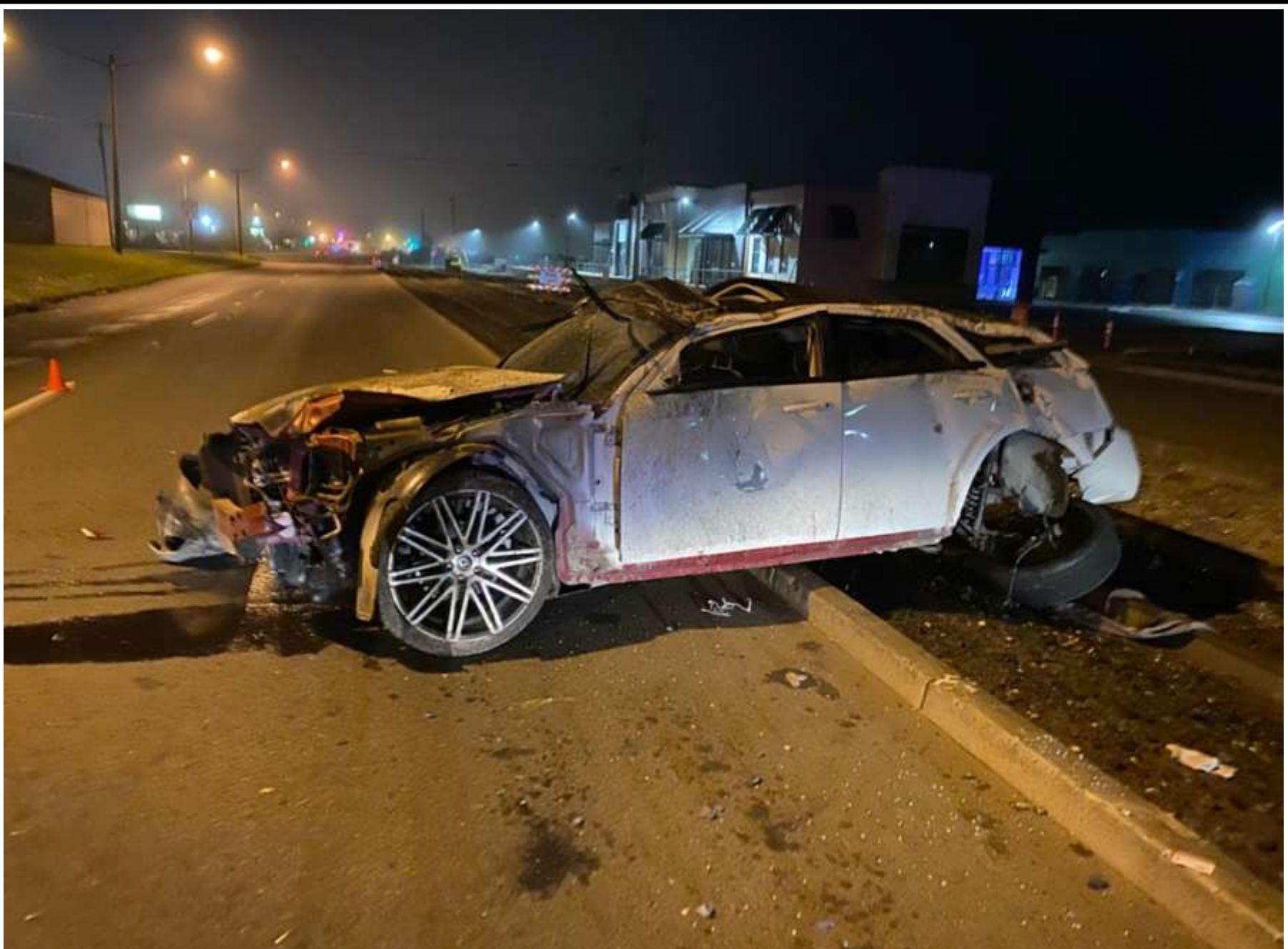

DUI Crash In Coos County

CBPD release - On October 29, 2020 at approximately 2:23 AM the Coos Bay Police responded to a report of a single vehicle crash in the 1200 block of N Front St. Callers advised the vehicle was on its side on the railroad tracks that run along the street and the vehicle appeared to be unoccupied. Officers checked the area, including a debris field of approximately three hundred feet, but were initially unable to locate the involved driver. During the investigation officers received additional information regarding the nearby location of the driver. The driver of the vehicle, located and identified as Kai Mikal Dendy of North Bend, was located within fifteen minutes of the initial call regarding the crash. Dendy was cited in lieu of custody on the charges of DUI, Reckless Driving and Failure to Perform the Duties of a Driver at an Accident. The Coos Bay Police were assisted on scene by the Oregon State Police.

Coos Bay Police arrest local male for setting fire to a building in the Empire Y Plaza

CBPD release - On 09/29/20 at 1952 hours Coos Bay Police Officers responded to a reported fire on the east side of the building at the southeast end of the Y

Plaza located at 1165 Newmark Ave Coos Bay. This section of building is currently occupied by O.C. Cab Company. The 911 caller, identified as Jared Murray, reported the fire and provided information about a man who he believed had started the fire. Mray described the male suspect, and a Coos Bay Officer recognized the description matched a male that he had contacted in the same area earlier on a complaint of an intoxicated man who was being vulgar and confrontational to customers of Bay Burger Inn. The male suspect was identified as 49 year old Shad Scott Ebinger. Mr. Ebinger was contacted on the sidewalk in front of the Nancy Deveraux Center around 2007 hours. After the investigation was completed, Mr. Ebinger was taken into custody on charges of Arson in the second degree, Criminal Mischief in the first degree, reckless endangering, and theft of mail. Two O.C. Cab Company employees were inside the building when it was ignited, and the interior was filled with smoke, however there were no injuries, and the damage was minimized as a result of the swift actions of another cab employee named Edward Burdge, who used a fire extinguisher to slow the spread of the fire until the Coos Bay Fire Department arrived. Mr. Ebinger was transported to the Coos County Jail on the listed charges.

