, motion detection, improved picture quality, and automatic patrols. This project removed virtually all dead zones within the Marina Complex, allowing the security team to monitor more effectively and maintain the quality of the environment for Marina patrons. The project kick-off took place on March 5th, 2020 and concluded on June 16th. The Charleston Marina Complex offers a wide array of amenities for both commercial and recreational fishermen, including a six-lane public boat launch, 100-space RV Park, fish cleaning stations, restroom and shower facilities, 400 moorage slips, tackle shops and restaurants, and a Shipyard.

Reckless Driver Witnesses Sought

On Saturday, August 1, 2020 at approximately 10:37 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers were dispatched to a reckless driver and hit and run crash located on Hwy 101 milepost 233 just north of North Bend, OR. The reporting person advised they were stopped at the traffic signal at East Bay Dr. and Hwy 101 when they were struck from behind. The suspect vehicle, a green older Dodge 1500 pickup with a green canopy bearing CA license plate, then accelerated attempting to push the vehicle into the intersection. None of the occupants

were injured and the Dodge continued northbound on Hwy 101 driving recklessly. OSP was notified by the Coos Bay Police Department they were investigating the same Dodge pickup for striking several vehicles while traveling north on Hwy 101 through the city of Coos Bay. OSP received a report the Dodge was observed at the trailhead to Siltcoos Lake, near the city of Florence, where the vehicle had intentionally struck several more vehicles and was again observed driving recklessly. One occupant from a struck vehicle was injured and transported by West Lane Ambulance to Florence Hospital. Oregon State Police Troopers responded to the area and located Kevin Simpson (47) of Eureka CA. on Hwy 101 near milepost 196. He was lodged at the Lane County Jail for failure to perform the duties of a driver (hit and run), reckless endangerment, reckless driving, and criminal mischief. The Dodge was located nearby and had crashed through a gate leading to private property and become stuck in the sand. The Dodge was reported stolen out of Eureka, CA. CCSO release - To the Citizens of Coos County: Citizens in the County have recently received a request for donation from an organization out of Florida. The Letter is addressed as from "Oregon Law Enforcement Fund Drive for Law Enforcement Officers Relief Fund". The letter contains a check for \$2.50 addressed to a local Coos County resident or bearer. The request is for the return of the check and additional funds. The Sheriff's Office is not aware of any association with law enforcement in Oregon and a simple Internet check shows a two star rating for this organization. There is also listing as to the rating performance of this organization. Citizen should be extra cautious during these current times regarding which organizations they wish to donate to or assist. Recently there have been several scams that have presented themselves throughout Oregon in attempt to solicit funds. If you or someone you know is concerned please con-

tact your local police agency.

McPherson et al v. City and Water Board Coos County Circuit Court Case No. 19CV43695

City of North Bend release of Attorney's letter - Circuit Court Judge Andrew Combs issued his letter opinion in the case of McPherson et al. vs. Coos Bay-North Bend Water Board et al. on July 31, 2020. That letter is posted on the City's website. Judge Combs dismissed all claims filed against the City of North Bend by Douglas Bankler, Debra Bankler and Lois McPherson. The crux of the opinion is that the City of North Bend has the authority under its City Charter to create the Public Safety Fee and have the Water Board collect it from rate payers on North Bend's behalf. A brief review of the history of this litigation will remind you of how the case arrived at this juncture. The original complaint was filed on October 7, 2019 by Douglas Bankler, Debra Bankler and Lois McPherson and their attorneys from the Oregon Legal Center. The

complaint sought certification as a class action on behalf of all current and former residents paying the fee and who were low income as defined by the federal government. The City opposed the class action certification and Circuit Court Judge Megan Jaquot issued an opinion and order on April 22, 2020 denying class certification. That decision was followed by McPherson and the Banklers filing an Amended Complaint on May 5, 2020 in which they sought: • A declaration that the imposition and collection of the Public Safety Fee was illegal. • A requirement that the City and the Water Board provide an accounting of all money paid for the Public Safety Fee from April 1, 2017 to the present. • An appointment of an independent auditor at the expense of the City and the Water Board to examine all expenditures from the Public Safety Fee funds. • A requirement that the City and the Water Board that all monies that were spent in violation of the North Bend City Charter be paid into a constructive trust. • To require the City and Water Board to refund all amounts charged in violation of the North Bend

