## Congratulations on 25 Years of Service

Recognizing Police Chief Gary McCullough, City of Coos Bay release - December 1, 2020 marked the 25-year anniversary of Chief Gary McCullough as a Police Officer for the City of Coos Bay. Chief McCullough began his Law Enforcement career in 1993 when he joined the ranks of the Coos Bay Police Department as a Reserve Police Officer. Chief McCullough was sworn as a full time Police Officer in December of 1995. Chief McCullough demonstrated excellent leadership and initiative and was promoted to Sergeant in 2002. In 2004, he was promoted to Captain, where he would oversee Patrol Operations and later Administrative Operations. In 2009 he was promoted to Chief of Police. During his career with CBPD, Chief McCullough has held the positions of Patrol Officer, Field Training Officer, Motorcycle Officer, Member of the Coos County Emergency Response Team, Survival Skills Instructor, Patrol Sergeant, Operations Captain, and Administrative Captain. Chief McCullough has an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Criminal Justice from Columbia Southern University, is a graduate of the Oregon Executive Development Institute and holds his Basic, Intermediate, Advanced, Supervisory,

Management, and Executive Certificates with the Oregon Department of Safety Standards and Training. Chief McCullough has also been very active in the Oregon Association of Chiefs' of Police, where he has held leadership and executive roles. Chief McCullough's span of 11 years as the top cop in Coos Bay ranks his length of service as fifth longest for City Marshalls'/Chiefs' of Police: Marshall John W. Carter 1897-1929 (32 years); Chief Rollie Pean 1967-1992 (25 years); Marshall Matthew Coy

1930-1946 (16 years); Chief Glen Kolhorst 1952-1967 (15 years); Chief Gary McCullough 2009-present (11 years). Chief McCullough has been married for nearly 39 years to his wife Lori. Together they have three grown children and one grandson. He and Lori also have a goddaughter who has blessed them with three grandchildren. Lori notes that two of their grown children have recently married and Gary and Lori are anxiously awaiting more grandchildren to spoil!

### Apprehension of Violent Criminal

NBPD release - On November 18, 2020, an astute city worker notified North Bend Police Department of a suspicious vehicle parked on private property north of Simpson Park. North Bend Police Department officers developed information that the driver of the vehicle may be wanted on a felony extraditable warrant out of California. Det. Sgt. Buddy Young worked with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and Sacramento Police Department authorities to learn that the warrant was for assault with a deadly weapon or instrument with a prior offense and involved the use of a machete and axe against his victims. NBPD officers surveilled the vehicle, which had moved inside Simpson Park near the Visitor's Center. Officers from North Bend PD, Coos Bay PD, and Oregon State Police conducted an operational briefing and took down the vehicle as it left Simpson Park in the area of Union Avenue and Florida Street. The suspect, Dustin Arlis White, age 31, of Sacramento, California, was taken into custody without incident. A female passenger, also from Sacramento, was released without charges. Officers observed a machete and axe inside the suspect vehi-

cle immediately adjacent to the driver's seat. The vehicle was impounded. White was transported to and lodged at Coos County Jail, awaiting extradition to California. North Bend PD would like to thank Oregon State Police, Coos Bay Police, Coos County Sheriff, the FBI, and Sacramento PD for their assistance and cooperation in apprehending and removing a violent criminal from our community.

### Clothing Pantry Fire

CBFD release - COOS BAY, November 28, 2020 - Just after 8:00 pm, the North Coos 911 Dispatch center began receiving multiple reports of a fire at the Seventh Day Adventist Church on Newmark in Coos Bay. Coos Bay Fire Department responded and found a fire inside the clothing pantry in an adjacent building belonging to the church. Fire fighters did a preliminary knockdown of the fire from outside before entering and completing the extinguishment. The fire was knocked down in about twenty minutes, but firefighters remained on scene for another hour and a half overhauling the building and conducting an investigation. The cause of the fire remains under investigation. The building is used as a food and clothing pantry, the food storage area suffered minor smoke damage, but the clothing pantry was severely damaged as was all the stored clothes and supplies. Damage estimates to the building is \$100,000 and contents conservatively at \$50,000 in damages. The building is insured. Coos Bay Fire requested and received aid from North

