### OSP at State Capitol

Wednesday, Jan. 6, Oregon State Police have heard rumors that armed groups were considering taking over and/or occupy the State Capitols. Oregon State Police fully support peoples first amendment rights of freedom of speech and to gather peacefully. OSP will not tolerate criminal activities and you will be arrested if you engage in any of these acts. The security of the capitol is our priority, if you are considering any unlawful activities at the Oregon State Capitol or surrounding areas, please reconsider. The safety of our community members, Capitol occupants, and police officers is paramount. If you are aware of anyone that intends to engage in these criminal acts, please report them to your local law enforcement or to the Oregon State Police immediately. **Earlier -** On January 6, 2021 at approximately 6:00 P.M., Troopers contacted, Cody Melby (39), attempting to access several doors at the Oregon State Capitol. He was contacted and arrested for Trespassing while in possession of a firearm. Cody Melby was lodged at the Marion County Jail. On Wednesday, January 6, 2021, Oregon State Police, Salem Police Department, and Marion County Sheriff's Office personnel were monitoring a protest that was occurring at the Oregon State Capitol. At approximately 2:00 P.M., a group of counter protesters arrived at the Capitol and a fight broke out between the opposing sides. Law Enforcement members quickly separated

the two groups and worked to keep the two groups separate for the remainder of the day. David Willis (43) of Lincoln City, was arrested and charged with harassment and disorderly conduct. The investigation is continuing and more charges are possible after consultation with the Marion County District Attorney.

### Bandon Male Arrested During Washington D.C. Riot

According to a report from the U.S. Attorney's Office in Portland, three Oregonians, including a Coos Co. male, were arrested during the storming of the Nation's Capitol on Wednesday, Jan. 6, in Washington D.C. Two Portland women (ages 28 & 54) were charged with Unlawful Entry and Curfew Violation, while 57-year old Rodney Taylor of Bandon was charged with Curfew Violation. Oregon U.S. Attorney Billy Williams said Oregonians who traveled to Washington D.C. and participated in last week's armed insurrection at the U.S. Capitol would be prosecuted to the "fullest extent of the law" in Oregon.

### Oregon National Guard at State Capitol

Oregon State Police Superintendent Terri Davie requested and was granted the activation of members of the Oregon National Guard to assist with potential upcoming civil unrest/protests by Governor Kate Brown. "The Oregon State

Police will continue to take a neutral role in ensuring Oregonians exercise their First Amendment rights," said Oregon State Police Superintendent Davie. "For the past seven months, your Troopers have responded throughout Oregon to various protests, unlawful assemblies and riots. Our goals have always been to protect people, protect people's rights and to protect property. The recent events at our Nation's Capitol building and at our own statehouse illustrate the need for law enforcement to be prepared and appropriately staffed for any large gatherings," Davie added. The Oregon Army National Guard will be deployed as necessary and their deployment locations will not be made public. OSP and the ONG routinely work and train together in response to Oregon's challenges, including civil unrest, human remain recovery in the recent wildfire response and safeguarding our communities in times of crisis. "With the Oregon National Guard supplementing OSP ranks, we will be ready to ensure peaceful events and handle emergency situations," said Oregon State Police Captain Timothy Fox. Oregon State Police will continue to work with our local, state and federal partners in planning for potential events at the Oregon State Capitol or any other jurisdiction in Oregon. OSP will continue to leverage their strong partnerships with local and federal law enforcement, in efforts to provide safety to legislators and employees conducting the people's business in the Capitol. The Oregon State Police does not discuss the specifics of potential threats or tactical plans made unless it is determined there is a public safety need.

