Putting the Brakes on Excessive Speeding

OSP release - Drivers stayed off the roads in droves during the pandemic. Unfortunately, those who did drive were the cause of a steep rise in roadway deaths, with the excess speed at the heart of many crashes. The Western States Traffic Safety Coalition (WSTSC) members came together to show commitment and emphasis on meaningful public education about the dangers of risky driving behaviors, especially excessive speeding. The WSTSC Coalition includes the following members from Arizona Department of Public Safety, California Highway Patrol, Colorado State Patrol, Idaho State Police, Montana Highway Patrol, Nevada Highway Patrol, North Dakota Highway Patrol, South Dakota Highway Patrol, Utah Highway Patrol, Washington State Patrol, Wyoming Highway Patrol, and #YourOregonStatePolice. Excess speed is a major factor contributing to serious injury and fatal crashes for drivers of all ages, along with speeding-related vehicle rollovers. As the nation opens up, summer vacations begin and more people hit the roads, law enforcement will be proactive in helping bring speeds and subsequent crashes down. Excessive speed has a devastating impact on the safety of life for those traveling on our highways. To help address this issue, the WSTSC will be conducting an Excessive Speed Enforcement Safety Campaign this June 25 – 27, 2021. Assertive traffic law enforcement activity with a targeted public safety focus is the purpose of the WSTSC partnership and this campaign. NB Shooting

Bay Area law enforcement agencies were seeking a suspect Friday morning, June 18, following two incidents that left two people dead in North Bend. According to reports, a hit & run was reported to police shortly before 10 a.m. at the Mill Casino RV Park. One person

was deceased and another was taken to Bay Area Hospital. Police then received a report of a shooting at the Herbal Choices marijuana dispensary on Hwy. 101 in North Bend. One person was reported to be deceased. Police are searching for a white 2019 Dodge 3500 with the license plate of 243 LWL. The investigation is on-going.

Shooting Folo

The search for the suspect responsible for the deaths of three people in North Bend Friday moved to Hwy. 126 east of Mapleton as the vehicle police were searching for was located on fire in Lane Co. The incident began Friday morning shortly before 10 a.m. with a report of a hit & run at the Mill RV Park off Tremont Ave. in North Bend. Police found a male deceased and a female seriously injured. Another report followed regarding a shooting at the Herbal Choice marijuana dispensary on Sherman Ave. (Hwy. 101) in North Bend. A clerk had been reportedly shot and killed. The suspect reportedly went to Big 5 sporting goods at Pony Village Mall on Virginia Ave. where he purchased bullets. Photos of the suspect were obtained and circulated throughout Western Oregon. Police then received a report of the suspect vehicle on fire off Hwy. 126 and a report of a male with a handgun entering the brush. The area was cordoned off and a wide range search began. Hwy. 126 was closed on the western end at Mapleton with eastbound traffic diverted to Hwy. 36, Swisshome-Triangle Lake.

Oregon State Police and Lane County Sheriff's Office responded to the report of a vehicle crash on Hwy. 126 near milepost 39 in Noti. The driver of the involved vehicle, a white Dodge 243LWL, was no longer on scene when authorities arrived. This vehicle is believed to be linked to the homicides that occurred in the North Bend area earlier Friday, June 18. The suspect in this case is described as a white male adult standing approximately 6'02" and weighing approximately 200lbs. He was further described as having short hair and wearing a dark-colored t-shirt and blue jeans. He is to be considered armed and dangerous. Residents in the area are asked to shelter in place and to immediately report any suspicious activity to authorities. Anyone who saw the involved vehicle during or following the crash or anyone matching the suspect description is asked to contact the Lane County Sheriff's Office at 541-682-4150 opt. 1. We are additionally hoping to contact the driver of a small white sedan that may have stopped at the crash scene. ***Update*** - As of 5:20pm authorities re-opened Hwy. 126 near milepost 39. The suspect's whereabouts are currently unknown and it is possible that he has already fled the area. Residents are asked to remain vigilant and to report any suspicious activity to police immediately. A heavy police presence is still on scene actively searching for the suspect.

Mayor of NB Statement on Shootings

City of North Bend release, Friday, June 18, 2021 - "On behalf of the City of

North Bend, I would like to express my deepest condolences and prayers for the victims, their families, and everyone else impacted by this terrible act of violence carried out in our community. Words fall short of describing the tragedy that took place this morning, and we are all left incredibly shaken. This is something you hope never happens in your community, in the town you call home. I also think of the emergency personnel who responded to the tragic scenes and request you keep them in your prayers." - Statement by Mayor Jessica Engelke regarding the violence that left three dead, and one critically injured.