City Charter in the amount of \$192,500.00. • An award to the Banklers and McPherson of their reasonable attorney's fees, costs and disbursements. After the Amended Complaint was filed and answered by the City, both sides filed Motions for Summary Judgment. These are motions which are based on a finding that there were no factual issues left to be determined, and a finding that the only issues left to be determined were legal issues to be decided by Judge Combs. The judge heard argument on the Summary Judgment motions on July 15, 2020 and issued the decision you now have before you on July 31, 2020. Judge Combs reached the same conclusions you reached a few years ago when you decided enact a Public Safety Fee: 1. North Bend is a "home rule" city, which gives it broad authority to enact municipal legislation and North Bend had the power under its City Charter to create a Public Safety Fee. 2. Court also found that North Bend had the power and authority under its City Charter to authorize the Water Board to collect the Public Safety Fee. Those basic conclusions take care of all

Running a red light is extremely dangerous

ODOT release - SALEM – How many times have you run a red light... or seen someone do it? If you're still alive, you're lucky. Red light running is a significant cause of serious injury crashes in Oregon. Because it often results in T-bone crashes, red light running can cause debilitating brain injury and death. It is essential that every driver in Oregon heed the warning to Stop on Red. Now through **Aug. 8** is National Stop On Red week, and safety advocates hope Oregon drivers will learn and obey the law. "When you run a red light, you are usually moving through the intersection at a higher-than-average rate of speed," said Kelly Kapri, Safe and Courteous Driving Program manager. "You need to stop on red, as it can be a matter of life or death." What does steady yellow mean? A steady yellow signal warns you that the signal is about to turn red. Stop before entering the intersection. If you cannot stop safely, drive carefully through it. What does steady red mean? A steady red signal means stop and remain stopped until the signal changes. You are allowed to make the following turns on red after coming to a complete stop unless a sign or police officer states otherwise. When entering a two-way road, you may turn right. When entering

a one-way road, you may turn right or left in the direction of the one-way road. Here are a few steps you can take to be prepared to stop safely at the next red light: Recognize the "Dilemma Zone." This is where you're approaching an intersection, and the light changes from green to yellow. Stop safely before entering the intersection. Know Oregon's laws on traffic lights. Control your speed at all times. Never drive drowsy, distracted or impaired.

New F-15EX coming to Oregon

SALEM, Ore. - The Oregon Air National Guard received news Friday, August 14, from the Secretary of the Air Force regarding the Air Force's plans to replace the Oregon Air National Guard's aging F-15C/D Eagles at both Oregon wings with the newly updated F-15EX model. Kingsley Field, Oregon in Klamath Falls, is scheduled to transition to the Air Force's first F-15EX formal training mission beginning in 2022, and the Portland Air National Guard Base is scheduled to become the first operational F-15EX squadron in 2023. The F-15C/D legacy platform is more than 40 years old and nearing the end of its service life. Whereas, the F-15EX, with a 20,000-hour airframe life, guarantees the long-term viability and extension of the mission of the Oregon Air National Guard for many years to come. "This announcement gives all of our Airmen who work to fly, maintain and support

the F-15, a great sense of purpose moving forward," stated Maj. Gen. Mike Stencel, the Adjutant General, Oregon National Guard.

The F-15EX is a proven homeland defense platform and will complement other 5th generation fighters. With this updated platform also comes the capability for rapid insertion of new technologies which according to Boeing, is the most significant differentiator between the new version and legacy variants. The decision to choose Oregon for the F-15EX transition highlights the importance and proven record of the Oregon Air National Guard's F-15 missions. The Oregon Air National Guard provides both homeland defense, protecting the skies of the Pacific Northwest, and fighter pilot training to all F-15C/D pilots in both the active and reserve components of the Air Force. "Now that we know what our future platform will be, we are committed to the same level of professionalism and dedication that we've demonstrated for decades," said Brig. Gen. Donna Prigmore, Commander, Oregon Air National Guard. "This is an exciting time for the Oregon Air National Guard and we embrace this new fleet of aircraft with absolute enthusiasm." This news also comes as the nation continues to battle the COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting financial and employment impacts that face the state. The decision to choose Oregon for the F-15EX provides an opportunity to further the livelihood of Oregonians as the transition stimulates growth in the region.