### Oregon's U.S. Attorney on Political Violence

PORTLAND, Ore.—Billy J. Williams, U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon, released the following statement on recent political violence: "Like most Americans, I watched in disgust and anger as radical insurrectionists stormed the U.S. Capitol in a shocking display of political violence. There is no question these violent acts were domestic terrorism aimed at disrupting Congress' Constitutional duty to certify the electoral victory of President-elect Joe Biden. The Justice Department and U.S. Attorney's Offices throughout the country are working tirelessly to investigate and prosecute all forms of domestic terrorism including this attack on our government, and those responsible will be brought to justice. As we approach next week's inauguration, the threat of similar political violence around the country and here in Oregon remains. Our office is working closely with the FBI, Federal Protective Service, Oregon State Police, Portland Police Bureau, and other local, state, and federal law enforcement partners to identify, investigate, and disrupt anyone

intent on engaging in violence here in Oregon. We need the public's help to keep our communities safe and protect all Oregonians' First Amendment rights. We urge you to submit any information you have about real or potential threats of violence at any upcoming demonstrations or events throughout the state. CCSO release - On January 6, 2021, at about 2300 hours, a deputy from the Coos County Sheriff's Office was en route to an unrelated call when he observed a blue in color Subaru pass through a stop sign without stopping and weave within it's lane of travel. Based upon the observed violation of Fail to Obey a Traffic Control Device, a traffic stop was initiated at Wallace Road and Evans Place in the Barview District of Charleston. The Deputy was informed the vehicle had been reported stolen. The Deputy initiated a high risk stop and along with partner deputies extracted the driver, identified as 33 year old Johnny McDaniels and the passenger, 23 year old Robert Mason from the vehicle. Through a field interview, a quantity of methamphetamine believed to be in excess of one ounce was recovered from

the vehicle. McDaniels was arrested, but released to medical staff due to medical complications. The case will be sent to the Coos County District Attorney's Office for charges

### Attempted Assault on Peace Officer

CCSO release - On January 15th, 2021 at approximately 7:30 PM, the Coos County Sheriff's Office responded to a report that a male, later identified as 47 year old Shaun Nix, was refusing to leave a residence after being asked to. The Coos County Sheriff's Office arrived and attempted to persuade Shaun to leave the property, even offering him a ride to his residence. Shaun appeared to be under the influence of a narcotic. After being given an opportunity to depart the property, Shaun attempted to re-enter the residence when Deputies placed him into custody. Shaun attempted to resist and pull away from the Deputies while he was being placed into custody, as well as kicking one of the Deputies. Shaun was carried to the patrol vehicle and transported to the Coos County Jail where he was booked and

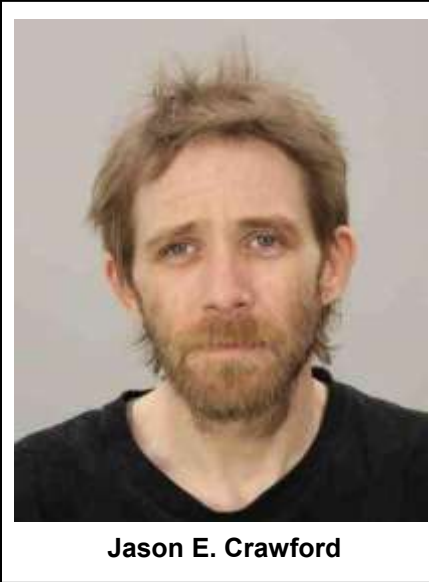
lodged for Criminal Trespass II, Harassment, Interfering with a Peace Officer, Resisting Arrest and attempted Assault on a Public Safety Officer.

### 4 Impaired drivers arrested by Coos Bay Police in December

CBPD release - In December the Coos Bay Police Department arrested 4 drivers for DUII. 3 arrests were made during regular patrols. In December 22nd and December 28th the Coos Bay Police Department participated in Christmas/New Years Holiday DUII enforcement operations sponsored by Oregon Impact and ODOT. 1 DUII arrest was made during the December 22nd operation. The Coos Bay Police Department will have additional officers out periodically throughout the month of January for DUII enforcement.

### Hwy. 18 Fatal, Lincoln Co.

OSP report - On Thursday December 31, 2020 at approximately 2:41 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two-vehicle collision on Hwy 18 near milepost 10. Preliminary investigation revealed a Honda Pilot, operated by Julien Doudna (35) of Mill City, was crossing Hwy 18 from the North Van Duzer rest area to the South Van Duzer rest area and collided with a Toyota Land cruiser, operated by Scott Brady (49) of Salem, which was eastbound on Hwy 18. Honda Pilot passenger Brandy Doudna (44) of Mill City sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Julien Doudna along with three juveniles were transported to Salem Hospital. Another juvenile passenger was transported by Life-flight to Legacy Emmanuel Hospital in

Portland. Brady and two passengers were not transported. A juvenile passenger was transported to North Lincoln Hospital.