Shooting Victims

The four victims of Friday's shooting in North Bend have been identified by the authorities. The clerk shot and killed at the Herbal Choices marijuana dispensary has been identified as 47-year old Jennifer L. Davidson, Coos Bay. The couple run over at the Mill Casino RV Park has been identified as 74-year old Anthony Oyster and 73-year old Linda Oyster, both of Florida. A fourth victim, 83-year old Charles Simms Nicholson, who owned the truck that was later found on fire in Lane Co., was found deceased in a travel trailer at the RV Park. It is believed he died of homicidal violence. He is the father of the suspect.

Suspect Identified

Authorities have identified the suspect in Friday's shooting in North Bend that left four people dead. 30-year old Oen Evan Nicholson, a former resident of California, has been reportedly living in the North Bend area since last October. He is considered armed and dangerous.

Suspect Turns Self In

City of North Bend release, David Milliron, City Administrator - Sunday, June 20, 2021. "I have been informed that Oen Evan Nicholson, the suspect in the events in North Bend on June 18, 2021, has turned himself into authorities in Wisconsin. Those gathered around me are just a sampling of the dedicated people who have worked tirelessly on this case. Much more work is yet to be done, but I want to thank every agency involved for the diligent work of their personnel." According to authorities, Nicholson forced a Springfield woman, Laura Johnson, to drive him across the country Friday. The investigation is continuing.

Public Assistance Sought Involving Bay Area Shooting

On Friday, June 18, 2021 Oregon State Police assisted numerous agencies with the investigation of multiple homicides that occurred in Coos County. The suspect, Oen Nicholson, traveled to Hwy 126, near Noti, in Lane County where the vehicle Nicholson was driving was ditched. It is believed that Nicholson obtained a ride from someone in the Noti area to Springfield where Laura Johnson was abducted and taken to Wis-

consin. Oregon State Police is requesting anyone with information or that might have given Nicholson a ride from Noti to Springfield to contact the Oregon State Police at 1-800-442-0776 or *OSP and leave information regarding OSP Case ## SP21-168713.

Autopsies Completed on Shooting Victims

Autopsies on the victims of last Friday's (June 18) shooting in North Bend were completed Tuesday, June 22. According to Coos Co. District Attorney R. Paul Frasier, Charles Nicholson "died as the result of multiple sharp force injuries to his neck, chest and abdomen." Anthony Oyster "died as the result of massive internal injuries to his chest and abdomen caused by being struck by the pickup truck that has been previously described." Jennifer Davidson "died as a result of multiple bullet wounds in the abdomen and chest." The suspect, Oen Nicholson remains in Wisconsin. When he will return to Oregon is not known at this time."

Nicholson Declines to Waive Extradition

The male accused of killing three people in North Bend June 18th before fleeing to Wisconsin in an abducted woman's vehicle has reportedly "declined to waive

extradition back to Coos County,” according to District Attorney R. Paul Frasier. Oen Evan Nicholson, 30, allegedly killed his 83-year old father, ran over a couple from Florida, killing the 74-year old male and seriously injuring his 73-year old wife, before driving to a Marijuana Dispensary where he allegedly shot and killed a 47-year old clerk. He reportedly fled town in his father’s Dodge truck. That truck was found on fire off Hwy. 126 near Noti in Lane County west of Eugene. Nicholson made it to Springfield where he abducted the woman forcing her to drive east to Wisconsin where he eventually turned himself in. The woman was not injured during her cross-country ordeal. According to Frasier, “My office is in the process of preparing the necessary documents to submit to the office of Governor

nor Kate Brown requesting that the Governor issue a Governor’s Warrant for the extradition of Mr. Nicholson. Once that warrant has issued, it will be sent to the governor of the State of Wisconsin requesting that they honor the request of our Governor to bring Mr. Nicholson back to Oregon.” Frasier added, “Mr. Nicholson will have the opportunity in Wisconsin to contest in court our Governor’s request that he be returned to Coos County. This process could take several weeks if not months before it is completed.”