### OLCC & Coos Bay Speedway

OLCC release - PORTLAND, OR. – The Oregon Liquor Control Commission opened its regular monthly meeting on November 19, 2020, by learning about the slump in Oregon’s brewing industry, which is similar to the impacts felt in other alcohol industry sectors and the hospitality industry as a whole. A representative from the Oregon Brewers Guild provided an overview of the effect of the COVID-19 pandemic on the brewing industry including: a downturn in sales, the impact of brewers transitioning to canning, and the subsequent cost increases with canning related to overall market shortages in aluminum cans. Commissioners continued their ongoing discussion about the overall difficulties currently faced by the alcohol industry, especially the bottom-line impact of the freeze period and the issue of “cocktails-to-go.” The OLCC has updated its “Freeze Period” FAQs – find them here on the OLCC website under the COVID-19 Resources tab, click on the Business Continuity Information – Alcohol link. OLCC alcohol licensees continue to contact staff and individual Commissioners to voice support for al-

lowing licensed bars and restaurants to sell cocktails-to-go, which is currently prohibited by law, and requires action by the legislature to change. Commissioners Kiauna Floyd, Hugh Palcic, Matt Maletis and Jennifer Currin emphasized that the hospitality industry needs to work with Oregon legislators and fellow licensees to change the law; only then will the Commission be able to create rules giving bars and restaurants the privilege to sell cocktails-to-go. At the same time that the Commission has been working to reduce regulatory and financial burdens on the industry, the OLCC has had to ensure that licensees are following face covering, and social distancing guidelines. That was reflected in settlement agreements with two licensees that had failed to follow those requirements, and received immediate license suspensions. "I really liked how these were handled," said Paul Rosenbaum, OLCC Commission Chair "I hope other licensees understand that we're serious about the enforcement of these regulations." The Commission subsequently approved those **two alcohol stipulated settlements**. Coos Speedway (L) in Coos Bay, engaged in activity that violated the Oregon Health Authority’s (OHA) Statewide Mask, Face Shield, Face Covering Guidance issued on July 24, 2020, when it failed to require its patrons and employees to wear appropriate face masks, face shields, or face coverings at the premises. The licensee has accepted responsibility and has agreed to serve a 33 day suspension or pay \$2,475

civil penalty. Licensee is Drake Nelson, Managing Member; Kimberly Nelson, Member.

exited the vehicle and became confrontational. When the deputy attempted to place her into handcuffs, Sigmund began resisting arrest. She retrieved a can of pork and beans and threatened to throw it at him. The deputy attempted to use his TASER device but was ineffective at which point Sigmund threw the can at the deputy's head and missed him. The deputy then attempted to physically take Sigmund into custody. She continued to resist and managed to kick the deputy twice in the ribs. The deputy ultimately took her into custody. During the struggle, the deputy sustained scratch marks to his arms, forehead and right ear. Sigmund was transported to the Douglas County Jail where she was lodged on the following charges: Assault on a Public Safety Officer; Resisting Arrest; Interfering with a Peace Officer; Criminal Mischief III; Disorderly Conduct II; Warrant. The deputy received treatment for minor injuries and is expected to return on his next shift.

### **Hwy. 26 Fatal, Tillamook Co.**

On Saturday, October 31, 2020 at ap-

proximately 6:10 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a single vehicle crash on Hwy 26 near milepost 31. Preliminary investigation revealed that a Toyota Tundra, operated by Colin Banwell (54) of Hillsboro, was eastbound when it left the roadway and struck a tree. Banwell sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased.

### **Hwy. 101 Fatal, Clatsop Co.**

On Wednesday, November 4, 2020 at approximately 10:10 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a multiple vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near milepost 9. Preliminary investigation revealed a Lincoln Navigator, operated by Rachael Forrest (26) of Seaside, was northbound when it crossed into the southbound lane and struck a Toyota Rav4 operated by Randall Shine (63) of Ilwaco, WA. The impact spun the Rav4 into the northbound lane where it was struck by Chevrolet pickup (ODOT) operated by Richard Kearns (67) of Ocean Park, WA. Kearns and his passenger Virginia

Williams (59) of Warrenton (both ODOT employees) were transported to the hospital. Shine and his passenger Patricia Shine (71) of Ilwaco, WA, both sustained fatal injuries and were pronounced deceased. Forrest was not injured. Alcohol is being investigated as a possible factor.