### Tsunami Siren Sounds on Central Coast

Residents and visitors to the "World's Smallest Harbor" on the Central Oregon Coast were alarmed Saturday, Jan. 2, after the City of Depoe Bay decided to sound its Tsunami Siren to warn about impending high winds. The confusion resulted in many calls and emails to the city's fire department. Fire Chief Bryan Daniels stated there was not tsunami threat. The Pacific Storm did produce high winds, 84 mph at Cape Perpetua south of Yachats and 75 at the Yaquina Bay Bridge at Newport. One visitor reportedly wrote "please reserve the doomsday siren for an actual doomsday."

### Thefts from State Parks

OPRD release - On December 30, 2020 the Oregon State Police received reports of thefts at Fogarty Creek State Park, Otter Crest Scenic Viewpoint, Boiler Bay Scenic Viewpoint, and the Devils Punchbowl State Natural Area. Oregon State Park Rangers had discovered the thefts of interpretive sign displays (photographs attached). The approximately 2' x 3" signs and their metal bases were removed from the parks. The thefts are believed to have occurred between December 24, 2020 and December 30, 2020. The Oregon State Police is investigating the thefts and requests anyone with information to contact the Oregon State Police Northern

### K-9 nabs Burglary Suspect on Central Coast

On Tuesday January 5th, 2021 at approximately 8:29 AM, Deputies from the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office, assisted by the Newport Police Department, responded to 6976 SW Surfland Street, South Beach regarding the report of a burglary at the residence. Upon arrival Deputies confirmed that unauthorized entry was made into the residence, the unidentified suspect was not located at that time. During the investigation it was determined the suspect was last observed traveling on foot heading North through private residential property toward SW 68th Drive. Personnel including Deputy Derick Smith and his K9 partner Nix responded to the area. K9 Nix identified a track of the suspect, leading Deputy Smith to a path to the beach where she located the suspect later identified as Jeremy Severns, age 34 of Newport. Mr Severns was taken into custody without further incident thanks to K9 Nix and assisting personnel. Jeremy Severns was lodged in the Lincoln County Jail on the following charges: Burglary in the 1st Degree, Theft in the 2nd Degree, Criminal Trespass in the 1st Degree, and Criminal Trespass in the 2nd Degree. His bail was set at \$187,500.

### Police Class Graduates

The Oregon Department of Public Safety

Standards and Training (DPSST) is pleased to announce the graduation of its 402nd Basic Police Class. The Basic Police Class is 16-weeks in length and includes dozens of training areas including survival skills, firearms, emergency vehicle operations, ethics, cultural diversity, problem solving, community policing, elder abuse, drug recognition, and dozens of other subjects. Basic Police Class 402 graduated during a private ceremony at the Oregon Public Safety Academy in Salem, Oregon on Thursday, **January 7, 2021**. Due to the COVID 19 pandemic and the need for social distancing the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training regrets that the ceremony was closed to the public. However, we would like to publicly congratulate Basic Police #BP402 on their successful completion of basic training. ### Hwy. 101 Fatal, Curry Co.

On Thursday, January 7, 2021 at approximately 5:30 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a vehicle that struck a pedestrian on Hwy 101 near milepost 358. Preliminary investigation revealed a Dodge car, operated by Kristen Batey (44) of Brookings, was northbound when it struck Makenzie Long (28) of Brookings who was in the northbound lane of Hwy 101. Long was transported to the hospital where she was pro-

nounced deceased.

### Hwy. 26 Fatal, Clatsop Co.

On Monday, January 11, 2021 at approximately 3:40 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two vehicle crash on Hwy 26 near milepost 7. Preliminary investigation revealed a Ford Explorer, operated by Lonnie Meade (65) of Seaside, was eastbound and stopped to turn left into a driveway when it was struck from behind by a Peterbuilt semi truck operated by Alejandro Flores (43) of Tigard. Meade sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Flores was not injured. Hwy 26 was closed for 4 hours.

