### Hwy. 101 Fatalities

CCSO release - On 04-22-21 at about 8:00 am, the Coos County Dispatch received multiple reports of a red Mitsubishi Eclipse bearing California license plate 4NDF245 being driven dangerously. Reports indicated the vehicle travelling in the Bandon area, and included unlawful u-turns on the highway, excessive speeds and near collisions with other vehicles. At about 8:17 am, the vehicle was involved in a crash that tragically resulted in multiple fatalities on Highway 101 near mile marker 247. The matter is under investigation by multiple agencies. Anyone with information regarding the red Mitsubishi Eclipse, who saw the vehicle between the hours of 7:00 and 8:20 and in the areas of Langlois to the intersection of Highway 101 and Highway 42 is asked to call the Coos County Dispatch non-emergency number at 541-396-2106. Please leave your name and a good contact number for investigating officers to return your call for a brief interview. Additional information may help piece together the events leading up to the crash.

### Hwy. 101 Multiple Death Update

CCSO release - On 04-22-21, starting at about 7:15 am, police began receiving reports in Port Orford of a red Mitsubishi Eclipse being driven by an adult male later identified as 32 year old Cory M Orsenico. Over the following

hour, Orsenico was reported multiple times for increasingly dangerous driving, including speeding, swerving in and out of lanes, passing on corners, making sudden u-turns, cutting off vehicles including semi-trucks, speeding through the school zone in Bandon at over 60 MPH and running red lights without slowing. Police from several agencies were attempting to locate Orsenico, as he was endangering people with his reckless driving. At mile marker 247 on Highway 101 (near the Belloni Boys ranch), officers from the Oregon State

Police and Bandon Department located Orsenico. Orsenico was north bound on the highway, and an OSP trooper south-bound. When the Trooper turned his vehicle to follow Orsenico, there was a minor collision before Orsenico again sped off, now heading south-bound. Investigating officers have reason to believe that Orsenico travelled from the slow lane of the three lane highway to the fast lane, then crossed the double yellow line before intentionally colliding with the a vehicle in the opposing lane, containing 54 year old Dawn Adams and 78 year old Jeffrey Adams, both of Bandon. All three involved people were declared deceased on scene. This matter is still under investigation by several agencies. We have received calls with information regarding the red Eclipse, which has assisted in completing a timeline of events leading to the tragic crash. Further information is requested; if you witnessed the red eclipse during this timeframe, please call 541-396-2106 and leave your name and a good contact number. Helpful information would include any contact with Orsenico in the last three days, video footage of Orsenico or the red Mitsubishi Eclipse or any other witness information at any time. Orsenico was reportedly arrested on March 10<sup>th</sup> in Orick, CA for Exhibiting a Deadly Weapon other than a Firearm, Vandalism and Probation Violation.

### North Bend Male Charged with Sexually Exploiting a Minor

PORTLAND, Ore.—Acting U.S. Attorney Scott Erik Asphaug announced Tuesday, April 20 that a North Bend, Oregon, man has been charged with sexually exploiting a minor female victim. On April 15, 2021, a federal grand jury in Eugene returned a three-count indictment charging Shannon Stacey Weather-

bee, 47, with sexual exploitation of children. According to the indictment, beginning around July 2017, Weatherbee is alleged to have knowingly coerced a minor female to engage in sexually explicit conduct for the purpose of producing a visual depiction of such conduct. These visual depictions were transmitted online. On April 16, 2021, investigators arrested Weatherbee while executing a search warrant on his North Bend residence. Weatherbee made his initial appearance in federal court today before a U.S. Magistrate Judge. He was arraigned, pleaded not guilty, and ordered detained pending a jury trial scheduled to begin on June 22, 2021. This case is being investigated by the FBI with assistance from the North Bend Police Department. It is being prosecuted by Jeffrey S. Sweet, Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon. Anyone who has information about possible crimes committed by Weatherbee, or the physical or online exploitation of any children, are encouraged to call the FBI at (503) 224-4181 or submit a tip online at tips.fbi.gov. If a child discloses an incident that did happen to him or her, or that they observed happen to someone else, the parent should not ask the child detailed questions about the incident. Instead, please contact your local law enforcement agency or the FBI immediately. This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006 by the