Officer Martin finished the nine-month Reserve Officer Training Academy (ROTA), which consists of classes in Criminal Justice, Constitutional Law, Tactical Skills as well as scenario-based training. In general, ROTA requires candidates to attend classes two nights a week at Southwestern Oregon Community College. Further, he completed an intensive background check. Res. Officer Martin is a native of Coos Bay and graduate of Marshfield High School. He currently works in construction/roofing for Gary W. Long Construction. Res Ofc. Chief McCullough Retires

City of Coos Bay release - On the evening of June 15, 2021, the City of Coos Bay hosted a Change of Command Ceremony honoring retiring Coos Bay Police Chief Gary McCullough as well as the promotion and appointment of incoming Chief Chris Chapanar. The audience included local Law Enforcement, Parole and Probation, U.S. Coast Guard, City Council, Coos Bay School District Superintendent, District Attorney's Office staff, City staff, family, friends, and citizens. The Ceremony took place in front of City Hall under ideal weather conditions. The ceremony provided an opportunity to reflect on Chief Gary McCullough's 26-year career in law enforcement. Chief McCullough rose through the ranks from Reserve Police Officer to Chief. The metering panel consisted of a large gray electrical box with smaller electrical meter box on one side, and four smaller 200-amp gray electrical service boxes with a long electrical gutter/box on the other. The boxes were mounted to a 4' x 8' sheet of 3/4" pressure treated marine grade plywood, and the plywood was mounted to two 6" pressure treated posts: refer to attached photos. It appears the suspects used a chainsaw to cut through the electrical conduit and posts. Initial estimated loss is \$20,000. The large gray box is approximately 4' x 4' square and contains several one-pull 30-amp circuit breakers. The 200-amp panels on the back side are approximately 30" tall and 14" wide. CCSO release - On 06-13-21 at about 0234 hours, Deputies from the Coos

County Sheriff's Office responded to 91484 Cape Arago Hwy for a report of an Arson. Upon the Deputies arrival they discovered an unknown male had poured gasoline on the door to the residence and set it on fire before departing the area. The homeowners briefly observed a tall male leaving the area. The owners stated the male walked off at a slow pace even when they attempted to confront him. This is the fourth such incident in the area. The first incident involved a male pouring gasoline in front of the entrance to Seaport RV park and setting the gasoline on fire. The second incident occurred on 5-21-21 at about 2:30 AM, at 91222 Cape Arago Highway. Cameras caught a video of a male, carrying a gas can. The second incident was on 6-5-21 at about 11:30 PM, at 92222 Cape Arago Highway. Cameras were installed at the residence, but were unable to capture the suspect in video or photographs. The latest incident was on 6-13-21 at about 2:30 AM, at 91484 Cape Arago Highway. Cameras caught both still and video images of the suspect. In all instances emergency personnel arrived on scene within minutes of the report and have not been able to locate the suspect. Road Rage Killer attended NB Schools

The 24-year old male accused of the road rage killing of a six-year old boy on a Southern California freeway May 21st attended school in the North Bend School District. Marcus Anthony Eriz was in the district from the 5th grade through the 10th grade before he trans-

ferred in 2013. He went on to graduate

from the Trinity Alps Unified School District in Northern California. Along with Wynne Lee he was arrested Sunday in Costa Mesa and has been charged with the murder of Aiden Leos who was riding in the backseat of his mother's vehicle when a shot penetrated the car and killed the boy.

Illegally Selling Crab in Hermiston

ODFW release - HERMISTON, Ore. — A Prineville couple has been sentenced to pay \$1200 in restitution after illegally selling recreationally caught crab on the commercial market. The incident showcases the importance of consumers knowing that the fish and shellfish they buy are legally harvested and handled as a food product. Gerald and Shawna Wilson of Prineville will also pay \$100 each to the Turn In Poachers (TIP) Line fund, and they are prohibited from obtaining a fishing or shellfish license for three years. OSP Fish and Wildlife troopers began an investigation after receiving a call on the TIP Line reporting crab advertised for sale on Facebook. Investigators followed up on the lead, and discovered the couple selling live or cooked crab via social media. The couple listed the crab as free of charge, but with a suggested donation of \$11 per pound to skirt marine fisheries laws that prohibit people from selling their per-

sonal limits of crab and other marine life on the commercial market, according to law enforcement. At least 11 people purchased the crab through Facebook or other social media, according to Lincoln County District Attorney Kenneth Park, who prosecuted the case in May of 2021. "This was a good resolution," Park said. "We charged for criminal negligence." He emphasized the importance of consumers knowing where their seafood is sourced. "If you see it online, and it is not a commercial operation, you are probably looking at illegal crab," he said. Bob Browning, an Oregon commercial crabber, is glad the case was solved and prosecuted. "When you don't have to play by the rules, you can sell products cheaper," Browning said, "But people who purchase that (illegal) crab are also missing out on consumer protections like hazard plans and food handling regulations."