### Golf Course Owner's Murder

On January 14, 2021, a Lincoln County Grand Jury indicted 52 year old Waldport resident, Jack E. Sigler, on charges of Murder in the Second Degree, four counts of Burglary in the First Degree and one count of Theft in the First Degree in connection with the death of Mark Campbell on December 6, 2020 in Waldport, Oregon. On December 6, 2020, Lincoln County Sheriff's Deputies responded to the report of a burglary in progress at 1680 S. Crestline Drive, Apartment #3, Waldport, Oregon. Upon arrival, deputies found Mark Campbell unresponsive inside the apartment. Mr. Campbell was subsequently pronounced deceased at the scene. The cause of death was determined to be severe trauma received from multiple stab wounds. The Lincoln County Major Crime Team conducted an extensive investigation into the death of Mark Campbell. Multiple witnesses were interviewed, physical evidence was gathered from several lo-

cations and submitted to the Oregon State Police Crime Lab for forensic analysis. On January 13, 2021, the Oregon State Police Crime Lab completed forensic analysis on physical evidence submitted, a Grand Jury proceeding was scheduled for the following day. The Grand Jury returned with an indictment on the listed charges. The Lincoln County Sheriff's Office received assistance in the criminal investigation from the Oregon State Police Criminal Investigation Unit (CID), Oregon State Police Forensics, City of Newport Police Department, City of Lincoln City Police Department and the Lincoln County District Attorney's Office. Sheriff Curtis Landers would like to personally thank all the agencies involved in the investigation leading to the indictment in the tragic death of Mark Campbell. Sheriff Landers expresses his sincere condolences to all those affected by this tragedy in our community. Further information regarding the investigation/prosecution of this case should be directed to the Lincoln County District Attorney's Office.

### Burglary & Assault Central Coast

On January 15, 2021, at approximately 5:52 pm, Lincoln County Sheriff's Office Dispatch received a 911 call reporting a stabbing that occurred on E Little Albany Loop, Tidewater, Oregon. The reporting party told Dispatch the victim was able to get away from the suspect and seek help from a neighbor. Dispatch received multiple calls during the response including one reporting the suspect's location. Lincoln County Sheriff's deputies responded to the scene and detained Branden Michael Gross, 29, of Tidewater. After Mr. Gross was detained and the scene was secured, medics with Pacific West Ambulance and Central Oregon Coast Fire/Rescue assessed the adult female victim. The victim sustained multiple stab wounds in the mid-section which were determined to be non-life-threatening. She was transported to Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital. Investigation determined the victim arrived home in the evening and found Mr. Gross upstairs, inside her home. The victim was able to wrestle Mr. Gross out of the residence through the back door while screaming for help. Mr. Gross turned back toward the residence and entered again through the back door. Another physical struggle ensued, and Mr. Gross stabbed the victim with a knife two times in the area of her abdomen. Neighbors were alerted to the victim's screaming and responded to the location to find Mr. Gross and the victim in a physical struggle at the back door. Neighbors intervened and got between the victim and Mr. Gross. During this time, the victim was able to escape and go to a neighbor's residence and Mr.

Gross was able to escape the victim's residence through the front door. Mr. Gross was located at a nearby residence and arrested for the crimes of Burglary in the first degree, Unlawful Use of a Weapon and Assault in the second degree with a total bail set at \$300,000. He was transported and lodged at the Lincoln County Jail. Investigation revealed the suspect was unknown to the victim. It was reported that Mr. Gross suffers from mental health issues.

### Missing Person Central Coast

On January 15, 2021, at approximately 5:17 pm, Lincoln County Sheriff's Office Dispatch received a report of a missing person, last seen in the area of Bayshore, Waldport, Oregon. The missing person, identified as Toni L. Goessman, 60, of Waldport, was reported to be last seen walking her dogs approximately 2 hours prior. The caller, Mr. Goessman, reported Mrs. Goessman had left on a walk with their two Boxer breed dogs. Mr. Goessman became concerned when one of their two dogs returned by itself to their residence, soaking wet. Mr. Goessman drove around the area, looking for his wife. Mr. Goessman reported Mrs. Goessman regularly goes on walks with their dogs on the beach. Mr. Goessman was unable to search on foot due to limited mobility.