### Recovered Stolen Vehicle & Drug Arrest

CBPD release - On 04/08/2021, at approximately 9:41a.m., the Coos Bay Police Department located a stolen vehicle on Highway 42 near Central Avenue in Coquille. The Coos Bay Officer was leaving the Courthouse and returning to the City of Coos Bay when he observed the stolen vehicle pass by him. The stolen vehicle report was filed with the Coos Bay Police Department the day before. The stolen vehicle was described as a 2006 Mazda MZ3, blue in color with California license plates. The vehicle had been stolen out of the Empire area in Coos Bay. The Coos Bay Police Officer was able to stop the vehicle and make contact with the male driver and a female passenger, the male driver was identified as 32-year-old Aaron Lott, of Coos Bay. ### Person Fatally Struck in Parking Lot

CBPD release - On 04/20/2021, at 1024 hours, the Coos Bay Police Department dispatch center received a 911 call reporting a vehicle struck a person in the public parking lot on the southeast side of the intersection at Commercial Ave. and N. 3rd St. Medical personnel and law enforcement were dispatched to the scene. Officers arrived on scene at approximately 1027 hours. The victim, 20-year-old Raven English, was pronounced dead at the scene. The driver of the vehicle remained on scene and cooperated with the investigation. Witnesses told officers that English had been laying in the parking lot and had been encouraged to move a short time before the incident. The driver of the vehicle said they had not seen English and drove over her. The driver, who was traumatized from the incident, was later transported to Bay Area Hospital. The Coos County Crash Team was notified and representatives from the Oregon State

### Vehicle versus Pedestrian Crash

CBPD release - On 04/15/2021, at 1029 hours, the Coos Bay Police Department dispatch center received a 911 call reporting a vehicle struck a pedestrian on Coos Bay Blvd. near Thompson Rd. Medical personnel and law enforcement were dispatched to the scene. Officers arrived on scene at approximately 1034 hours. The pedestrian was evaluated by medical personnel was transported to Bay Area Hospital by Bay Cities Ambulance. The driver and passenger of the vehicle that struck the pedestrian remained on scene and cooperated with the investigation. The Coos County Crash Team was activated and representatives from Oregon State Police, Coos County Sheriff's Office, North Bend Police Department and the Coos County District Attorney's Office responded to

the scene to assist. Mast Bros Towing Company arrived on scene to assist in the removal of the vehicle. The crash is still under investigation and is being conducted by the Coos Bay Police Department.

### Bandon Assault

CCSO release - On April 5, 2021 at approximately 04:16 am, Coos County Deputies received a report from a female that her boyfriend, 67 year old Michael B. Currie of Bandon assaulted her in the home they shared. Deputies responded to the scene and located the victim. She was seated in a car outside the residence wearing only a pair of pants, shoes, and a robe. She had obvious wounds and blood covering her face. Mr. Currie was contacted and it was discovered he was under the influence of alcohol. The incident was investigated, and Mr. Currie was taken into custody. It was also discovered Mr. Currie had a firearm in the house. There was an active stalking protective order against Mr. Currie, prohibiting him from owning any firearms. The exact situation that led to Mr. Currie possessing this firearm is still under investigation by the Coos County Sheriff's Office. The gun was seized from the residence. Mr. Currie was transported to the Coos County Jail where he was

Emergency personnel located a Chevrolet Camaro submerged in the river. Darious Oaks (72) of Coos Bay was located inside the vehicle deceased. He had been reported missing on March 26, 2021. OSP was assisted by the Bandon Fire Department Dive Team, Millington Fire Department, and ODOT.

### Central Coast Felon Sentenced to Prison over Meth

EUGENE, Ore.—A Lincoln City, Oregon man with multiple felony convictions was sentenced to federal prison today for distributing methamphetamine in and around Lincoln City, announced Acting U.S. Attorney Scott Erik Asphaug. Jerad Joseph White, 39, was sentenced to 100 months in federal prison and 5 years' supervised release. According to court documents, on March 12, 2018, White and an accomplice, Patricia Rose Hendrick, 25, of Lincoln City, Oregon, arrived in a vehicle to the parking lot of the Lincoln City Outlets. As had been previously arranged, White sold three ounces of methamphetamine to an undercover agent for \$900. On December 12, 2018, a federal grand jury in Eugene returned a two-count indictment charging White and Hedrick with conspiring to possess with intent to distribute methamphetamine and possession with intent to distribute methamphetamine. By December 2020, White and Hendrick had both pleaded guilty to possession with intent to distribute methamphetamine. On October 29, 2020, Hendrick was sentenced to time served in prison and five years' supervised release. This case was investigated by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives; the Lincoln City Police Department; and the Tillamook County Sheriff's Office. It was prosecuted by Nathan J. Lichvarcik, Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District