### **Public's Assistance requested to find elk poachers in Clatsop County**

ODFW release - Bull elk poached in Clatsop County near Hwy 26 rest stop. Poached elk found dumped in Clatsop Co. off an embankment on Sugarloaf Mainline road, near milepost 5 on Hwy 26.. Click on photos for larger view. HILLSBORO, Ore.—Two elk were recently poached and left to waste near Hwy 26 in Clatsop County. Members of the public who heard shots fired or noticed unusual activity near the Hwy 26 rest stop or near McGregor State Forest Road on or about Oct. 15 or 16 should contact Oregon State Police. Both elk were found on private timber lands, but

not together. The cases are likely not related according to Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife Senior Trooper David Herman. OSP Senior Trooper Herman found the first elk lying in torn sod and muddy ground and in the early stages of decomposition. The elk was likely shot a few days earlier, on Oct. 14 or 15. He located the entry wound; a rifle shot to the spine, taken from behind the animal. Herman suspects someone shot the elk on Clatsop County forest land near the Hwy 26 rest stop, likely in the area of the first few miles McGregor State Forest Road. The second elk was killed in an unknown location, with an unknown weapon on or about Oct 16. The poacher removed the head, two legs and the back strap. The poacher transported most of the animal by vehicle to the Sugarloaf Mainline and dumped the carcass down an embankment near milepost 1.5. This is also near milepost 5 on Hwy 26. A Lewis and Clark Timberlands employee found the carcass and reported it to Senior Trooper Herman. Herman investigated the dump site and estimates the bull was a large trophy but is not certain without the head. He suspects the elk

was taken from a nearby herd. Herman is concerned about the number of poached deer and elk he has investigated over the past two years. He says the number is on the rise in the area. "I've found at least 15 elk killed off-season in the last couple of years," he said, "And those are just the ones that we get called about. There are many more that we don't find." Roosevelt elk are indigenous to the Oregon coast range. An estimated 59,000 "Rosies" meander among mossy trees and brush on their treks from mountainside to seashore via fields, housing developments and major roadways. They can grow to 1,100 pounds and are the third largest mammal in North America. Oregon has regular coast elk hunting seasons each fall. The Turn In Poachers program will award four hunter preference points or \$500 for information that leads to a citation in either of these cases. The Stop Poaching Campaign educates the public on how to recognize and report poaching. This campaign is a collaboration among hunters, conservationists, land owners and recreationists. Our goal is to increase reporting of wildlife crimes through the TIP Line, increase detection by increasing the number of OSP Fish and Wildlife Troopers and increase prosecution. This campaign helps to protect and enhance Oregon's fish and wildlife and their habitat for the enjoyment of present and future generations. K9 Nato spent his first week getting settled and doing some ride-along time with Ofcr Wehrley. Although K9 Nato's initial week in Oregon brought some very unwelcoming weather, he was still happy and ready to go to work every day, which she feels is great for a K9 working on the coast. Over the next

few months, Ofcr Wehrley and K9 Nato will be building their bond and extensively training to achieve their state certification before moving to a regular patrol shift. that heat lamps pose a potential fire a danger due to improper size and wiring, poor grounding of extension cords, as well as placing too close to flammable materials. As with all maintenance and repairs, consult your owner's manual for any special recommendations or concerns.

### When Boating, Prepare & Plan

Oregon is blessed with a plethora of boating opportunities year-round but fall and winter require more preparation and planning. This year is no exception and boaters are urged to take a few extra steps to ensure a safe voyage. Oregon's waterways are cold year-round and noticeably cold now, so dress for the water temperature and expect to get wet. For paddlers, SUPers, and rafters, the Marine Board recommends wearing a wet suit, dry suit, warm layers, and a life jacket designed for the activity. At a minimum, carry a cell phone in a dry bag/container or other communication device, and share a float plan with friends or family so they can call for help if you are overdue. Fall rains can also cause dramatic rises in river flows. Because of this year's historic wildfires, these fluctuations may be quicker and larger, and more debris is entering the rivers and lakes. The water is staying muddy much longer as well. Boaters are encouraged to monitor NOAA weather for their region, check river gauges and reservoir levels, and to visit the agency's interactive Boat Oregon Map with information to contact facility owners and learn if access is open. The Marine Board works closely with marine law

### Coast Guard urges winterization of boats across the PNW

SEATTLE — The Coast Guard urges the public to winterize their vessel as winter approaches the Pacific Northwest. Winterization is an important step, even if you live in a moderate region like the Pacific Northwest. Proper winterization will ensure your safety, prolong the longevity of your vessel, and help safeguard the maritime community and environment around you. The Coast Guard frequently responds to sunken vessels and oil discharges at marinas due to poor winterization. Below are a few items to get you started but if you don't feel comfortable performing these items by yourself, we encourage you to reach out to your boat dealer or local marina for assistance: Remove excess gear – Removing gear that has accumulated over the boating season will make room for cleaning and any necessary repairs. This should include an inspection of all safety gear and replacing any expired or defective gear, including life jackets, fire extinguishers, first aid kit, etc. Drain the water – Properly dispose of any bilge water and drain any fresh water tanks, fittings and lines. During this time check all boat plugs and seals to ensure they are properly set and ready for winter. This is an important step to prevent water lines and tanks from cracking and preventing internal water damage, including mold. Remove waste and materials – Use environmentally friendly chemicals when cleaning your vessel and remember to properly dispose of any chemicals, oils, and batteries. If you are not sure of where to dispose of these items, check with your marina or local authorities. Whether you are going to keep your boat in the water for the winter or take it out, we encourage you to disconnect your batteries, shut and lock all doors and windows, and secure all covers. Before departure, double check all moorings and ensure they are securely set. If the boat is taken out of the water, shrink wrapping the vessel is also an option. Sealing the vessel is extremely important in preventing capsizing due to heavy rainfall or icing. Be advised