SCINT Meth Bust in MP

SCINT release - On 10-1-2020 at approximately 1630 hrs. The South Coast

Interagency Narcotics Team (SCINT) served a search warrant at 1863 Roseburg Rd. in Myrtle Point. This is the home of Robert and Cindy Briggs. Detectives and assisting officers located over three pounds of methamphetamine, scales, packaging material, three handguns, and other paraphernalia. Detectives also seized over \$1,000.00 in US currency. This commercial quantity of methamphetamine has a street value of over \$50,000. Robert Briggs was transported to Coquille Valley Hospital by Ambulance for medical reasons. Cindy Briggs was released at the scene. Both Robert and Cindy will be referred to the Coos County District Attorney's Office. The search warrant marked the culmination of an investigation spanning several months. SCINT was assisted by members of the Coos County Sheriff's Office, Coos Community Corrections, Cur-

ry County Sheriff's Office, Oregon State Police, and the Myrtle Point Police Department. SCINT encourages the public to report narcotics activity on the web by going to www.scint.us and "Report a Dealer".

Robbery Charge in North Bend

A 60-year old male was arrested Monday, Oct. 12, after he allegedly attempted to rob a taxi cab driver near the northside of the Public Library between Union and Connecticut avenues. According to a news release from NBPD, Daniel William Duran, Coos Bay, "reportedly threatened the driver of the Yellow Cab with a gun and demanded his money." The suspect fled the area with an undisclosed amount of cash. However, he was apprehended on the corner of California and Sherman. "It was determined was not in possession of a firearm." The money was recovered and returned. Duran was transported to the Coos Co. Jail in Coquille on charges of Robbery II and Probation Violation.

Arrest, Stolen Property Recovered

CBPD release - On October 14, 2020, at 07:44 AM, Coos Bay Police Department responded to a report of two vehicles that had been entered in front of a residence in Englewood area of Coos Bay. The victim advised that multiple purses had been stolen out of the vehicles and that a fraudulent charge had already been made by the suspect with one of

her cards at a nearby business. The officer responded to the business and contacted an employee who advised she was familiar with the suspect but refused to provide his name. The officer was eventually able to identify the suspect, locating him approximately two hours after the initial call and recovered nearly all the property that was stolen from the vehicles. Tristin Fields, a 21-year-old male from Coquille, was taken into custody on charges of two counts of unlawful entry into a motor vehicle, theft in the second degree, identity theft, 2 counts of fraudulent use of a credit card, possession of a restricted weapon and probation violation. Fields was transported to the office of Coos County Parole and Probation and released to his probation officer for transport to the Reedsport City Jail.

Water Board Burglary Suspect Arrested

CBPD release - On 10/26/20 at approximately 0802 hours, Coos Bay Officers responded to a burglary report at 2305 Ocean Blvd., Coos Bay / North Bend Water Board main building site. When officers arrived, it was reported to them that the Water Board building had been broken into sometime over the weekend between Friday night after closing and Monday morning. Officers discovered that entry into the building had been made by breaking out one of the glass windows and that several items of value had been taken. Officers took the report and began investigating the burglary.

After reviewing some details from a recent incident, a subject identified as Landon Williams became a person of interest. Williams had been involved in a recent burglary and was arrested on Saturday afternoon. Officers began looking around the area for Williams and at approximately 1231 hours, they located him near the Goodwill store in North Bend. Williams was detained on unlawful possession of Heroin. Williams was questioned about the Coos Bay / North Bend Water Board burglary and he gave the officers a full confession. He then provided the officers detailed information of the location of the majority of the stolen property. Officers were able to recover almost all of the stolen property and return it to the Coos Bay / North Bend Water Board. Williams will be referred to the District Attorney's Office for the charges of Burglary II, Theft I, and Unlawful Possession of Heroin.

Utah Amber Alert Leads to Arrests in North Bend

CCSO release - On October 1, 2020, at about 1:17 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office was notified of the whereabouts of a six year old child, the subject of an Amber Alert which issued out of

the Unified Police Department of Greater Salt Lake, Utah. Through investigative measures, Detectives from the Unified Police Department were able to provide potential locations of the suspects with whom the child was presumed to be. As a result of an investigation conducted by the Coos County Sheriff's Office in cooperation with the Unified Police Department of Greater Salt Lake, the suspects, 43 year old Emily Jolley and 56 year old Bonnie Jackson were located at a residence on Broadway Street in North Bend, along with the child. The child was found unharmed and in good health. The child was taken into protective custody by the Coos County Sheriff's Office. Emily Jolley and Bonnie Jackson were arrested and transported to the Coos County Jail alleging the federal crime of Abduction and Kidnapping of a Minor and Taking him Across State Lines from the State of Utah and the Utah State crime of Custodial Interference 3rd Degree. Coordination was made with the child's custodial parent for his return. The Coos County Sheriff's Office was assisted by the Oregon State Police and the Oregon Department of Human Services - Child Welfare.

Amber Alert Update

CCSO release - Recently, the Coos

County Sheriff's Office assisted in the recovery of a six year old child who was the subject of an Amber Alert out of Utah. The child has been returned to family. The suspects in the case, 43 year old Emily Jolley and 56 year old Bonnie Jackson were arrested and detained at the request of Utah Law Enforcement authorities pending the issuance of arrest warrants. Since the recovery of the child, Utah has indicated they are unwilling to extradite the suspects, and the issued warrants were restricted to service in Utah only. As a result, both suspects were released from custody. Further actions or decision will need to be originated from Utah Law Enforcement.