of Oregon. This case was brought as part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN). PSN is the centerpiece of the Department of Justice's violent crime reduction efforts. PSN is an evidence-based program proven to be effective at reducing violent crime. Through PSN, a broad spectrum of stakeholders work together to identify the most pressing violent crime problems in the community and develop comprehensive solutions to address them. As part of this strategy, PSN focuses enforcement efforts on the most violent offenders and partners with locally based prevention and reentry programs for lasting reductions in crime.

### Hwy. 101 Fatal, Tillamook Co.

On Saturday, April 17, 2021 at approximately 11:51 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to the report of a pedestrian that had been struck on Hwy 101 near mile post Z49. Preliminary investigation revealed a pedestrian, Quinten Hoptowit (23) of Warm Springs, was laying in the roadway when he was struck by a northbound vehicle. The vehicle described as a dark color crew cab pickup with a short box, open bed, and inoperative passenger side tail light - left the scene. Hoptowit sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. OSP was assisted by Tillamook County Sher-

iff's Office, Rockaway Beach Fire Department, Rockaway Beach Police Department and ODOT.

## USCG

### Oregon Coast Guard cutter returns home following Eastern Pacific law enforcement patrol

USCG release - ASTORIA, Ore. — The Coast Guard Cutter Alert (WMEC 630) returned home to Astoria Wednesday, April 7 following a 63-day counterdrug patrol in the Eastern Pacific Ocean. Working in conjunction with different Coast Guard and Mexican law enforcement agencies, Alert's crew's disrupted more than 2,100 pounds of cocaine, valued at over \$41 million wholesale, from entering the United States. The Oregon-based cutter and crew patrolled international waters off the coast of Mexico and the United States-Mexico Maritime Boundary Line, enforcing international laws and treaties throughout their deployment and disrupting the flow of illegal narcotics and migrant smuggling. While on patrol, a maritime patrol air-

craft spotted a suspected smuggling vessel. Alert's crews launched both cutter small boats and pursued the vessel until it ran out of fuel. The case was transferred to Mexican law enforcement officials from the Secretaria de Marina (SEMAR). Through the collaborative and international team effort, the smugglers were successfully apprehended, and 1,600 pounds of illegal narcotics seized by Mexican Law Enforcement. Within 48 hours, Alert's crew identified another law enforcement case for interdiction and changed course to intercept the suspected smuggling vessel. After a multi-hour pursuit, the crew successfully interdicted approximately 550 pounds of cocaine and apprehended six suspected narco-traffickers for prosecution in the United States. Numerous U.S. agencies from the Departments of Defense, Justice and Homeland Security cooperated in the effort to combat transnational organized crime. The Coast Guard, Navy, Customs and Border Protection, FBI, Drug Enforcement Administration, and Immigration and Customs Enforcement, along with allied and international partner agencies, play a role in counter-drug operations. Alert's crew transferred the seized narcotics and suspected drug traffickers to the Department of Justice, via Coast Guard Station San Diego March 1 before steaming north to complete their three-week Tailored Ship Training As-

assessment (TSTA), a bi-annual assessment designed to evaluate the cutter's training teams and operational readiness. "Once again, the crew of Alert was able to overcome the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic and equipment failures on a 50 year old ship to execute a wide range of Coast Guard missions from the US-Canada Border to the Mexico-Guatemala border over a two month period," said Cmdr. Tyson Scofield, Alert's commanding officer. "Overall, Coast Guard Cutter Alert successfully completed a variety of operations through the combined effort of every

member of the crew." While patrolling the Eastern Pacific, Alert's watchstanders identified a sea turtle entangled in fishing debris. The cutter maneuvered into position and launched its small boat to help the endangered sea animal, ultimately setting the sea turtle free from the entwined debris. Marine environmental protection is a statutory mission of the Coast Guard and every year approximately 300 sea turtles are saved by the Coast Guard. "Marine life has always had a special place in my heart. When the opportunity to save a turtle arose, I was beyond excited to help," said Petty

Officer Third Class Timothy Waters who was aboard the small board to help free the entangled sea turtle. "I am honored to have done something so small that contributes to something much larger than me."