Menacing in Powers

CCSO release - On August 8, 2020 at approximately 5:13 pm, The Coos County Sheriff's Office responded to 150 Fig Street in the City of Powers for a report of a domestic disturbance involving an armed male subject who was threatening his wife. As a result of the investigation, 56 year old Philip Sullivan was arrested on one count of Menacing (Domestic). Sullivan was transported to the Coos County Jail where he was booked and lodged.

Rescue off Libby Ln.

Forest Lands off of Libby Lane – CCSO report - On Saturday August 15, 2020 the Coos County Sheriff's Office responded with Bay Cities Ambulance for a report of a male subject having an unknown medical emergency on forest lands off of Libby Lane. The man's son had located him but was unable to give an exact location to Deputies. The son was talking with another person who was on Libby Lane via a poor cell phone connection. Deputies instructed him to hang up and call 911 in order to get a GPS location. The Coos County Dispatch Center was able to obtain coordinates from the 911 call. Coos County Deputies, assisted by Oregon State Police and Bay Cities Ambulance located the man and his son in rugged terrain. The US Coast Guard responded with a helicopter to assist in reaching the man. The man was taken by US Coast Guard to Bay Area Hospital for treatment.

ODNRA ATV Fatality

CCSO release - On Tuesday, August 11, 2020 at about 3:15 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office, Hauser Fire Department and Bay Cities Ambulance responded to a report of an injury accident on razorback Hill in the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area (ODNRA). The accident occurred when the operator, Dustin DelCarlo, age 51, of Fort Jones California, was riding a Yamaha dirt bike southbound on top of Razorback hill. It appears that he unexpectedly launched off the slip face of the dune landing approximately 60 feet on the downhill slope and crashing the motorcycle. It was reported he was unconscious for approximately 15 to 20 minutes. Hauser Fire Department and Bay Cities Ambulance arrived on scene and while transporting him off the sand began CPR. At approximately 4:22 PM he was pronounced deceased. DelCarlo was wearing a helmet and at this time there does not appear to be any indication of intoxication.

about 4:54 PM, Lakeside Fire was paged for a medical call on North Tenmile lake in Lakeside. It was initially reported that two males were in the water after their kayak rolled over in the lake. Lakeside Fire, the Coos County Sheriff's Office and Oregon State Police responded to the scene. On arrival of Law Enforcement units, both subjects had been pulled from the water, and CPR started. It was later determined the victims were 67 year old Philip J. Gray and his brother, 51 year old Mark A. Gray. During the course of the investigation, it was determined that Mark Gray had rolled his kayak approximately 50 feet from shore and had been unable to re-board or self rescue. Unfortunately, Mark had not been wearing a life vest when his kayak tipped. Philip Gray heard his brother's cry for help and immediately ran down the dock and jumped in the water in an effort to help Mark. CPR efforts performed by multiple citizens, Law Enforcement Officers and Lakeside Fire volunteers on scene were unsuccessful. Both Philip and Mark ultimately succumbed to their injuries.

Attempt to Elude on an ATV

CCSO report - On August 16th at about 8:10 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office attempted a traffic stop on a Class I ATV (quad) on Airport Lane near Spinreel Road in Lakeside for operation without head lights and operating on the shoulder of the roadway. The operator, 38 year old Jeffery Ross, then attempted to elude, turning down Spinreel road, driving recklessly and endangering other vehicles on the road including a bicyclist and a person on foot. Ross then abandoned the vehicle in front of Dunes Mobil Ranch and attempted to elude on foot south bound onto the railroad tracks. The sheriff's deputy pursued Ross for about four hundred yards down the tracks and was able to end the pursuit by tackling Ross as he turned off of the tracks, attempting to get to Highway 101. Oregon State Police officers in the area assisted with the pursuit and investigation. The ATV was determined to be stolen from the Hauser KOA earlier this year. Ross was issued multiple citations for the above mentioned charges and released. There was also a loaded syringe with suspected Methamphetamine

seized. The recovered ATV was taken to impound by Mast Brothers Towing.