Missing Person

CCSO release - On 10-7-20, the Coos County Sheriff's Office received a report of missing 68 year old Daniel B Wheeler out of Salem, Oregon. Mr. Wheeler was last seen on 9-29-20. Despite mutual aid search assets from Douglas County and numerous Coos County personnel, we have been unable to find Mr. Wheeler as of 10-8-20 at 4:50 PM. State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a single vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near milepost 258. Preliminary investigation revealed a Toyota SR-5 pick-up, operated by Andrew Martin (35) from Coos Bay, was southbound when it went off the roadway and struck a tree. Martin was transported to Bay Area Hospital with serious injuries. The passenger, Douglas Hansen (55) of Coos Bay, sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased.

Hwy. 241 Fatal, Coos Co.

On October 18, 2020 at approximately 6:41 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a single vehicle crash on Hwy 241 near milepost 11. Preliminary investigation revealed a Dodge truck, operated by Tyler Boyd (36) of Coos Bay, was eastbound when it left the road and struck a tree before entering the river and sinking. The passengers, Lea Haigler (30) of Coos Bay and Casey Little (34) of Coos Bay, were able to escape the vehicle and make it to shore. Boyd was not located. A Coast Guard Helicopter searched the area by

air. Two boat patrols consisting of a Coos County Marine Division and the Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife searched the waterway. Bandon Fire Department Dive teams searched the water. Attempts to locate Boyd were unsuccessful. On October 27, 2020 at approximately 4:41 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a deceased person in the river on Hwy 241 near milepost 11. The deceased person has been identified as Tyler Boyd. OSP was assisted by the Coos County Sheriff's Office, United States Coast Guard, Bandon Fire Department, and ODOT.

Oregon Coast

Pedestrian Struck on Central Coast

On Monday, September 28, 2020 at around 8:38 PM, the Lincoln City Police Department responded to a motor vehicle crash involving a pedestrian in the

south 800 block of Hwy 101. Upon arrival the officers determined that a 17-year-old male was struck while attempting to cross the highway in the crosswalk between the City Hall complex and Burger King. The investigation revealed the juvenile pedestrian was walking east bound across Hwy 101 in the crosswalk when he was struck by a vehicle that was traveling northbound on Hwy 101. As a result, the pedestrian was thrown across the intersection, sustaining moderate injuries from the impact. Bystanders from nearby parking lots and from other vehicles, including a nurse, quickly came to render assistance to the injured pedestrian until Medical Personnel and Law Enforcement arrived on scene. The driver of the involved vehicle, identified as 66-year-old Virginia Ensign of Lincoln City, stopped and stayed at the scene and cooperated with the investigation. Initially it was thought that the driver may have run a red light, however further investigation determined the driver of the vehicle had a green traffic light when she entered the intersection and the pedestrian was crossing against a red "Don't Walk" signal. The pedestrian

was transported to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital by PacWest Ambulance and later released with minor injuries. There were no indications that speed or impairment were factors in the crash. Lincoln City Police Department would like to thank everyone involved who stepped up to help in this emergency-situation and stayed by to assist in the investigation. In addition, we thank the members of North Lincoln Fire & Rescue and PacWest Ambulance for their assistance at the scene. As a reminder, safety and courtesy go hand in hand regarding pedestrian crossings. Drivers and pedestrians are encouraged to be alert for the right of way issues that affect each of them. Pedestrians need to exercise due caution when stepping into marked or unmarked crosswalks and to stay observant and cautious while crossing the roadway.

Central Coast House Fire

On October 5, 2020 at 7:40 PM the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office in combination with Depoe Bay Fire were dispatched to a report of a house fire at

6550 Carolyn Ave in Gleneden Beach. Initial reports indicated the homeowner had set the fire intentionally inside the home. Upon arrival of emergency personnel, the surrounding homes were evacuated for safety precautions. Deputies assisted Depoe Bay Fire, Newport Fire and North Lincoln Fire and Rescue for several hours throughout the night. During the firefighting efforts, emergency personnel found the homeowner inside the burning structure and pulled him to safety. The homeowner was transported to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital for complications from the fire. The property remained under law enforcement security for further investigation until October 6th when a search warrant was served on property. This case remains under investigation. A second media release will be conducted as information becomes releasable.

Arson Charge on Central Coast

On October 7, 2020 the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office with assistance from Oregon State Fire Marshal's Office concluded its investigation pertaining to the house fire at 6550 Carolyn Ave in Gleneden Beach. The investigation revealed Kevin P. Dugger age 64 had intentionally set his home on fire. At the time the fire was set there were two additional people living in an apartment attached to the primary residence. The two occupants successfully fled the property without injury and called 911 to

report the fire. Deputies arrested Mr. Dugger for Arson in the First Degree, Arson in the Second Degree and Reckless burning. He was released from the hospital and taken to the Lincoln County Jail where his bail was set at \$215,000.

Hwy. 101 Fatal, Curry Co.

On Tuesday, October 13, 2020 at approximately 10:10 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near milepost 358. Preliminary investigation revealed a Toyota Camry, operated by Benjamin Demaris (64) of Crescent City, was southbound when he struck a pedestrian, Michael Christian (32) of Crescent City, as he walked across the highway. Christian sustained life threatening injuries and was transported to Sutter Coast Hospital for treatment and then to Rogue Valley Hospital. Christian was pronounced deceased at the hospital.