Mr. Goessman reported it was out of the ordinary for Mrs. Goessman to be without their dogs. Lincoln County Sheriff's deputies responded to the area and conducted a preliminary search. Lincoln County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue was activated, and additional personnel began searching the area. The U.S. Coast Guard was also notified and their assistance was requested. At about 10:32 pm, Search and Rescue volunteers discovered Mrs. Goessman, deceased in the surf near the mouth of the Alsea River. Their other dog, "Tango", described as a brown Boxer with a white chest, was not found. Circumstances surrounding Mrs. Goessman's death did not appear suspicious. Mr. Goessman was notified of Mrs. Goessman's death and Bateman Funeral Home responded to the location. The Lincoln County Sheriff's Office extends its deepest condolences to the Goessman family and would like to remind members of the public to please use caution when recreating near waterways.

### K9 Ghost Working the Central Coast

On December 30th, 2020 K9 Handler Deputy Zach Akin and K9 Ghost completed six weeks of training. During this time, they trained on Handler Protection, Tracking, Suspect Apprehension and Evidence Collection. This training also

enhanced the important bond and trust between both Deputy Akin and Ghost. The team demonstrated these learned skills and became certified through the Oregon Police Canine Association Patrol Standards. The newly minted team began patrolling the streets shortly after. On January 20, 2021 at approximately 1:00 PM Deputy Akin and K9 Ghost answered a request for assistance from the Lincoln City Police Department near the 2600 block of NW Lincoln City. When Deputy Akin arrived, he learned a male identified as Nicholas A. Ballentine age 32 of Lincoln City was seen by LCPD Officers. Mr. Ballentine had felony warrants for his arrest and fled from the Lincoln City Officers. Deputy Akin and K9 Ghost immediately went to work tracking. Ballentine was escorted to a patrol car and subsequently transported to the Lincoln County Jail where he was lodged on the Felony Parole Violation Warrant, as well as being charged with Possession of Methamphetamine and Possession Psilocybin. ### Coast Guard responds to sunken pier in Anacortes, WA

SEATTLE — The Coast Guard respond-

ed Wednesday to a sunken pier and multiple vessels affected by high winds and tidal surges created by a storm that moved across the Pacific Northwest Tuesday, Jan. 12. A 300-foot by 50-foot concrete floating pier submerged early Wednesday morning in the area of Lovric's Sea-Craft in Anacortes with three vessels moored to it. A tug boat, the Hellen S, was tangled up in mooring lines and had to be detangled and removed safely. The decommissioned Coast Guard Cutter Acushnet was also tangled. A tug boat, the Garth Foss, was hired to assist by capturing the vessel and securing it in a temporary location. A decommissioned 100-foot vessel, the Chilkat, was wrenched completely free of it's mooring, set adrift, and eventually sank in the early morning. Near the Guemes Island ferry terminal in Anacortes. The vessel was empty of fuel and oil. No persons were aboard any of the vessels at the time and no pollution has been reported. "This was an unfortunate incident," said Chief Petty Officer Kevin Ouyoumjian, Federal On Scene Coordinator's Representative, Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound's Incident Management Division. "However, the immediate actions of the Lovric Sea-Craft marina prevented it from becoming a catastrophe. Also, the power of these winter storms should remind all mariners of the importance of securely mooring vessels at all docks and marinas."


### USCG Craft Target of Laser

PORTLAND, Ore. — The Coast Guard is seeking information from the public in locating a suspect or suspects who pointed a green laser light at the cabin of a

Station Portland boatcrew conducting underway operations Tuesday night, Jan. 12. Coast Guard crews from Station Portland have been struck with lasers several times in the past six months. The latest laser strike occurred around 10 p.m. and reportedly came from a building on the southern shore of the Willamette River west of the Fremont Bridge. The crew aboard the 29-foot Response Boat-Small immediately conducted an on-scene health assessment after the strike and then safely transited back to base. Laser pointers can cause danger to Coast Guard boatcrews due to glare, afterimage, flash blindness or temporary loss of night vision. "Laser incidents are incredibly dangerous, put the safety of our boatcrews in jeopardy and degrade our ability to navigate and respond to emergencies," said Lt. Cmdr. Colin Fogarty, enforcement chief, Sector Columbia River. "We ask the public to understand the dangers associated with playing with lasers and how they disrupt our crews from responding to mariners in distress." Causing the beam of a laser pointer to strike a vessel operating on the navigable waters of the United States is a felony crime under 46 U.S. Code