### USCG Assists with Meth Bust


SEATTLE — The Coast Guard assisted U.S. Customs and Border Protection agents with the seizure of a significant amount of methamphetamine west of Port Angeles during a joint interagency operation. After receiving information that suspicious bags were observed near the beach on Apr. 11, a Border Patrol agent arrived and deployed his K-9 partner. The Border Patrol K-9 led the agent to multiple bags and alerted to the presence of narcotics. The bags contained 342 pounds of methamphetamine worth nearly \$1.7 million. Agents seized the contraband and further coordinated with all partner agencies such as the U.S. Coast Guard, Homeland Security Investigations, the Olympic Peninsula Narcotics Enforcement Team, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, CBP's Air and Marine Operations, Clallam County Sheriff's Office, and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. "This seizure highlights the great work the United States Border Patrol conducts with its U.S. and Canadian law enforcement partners," said Chief Patrol Agent David S. BeMiller. "Trans-national criminal organizations capitalizing on this vulnerable area by smuggling narcotics are a danger to the community. By focusing on border security, we are enhancing national security." Coast Guard assets and crews that contributed to the effort were:

Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound; Coast Guard Cutter Blue Shark crew; Coast Guard Cutter Adeline crew; Coast Guard Station Port Angeles boatcrews; Coast Guard Air Station Port Angeles aircrews. "I am incredibly proud of our United States Coast Guard team working in conjunction with both our U.S. and Canadian law enforcement partners to secure the maritime border," said Rear Adm. Anthony Vogt, commander, 13th Coast Guard District. "The operations of trans-national criminal organizations are on-going regardless of the COVID pandemic. The women and men of the United States Coast Guard will continue to protect the communities we serve and disrupt these illegal activities taking place in the maritime domain."

DILLARD, Ore. - A Roseburg man was cited Tuesday night following an injury DUII accident in Dillard. On March 30, 2021, at 9:20 pm, 9-1-1 dispatchers began receiving reports of a single vehicle crash in the 9000-block of Old Highway 99 South near Dillard. When deputies arrived on scene, they found a 2007 Toyota Tacoma in a ditch. The driver, 35 year-old Jesse Lee Gardner of Roseburg, had been traveling south on Old Highway 99, when he drifted off of the roadway and into a ditch coming to rest against a culvert. Fire and EMS crews extricated a female passenger, 46 year-old Amber Taylor of Eugene, from the pickup and transported her to Mercy

Medical Center where she was evaluated for her serious injuries. Gardner was also transported to Mercy Medical Center by ambulance where he was treated. Deputies conducted a follow up investigation and arrested Gardner for Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants, Reckless Driving, Reckless Endangering and Assault. Due to his injuries and condition, deputies cited and released Gardner at the hospital.

**Meth Arrest, Douglas Co.**

On April 6th, 2021, detectives with the Douglas Interagency Narcotics Team (DINT) arrested 60 year old Robert Paul Muniain of Oakdale, California, for drug crimes related to large quantities of methamphetamine. DINT detectives were following Muniain as part of an

ongoing drug investigation, and with the help of the Douglas County Sheriff's Office, attempted a traffic stop on Muniain as he was driving Northbound on I-5 near Myrtle Creek. Muniain slowed, but refused to stop initially, exiting the freeway in Myrtle Creek. Muniain continued, traveling into the city of Myrtle Creek and as he was crossing the bridge over the South Umpqua River he threw a bag out of the vehicle window into the river below. After throwing the item out

the window Muniain complied and stopped the vehicle. A DINT detective, fearing Muniain had thrown drugs into the river, scrambled down the river bank and saw the bag floating down the river. The detective dove into the water



and swam to the bag which was still floating when he got to it. He retrieved the bag and continued swimming to the opposite side of the river. The bag contained approximately 472 grams of methamphetamine, which is more than 1 pound. That is a very large amount of methamphetamine which is not a personal use amount. For context, the typical addict would use only approximately one gram per day, on average. The detective emerged very wet and cold, but otherwise uninjured. Muniain was arrested and lodged at the Douglas County Jail on charges of Unlawful Possession and Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine. The investigation is continuing and more charges are pending.