enforcement to assess reported navigation obstructions as well, adding verified obstructions to the map with river sections to avoid or recommendations for safe passage, where possible. Conditions are dynamic, though, with new obstructions reported almost daily right now. Scout ahead in unknown waters. Boating has become a great escape during this time of COVID but requires vigilance and skill. If you're new to boating, take advantage of a free online paddling course or other boating safety education offerings for motorboat operators. Start out in locations that are calm and sheltered from rapidly changing conditions due to weather or water volume.

### USCG & Paddle Board Identification

USCG release - SEATTLE — The Coast Guard and its Washington and Oregon boating safety agency partners urge the labeling of paddle craft and owner responsibility on the waters of the Pacific Northwest. Reports of unmanned and adrift paddle craft divert federal, state and local response boat and air crews on hundreds of dangerous and costly searches that turn out to be false alarms. Since 2016, 13th Coast Guard District aircraft and vessels have launched on 746 individual cases of vessel reported capsized and adrift. All were unmanned and adrift, not resulting in an actual distress. Each case represents a minimum cost of approximately \$40,000 to the taxpayers to respond and conduct searches for possible persons in the water. For the 13th District, this accounts for an operational cost of approximately \$29,840,000.00. The Coast Guard treats every distress call and report of an unmanned paddle craft as if a real life is at stake. "Unmanned adrift vessel search and rescue responses are the No. 4 response activity in the Coast Guard nationwide," said Dan Shipman, recreational boating program specialist for the 13th District. "By properly securing your small craft, on the beach, dock or your vessel from being set adrift, you're not only saving taxpayers' dollars, you are helping protect your property, the environment and possibly the life of someone who is actually in need of assistance." **The Coast Guard urges the public to do the following three things:** Help us help you find your kay-

ak. Mark It! Take responsibility for your paddle craft by labeling with an 'If Found' sticker. This label allows responders to confirm if someone is actually in trouble and collect information to help search efforts. Take responsibility for recovering your paddle craft. Unmanned and adrift kayaks, canoes, dinghies and rowboats often cause hazards to navigation in the waterway and increase the level of risk and fatigue on response crews tasked to find the owners associated with the unmanned paddle craft. Do your part to prevent false alarms. First responders deployed in search of unmanned paddle craft divert resources away from actual lives in distress. ### Siuslaw National Forest Rescue

USCG release - NORTH BEND, Ore. — A Coast Guard aircrew and sheriff's deputies rescued a missing hunter Thursday, Nov. 19, who had become stranded in the Siuslaw National Forest. The hunter had reportedly suffered a broken ankle and hypothermia. Due to his location, sheriff deputies requested the assistance of a Coast Guard helicopter crew to airlift the man to safe-

ty. A Coast Guard Sector North Bend MH-65 rescue helicopter crew hoisted the man and delivered him to awaiting emergency medical technicians for further care. "The Coast Guard works closely with state and local agencies to keep people safe, and this case demonstrates how good communication and cooperation can help save lives," said Cmdr. Winston Wood, Coast Guard Sector North Bend Search and Rescue Coordinator.

### More on the Injured Hunter, Lane Co.

On November 17, 2020 shortly after 4:30 p.m., the Lane County Sheriff's Office received a report of a missing hunter in the Rock Creek wilderness area in northwestern Lane County. The hunter, 30 year old Tyler Saxon of Creswell, was dropped off in the area the morning of November 17th to go hunting and was supposed to meet up with someone a few hours later and never showed up. Family reported him missing shortly thereafter. Lane County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue deployed a rescue team to the area and searched all night Tuesday, all day Wednesday and into Thursday. Search and Rescue teams from Linn County, Lincoln County, and Benton County joined the search along with the U.S. Coast Guard who assisted with a heli-

copter and a team to search from the air. On November 19, 2020 shortly before 4:00 p.m. Search and Rescue volunteers located Mr. Saxon in a heavily wooded area near where he was dropped off. He was found with non-life-threatening injuries and is currently with searchers as they work on a rescue plan to get him out safely.