Oregon Coast

Deceased Female on Central Coast Identified

On Thursday, July 30, 2020, at approximately 1:02 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to the report of a deceased adult white female found on the beach between Devil's Punchbowl and Otter Rock. The deceased female is believed to have washed up after an undetermined amount of time in the Pacific Ocean. The deceased female has yet to be identified and the investigation is ongoing. OSP is seeking the public's assistance with help identifying this person. The deceased white adult female has blonde mid-length hair, blue eyes and believed to be between 40 and 50 years of age. She was wearing black yoga-style pants with the logo "Wilson Lacrosse" on the hip, a white t-shirt with "Skyhawks Sports Academy" logo, and gray with orange sole Nike shoes. Hwy. 101 Fatal North Coast

On Thursday, July 30, 2020, at approximately 9:30 P.M., Oregon State Police responded to a vehicle versus pedestrian on Hwy 101 milepost 17. Preliminary investigation revealed a Chevrolet coupe, driven by Aaron Harris (29) Cannon Beach, OR, was traveling northbound when he saw a pedestrian but was unable to avoid them as they crossed into his path of travel. The pedestrian, identified as Rachel Faith McCune (35) Seaside, Oregon, suffered fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased at the scene. Hwy 101 was closed to one lane of travel for 3 hours.

Central Coast Drug Bust Snags Four

On Tuesday morning, August 4, 2020, the Street Crimes Response Team (SCRT) along with Lincoln City Police and Newport Police executed a search warrant at a residence located approximately 476 feet from the Oceanlake Elementary School property. Christopher

Kalin, (48) Teri Cipres (47), Amber McColligan (33), and Amber Williams (37) all of Lincoln City, were arrested after lengthy investigations into the distribution of illegal narcotics in the Lincoln County area. During the warrant execution, the SCRT seized quantities of suspected methamphetamine and narcotics paraphernalia such as digital scales and plastic baggies, drug transaction records, and a weapon. Kalin (top left) was lodged at the Lincoln County Jail on charges of Delivery / Possession / Manufacturing of Methamphetamine within 1,000 feet of a School, Commercial Sexual Solicitation, and Felon in Possession of a Restricted Weapon. His bail was set at \$580,000.00. Due to Lincoln County Jail COVID-19 Jail Procedures, Cipres, McColligan and Williams were all issued criminal citations/summons to appear for Possession of Methamphetamine. The Street Crimes Response Unit (SCRT) is a county-wide team designed to augment the Patrol Division. This team specializes in the handling of community-impact crimes, such as narcotics investigations, burglaries, and repeat offenders, and does so by investigating these crimes thoroughly. The SCRT is made up of members of the Lincoln City Police and the Newport Police Department, and routinely obtains assistance from the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office and Toledo Police Department.

Strangulation Report Central Coast

On August 5, 2020, at approximately 6:10pm, Lincoln County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to the 5900 block of Salmon River Highway, Otis, Oregon for a disturbance possibly involving a firearm. The complainant reported hearing a gunshot from across the creek followed by a female yelling, "No... No.. No." Responding deputies determined the disturbance actually occurred at a residence on N. Holiday Lane in Otis. Deputy McCave contacted the 83 year old victim who reported he had been in a physical altercation with his 27 year old grandson, Quentin Kayleb Zeller-Nelson, of Otis. The victim reported Mr. Zeller-Nelson had come to his residence and demanded money and keys to his car. The victim refused to give his keys to Mr. Zeller-Nelson which resulted in the physical altercation between the two men. At one point during the incident, Mr. Zeller-Nelson reportedly got on top of the victim and began strangling him by grabbing his neck. The victim's wife was able to pull Mr. Zeller-Nelson off. The victim reportedly got up but was taken to the ground again by Mr. Zeller-Nelson. The victim, with the assistance of his wife, was able to get Mr. Zeller-Nelson off him a second time. Mr. Zeller-Nelson began approaching the victim a third time. While still on the ground, the victim drew a small pistol and discharged it in the direction of Mr. Zeller-

Nelson. After the victim fired his pistol, Mr. Zeller-Nelson retreated and went inside the residence. It was determined Mr. Zeller-Nelson was not struck by the gunshot. Following the investigation, Mr. Zeller-Nelson was taken into custody and transported to the Lincoln County Jail where he was lodged on the charges of Harassment, Menacing and Strangulation with a total bail set at \$40,000.00.