Motorcycle/Vehicle Collision Central Coast

On Wednesday, October 14, 2020, at about 4:20 PM, Lincoln City Police Officers responded to a report of a motor vehicle vs motorcycle crash in the south 1500 block of Hwy 101. When officers arrived on scene they found both of the southbound lanes of travel were blocked as a result of the crash. The motorcyclist, identified as 57-year-old David R. Johnson of Lincoln City, was laying injured

in the southbound lanes of travel. Medical personnel from North Lincoln Fire & Rescue and Pacific West Ambulance quickly arrived on scene and began medical treatment of Mr. Johnson. Both southbound lanes of travel were closed and southbound traffic was diverted into the center turn lane while the crash investigation was being conducted. The driver of the involved vehicle, a silver 2015 Dodge Challenger, was identified as 68-year-old Gary E. Bellah of Prineville, Oregon, did not report any injuries as a result of the crash. The subsequent investigation determined that the motorcycle had pulled out of SW 16th Street and was traveling northbound on Hwy 101. The driver of the silver Dodge Challenger was pulling out of a parking area in the south east 1500 block, crossing the northbound lane while turning left onto Hwy 101 to head south bound. The driver of the Challenger reported he did not see the motorcycle heading northbound until the impact. The motorcyclist was thrown on the hood of the car and the motorcycle was dragged into the southbound lanes by the car. The motorcyclist, Mr. Johnson, sustained serious injuries as a result of the crash and was transported by ambulance to North Lincoln Hospital for further medical evaluation and treatment. Due to the extent of Mr. Johnson's injuries, he was later transported by Life Flight to a Portland area hospital for more advanced medical treatment. The driver of the silver Challenger, Gary Bellah, was issued a traffic citation charging him with Failing to Yield Right-of-Way When Entering a Roadway. The motorcyclist, David Johnson, was issued a citation charging him with Driving While Uninsured. Once the scene was cleared, the southbound lanes were opened back up to vehicle traffic. The members of the Lincoln City Police Department would like to remind all drivers to stay alert while driving and to use extra caution when pulling out onto the highway from side streets and driveways.

Threatened Law Enforcement on Central Coast

On October 15th, 2020, the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office was made aware of a subject making threats against public employees and buildings. Sources indicated 44-year-old Otis resident Daniel Scott Kessler was in possession of firearms and was preparing to harm specific law enforcement officers and the Lincoln County Courthouse. A prior court order prohibited Kessler from lawfully possessing firearms. Detectives from the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office conducted an investigation with assistance from the Lincoln City Police Department; Federal Bureau of Investigation; Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explo-

sives; and Oregon State Police. It became apparent over the course of the investigation that Kessler's threats were credible, and he had the means to follow through with his plans. Investigators applied for a search warrant for Kessler's Otis residence, which was executed on October 20th. Kessler was in possession of several firearms when he was taken into custody during the execution of the search warrant. Despite the allegations of threats to law enforcement, no use of force was required to take Kessler into custody. Kessler is charged with two counts of Furnishing a Firearm Used in a Felony, four counts of Unlawful Use of a Weapon, and three counts of Unlawful Possession of Firearms. Kessler also had an outstanding warrant for his arrest for unrelated crimes. Kessler was arraigned on the charges in court on October 20th. After a brief hearing, Judge Branford denied bail and Kessler is currently being held in the Lincoln County Jail without the possibility of release. The incident remains under investigation by the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office and its partner agencies. U.S.C. Section 231(a)(3). According to the court record, on the evening of September 6, 2020, Fox was part of a group protesting near the Portland Police Bureau's (PPB) East Precinct building. Fox was seen on video with other protesters, who had formed a line in the street across from PPB officers and Oregon State Police troopers. Fox can be seen, while walking behind the line of protesters, turning toward the camera, using a torch lighter to ignite a large, cylindrical firework, and throwing the device over the protesters toward the officers. Moments later, an explosion and flash occurred near the officers. He was arrested later that night. Fox made his initial appearance in federal court today before U.S. Magistrate Judge Youlee Yim You. He was arraigned, pleaded not guilty, and ordered released pending a two-day jury trial scheduled to begin on **December 29, 2020**. The Federal Bureau of Investigation investigated this case. It is being prosecuted by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Oregon. An indictment is only an accusation of a crime, and a defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.

Vessel Aground on Columbia River

ASTORIA, Ore.— The Coast Guard is responding to a 608-foot container ship that ran aground Thursday, Oct. 1 on the Washington side of the Columbia River south of Skamokawa Vista Park. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Columbia River received a report at 12:50 a.m. that the Genco Auvergne had run soft aground due to a loss of main engine propulsion while transiting down the Columbia River. The tug vessels Carolyn Dorothy, Samantha S. and Willamette were on scene to assist. The captain of the Genco Auvergne reported no injuries or pollution. The Marshall Islands-flagged vessel was reported to be carrying grain and approximately 616,644 gallons of fuel oil. The Coast Guard dispatched a marine inspector from Sector Columbia River and a Columbia River Bar Pilot is aboard Genco

Auvergne coordinating vessel traffic through the area. The vessel is constructed with a double hull and regular soundings are being taken to monitor fuel-tank levels. "We have great coordination with the vessel agents, class society, river pilots, flag state and port partners," said Capt. Gretchen Bailey, deputy commander at Sector Columbia River. "The implementation of the non-tank vessel response plan mitigated the impacts of the incident and will assist in the expedited re-floating of the vessel." The vessel was re-floated at 2:20 p.m. during high tide and continued transiting to Longview, Washington.