### Capsizing Netarts Bay

USCG release - On Friday, November 27, 2020 at approximately 2:20 P.M., emergency personnel from the Oregon State Police, Tillamook County Sheriff's Office, Netarts Fire and Rescue, and the United States Coast Guard responded to a capsized boat at the mouth of Netarts Bay. Srun Hong, who was not wearing a life jacket, has not been located and is presumed drowned.

On August 25, 2020, Stark was charged by criminal Information with Theft of Government Funds in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 641. He will be sentenced on February 8, 2021 before U.S. District Court Judge Karin Immergut. "Social Security benefits theft is a crime that threatens this very important program meant to support the most vulnerable in our nation," said United States Attorney Williams. "Anyone who knowingly steals the retirement benefits of others must be held accountable for their conduct." The Social Security Administration, Office of Inspector General investigated this case. It is being prosecuted by Rachel Sowray, Special Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon.

### Child Sex Abuse Suspect, Josephine Co.

On Tuesday, November 3, 2020 Oregon State Police Detectives began an investigation into child Sex Abuse allegations in Josephine County. On Monday, November 9, 2020 detectives served a search warrant in the 3500 block of Quartz Creek Rd. Merlin, OR. David Campa (55) attempted to flee, on foot, out the back of the residence but was

quickly detained. The Oregon State Police Criminal Investigations Division was assisted by the Josephine County District Attorney's Office.

### Frenzy of wildlife poaching in Lane County causes concern

SALEM, Ore. — A decapitated black bear joins a growing list of animals from a frenzy of poaching in Lane County in recent weeks. The crimes appear to be random and opportunistic, and officials are looking for leads in multiple cases. Oregon State Police Senior Trooper Josh Wolcott, who works with the state's only conservation K9, a yellow lab named Buck, is traveling Lane County investigating wildlife crime scenes and searching for evidence. "This is the worst I've ever seen. Things are happening all over Lane County right now," Wolcott said, "Every day is a new report." Reports include the bear and multiple deer and elk so far. Wolcott takes Buck to poaching sites where the dog detects shell casings, gunpowder residue and human scent; all of which can lead to a forensic bonanza. Tangible evidence helps, but even better would be a suspect's name or a vehicle description. When Wolcott discovered the black bear, he found a scene of carnage. The bear's head, claws, backstrap and some leg meat were removed. The majority of the carcass was left to waste. Poachers target black bears for their paws, claws, head and gall bladder. The gall bladder is an ingredient in some traditional medicine even though a synthetic version of bear bile is readily available. Wolcott said it is very possible the gall bladder had been harvested, but because of the condition of the carcass, he was unable to tell for sure. OSPF&W troopers need public information in the following cases: A black bear discovered on Roseburg Forest Products property outside of Veneta. The bear was likely poached about Oct 13. The head, claws, portions of backstrap meat and portions of leg

meat were removed. The remainder of the bear was left to waste. Wolcott and K9 Buck located the carcass on Oct 15, in response to a call to the Turn In Poachers (TIP) Line. A doe deer discovered on National Forest Property near Fall Creek. The deer was likely poached on or about Oct 14. No meat was taken; the doe was left to waste. Wolcott and K9 Buck located the carcass on the morning of October 15 in response to a call to the Turn In Poachers (TIP) Line. A doe deer discovered along US Forest Service Road 2118 near Hills Creek Reservoir. The deer was likely poached on Oct 14 or 15. No meat was taken; the doe was left to waste. OSPF&W Senior Trooper Marshall Maher located the carcass on the evening of Oct 15, in response to a call to the TIP Line. A buck deer discovered on private property near Lowell. The deer was likely poached during the night of Oct 15 or early morning hours of Oct 16. No meat was taken; the buck was left to waste. Sr. Trooper Maher located the carcass on the evening of Oct 16 in response to a call to the TIP Line. A spike buck deer discovered near High Pass Road. The buck was likely poached on or about Oct 16. The buck was field-dressed and left to waste. Wolcott and K9 Buck located the deer on Oct 17, in response to a call to the TIP Line. A doe discovered in the Veneta area. It was likely poached on or about Oct 18. ODFW Wildlife Division Administrator Doug Cottam is disappointed in this situation. "There are available and inexpensive opportunities to legally harvest a deer or bear to eat in Oregon. There is no excuse for poaching," he said. "I am very concerned about people who kill wild animals just to satisfy their desire to kill something. Stop Poaching campaign coordinator Yvonne Shaw agrees. "Poaching is someone's instant gratification that creates an ongoing loss of natural resources for the rest of us in Oregon," she said. The Stop Poaching Campaign educates the public on how to recognize and report poaching. This campaign is a collaboration among hunters, conservationists, land owners and recreationists. Our goal is to increase reporting of wildlife crimes through the TIP Line, increase