Graffiti Tagger Arrested Central Coast

Starting in early August, Lincoln City Police had been receiving graffiti complaints from various properties around the city. Luckily, multiple businesses submitted video surveillance of the suspect. On August 13, 2020, Lincoln City Police completed the investigation and made an arrest. Gerardo Cervantes-Naranjo (21) of Lincoln City was linked to and arrested on five separate graffiti cases where markings similar to the word "arome" was done. Cervantes-Naranjo was arrested and lodged at the Lincoln City Police Department on charges of Criminal Mischief in the Second Degree (4 counts) and Criminal Mischief in the First Degree (1 count). Due to Lincoln County Jail COVID-19 Jail Procedures, Cervantes-Naranjo was later issued criminal citations/summons to appear for Criminal Mischief. As a result of the investigation, Michael Young Jr. was arrested for Fleeing or Attempt to Elude a Police Officer – Vehicle, Driving While Suspended: Misdemeanor, Criminal Trespass in the Second Degree, and Reckless Driving. Young's bail was set at \$95,000.

Hwy. 101 Fatal, Clatsop Co.

On Tuesday, August 11, 2020 at approximately 10:15 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near milepost 32. Preliminary investigation revealed a Harley Davidson motorcycle, operated by Van Nordquist (70) of Cannon Beach, was south-

bound when it failed to negotiate a curve, crossed into the northbound lane, and collided with a Freightliner semi truck (towing two empty trailers) operated by Joshua Mullins (24) of Vancouver. Nordquist sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Hwy 101 was closed for nearly five hours. ODOT established a detour around the crash.

Central Coast Jail adds Tablets

The Lincoln County Jail recently purchased and began testing tablet devices to be used by the adults in custody (AIC). The tablets sold by TurnKey Corrections in partnership with EDOVO learning provide the AIC's an opportunity to learn and expand their skills while in custody. The tablets contain many educational modules, examples include but are not limited to, GED studies, vocational training, stress, and anger management, as well as cognitive and behavioral therapy. Through the completion of these modules the AIC's are rewarded with points which can then be used to watch a movie, tv show or play a video game. Points cannot be purchased by the AIC's, they may only be earned by engagement in the different modules. These tablets are provided to the AIC's at no cost, the usage fee is paid for out of the jail commissary revenue fund ensuring that all AIC's have access to this tool to better themselves while not only in custody but once they are released back into our community.

suit in federal court alleging that the owner of residential rental housing in Florence, Oregon, made discriminatory statements, preventing a foster parent from applying to rent a home, in violation of the federal Fair Housing Act. "Under the Fair Housing Act, owners and managers of rental housing must ensure their properties are open to families with children," said Billy J. Williams, U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon. "Our office will vigorously enforce this important civil rights protection to provide relief for families victimized and deter future discrimination." The lawsuit, filed in the U.S. District Court in Eugene, alleges that Kathie Carmer, 74, of Florence, engaged in unlawful familial status discrimination in connection with a single family home in Florence that she had advertised for rent on Craigslist. The civil complaint alleges that a prospective tenant called Carmer in November 2018 to inquire about the rental and disclosed that she was looking for a residence suitable for herself and her four foster children. Carmer then allegedly made discouraging and discriminatory comments to the prospective tenant about her intent to leave the children with a babysitter while she is working, a carpeted house not being suitable for children, and the tenant not being a good fit for the rental. Carmer did not provide the prospective tenant an opportunity to continue with a rental application. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) investigated this case after receiving a complaint from the prospective tenant. The department concluded that there is reasonable cause to believe that Defendant violated the Fair Housing Act. The filed complaint asserts three allegations against Carmer of discrimination against families with children, based upon the findings of HUD's investigation: (1) refusing to rent or to negotiate for the rental of the advertised property because of familial status; (2) discriminating in the terms, conditions, or privileges of the rental of a dwelling because of familial status; and (3) making discouraging and other discriminatory statements to a potential renter with children. The lawsuit seeks monetary damages, a civil penalty, and a court