Coos Bay Male Sentenced for Child Sexual Exploitation

EUGENE, Ore.—A Coos Bay, Oregon man was sentenced to federal prison today for producing sexually explicit images and videos of a 3-year-old child. Keith James Atherton, 33, was sentenced to 30 years in federal prison followed by a life term of supervised release. According to court documents, on July 13, 2018, an undercover agent from Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) viewed child sexual abuse material streamed on a video chat website. Less than 24 hours later, Atherton was identified as the perpetrator, located, and taken into federal custody. Further investigation revealed that Atherton had pro-

duced several sexually explicit images and videos involving a 3-year-old child. Investigators seized more than 10 digital devices from Atherton, containing at least 35,000 images and 8,000 videos depicting the sexual abuse of infants, toddlers, and young children. On July 18, 2018, a federal grand jury in Eugene returned a three-count indictment charging Atherton with using or attempting to use a minor to produce a visual depiction of sexually explicit conduct and possession and distribution of child pornography. On February 24, 2021, Atherton pleaded guilty to using or attempting to use a minor to produce a visual depiction of sexually explicit conduct. Acting U.S. Attorney Scott Erik Asphaug of the District of Oregon made the announcement. This case was investigated by Homeland Security Investigations with assistance from the Coos Bay Police Department, the Coos County Sheriff's Office and the Oregon State Police. Assistant U.S. Attorney Jeffrey S. Sweet prosecuted the case with assistance from the Coos County District Attorney's Office. Anyone who has information about the physical or online exploitation

of children are encouraged to contact HSI at (866) 347-2423 or submit a tip online at www.ice.gov/tips. Federal law defines child pornography as any visual depiction of sexually explicit conduct involving a minor. It is important to remember child sexual abuse material depicts actual crimes being committed against children. Fatal Accident Hwy. 101, Curry Co.

On Thursday, June 24, 2021 at approximately 11:30 A.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a vehicle crash on Hwy 101 near milepost 339. Preliminary investigation revealed a Kawasaki Ninja motorcycle, operated by James Rice (29) of Brookings, was northbound when it struck a, also northbound, Infiniti QX60, operated by Brecken Watterson (43) of Cedar Park, TX. The Infiniti was turning left into a viewpoint. Rice sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Watterson and 4 juvenile passengers were not injured.

Bear Camp Road

Two women and a three-year old girl spent the night in the outdoors of Southwest Oregon after their vehicle became stuck on a back road while attempting to drive from the hot Grants Pass area to cooler Gold Beach in Curry Co. Saturday, June 26. The three attempted to use Bear Camp Road and became lost. After spending the night in their car, they walked Sunday until they could get cell-phone service. Search and rescue teams from both Curry County and Josephine County set out to locate them. About four-hours after their call, the trio were located in the Wild Horse area off Bear Camp Road. The women were identified as 24-year old Savanah Barnett and 19-year old Hailey McGregor, both of Grants Pass.

Coast Guard terminates illegal charter on Lake Washington

USCG release - SEATTLE — The Coast Guard terminated an illegal charter Saturday, May 29, near Mercer Island on Lake Washington. A Coast Guard Station Seattle boarding team observed a 38-foot vessel which had 15 passengers and one non-credentialed mariner operating as an illegal passenger-for-hire operation. The vessel was also knowingly operating in violation of an order by the Captain of the Port issued to the vessel in December ordering the owner to cease operations as an uninspected passenger vessel carrying any passengers for hire until appropriate regulatory requirements were met. The vessel operator was cited for several violations, and the Coast Guard is pursuing additional enforcement options to deter future unsafe operations. "Illegally chartered vessels undermine legitimate operations and pose significant safety concerns to everyone onboard," said Lt. Alex Cropley, commanding officer of Coast Guard Station Seattle. "Terminating these dangerous voyages and educating the boating public is our top priority. If you encounter vessels operating in an unsafe manner or suspect an illegal charter operation, call the Coast Guard on VHF-FM channel 16." Are you planning on getting on the wa-

ter for Memorial Day Weekend? In conjunction with National Safe Boating Week, the Coast Guard highly encourages passengers who are planning on hiring a vessel for charter to verify their captain has a safety plan and a Coast

Guard issued credential. For larger charter boats, or those with more than six passengers, ask to see a Coast Guard-issued Certificate of Inspection. If the operator cannot produce the appropriate credentials, passengers are recommended to not get on the boat and report the operator to the Coast Guard. Owners and operators of illegal charter vessels can face potential civil penalties of \$59,000 for illegal passenger-for-hire operations. Charters that violate a Captain of the Port Order can face more than