### USCG Warns Mariners about Disabling AIS

ASTORIA, Ore. --- The Coast Guard is issuing a warning to mariners and commercial fisherman about the dangers and legal consequences of disabling a vessel's Automated Identification System. The Coast Guard has seen an alarming increase of commercial fishing and crabbing vessels disabling their AIS, purportedly in an attempt to keep their fishing spots secret from competition. "AIS is a vital tool in a host of Coast Guard missions including Search and Rescue and Port Security," said Lt. Collin Gruin, boarding team supervisor at Coast Guard Sector Columbia River. "It's not only illegal to turn it off but also incredibly dangerous." AIS is a maritime navigation safety communications system adopted by the international community to help save lives and facilitate safe transit of navigable waterways. AIS automatically transmits vessel information to shore stations, other ships, and aircraft. That includes vessel identity, type, position, course, speed, navigational status, and safety-related information. The regulation (33 CFR 164.46) in part states that all self-propelled vessels, at a length of 65-feet or more, engaged in commercial service and operating on the Territorial Seas (within 12-nautical miles of shore) must maintain AIS in effective operating condition, which includes the continual operation of AIS and its associated devices (e.g., positioning system, gyro, converters, displays) at all times while the vessel is underway or at anchor, and, if moored, at least 15 minutes prior to getting underway. Effective operation condition also includes the accurate input and upkeep of all AIS data fields; an AIS encoding guide has been provided to facilitate complying with this requirement. Violators of this regulation can expect to receive a civil penalty up to a maximum of \$35,486 per violation. "Crabbers may think that they

are protecting their businesses, but they are actually making search and rescue efforts more difficult if an emergency happens at sea," said Gruin.

### USCG Helo Rescue Southern Oregon

MEDFORD, Ore. — The Coast Guard and partner agencies rescued a hiker Monday, Jan. 18 after she reportedly fell down a cliff near Grayback Mountain. A Coast Guard rescue swimmer spent 12 hours rendering lifesaving medical care to the hiker before a hoist could be conducted Tuesday morning. Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector North Bend received an agency assistance request from Oregon Emergency Management at approximately 9 p.m. Monday. A 42-year-old female had reportedly fallen about 50 feet and sustained serious injuries. An MH-65 Dolphin rescue helicopter crew from Sector North Bend launched at approximately 11 p.m. At 11:45 p.m., the aircrew arrived on scene and lowered the rescue swimmer to evaluate and render immediate care. Due to weather conditions and challenging terrain, a hoist was not conducted immediately. The rescue swimmer remained on scene overnight until an Oregon Army National Guard aircrew aboard a UH-60 Blackhawk helicopter arrived to complete a hoist evacuation Tuesday at approximately 11:45 a.m. The survivor and one other uninjured hiker were transported to awaiting medical personnel in Medford. The rescue swimmer was subsequently transported to Sector North Bend. "Our immediate goal is to get on scene, evaluate and stabilize," said Chief Aviation Survival Technician Roderick Ansley. "Our people bleed, sweat and work hard to train for these situations. We prepare for the missions of our AOR [area of responsibility]." In the Pacific Northwest, there is the potential for inland search and rescue cases conducted by the Coast Guard. In preparation for these nontraditional Coast Guard mis-

ness of the Pacific Northwest be prepared for an emergency. Wear appropriate clothing and footwear, stay hydrated and always have a reliable means of communication to reach first responders.