home at the 22000 block of Fisk Rd. in Noti. The victim (a 73 year old male) was reportedly assaulted by a family member, 44 year old Shawn Stilwell of Noti, and suffered significant facial injuries. The victim was able to get out of the house but the victim's wife, who is on hospice, was reportedly still in the home with Shawn. Information obtained during the investigation indicated that Shawn was agitated, possibly intoxicated, and had access to weapons. Upon arrival, deputies found Shawn's vehicle parked about halfway up the long driveway to the home, blocking other vehicles from passing. Deputies attempted to loud hail from their patrol vehicles from behind Shawn's vehicle but did not get any response from him or the victim's wife. Due to the unusual way the suspect blocked the driveway, the severity of injuries inflicted upon the victim, and information that Shawn had access to multiple weapons, an armored rescue vehicle was called out to the scene. Deputies were able to use the armored rescue vehicle move Shawn's car in order to get access to the home, which was in a remote, wooded area. Once deputies were able to get closer to the home they used a PA system again to loud hail into the residence in attempt to get Shawn to come out. Because of the armored rescue vehicle, deputies were able to get close enough to see the victim's wife who appeared to be uninjured. Deputies were also able to see Shawn pacing in the home as they continued to talk with him to try to get him to come out voluntarily. Shortly after 7:00 a.m. on November 23, 2020, Shawn came to the front porch of the residence with his hands up and was taken into custody and lodged at the Lane County Jail on Assault in the second degree, Menacing, and Strangulation. The victim was not transported to the hospital. The victim's wife was evaluated and thankfully determined to be uninjured.

### Poacher caught, convicted after traffic stop in Eastern Oregon

ODFW release - VALE, Ore. — A Vale man caught during a traffic stop has been convicted for poaching a trophy-sized mule deer in eastern Oregon last year. Garrett Harris, 22, of Vale, pled guilty on Oct. 31 to criminal unlawful take of a buck deer and waste of a game mammal after poaching the 5X5 mule deer buck in the Beulah unit of eastern Oregon in November 2019. Harris became a suspect in the case earlier this year when someone called the Turn In Poachers (TIP) Line to report that Harris had shot a mule deer while the season was closed in 2019. OSP troopers tried to contact Harris after the initial report but were unable to locate him. On June 16, 2020, OSP Fish and Wildlife Ser-

geant Erich Timko, returning from a Magone Lake patrol, stopped a black Jeep Cherokee on US 26 for several traffic violations. Harris was driving. When Sgt. Timko realized he had apprehended the wildlife crime suspect, he asked Harris about his hunting exploits. Harris eventually confessed to shooting the mule deer. According to Sergeant Timko, Harris shot the buck with his bow in the Beulah unit on Nov. 21, 2019. The wounded buck crossed onto adjacent property for which Harris did not have permission to enter. Harris left the deer to die. Then he returned the following day to retrieve the deer, coyotes had gotten to it. He removed the head and left the remainder of the animal to waste. Then he hid the head on a family member's property. OSP troopers retrieved the head from the relative's property and charged Harris with multiple wildlife crimes. He appeared in Malheur County Court on Oct. 31 and pled guilty to criminal Unlawful Take of Buck Deer and Waste of Game Mammal. To make the punishment fit the crime, Nathaniel Rupp, Assistant District Attorney for Malheur County, sentenced Harris to community service time talking to hunter education students about the perils of poaching. Harris will spend 48 hours conducting speaking engagements while he ponders his loss of hunting privileges for two years, forfeiture of his bow and \$1,100 in fines and restitutions. Of that, \$1,000 will go directly to the Turn In Poachers (TIP) Line rewards fund with the Oregon Hunters Association. Rupp, who is new to Malheur County and has never prosecuted a wildlife crime before, was impressed with how the case evolved and the detective work associated with it. "I think the anti-poaching program set up by the legislature is a great program," he said. "Sergeant Timko was really helpful to the prosecution side for deciding an acceptable guilty plea. He also helped our office to prosecute a poaching case." As for the community service talks Harris will give, Rupp said, "This is definitely helpful for the defendant. And it educates the public on what not to do." Timko echoes Rupp's comments, and added that when troopers observe one crime, the encounter can lead to additional offenses. "Throughout my career I've found that some of the biggest criminal cases are made from conducting a simple traffic stop, many times for a minor violation," Timko said. "We all make mistakes in life and a lot of our character develops from our accountability and improvement from those mistakes." The Stop Poaching Campaign educates the public on how to recognize and report poaching. This campaign is a collaboration among hunters, conservationists, land owners and recreationists. Our goal is to increase reporting of wildlife crimes through the TIP Line, in-