\$94,000 in penalties for each day the vessel is in violation. Repeated violations of a Captain of the Port Order can result in criminal charges. Some potential fines for illegally operating a charter vessel include: Up to \$7,710 for failure of operators to be enrolled in a chemical (drug) testing program. Up to \$4,803 for failure to provide a Coast Guard Certificate of Inspection for vessels carrying more than six passengers. Up to \$16,398 for failure to produce a valid Certificate of Documentation for vessels over 5 gross tons. Up to \$94,219 per day for failure to comply with a Captain of the Port Order.

Coast Guard Cutter Active returns to homeport after two-month counter-drug patrol, \$106M worth of cocaine seized

USCG release - PORT ANGELES, Wash. — The crew of the Coast Guard Cutter Active (WMEC 618) returned to their homeport Thursday in Port Angeles after a 58-day counter-drug patrol in the Eastern Pacific Ocean. The 55-year-old cutter and crew patrolled international waters off the coasts of Central America and Mexico in support of the Coast Guard and partner agencies' maritime illicit drug interdiction missions. The Active intercepted two vessels suspected of smuggling illicit narcotics. Active's crew seized approximately 5,650 pounds of cocaine worth an estimated \$106.8 million from the combined interdictions. One of the two smuggling vessels, which are designed to evade detection, was a low-profile vessel. Low-profile vessels ride low in the water and are often painted blue to camouflage with the ocean which make them more difficult to track. The contraband and suspects were transferred to the custody of federal law enforcement agencies for prosecution. Coast Guard assets, authorities, & missions uniquely position the Coast Guard to be a vital part of the overall U.S. joint force to operate with, & provide ability and capacity development programs to Central & South American nations. Active's crew of-

flooded approximately 11,500 pounds of seized cocaine in San Diego, May 19th, representing four suspected drug smuggling vessel interdictions made by crews aboard the Active, the Coast Guard Cutters Steadfast (WMEC 623) and the Tahoma (WMEC 908). The cutter also conducted two search and rescue missions during their deployment. Active's crew rescued four fishermen from a stranded fishing vessel and towed the disabled vessel until another Coast Guard cutter completed the search and rescue case. The second case Active responded to was a distress call for a jet skier injured in the water. The Active's health services technician provided first aid to the person and stabilized the injured jet skier for further transfer by Coast Guard Station San Diego to waiting emergency medical services personnel. The Active was accompanied by an MH-65 Dolphin helicopter from Coast Guard Air Station San Francisco and personnel from the Helicopter Interdiction Tactical Squadron (HITRON) from Jacksonville, Florida. The helicopter and HITRON aircrews are capable of utilizing airborne use of force including disabling fire on the engines of non-compliant vessels suspected of carrying contraband. Additionally, Active's crew was supplemented by four Pacific Tactical Law Enforcement Team (PAC-TACLET) members from San Diego. PAC-TACLET's specialization in law enforcement and knowledge of the Law of the Sea enhanced Active's ability to identify, interdict, and process suspected drug smugglers. "This patrol was another superb example of teamwork across the interagency," said Cmdr. James M. O'Mara IV, Active's commanding officer. "Beyond our lifelines, interagency and partner nations shared information to develop cases, while U.S. Navy, Customs, and Coast Guard aircraft detected targets of interest. Active's crew leaned forward, operated aggressively, and executed their missions with distinction." This patrol marked O'Mara's last patrol as commanding officer of the Active. Assuming command in January of 2019, O'Mara sailed over 55,000 miles throughout his nearly two and a half year tenure as Active's commanding officer. O'Mara was relieved by Cmdr. Brian J.

Tesson on May 24th during a change of command ceremony aboard the cutter in the San Francisco Bay while transiting home. O'Mara will be reporting to Pacific Area Cutter Forces in June. Tesson reports to the Active from the Coast Guard Civil Engineering Unit Oakland where he served as the executive office. Commissioned in 1966, Active is a 210-foot Reliance Class medium endurance cutter homeported in Port Angeles and routinely deploys in support of counter-drug, migrant interdiction, fisheries, and search and rescue and homeland security missions.