Coast Guard surfmen drive to close gender gap

USCG release - By Petty Officer Cynthia Oldham - While for decades the Coast Guard has permitted women to serve in every job - from aviator to captain of a ship to boarding officer, there are roles in the service that have remained predominately filled by men. That tide is turning, especially among the Coast Guard's most highly trained and courageous boatswain's mates. Today, the Coast Guard's select group of surfmen, who skillfully drive rescue boats in up to 30-foot seas, includes more women than ever. In fact, more women have earned the revered heavy

weather boat handling certification in the last five years than in the Coast Guard's entire lifesaving history. But don't call these 10 expert coxswains 'female surfmen.' "We need to encourage people to stop saying 'female' in front of titles where they would not label male," said Lt. Jessica Shafer, Surfman #390 and commanding officer of Coast Guard Station Cape Disappointment in Ilwaco, Washington. "While I believe this [qualifier] is often well intended, it highlights difference rather than acknowledges commonality," Shafer added. Shafer believes a lack of women in the surf community, as well as in the active duty workforce, is not limited to the Coast Guard. Shafer sees the issue gradually improving due to a changing society. Cultural shifts are rejecting outdated biases toward women and men, and increasing availability to resources is enabling women to pursue and thrive in careers not previously as accessible. Recent studies to discover why the service recruits and retains women at a lower rate than men have indicated that berthing restrictions on board ships or at stations create barriers to advancement. Decades ago, legacy cutters and facilities were designed to only house men. The 21st century Coast Guard is building and designing ships mindful that women may comprise 50% of the crew. Going forward, more facility improve-

ments like these will promote gender parity. As we reduce physical barriers to enable success, we must also normalize it. Mission success achieved by a woman should be normalized rather than highlighted as exceptional. Shafer added that for the Coast Guard to continue to improve retention rates, the service needs to be a true meritocracy, because any person who gets a job for reasons other than competence is set up to fail. Failure on a rescue boat is not an option. Petty Officer 2nd Class Kelsi Dozier, Surfman #561 from Coast Guard Station Yaquina Bay in Oregon, agrees - gender is arbitrary in a lifesaving situation. "I became a surfman because I want to help people on their worst days in the worst conditions," Dozier said. Dozier acknowledges that while women and men are different in many aspects, skill and determination are gender-neutral. Dozier said when she is driving a boat for training or during a lifesaving rescue, it is irrelevant she is a woman. Every surfman endures the same training where they are exposed to extreme weather conditions and expected to maintain composure to lead a boatcrew on a mission to save lives. Yet, less than two decades ago a surfman's gender was considered highly relevant to mission success. In 2002, when Chief Warrant Officer Beth Slade, Surfman #321 and commanding officer of Coast Guard

Station Coos Bay in Oregon, certified as the first woman to qualify as a surfman on the 47-foot Motor Lifeboat, she faced a lot of pushback for trying to push forward the Coast Guard's value of women boat operators. "My male shipmates would doubt me and ask what kind of favors I did to get my certification. Some would refuse to be my engineer simply because I was a woman," Slade said. Rising up the ranks as one of the only women in her field, Slade endured some ridicule by senior boatswain's mates. She had some shipmates who, when they were not demeaning her for being a woman, expected her to act like one of the men. Slade initially wanted to escape the surf community, but that same perseverance that pushed her to earn her surfman qualification, drove her not to give up. Even though she had the same skills and passion for driving rescue boats and saving lives as her male counterparts, she didn't fit the traditional boatswain's mate mold. She learned she didn't need to. Slade said she wants other women to know not fitting into a mold is what makes our Coast Guard great and rich with new ideas and diversity. Slade credits an uptick of women earning the prestigious surfman designation to an overall shift in mindset by Coast Guard women and men that is dismantling the "old guard" mentality. It was with support of forward-thinking, supportive women and men, including her husband, Slade was able to build confidence and stay focused on completing Coast Guard missions and achieving her personal goals. Surfmen like Slade and Shafer have paved a path for not only surfmen but women and men in all Coast Guard ratings. "Women are the

majority in our country but make up less than a quarter of the Coast Guard," said Dozier. "Every woman who enlists, regardless of which job she pursues, has already taken a bold step toward progress." Fortunately, increasing service inclusivity is not just limited to the Coast Guard's surf community. Petty Officer 1st Class Victoria Hansen, Surfman #484 and an instructor at the National Motor Life Boat School in Washington, said it isn't just the surf community seeing a change. Many operational jobs traditionally filled by men are now performed by women who trickle into the ranks and advance into leadership roles. "There are more women in aviation, law enforcement, the tactical community and other specialty jobs. Women are proving they can succeed," Hansen said. "The more diverse our ranks become, the more anyone can feel welcome in any position." As an instructor, Hansen stressed that being a surfman requires willingness, brains and skill - not a specific physique. She argues it's a job that levels the playing field. Shafer and Slade both acknowledge the barriers they once faced coming up through the ranks are continuing to be broken down by waves of newer surfmen like Dozier and Hansen, as well as Coast Guard members throughout the service who are socially aware and passionate about justice. "What I find refreshing in our new generation of recruits and junior personnel is they have been raised to be more aware of their rights," said Shafer. "They join [the Coast Guard] to serve like those before them but stand up against biases that used to be perceived as acceptable - although, they never truly were." As senior surfmen and

commanding officers of surf stations, Shafer and Slade take pride in and revere their roles as leaders in the surf community. Charged to mentor and relish in the successes of their crews, they both understand the driving force to be a surfman is ultimately a passion for the mission. The mission of saving lives is no longer considered a "man's job" or a "woman's job." The Coast Guard needs people who have a bias for action vice a bias toward gender. In the Coast Guard of 2020, saving lives is everyone's job.