County. Watchstanders at Sector Columbia River received an agency assistance request from Oregon Emergency Management at approximately 5:30 p.m. Two hikers found the injured man near Gorton Creek Trail on Friday. The man reportedly fell, sustained immobilizing injuries and became stranded in the canyon Tuesday, three days earlier. When the Coast Guard received initial notification, the Hood River County Sheriff's Office and other first responders were on scene administering immediate medical care but were unable to safely medevac the injured hiker due to challenging terrain. The MH-60 Jayhawk aircrew was conducting training offshore when diverted to Air Station Columbia River to retrieve necessary equipment and a rescue swimmer [Aviation Survival Technician]. The aircrew departed from Air Station Columbia River at approximately 6 p.m. The aircrew arrived on scene and deployed the rescue swimmer at 6:42 p.m. The survivor was successfully hoisted from the canyon in a coordinated effort between the Coast Guard aircrew and other responders on scene before being transported to Legacy Emanuel Memorial Hospital in Portland. "The interoperability of federal, state and local agencies made the difference. It saved this man's life," said Greg Merten, operations unit specialist and search and rescue controller at Sector Columbia River. "Knowing information about the terrain, medical condition of the hiker, allowed us to prepare and to arrange everything to successfully effect the rescue." At 8 p.m., the survivor was transferred in stable condition to the hospital's trauma team. The Coast Guard urges mariners and those exploring remote areas inland to have a plan and to let others know when you expect to return. Always have a reliable means of communication to reach first responders in case of emergency.

### USCG Medevac

SEATTLE — A Coast Guard aircrew medevaced a woman from a ship Saturday afternoon, Jan. 30, experiencing breathing difficulty and temporary unconsciousness off the Washington coast near Neah Bay. Watchstanders at

Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound command center received a call at 11:30 a.m. from the ship's health insurance provider stating a 65-year-old woman aboard the vessel needed medical attention. At the time, the 710-foot container ship, Matson Kodiak, was transiting westbound in the Strait of Juan de Fuca. The command center diverted an MH-65 Dolphin helicopter crew from Air Station Port Angeles who was already airborne near Seattle. At 1 p.m., the rescue crew arrived on scene, deployed the rescue swimmer to assist, and safely hoisted the woman. The aircrew then proceeded en route to Olympic Medical Center in Port Angeles. She was transferred to higher medical care at 1:50 p.m. The patient's current medical condition is unknown.

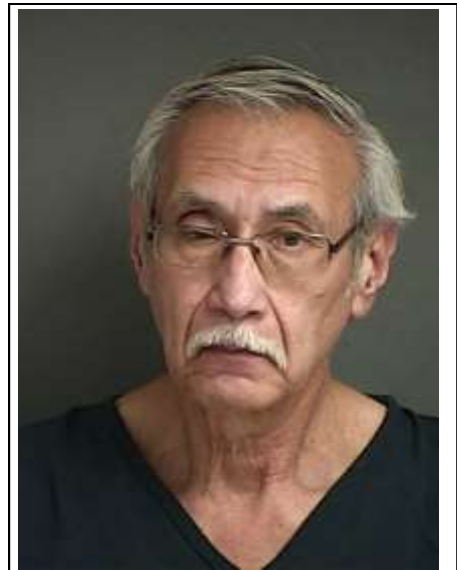
### Motorhome Mayhem

Deputies learned that James had been the subject of multiple driving complaints and was reported to have struck

multiple vehicles on Interstate 5 while traveling south from Cottage Grove. Oregon State Police Troopers had been responding to the area to locate the motorhome. After exiting the freeway, James struck an ODOT truck head-on and drove away from the scene. He then entered the RV Park and attempted to strike a pedestrian with the motorhome before crashing into the travel trailer. Deputies also discovered an adult female, who was James' girlfriend, had been a passenger in the RV. The passenger had asked James to stop and let her out, but he did not and continued driving. Deputies discovered James had caused significant damage to the travel trailer, which was occupied at the time of the collision, although the occupants were not injured. Additional damage occurred to the park's waterline and another vehicle. James was arrested and lodged at the Douglas County Jail on the following charges: Attempted Assault in the First Degree x2; Criminal Mischief in the First Degree x3; Robbery in the Third Degree; Reckless Endangering x3; Felon in Possession of a Firearm; Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine; Assault in the Fourth Degree; Theft in the Second Degree; Interfering with a Peace Officer; Disorderly Conduct in the Second Degree; Failure to Perform the Duties of a Driver – Misdemeanor. Additionally, the Oregon State Police investigated the crimes which occurred on Interstate 5 and the incident involving the ODOT truck. ### Missing Woman Found Deceased Western Douglas Co.