### Douglas Co. SO Line of Duty Death

DOUGLAS COUNTY, Ore. - Sheriff John Hanlin is saddened to announce the line-of-duty death of retired Deputy Stanley "Allen" Burdic from duty-related wounds suffered in 1980. In October 1976, Allen Burdic was hired

by the Canyonville Police Department where he served until July 1979 when he accepted a Deputy Sheriff position with the Douglas County Sheriff's Office. On August 12, 1980, Deputy Burdic responded to a reported shooting at the Nutshell Tavern in Myrtle Creek. Sometime in the early morning hours of August 13, Deputy Burdic located the suspect at a gravel turnout north of the Myrtle Creek Bridge near Interstate 5. The suspect opened fire on Deputy Burdic, striking him twice. The suspect then stole the deputy's patrol car. As the suspect left in the stolen patrol car, he ran over Deputy Burdic's legs. Deputy Burdic sustained serious injuries from the gunshot wounds, which prevented his return to his position as a deputy. He medically retired from the Sheriff's Office in 1982. He briefly returned to the Canyonville Police Department as a Police Officer from July 1984 to November 1985. Deputy Burdic passed away at his

home on March 11, 2021 from complications of the injuries he sustained in the line of duty working for the Douglas County Sheriff's Office in 1980. "Deputy Burdic's sacrifice while in service to the citizens of Douglas County, no matter the span of time between the shooting and his death, cannot go unmentioned. We will honor him, his family and his memory and never forget what happened to this deputy on August 13, 1980," Sheriff Hanlin said. Deputy Burdic's memorial service is scheduled for Saturday, April 17, 2021, at 2:00 p.m. at the Tri-City Baptist Church. Deputy Burdic will be afforded law enforcement honors at the service. Deputy Burdic's Family and the Douglas County Sheriff's Office are being assisted by the Oregon Fallen Badge Foundation. Anyone wishing to make financial contributions to support the Burdic family may do so through the Oregon Fallen Badge Foundation.

### Winston Fatal

WINSTON, Ore. - On Tuesday, April 13, 2021, shortly before 11:30 pm, 9-1-1 dispatchers received a report of a single vehicle crash in the 5000-block of Willis Creek Road in Winston. 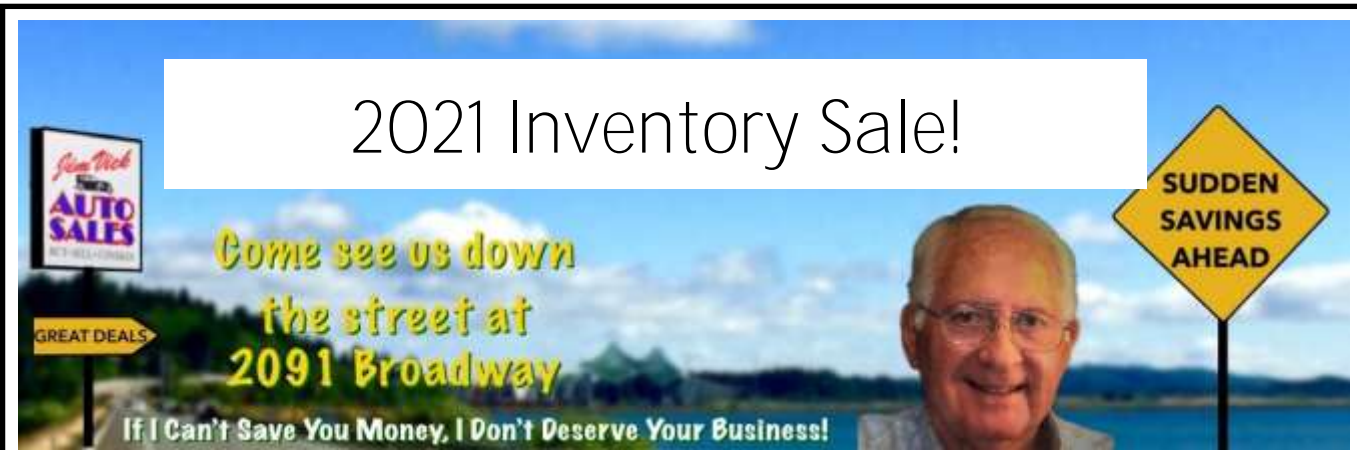