order barring future discrimination and harassment. While the complaint contains allegations of unlawful conduct; the allegations must be proven in federal court. The United States is being represented in this matter by Adrian Brown, Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon. The federal Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in housing based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability and familial status. Individuals who believe they may have been victims of familial status discrimination or other types of housing discrimination at rental dwellings owned or managed by Carmer, or who have other information that may be relevant to this case, are asked to contact the United States Attorney's Office at 503-727-1000 and request to speak to the Civil Rights Coordinator.

OSP Seeking Public's Assistance

On August 23, 2020, at approximately 07:30 am Troopers from Oregon State Police Florence and Springfield Area Command responded to an injured male on SR 126 W near milepost 26.5. The male victim was located on the highway with extensive injuries to his head, face and body and was transported to Peace Harbor in Florence for treatment of his injuries. It was reported that Michael Light and two additional unknown males had assaulted the male victim for an extended period of time in his campsite before Michael Light left with a female victim against her will. At some point in the early morning hours the male victim escaped into a heavily forested area and hid until daylight hours before he was eventually found on the highway. An area search located Michael Light and the female victim in a vehicle in the area. Michael Light was taken into custody without further incident. The female was treated at the scene for minor injuries. Follow up investigation conducted by Oregon State Police Major Crimes

Section and the Lane County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigation Division identified Michael Lokey-Wilson and Jonathan Dakota Appelt as the other two suspects involved in the Assault and kidnapping. Michael Lokey-Wilson is described as a white male standing 5'11" tall and weighing approximately 145 pounds with short blonde hair and blue eyes. Jonathan Dakota Appelt is described as a white male standing 6'tall and weighing approximately 185 pounds with short blonde hair and blue eyes. Appelt has a prominent tattoo on his neck. The Oregon State Police is asking anyone who has seen Michael Lokey-Wilson or Jonathan Dakota Appelt since 08/23/2020 or knows where they are located to call the OSP Dispatch Center at 1-800-442-0776 or the Springfield Area Command at 541-726-2536. Community members are asked to not attempt to contact or apprehend either of the men and they should be considered armed and dangerous.

Coastal Visitors Trashing North Coast

Agencies taking measures to control parking congestion, trash at Oregon State Parks on north coast – OPRD release - Salem, Ore – Visitor traffic on Oregon's north coast has spiked to extraordinarily high levels in August, caus-

ing problems with parking congestion and trash. The Oregon Parks and Recreation Department is working with other state and local agencies to create a safer, more enjoyable experience for visitors. While resources are stretched thin by the public health emergency and economic stress, Tillamook County, the Oregon Department of Transportation, the Oregon State Police, and OPRD will: Designate safer, legal parking options and advise drivers to keep traveling if parking lots are full. With support from ODOT, more than a dozen new advisory and "No parking" signs will be installed along U.S. 101, Increase restroom and trash services where money and labor are available, Step up enforcement, ticketing unsafely parked cars and calling for tows at the owner's expense, where needed. "If you love the coast, show it," says Lisa Sumption, OPRD Director. "Take care of it and yourselves with some very simple steps." Visitors play a key role in protecting parks from damage. In addition to preparing for a safe visit using the guidelines posted online at <https://stateparks.oregon.gov>, each visitor can help by: Only parking in designated stalls, Bypassing full parks and going someplace else, Packing out anything brought in and leaving no trash, Using restrooms before arriving or after leaving. Visiting mid-week early in the day.

Hunter Killed by Elk, Tillamook Co.

On Saturday, August 29, 2020 Mark David (66) from Hillsboro was archery hunting on private property in the area of Trask Road E in Tillamook, OR. David wounded a 5X5 bull elk but was unable to locate it before dark. David and the landowner attempted to find the wounded bull on the morning of Sunday, August 30, 2020 at approximately 9:15 A.M., David located the bull and attempted to kill it with his bow. The elk charged David and gored him in the neck with its antlers. The landowner attempted to help David but he sustained fatal injuries and died. The elk was killed and the meat was donated to the Tillamook County Jail following the investigation.