USCG Rescue off Rocky Creek

WARRENTON, Ore. — The Coast Guard rescued a man from the water Friday, Oct. 2 off Rocky Creek State Park near Depoe Bay. Rescued was 40-year-old James White, who reportedly suffered minor lacerations and mild hypothermia. A nearby ranger from the U.S. Forrest Service saw the distressed man in the water and quickly alerted watchstanders at Coast Guard Station Depoe Bay. A 47-foot Motor Lifeboat crew immediately launched to rescue the man from danger. The MLB crew arrived on scene in less than ten minutes, threw a life line to White in the water and safely pulled him aboard the rescue boat. The MLB crew provided initial first aid and worked to warm the man while transiting back to the Coast Guard station. "The quick notification by the park ranger to alert us to the person in distress helped ensure an extremely rapid response," said Chief Petty Officer Ryan Clendenen, the officer-in-charge at Station Depoe Bay. "It was an incredibly fast and smooth rescue. Everyone here holds a strong bias for action and that


teamwork is what help get this man out of danger in less than twenty minutes." When the Coast Guard MLB crew arrived back to shore, White's care was handed over to awaiting Depoe Bay Fire Department and emergency medical personnel.

USCG Rescues Family

Warrenton, OR — The Coast Guard rescued a family Saturday, Oct. 3 from the Washaway Beach Jetty on the North Cove of Willapa Bay, Washington, after they became trapped by the rising tide. Two male adults, one minor and a canine were airlifted to safety without any reported injuries. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Columbia River received notification from Pacific County dispatch at 2:14 p.m. that a family had walked out to the end of the jetty and then become stranded there. At 2:16 p.m. an MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew diverted from their training mission and arrived on scene at 2:48 p.m. A rescue swimmer deployed and hoisted the family off the rocks and away from the rising water. The helicopter crew landed at a nearby field at 3:13 p.m., where Pacific County Sheriff's deputies waited to return the family to their vehicle. "This

Astoria-based Coast Guard cutter returns home after 57-day counter-narcotics patrol; \$67 million in cocaine seized

USCG release - ASTORIA, Ore. — The crew aboard the Coast Guard Cutter Steadfast (WMEC 623) returned home Sunday following a 57-day counter-narcotics patrol to the Eastern Pacific Ocean. Steadfast travelled more than 10,000 miles while conducting law enforcement, search-and-rescue and marine life protection operations. During their deployment, Steadfast crews boarded five suspected smuggling vessels, seizing 3,905 pounds of pure cocaine worth an estimated \$67 million, and detaining eight suspected drug traffickers. The crew offloaded the seized contraband Oct. 1 in San Diego. The crew also responded to a search and rescue case, rescued a sea turtle entangled in an abandoned drift net and served as a training platform for tactical law enforcement units from Maritime Security Response Team-West. Steadfast deployed with an MH-65 helicopter and aircrews from Air Station North Bend, Oregon; Air Station Port Angeles, Washington; and an aviation detachment from Helicopter Interdiction Tactical Squadron (HITRON) from Jacksonville, Florida. The HITRON unit provided airborne use of force capability, which assisted in the interdiction of four go-fast vessels suspected of illegal narcotics smuggling. Additionally, Steadfast patrolled with a counter-narcotics subject matter expert from the Pacific Tactical Law Enforcement Team (TACLET). “The crew put a phenomenal amount of work into readying the cutter for this deployment and sharpening the skillsets required for counter-narcotics operations,” said Cmdr. Craig Allen, Stead-

fast’s commanding officer. “Their efforts paid dividends during the smooth execution of several challenging evolutions throughout the patrol. Our HITRON aircrew and TACLET member were an outstanding addition to the Steadfast team. I’m extremely proud of the crew’s accomplishments, and I’m also grateful to the Steadfast families who held down the homefront during a turbulent two months that included ongoing COVID-19 challenges and wildfires.” To ensure the safety of Steadfast’s crew during the COVID-19 global pandemic, the crew conducted pre-deployment COVID-19 testing, followed by a 14-day monitoring period. Throughout their patrol, Steadfast’s crew maintained strict health precautions during all interactions with the public, including wearing N95 masks and undergoing intensive health screenings before each boarding. Steadfast continued its tradition of supporting the Columbia River Maritime Museum’s Miniboat Program. The Miniboat Program connects students from local Oregon elementary schools with their peers across the Pacific Ocean in Japan. Students learn about the significance of ocean currents and weather while building miniature boats to send across the ocean to their partner schools. During this patrol, Steadfast launched this year’s miniature boat “Goonies” (complete with a 3-D printed figurehead of the Goonies movie character Sloth) approximately 160 miles south of the Mexican Coast. Follow the journey of “Goonies” here: <https://www.crm.org/miniboat-program.html> Steadfast is a 52-year-old Reliance Class cutter and has been homeported in Astoria since 1994.

Marine Resources Patrol USCG

USCG release - ASTORIA, Ore. – The crew aboard the Coast Guard Cutter Alert (WMEC-630) returned to their home port Tuesday, Oct. 27, following a

60-day living marine resources patrol that began in late August. The cutter and crew patrolled the California coast, spanning from Humboldt County to the Southern Maritime Border with Mexico, enforcing federal, state and local policies aboard U.S. commercial fishing vessels. In direct support of the Coast Guard’s Ocean Steward and Ocean Guardian strategic guidance, the Alert completed 38 vessel boardings that enforced fisheries regulations and reporting compliance resulting in 47 violations. The Alert crew discovered 30 safety violations and terminated the voyages of three commercial fishing vessels, which were determined to be unsafe to continue operating. The vessel terminations were due to overdue survival craft servicing, expired hydrostatic releases on survival craft and expired flares. At-sea boardings are critical to ensuring safety of life for fleets operating on offshore fishing grounds. These efforts identified potential life-threatening situations and required the three vessel operators to correct these deficiencies before continuing their voyage. In addition to safety inspections, the Alert’s crew also checked for fisheries regulation compliance, and issued 17 living marine resources violations, that primarily consisted of fishing vessels not broadcasting vessel monitoring system codes, declaring incorrect vessel monitoring codes, fishing in closed areas and not having required vessel markings or logbooks aboard. The Coast Guard plays a critical role in helping the nation recover and maintain healthy populations of marine-protected species through its statutory mission of living marine resources. The nation’s maritime ecosystems are key to the United States’ economy and well-being and ensuring the country enjoys a diverse and sustainable marine environment is an important Coast Guard mission. This effort includes aiding in the prevention and decline of protected marine-species populations, promoting the recovery of endangered marine habitats and partnering with other agencies to enhance the sustainability of marine ecosystems. “It was amazing safe guarding the waterways and channels so close to where I grew up,” said Petty Officer 3rd Class Riley Wright, a boatswain’s mate aboard the Alert and a native of Murrieta, California. “It felt great knowing that we identified multiple dangerous situations with on-board safety gear and that our actions during this patrol potentially saved several lives.” Due to the global COVID-19 pandemic, numerous safety measures and precautions were put into place