In addition to a Federal Warrant for Counterfeiting, Conner was lodged at the Lane County Jail on new charges of: Attempting to Elude a Police Officer, Failure to Perform Duties of a Driver, Possession of a Stolen Vehicle, Reckless Endangering x5, Criminal Mischief 1 x4, Criminal Mischief 2, False Information to a Police Officer, Reckless Driving, Theft of Services, and Theft 2.

### Shots Fired in Eugene

On 4/27/2021 at 12:05pm the Lane County Sheriff's Office was called to the 1300 block of N. Park Avenue in Eugene for the report that a male, identified as 48 year old Daniel Wayne Wilkinson of Eugene, had killed a family dog during a mental health crisis. It was reported by family members that Wilkinson was making delusional comments, shot the dog, and then barricaded himself in a bedroom when confronted by family. Wilkinson was reported to have several firearms inside the bedroom. Wilkinson was further reported to have a violent history while armed with a firearm. Deputies arrived on scene and learned that there was no home phone, Wilkinson did not have a cell phone, and there was no way to contact him without putting themselves in danger. An armor rescue vehicle was called to the scene to utilize the loudspeaker and establish communication with Wilkinson. Kelly Middle School was one block to the north. Contact was made with the school and surrounding residence advising them of the possible threat. With the aid of that Rescue vehicle's loudspeaker deputies were able to convince Wilkinson to surrender peacefully to law enforcement. Several firearms were recovered at the scene. He was taken into custody at 1:34 pm and lodged at the Lane County Jail for the crimes of Unlawful Use of a Weapon and Animal Abuse-1. There is no ongoing threat to the public at this time.

### Former Weyco Accountant Sentenced

EUGENE, Ore.—Susan Tranberg, 62, of Eugene, Oregon, was sentenced to federal prison today for defrauding her former employer, the Weyerhaeuser Company, out of more than \$4.5 million, announced Acting U.S. Attorney Scott

Erik Asphaug. Tranberg was sentenced June 2004 and continuing to January 2019, Tranberg defrauded Weyerhaeuser out of more than \$4.5 million by submitting fraudulent invoices for payment to a

fake vendor she created. Tranberg had worked for Weyerhaeuser in Springfield, Oregon in various positions for more than 40 years. A financial analysis determined that the vast majority of the money was used to fund a lavish lifestyle of expensive dinners, vacations, six-figure wedding expenses, and shopping sprees. At some point in or before June 2004, Tranberg created a fake timber contract between the company and a vendor she named after her mother, who was unaware of the scheme. Over the next 10 years, Tranberg would use her positions in the company's accounting and finance departments to request cashier's checks, which she then cashed into her own bank account. During this time period, Tranberg requested and received more than \$2.6 million. In June 2014, Weyerhaeuser transitioned to a new payment processing system. To continue her scheme, Tranberg set up a fake vendor account in the new system and attached a letter purportedly from her mother describing the documentation provided to set up the account. This documentation included a Form SSA-1099 Social Security Statement and a forged Form W-9 Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification. At the time Tranberg sent the letter and documentation, Tranberg's mother had been deceased for five years. After setting up the fake vendor account, Tranberg continued her scheme by forging col-

leagues' signatures on check requests and using her colleagues' computer login credentials without authorization to create requests and approve fraudulent payments. All requested cashier's checks were sent via private or commercial interstate carrier directly to Tranberg. During these final five years, ending in January 2019, Tranberg requested and received nearly \$1.9 million. On January 29, 2020, Tranberg was charged by superseding criminal information with mail fraud, aggravated identity theft, and tax evasion. On January 30, 2020, she waived indictment and pleaded guilty to all three charges. During sentencing, U.S. District Court Judge Michael J. McShane also ordered Tranberg to pay more than \$5.3 million in restitution, to include \$775,984 to Weyerhaeuser, \$3,805,223 to the Crime Victims Fund, and \$807,033 to the IRS.