Coast Guard Sector North Bend transfers command

NORTH BEND, Ore. — Coast Guard Sector North Bend held a change of command ceremony Friday at 10 a.m. in the sector's helicopter hangar. Capt. Olav Saboe transferred command to Capt. Breanna Knutson as Rear Adm. Anthony "Jack" Vogt, commander, 13th Coast Guard District, presided over the ceremony. Knutson, a native of Bremerton, Washington, is reporting to Sector North Bend from Coast Guard Headquarters in Washington, D.C., where she served as the House of Representatives Liaison Officer for the Coast Guard. Now, as the commander of Sector North Bend, she will lead the Coast Guard personnel who protect the Oregon coast through the aggressive and professional prosecution of all Coast Guard missions. Ahead of his departure from command, Saboe expressed deep appreciation for the community members of North Bend and Coos Bay. "It has been an honor and a privilege to lead over 450 active duty Coast Guard women and men who work 24/7 to safeguard the maritime

public and proudly serve the coastal communities of Oregon, from Pacific City to the California border," said Saboe. "It has been a pleasure getting to know and work with many private and public stakeholders up and down the coast." Saboe added that while he and his family are looking forward to their next assignment in Seattle, they also look forward to staying in touch with the many friends and neighbors they made during their time in Coos County. "We wish to spend a special thanks to the front-line health care workers who have worked tirelessly to protect the community during the global pandemic as well as the educators who have done an amazing job of providing an educational experience, in a safe environment, for the children of the community. Ours included," said Saboe. Saboe is departing Sector North Bend to become the chief of staff of the 13th District headquartered in Seattle. There, he will direct more than 2,000 Coast Guard men and women responsible for executing Coast Guard missions within the Pacific Northwest, including the states of Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana. The change of command ceremony is a tradition deeply rooted in Coast Guard and Naval history. The event signifies a total transfer of responsibility, authority and accountability for the command. All members of the unit attend the ceremony so they can witness the transfer of leadership.

commander U.S. Coast Guard Pacific Area, presided over the ceremony where Cmdr. Matthew Kolodica relieved Cmdr. Tyson Scofield as Alert's commanding officer. "It has been a privilege to lead the Alert crew over the last two years," said Scofield. "Despite the challenges of the COVID pandemic, maintenance on a 52 year old cutter, or the stormy conditions of the Pacific Northwest, this crew continuously rose to occasion to safely and successfully execute our missions." Following his command of Alert, Scofield will report to the Eisenhower School of National Security and Resource Strategy in Washington, D.C. Kolodica's reports to the Alert from the Coast Guard's Maritime Force Protection Program office in Washington, D.C. The change of command ceremony is a historic military tradition representing the formal transfer of authority and responsibility for a unit from one commanding officer to another. The event reinforces the continuity of command and provides an opportunity to

celebrate the crew's accomplishments. Commissioned August 4, 1969, Alert was the last 210-foot medium endurance cutter built. Alert's crew conduct search and rescue missions, counterdrug operations and enforce local, state, and federal fisheries legislation in support of the Coast Guard's living marine resources mission. They operate from the Maritime Boundary Line in the North Pacific between Russia and the United States down to international waters of the Eastern Pacific Ocean. Alert is one of two 210-foot medium endurance cutters homeported in Astoria.

USCG Rescue at Saddle Mtn.

USCG release - ASTORIA, Ore. — The Coast Guard medevaced a hiker Friday, June 18 after a reported medical emergency near the top of Saddle Mountain. A hiker was reported to have what appeared to be a broken ankle. Coast Guard Sector Columbia River received an agency assistance request from the

Seaside Police dispatch. A Hamlet Fire and Rescue team was on scene with the hiker, but deemed it unsafe to reach and recover the woman on foot and requested Coast Guard helicopter assistance. A Sector Columbia River MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew arrived on scene at 5:44 p.m. A rescue swimmer deployed to conduct a hoist and medevaced the woman at 6:49 p.m. At 6:56 p.m., the patient was transferred to awaiting emergency medical personnel at Sector Columbia River and treated for shock and a broken ankle while en route to the hospital. The Coast Guard urges mariners, hikers and anyone venturing to remote areas to have reliable means of communication to reach first responders.