crease detection by increasing the number of OSP Fish and Wildlife Troopers and increase prosecution. This campaign helps to protect and enhance Oregon's fish and wildlife and their habitat for the enjoyment of present and future generations. ### Bull Trout Poacher Sentenced

EUGENE, Ore.—Culver, Oregon resident Thomas R. Campbell, 29, was sentenced in federal court for the flagrant and repeated poaching of protected and Tribally significant bull trout, announced U.S. Attorney Billy J. Williams. "One of the most solemn duties of the U.S. Attorney's office is enforcing the laws for the protection of our threatened wildlife and upholding our special trust relationship with our tribal partners," said United States Attorney Billy J. Williams. "This case demonstrates our priorities in exercising those duties and holding accountable those who would flagrantly disregard our nation's laws that protect threatened species." "Bull trout are an iconic species of the Pacific Northwest whose populations are suffering from habitat degradation, and are protected by Tribal, State and Federal laws," said James Ashburner, Special Agent in Charge, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. "The defendants in this case caused great harm to the recovery efforts of all of the government and non-government groups who have invested in the recovery of this species. This joint case demonstrates the resolve of Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs, Oregon State Police, the U.S. Forest Service, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in preserving bull trout for future generations. A special thank you goes out to the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Oregon for placing an emphasis on environmental crimes that impact the natural world we all enjoy." According to court documents, on multiple occasions in 2017 and 2018, Thomas R. Campbell poached bull trout from the Metolius River, fishing from both U.S. Forest Service lands and while trespassing on the "Eyerly Property," which was held in trust by the United States for the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs. Campbell also encouraged others to do the same. The Metolius River requires catch-and-release for all species of fish, including bull trout. Although one can legally angle for bull trout on the Metolius River and in Lake Billy Chinook, bull trout are not legal to target elsewhere in Oregon. This makes the Metolius River one of the Oregon's crown gems of angling. Campbell targeted, kept, and grossly mishandled bull trout despite admittedly knowing the

laws protecting the species and how to properly handle fish to immediately release unharmed. He also committed these crimes despite numerous warnings from public viewers of his social media boasts about his poaching. Campbell repeatedly posted photos of his bull trout poaching exploits to his social media platforms where he had more than 1,000

followers. Bull trout are listed as threatened under the Endangered Species Act. The species has been depleted by a range of factors, including overfishing. Today, bull trout inhabit less than half of their historic range. Central Oregon's Metolius River helps serve as a prized spawning ground, and it is used to help repopulate other waters where bull trout numbers have dwindled even lower. These magnificent fish are revered by anglers and are a cherished Tribal resource. Poaching represents a lethal threat to their recovery. On August 13, 2020, Campbell pleaded guilty to three misdemeanor charges contained in the criminal information. These counts charge violations of the Lacey Act, 16 U.S.C. § 3372(a)(1) for knowingly acquiring and transporting bull trout from the Metolius River in the Deschutes National Forest and from Warm Springs' Tribal land. Robert "Bobby" Brunoe, the General Manager of Natural Resources and Tribal Historic Preservation Officer for the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs addressed the sentencing judge on behalf of the Tribes. He discussed the Tribes' sovereignty over the Warm Springs Reservation, the severity of the trespasses by non-members like Campbell, and the cultural importance of bull trout to the Tribes. Mr. Brunoe also discussed his own connection to these fish, recalling his grandmother's subsistence fishing for bull trout when he was a child. He stressed the importance of protecting and restoring bull trout. U.S. District Court Judge Ann Aiken sentenced Campbell to five years of federal probation and banned him from angling or hunting anywhere in the United States as a condition of probation. In addition, Judge Aiken ordered Campbell to pay a \$6,000 criminal fine to the Lacey Act Reward Fund and \$649.95 in restitution to the Oregon State Police for his destruction of a trail camera designed to catch poachers. Campbell was also ordered to perform 300 hours of community service with a non-profit focused on conservation or with a collaborative relationship with the Confederated Tribes of

Warm Springs. This case was investigated by the United States Fish and Wildlife Services, Office of Law Enforcement; Oregon State Police, Fish and Wildlife Division; Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Branch of Natural Resources; and the United States Forest Service, Law Enforcement and Investigations. It was prosecuted by Will McLaren and Pam Paaso, Assistant U.S. Attorneys for the District of Oregon.