Injured Fisherman Rescued off Central Coast

SEATTLE – The Coast Guard medevacated an injured fisherman Tuesday, Aug. 4 from a 63-foot commercial fishing boat operating about 150 miles offshore from Yaquina Bay, Oregon. Rescued was Nathaniel Miller, 24. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Station Yaquina Bay received a call for help Tuesday at about 1:30 p.m. from a person using a satellite phone aboard the fishing boat Piky. The crew member reported that Miller, who was working aboard Piky, suffered a serious eye injury and vision loss after a line slipped while he was reeling in a tuna, and a swivel tackle hit him in the eye. After the distress was relayed from the station to watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector North Bend, Oregon, a Coast Guard flight surgeon deemed it necessary to medevac Miller and transport him to a higher level of medical care as soon as possible. Watchstanders instructed Piky's captain to transit toward shore to close the distance and shorten response time for the medevac. An MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew from Coast Guard Sector Columbia River, and an HC-27J Spartan medium-range surveillance, search and rescue aircrew from Coast Guard Air Station Sacramento in McClellan, California, deployed to assist the injured fisherman. Once on scene, the Jayhawk aircrew hoisted the man, while the Spartan aircrew provided air

cover and communication and logistic support. The Jayhawk aircrew flew Miller to Oregon Health & Science University Hospital in Portland and transferred his care to medical professionals shortly after 6 p.m. "This rescue was the result of multiple Coast Guard units across the Pacific area working together to coordinate a successful offshore medevac," said Lt. Matthew Peryea, command duty officer at the 13th Coast Guard District Command Center. "The teamwork of all units involved is testament to service dedication we take pride in as we celebrate the Coast Guard's 230th birthday."

Coast Guard reminds commercial fishermen of restricted bar crossing requirements

USCG release - PORTLAND, Ore. — The Coast Guard is advising commercial fishermen they are required by law to notify Coast Guard watchstanders prior to crossing a bar between sunset and sunrise when bar restrictions are in place for recreational or uninspected passenger vessels of the same length. Prior to crossing a restricted bar, commercial fisherman must notify the Coast Guard on VHF-FM channel 16 or 22A and provide their vessel name, position, number of people aboard, their destination and any vessel limitations. Then, after crossing, they are required to report a safe transit or otherwise. "Since 2016, five commercial fishing vessels have capsized while crossing a restricted bar along the Oregon Coast, tragically resulting in the loss of life of 10 mariners," said Lt. Carl Eschler, investigations division, Coast Guard Marine Safety Unit Portland. "Had the Coast Guard been aware that these vessels were crossing the bar when these hazardous conditions were present, Coast Guard assets could have been on scene and ready to assist as needed to ensure a safe crossing of the bar. Contacting the Coast Guard prior to crossing a restricted bar between sunset and sunrise is more than just a good idea for commercial fishermen, it is a requirement." Operators are also reminded that they shall ensure all persons on deck, or located in any open areas of the vessel,

are wearing life jackets or immersion suits while crossing a restricted bar. Life jackets or immersion suits are required to be readily accessible for all persons located in any enclosed spaces of vessels when crossing a bar with restrictions in place. Life jackets are also required whenever a vessel is under tow or while being escorted across the bar by the Coast Guard. Failure to comply with these requirements may result in a maximum civil penalty of \$25,000.