USCG Rescue off Northern California

MCKINLEYVILLE, Calif. —Coast Guard crews from McKinleyville and North Bend, Oregon, rescued six people from their 79-foot sailboat Saturday, approximately 80 miles west of Crescent

City. Coast Guard Sector Humboldt Bay watchstanders received a VHF distress call at 3:45 p.m. from the crew of the sailboat Barlovento reporting the boat was disabled, taking on water and had a person aboard with a head and arm injury in approximately 60 mile-per-hour winds and 20-foot seas. Watchstanders directed the launch of a Coast Guard Air Station Sacramento C-27J Spartan fixed-wing crew to provide air support and a Coast Guard Sector Humboldt Bay MH-65 Dolphin helicopter crew. The Dolphin crew arrived on scene and hoisted the injured person from the Barlovento and transported the person to local emergency medical services personnel at Coast Guard Sector Humboldt Bay. With the Barlovento expected to lose power, Sector Humboldt Bay watchstanders requested additional air support from a Coast Guard Air Station North Bend MH-65 Dolphin helicopter crew. The Sector Humboldt Bay Dolphin crew returned to the scene and hoisted three people from the Bar-

lovento and the Air Station North Bend Dolphin crew arrived on scene and hoisted the remaining two people. All survivors were transported to Sector Humboldt Bay. "This case was a great example of a successful, multi-unit effort and highlights the importance of standardized procedures," said Lt. Ryan O'Neill, a Dolphin aircraft commander at Sector Humboldt Bay. "The careful coordination between the two helicopters with support from the C-27 allowed us to save all six sailors." Sector Humboldt watchstanders issued a broadcast to mariners regarding the abandoned Barolvento and requested that mariners transit the area with caution.

Coast Guard kicks off Operation Be Whale Wise

USCG release - SEATTLE — The Coast Guard kicks off Operation Be Whale Wise to encourage the public to practice safe whale-watching this summer in the Pacific Northwest. Operation Be Whale Wise is an effort to educate the public through outreach and enforcement activities, as well as increase the public's stewardship of these local orcas through engagement of "citizen science." The Coast Guard is working closely with several partner agencies focused on educating the public and raising awareness within the boating community, including enforce southern resident orca vessel buffer zones and other vessel

-related regulations in the Puget Sound. The Puget Sound and Salish Sea is home to numerous species of marine mammals. The most recognized of these is the Southern Resident Killer Whale. This species of whale is a distinct population of orcas that are genetically unique from their transient counterparts. They have evolved to feed on fish instead of mammals. SRKW continue to be a critically endangered species with only 73 members remaining as of February 2021. It is important to keep our marine friends safe from preventable mishaps. Federal regulations prohibit vessels from approaching killer whales within 200 yards or parking in the path of killer whales. In 2019, the State of Washington enacted regulations requiring vessels to remain at least 300 yards away from either side or 400 yards in front of or behind orca whales. Additionally, state regulations require that vessels within a half mile of orcas must reduce speed to less than 7 knots. Below are guidelines to be whale wise: Keep your distance: Do not approach or get too close to marine life. Look in all directions before planning your approach to view wildlife. Slow down and reduce your speed to less than 7 knots when within a half mile of the nearest marine mammal to reduce your engine's noise and vessel's wake. Pay Attention: Be vigilant for marine mammal presence. Whales may change directions or surface unpredictably. Move away slowly and cautiously at the first sign of a disturbance or agitation. Be mindful of you vessel: Place engine in neutral or shutdown and allow the animals to pass if your vessel is not in compliance with regulations. If it's safe to do so, also turn off your fish finder and echo sounders. Be courteous: Stay on the offshore side of whales when they are traveling close to shore. Always avoid going through groups of porpoises or dolphins. Hold course and reduce speed gradually to discourage bow or stern-riding. Report whale sightings: The Whale Alert App helps mariners and members of the public practice citizen science by providing a user-friendly tool directly on their tablet or smart phone that displays whale "safety zones." The app also allows the user to report any live, dead, or distressed whale sightings to the appropriate response agency. Be Whale Wise is a coordinated effort between the U.S. and Canada with multiple commercial, non-profit and environmental non-governmental organizations dedicated to educating the public and raising awareness within the boating community. For more information, visit Be Whale Wise.

Stolen Vessel

USCG release - SEATTLE — The Coast Guard, along with multiple partner agencies, responded Thursday morning, June 24, to reports of a stolen vessel and a