aboard the Alert. The boat crews and boarding team members followed both Coast Guard and CDC guidelines to protect the fishing fleets and crews. All personal protective equipment was worn and the Alert’s small boats were decontaminated after every boarding. The 51-year old ship overcame several disabling equipment casualties during the patrol. The crew also embarked two California Fish and Game Wardens in an effort to build upon standing federal and state level law enforcement partnerships and improve maritime domain awareness for those tasked with regulating safety and oversight of the California commercial fishing industry. “I’m extremely proud of the Alert crew for their dedication and devotion to duty during our living marine resources patrol off the coast of California,” said Cmdr. Tyson Scofield, the Alert’s commanding officer. “The fishing industry is a vital component of the West Coast economy, and the Coast Guard is ready to keep the industry safe and sustainable. Alert’s first District 11 Living Marine Resources patrol in several years was a resounding success, paving the way for future major cutter operations in the region.” The Coast Guard Cutter Alert is a 210-foot medium-endurance cutter homeported in Astoria. The 11th Coast Guard District is headquartered in Alameda, California and encompasses the states of California, Arizona, Nevada and Utah, along with the coastal and offshore waters from the California-Oregon border south including Mexico, Central America and down to South America.

Meth/Heroin Douglas Co.

Over the course of the past several months, DINT has been investigating the activities of an interstate drug trafficking organization that has been having a big impact on our local community, as well as other surrounding communities. Detectives suspect the organization of trafficking large amounts of methamphetamine and heroin from southern California to Douglas County. As a part of that investigation, on Sunday, October 11th, 2020, at approximately 1:30 PM, DINT

detectives and Douglas County Sheriff's Office deputies initiated a traffic stop on a 2020 Nissan Altima on Interstate 5 at milepost 85 near Glendale, Oregon. The vehicle was occupied by 54 year old Michael Panoosi, 34 year old Jack Lewis, and 44 year old Michael Housel, all from the greater Los Angeles area of southern California. DINT detectives executed a search warrant on the vehicle and located approximately 46.5 pounds of suspected methamphetamine, 1.4 pounds of suspected heroin, and several firearms. Detectives believe much of the drugs were destined for Douglas County, as well as some surrounding counties. All three occupants of the vehicle were arrested. Michael Panoosi and Jack Lewis were lodged at the Douglas County Jail. Michael Housel was cited and released. Their charges were as follows: Michael Panoosi: Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Possession of Heroin, Unlawful Delivery of Heroin, Felon in Possession of a Firearm. Jack Lewis: Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Possession of Heroin, Unlawful Delivery of Heroin, 3 counts of Felon in Possession of a Firearm. Michael Housel: Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine. The investigation is continuing and more arrests are likely. Roseburg Police Department drug detection K-9 "Trapper" also assisted on this case. Trapper is a valuable member of our team, helping to keep our community as drug free as possible. Trapper earned some well deserved treats and a day off.

Reward for information on deer poached in Glide

ODFW release - GLIDE, Ore.—A poacher shot a trophy-size white-tailed buck in the city limits of Glide, Oregon on Oct. 7, then left the animal to languish. A reward for information leading to a citation currently stands at \$500 or four hunter preference points. The poacher fired a weapon in city limits, and likely shot from across a busy road,

according to Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife Senior Trooper Jason Stone. Not only was the shot itself illegal, but white-tailed deer are protected across the state, except for controlled hunts in select designated areas. The poacher broke multiple laws. The white-tailed buck, a three-point with eye guards, died near Abbott Street and Mt Scott Lane. Residents of the small town near Roseburg reported hearing what sounded like gunshots fired around 12:30 p.m., according to Stone. Later in the day, several people saw a wounded deer in a backyard and thought it had injured itself getting caught in a fence. A resident reported the injured animal to law enforcement, but no one was available to respond at the time. Eventually the deer died. The next day, while removing the carcass, Stone found it had wounds consistent with a small-caliber rifle. Both law enforcement and residents in the area are concerned with this turn of events. "Mostly I'm angry," one resident, who prefers to remain anonymous, said. "Somebody was careless, they shot and put people in danger. Everyone walks on our paths, which are near where the deer was, and there are houses there too." Stone thinks the deer may have been in the area because it was displaced by the Archie Creek fire. This year many animals are displaced by wildfires," he said, "They are easier targets because they aren't familiar with the area and they don't know where to go." Stone said another report came in on Wednesday of shots fired about 3:00 a.m. "There could be other poached deer out there," he said. The Oregon Hunters Association (OHA) offers rewards through the Turn In Poachers (TIP) Line. Cindy Rooney, an OHA Southwest Director and a member of the Umpqua OHA Board, takes this crime personally.