Coast Guard seeks public comment on shallow draft waterway navigation system

USCG release - SEATTLE — The Coast Guard is conducting a Waterways Analysis and Management System Study on the Shallow Draft System, which applies to waters less than 12 feet deep, to update its policies and make navigable waterways of the United States safer and more efficient. Our waterways have become increasingly congested and complex. While the number and size of the vessels traveling through the U.S. Marine Transportation System has increased, the number and in some cases size of U.S. navigation corridors has not. The recreational boating industry has also seen steady growth over the last decade further congesting the waterways. To address these changes and determine navigation requirements for the Shallow Draft Waterway System, the Coast Guard will consider feedback from local maritime partners and stakeholders that operate on the affected waterways. The study's purpose is to determine the navigational needs and requirements of vessels operating in shallow draft navigable waterways throughout the country. The study will focus on

the existing shallow water Aids to Navigation system, future development projects, waterborne commerce transiting these waters and marine casualty information. Waterway users, interested parties, and stakeholders are invited to provide comments or feedback via the tool posted at <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/ShallowWaterWAMS>. USCG Search off Cape Flattery

Coast Guard rescues 1, continues search after fishing vessel floods 85 miles off Cape Flattery, WA. USCG release - SEATTLE — The Coast Guard rescued one fisherman from a lifeboat early Tuesday morning, Aug. 11 after a 66-foot commercial fishing boat began to take on water about 85 miles offshore of Cape Flattery with three people aboard. Watchstanders at multiple Coast Guard units received a VHF radio hail for help at about 2 a.m. from a person aboard the Canadian-based commercial fishing vessel Arctic Fox II reporting the vessel was taking on water and the three people aboard planned to abandon ship. The fisherman who hailed for help reported they were wearing survival suits. An MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew from Coast Guard Sector Columbia River and an HC-27J Spartan medium-range surveillance search and rescue aircrew from Coast Guard Air Station Sacramento in McClellan, California, deployed to search for the fishermen. Once on scene, Coast Guard aircrews immediately spotted a lifeboat with one survivor inside and hoisted him

USCG Tow off Brookings

A disabled 60-foot sailing vessel was successfully towed to Crescent City, CA after it became disabled off the Chetco River at Brookings Friday night, Aug. 14. According to reports, the vessel sustained a broken boom and engine failure about 26-miles off the South Oregon Coast. A USCG 47-foot motor lifeboat from Chetco River responded about 10:30 p.m. and towed the vessel to Del Norte Co. arriving about 11:15 a.m. Saturday.

USCG Hoists Hiker

A U.S. Coast Guard helicopter crew on a training mission Saturday, August 15, were re-routed to a report of a hiker experiencing symptoms of a possible stroke near the Upper Pony Ck. Reser-

voir in Coos Bay. The USCG arrived about 3:30 p.m. and hoisted the hiker to Bay Area Hospital by 4:20 p.m.

USCG Rescue at Cape Falcon

SEATTLE — A Coast Guard aircrew hoisted a surfer in distress and assisted three others Saturday afternoon, Aug. 22 from rocks at Cape Falcon near Manzanita, Oregon.

At 5:15 p.m., watchstanders at the Coast Guard Sector Columbia River Command Center received a request for assistance from Tillamook County dispatch reporting a male surfer who was unable to get back to shore and became stuck on nearby rocks. Three other surfers who were in wetsuits tried to assist the man, but they also became trapped on rocks and were unable to get back to shore. A Coast Guard aircrew aboard an MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter was already airborne and diverted to the area. At 5:30 p.m., the rescue crew arrived on scene. The rescue swimmer deployed to

hoist the first surfer, who was not wearing a wetsuit and appeared to be showing symptoms of hypothermia. After he was hoisted into the helicopter, a member of the rescue crew provided a blanket to the man. At 6:15 p.m., the surfer was safely brought to awaiting emergency medical services at Short Sand Beach. The remaining three individuals were brought to shore by the Manzanita Fire Department using jet skis. The Coast Guard rescue swimmer stayed on the rocks to assist each surfer on to the jet skis. Each person was transported to Short Sand Beach with no medical concerns. The first surfer's current condition is unknown.

Columbia River Rescue

Eleven people were rescued from the Columbia River Monday, Aug. 24 following a collision near the mouth of the river on the Washington State side of the Astoria-Megler Bridge. The vessels reportedly collided about 9 a.m. throwing six from the 20-foot craft and five from the other vessel into the cold wa-

ters of the river. Other boaters responded quickly and safely pulled everyone out of the water. The boats sank.

of Douglas County. "Our hope is that as people are recreating in the mountains, that they be aware of this case and report any information which may help us to locate Richard," said Sgt. Brad O'Dell.