person threatening public safety in the Puget Sound. An employee from Argosy Cruises contacted Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound watchstanders at about 7:50 a.m. Thursday to report one of their vessels, Beaver, was stolen from their dock. Sector Puget Sound watchstanders immediately began to track the stolen vessel as the operator made his way northbound. Coast Guard Stations Port Angeles and Seattle launched 45-foot Response Boat-Medium crews, and the 87-foot Coast Guard Cutter Swordfish and crew diverted to the scene. At 9:50 a.m., it was reported the person aboard the stolen vessel used a VHF-FM radio on channel 16 to relay threats of explosives and hostages. Following the notification of potential explosives and hostages, Sector Puget Sound watchstanders coordinated their response with local and state authorities. Seattle Vessel Traffic personnel redirected maritime traffic from the area. Coast Guard units arrived on scene at about 9:05 a.m. and observed the person sitting aboard the vessel's stern. After speaking to the person and assessing the situation, the Station Port Angeles RB-M crew approached the vessel and took the subject into custody. The stolen vessel was taken to shore in Seattle at about 4:20 p.m. for further investigation. "As Captain of the Port, I'm proud of the decisive response by the Coast Guard and our interagency partners to successfully de-escalate a complex active threat to the Maritime Transportation System, quickly providing for the maritime safety and security of the boating public," said Capt. Patrick Hilbert, commander, Sector Puget Sound. "Today's event highlights the critical importance of continued partnership and coordination with state, local and Tribal agencies to ensure we remain ready to respond to all threats and safeguard the waters of the greater Puget Sound region." Local police and Coast Guard Investigative Services personnel are continuing to investigate the incident.

Traffic Fatality Roseburg

The motorcycle rider involved in Friday's accident has been identified as 26 YOA, Erik Brown, from Roseburg. On Saturday May 29th, Brown passed away from his injuries sustained during the accident. On Friday, May 28th at about 1:35 PM the Roseburg Police Department responded along with medics from Bay Cities Ambulance and the Roseburg Fire Department to a report of a traffic collision between a street motorcycle and a Suzuki Sidekick utility. The motorcyclist, a 26-year-old Roseburg man with a valid motorcycle endorsement, was transported by ambulance to Mercy Medical Center, from which he was flown to Legacy Emanuel Medical Center in Portland for treatment of head injuries. The motorcyclist was wearing an approved helmet. The driver of the Suzuki was a 64-year-old Sutherlin woman with a valid driver license. She was uninjured but was examined at the scene by emergency medical services. Her 1994 Suzuki Sidekick was towed from the scene by Roseburg Towing. The motorcycle was a 2015 Kawasaki badly damaged by the collision and was seized as potential evidence by the Roseburg Police Department, which is investigating whether speed was a factor in the collision. The initial investigation indicated the motorcycle was traveling east on Harvard Avenue in the inside lane of travel when it passed a slower vehicle by swerving into the outside lane. Fatal Crash Douglas Co.

ROSEBURG, Ore. - A Roseburg woman died in a traffic crash on Thursday night on Del Rio Road. On May 27, 2021, at approximately 6:36 pm, 9-1-1 dispatchers received a report of a serious two vehicle crash in the area of Del Rio Road near Wilbur Road. Deputies arrived on scene and discovered a 2002 Maroon Ford Taurus had been traveling eastbound on Del Rio Road. When the vehicle was approaching Wilbur Road, the driver of the Taurus made an abrupt turn into the path of an oncoming 2017 Blue Volkswagen SUV. The driver of the Taurus, 43 year-old Roseburg resident Michael Eugene Garcia, and an infant in the vehicle were injured and transported by ambulance to Mercy Medical Center for treatment. The infant was later released and Garcia was flown to an out of area hospital. Garcia's passenger, 25 year-old Alexandria Ann Contreras-Garcia of Roseburg was pro-

nounced deceased at the scene. The driver of the Volkswagen, 24 year-old Olyvia Renee Fox of Roseburg was treated for minor injuries. Fox is cooperating with law enforcement in the investigation. The crash remains under investigation, although alcohol is believed to be a contributing factor. Traffic Accident Roseburg

On June 3, 2021, at approximately 6:59 P.M., officers and deputies from the Roseburg Police Department and Douglas County Sheriff's Office, along with emergency personnel from the Roseburg Fire Department and ambulance services responded to the 2500 block of NE Stephens (Rose Villa apartments) after receiving multiple calls of shots fired at the location. Based upon the initial investigation and available information,

two Roseburg men were identified as being involved in the shooting. Both males were life-flighted to Legacy Emanuel to be treated for their injuries. One male succumbed to his injuries and the condition of the other male is unknown. The investigation is ongoing and more information will be released when it becomes available. Names of the involved are not being released as the investigation continues, but it is believed they were known to each other and there is no continued threat of harm to the public. ****UPDATE**** The individuals involved in yesterday's shooting have been identified as 37 year old Terrence Wade Beason and 59 year old Gregory Allen Bennett, who passed away from a self-inflicted gunshot wound. The investigation is continuing and there is no continued threat of harm to the community.