Not only did the poacher endanger the lives of citizens by being reckless with a firearm, they killed a game animal illegally. "Every animal that is poached is an opportunity lost for a legal hunter," she said. "Our game populations in the State of Oregon are a precious resource that needs to be appreciated and managed for future hunters." Stone agrees. "No one is more disappointed with poaching than an avid hunter," he said. The deer carcass was not salvageable. The antlers have been retained as evidence in the case. The Stop Poaching Campaign educates the public on how to recognize and report poaching. This campaign is a collaboration among hunters, conservationists, land owners and recreationists. Our goal is to increase reporting of wildlife crimes through the TIP Line, increase detection by increasing the number of OSP Fish and Wildlife Troopers and increase prosecution. This campaign helps to protect and enhance Oregon's fish and wildlife and their habitat for the enjoyment of present and future generations. Burglar Arrested in Douglas Co.

DEA Project Safeguard

SEATTLE – Drug Enforcement Administration Acting Administrator Timothy J. Shea announced that the DEA will direct resources to help reduce violent crime in communities throughout the country. Under this initiative, called Project Safeguard, DEA will identify and prioritize ongoing drug trafficking investigations with a nexus to violent crime. "Drug trafficking and violent crime are inextricably linked," said Acting DEA Administrator Shea. "From the extreme levels of violence in Mexican cartels, to the open-air drug markets in American cities, drug traffickers employ violence, fear, and intimidation to ply their trade. Neighborhoods across our country are terrorized by violent drug trafficking organizations that have little regard for human life, and profit from the pain and suffering of our people. Along with our law enforcement partners, DEA is committed to safeguarding the health and safety of our communities." "Violence goes hand in hand with illegal drug trafficking and continually threatens the safety of our communities," said DEA Special Agent in Charge Keith Weis. "While conducting investigations we continually encounter individuals associated with violent actions that have included kidnappings, armed assaults, home invasions, murder for hire, weapons trafficking and distributing the most dangerous drug we face –fentanyl." Working in collaboration with our federal, state, and local partners, including the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives and the U.S. Marshals Service, DEA's Project Safeguard will comprise three focus areas to address the growing violent crime threat in many cities across the United States: Disrupting, dismantling, and destroying the most significant violent drug trafficking organizations throughout the United States; Increasing federal prosecutions of firearms traffickers associated with drug trafficking organizations; and Prioritizing the capture of DEA fugitives who employ violence as part of drug trafficking. The traffickers that flood our communities with deadly drugs, including opioids, heroin, fentanyl, meth and cocaine, are often the same criminals responsible for the high rates of assault, murder, and gang activity in our cities. These criminals employ fear, violence, and intimidation to traffic drugs, and in doing so, exacerbate a drug crisis that claims more than 70,000 American lives every year. In recent months, violent crime has spiked in numerous cities and regions around the country, and drug trafficking is responsi-

ble, in part, for this violence. Since August 1, 2020, the DEA Seattle Field Division and its state and local partners have conducted operations against these violent traffickers throughout the Pacific Northwest which have yielded: 146 arrests; 95 weapons seized; \$3,559,107.00 in assets seized; Seized drugs: 120 pounds of heroin; 18.5 pounds of powder fentanyl; 571 pounds of methamphetamine; 37 pounds of cocaine; 41,200 pills containing fentanyl. The DEA Seattle Field Division has worked these high-level investigations with the assistance of our local, state and federal law enforcement partners in Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Alaska.

On October 29, 2020 at approximately 9:50 a.m., a Salem Police patrol officer was conducting a traffic investigation when the involved vehicle crashed at 17th and Court STS NE. The driver fled from the vehicle on foot. The officer, on foot, pursued the driver into a resident backyard on Court ST NE. Shortly after confronting the driver in the backyard, shots were fired. The officer was struck in the ankle. The suspect was also struck by gunfire and pronounced deceased at the scene. The officer was treated by medical staff and released. Jendraszek, who has been extremely cooperative and forthcoming throughout the investigation has talked openly with investigators about her

wrongdoings. Moreover, Jendraszek has also admitted withholding vital and medically necessary medication from forty-four vulnerable and elderly residents whom were her care. The investi-

gation began on September 10th, 2020 when the son of a resident reported cash had been stolen from this elderly father, who had moved into the Junction City Retirement and Assisted Living Facility

in August of 2018. Investigation led officers to speak with Jendraszek, a med-tech with the facility since October of 2018. Within hours of the start of the initial interview, Jendraszek surrendered approximately 275 pieces of jewelry she admitted she has stolen from residents of various assisted living and care facilities over the past five to six year; residents who resided at facilities in the Willamette Valley from Salem to Eugene. Sadly, many of the residents have now passed away so reuniting these items of sentimental value, with family members, is going to be difficult if not impossible. During multiple interviews with officers over the past month, Jendraszek has indicated she has come to be at peace with her decision to be honest about the crimes she has committed. In a notarized affidavit admitting her guilt, Jendraszek stated, "I am very apologetic for any harm I have done and/or any sadness I have caused. It is my intent to correct my wrongs and do the right thing by taking responsibility for my actions. I hope someday that all the families and persons I have harmed can find it within themselves to forgive me because I know what I have done is wrong and I am seeking the help I need to recover and become a better person." The Junction City Police Department needs help identifying the various pieces of recovered jewelry. The facilities in which Jendraszek has been employed

during the past five years, in alphabetical order include: Cedar Village Assisted Living Community – Salem; Capital Manor Retirement Community – Salem; Four Seasons Residential Care – Salem; Junction City Retirement and Assisted Living – Junction City; Gibson Creek by Bonaventure – Salem; Prestige Senior Living Orchard Heights – Salem; Redwood Heights Retirement and Assisted Living Community – Salem; River Grove Memory Care – Eugene. If you have had a friend or relative who was a resident of any of these facilities within the last five years and believe the resident has jewelry gone missing or may have been stolen, you are urged to visit the following website where all the recovered jewelry is displayed and available for review. Instructions on the website must be followed in order for the department to look into any claims.