Officer Parsons sustained a grazing gunshot wound to the leg and was treated and released. No more updates are expected before the Marion County District Attorney presents the case to a Grand Jury - which is standard protocol in Marion County. **Original release on Oct. 29, 2020 at 1305:** Salem, Ore. —

On October 29, 2020 at approximately 9:50 a.m., a Salem Police patrol officer was conducting a traffic investigation when the involved vehicle crashed at 17th and Court STS NE. The driver fled

from the vehicle on foot. The officer, on foot, pursued the driver into a resident backyard on Court ST NE. Shortly after confronting the driver in the backyard, shots were fired. The officer was struck in the ankle. The suspect was also struck by gunfire and pronounced deceased at the scene. The officer was treated by medical staff and released. As per Salem Police policy, the involved officer has been placed on administrative leave. In accordance with Senate Bill 111, the Salem Police Department has requested the Oregon State Police be the lead investigative agency for the incident. This is an ongoing investigation, and any further details will be released by the Oregon State Police. No identities will be released until next of kin and positive identifications take place.

### Eastern Oregon Meth Bust

MEDFORD, Ore.—U.S. Attorney Billy J. Williams announced Friday, Oct. 30 that an Ontario, Oregon resident, and a Weiser, Idaho resident have been charged with interstate trafficking of methamphetamines and other drugs. Alma Lorena Pacheco Ortiz, 52, and Victor Gomez Casa 26, have been charged by criminal complaint with possession of controlled substances with intent to distribute, and Pacheco was also charged with possession of a firearm by a person unlawfully in the United States. "Rural communities across Oregon have been ravaged by the effects of methamphetamine addiction" said U.S. Attorney Billy J. Williams "We cannot succeed in breaking the cycle of addiction and affliction in these communities when individuals like the defendants, motivated by greed, continue to provide a steady supply of poison. We are proud of the collaborative efforts to disrupt this long term drug trafficking enterprise" "Communities are struggling to reduce or eliminate the physical and mental damage caused to individuals and communities by illicit drug addiction," said Steven Romero, Ontario, Oregon Chief of Police. "Area law enforcement continue to use a 'force multiplier' approach for disrupting or dismantling international, multi-state and local drug trafficking and money laundering organizations. We're proud work together with our law enforcement partners to make our communities safer." "I applaud the work of Federal, state, and local law enforcement in this effort," said Malheur County, Oregon Sheriff Brian Wolfe. "People are being held accountable for serious illegal activity which in turn makes our communities safer." "Oregon State Police Troopers work diligently to observe signs of criminal activity during every traffic stop," said Captain Tim Fox. "As part of this coordinated effort, our OSP Troopers engaged these observation skills which

proved fruitful in pulling a significant amount of drugs off the streets." According to court documents, on October 25, 2020, law enforcement conducted a coordinated traffic stop on a 2015 Chevrolet Tahoe with Idaho plates. The driver of the car was Pacheco, and the passenger was the registered owner Victor Gomez Casa. A search of the vehicle led to the discovery of a mechanically actuated trap located under the rear seat of the vehicle. Law enforcement was able to activate the trap, opening the storage compartment which revealed approximately 40 pounds of methamphetamine and a kilo of heroin. Pacheco admitted traveling to California to obtain drugs, which she had been transporting and distributing in Eastern Oregon for several years. On the same day, law enforcement served a federal search warrant at Pacheco's residence located in Ontario, Oregon. During the search, law enforcement located approximately \$75,000 in United States currency, a firearm and additional suspected methamphetamines. Law enforcement records indicate Pacheco was deported in 2013 to Mexico, Pacheco's country of origin.

### Wolf Killed Baker Co.

The Oregon State Police Fish & Wildlife Division is asking for the public's help with identifying the person (s) responsible for the killing of a wolf in the Pine Creek Wildlife Management Unit, located in the Wallowa Whitman National Forest, on or about October 29, 2020. This incident occurred in the Grouse Flat area off of the USFS 3990 RD, northeast of Halfway, OR. An elk hunter found the deceased wolf and reported the incident to OSP. The hunter then led OSP and ODFW personnel to the location of the deceased wolf. The investigation determined the wolf was shot with a firearm. ODFW stated the wolf was a non-breeding sub-adult female wolf approximately 1.5 years of age. The wolf was in the Pine Creek Pack territory.