REEDSPORT, Ore. - On Friday, January, 22, 2021, at approximately 3:00 pm, a deputy was notified of a vehicle off of the side of the road near milepost 36 on Lower Smith River Road. The caller reported finding a dog near the vehicle and stated he had taken the dog with him. The vehicle did not appear to have been involved in a traffic crash and the vehicle doors were locked. The deputy conducted a DMV check on the vehicle and learned it was registered to a female in Winchester Bay (not Garrison). The deputy drove to the registered owner's residence and attempted to make contact, but did not receive a response. On Sunday, January 24, 2021, at 4:25 pm, the Douglas County Sheriff's Office received a report of a missing person involving 70 year-old Margare-

ret Lucretia Garrison of Reed-sport. Deputies learned that Garrison left Lakeside on Thursday, January 21, 2021, at approximately 3:30 pm. She last spoke to an acquaintance by telephone at approximately 4:30 pm on that day. The caller provided a description of the vehicle and the license plate at which time the investigating deputy recognized it to be the one mentioned on the Friday, January 22, 2021, incident handled by the original deputy. Deputies responded to the location on Smith River Road where the vehicle was still located. They searched the immediate area and were unable to locate anyone. It was later discovered the vehicle had been purchased by Garrison, but not been registered in her name at the time of initial report. At the time there were no indications the vehicle was associated with Garrison, nor had she been reported missing. Deputies contacted several area hospitals checking to see if Garrison had been admitted, which she had not. Douglas County Search and Rescue was

notified and a search plan was developed. On, Monday, January 26, 2021, resources with Search and Rescue searched for Garrison; eventually locating items belonging to her. Search and Rescue deputies made arrangements for the Sheriff's Office Marine Division to launch a boat on Tuesday morning to conduct a search from the river. On Tuesday, January 26, 2021, search crews and marine deputies continued the search for Garrison. Two men in a drift boat, later reported they had located a deceased body in the middle of the river approximately one mile downstream from where Garrison's vehicle was located. Marine deputies identified the body to be that of Garrison and recovered her body from the river. Garrison's death is under investigation by the Douglas County Medical Examiner's Office, although it is not considered suspicious at this time. Next of kin has been notified. The Sheriff's Office was assisted by Douglas County Search and Rescue, Bureau of Land Management Law En-

forcement and several members of the public.

**Former Eugene Teacher Convicted**

EUGENE, Ore.—A former Eugene elementary school teacher Pleaded guilty

today for sexually abusing a minor female, announced U.S. Attorney Billy J. Williams. William Hamann, 38, pleaded guilty to one count of sex trafficking of a child. According to court documents, on several occasions beginning in 2018 and continuing until July 2019, Hamann paid a minor female for oral sex and recorded the minor performing the sex acts. The minor female was 15 years old during the first encounter with Hamann. Eugene Police Department detectives and FBI agents arrested Hamann on July 26, 2019, when he came to meet the minor a fourth time. Agents searched his mobile phone and found a recording of one of the sex acts. Hamann used social media to arrange the meetings with the minor. On August 21, 2019, a federal grand jury in Eugene returned a four-count indictment charging Hamann with sexual exploitation and trafficking of a child, possession of child pornography, and attempted sex trafficking of a child. Hamann was also charged with multiple counts in Lane County Circuit Court, including sodomy and sex abuse. Hamann will be sentenced on March 1, 2021 before U.S. District Court Judge Ann Aiken. The U.S. Attorney's Office will recommend a sentence of 160 months in federal prison to be served consecutively to a 20-month prison sentence in Lane County. As part of the plea agreement, Hamann has agreed to pay restitution in full to his victim. This

case was investigated by the FBI and the Eugene Police Department. It is being prosecuted by Jeff Sweet, Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon, and Katherine Green, Lane County Deputy District Attorney. Anyone who has information about the physical or online exploitation of children are encouraged to call the FBI at (503) 224-4181 or submit a tip online at tips.fbi.gov. Federal law defines child pornography as any visual depiction of sexually explicit conduct involving a minor. It is important to remember child sexual abuse material depicts actual crimes being committed against children. Not only do these images and videos document victims' exploitation and abuse, but when shared across the internet, child victims suffer re-victimization each time the image of their abuse is viewed.
