ODOT encourages drivers to be ready for winter driving conditions

ODOT release - Winter is coming - If you must travel in difficult weather conditions, be sure to have chains or traction tires for your vehicle and use them when it's necessary. • Chains can be link chains, cable chains or other devices that attach to the wheel, vehicle, or outside of the tire that are specifically designed to increase traction on snow and ice. Drivers should note that link chains may not be recommended for use on some types of vehicles; check your owner's manual. • Traction tires can be studded tires or tires that meet Rubber Manufacturers Association standards for use in severe snow conditions and carry a special symbol on the tire sidewall showing a three-peaked mountain and snowflake. These tires work about as well as studded tires on ice, but work better than studded tires or regular, all-weather tires in most other winter conditions. And they cause no more damage to road surfaces than regular, all-weather tires. Both chains and other types of traction tires are easier on roads than studded tires. Our latest study concluded studded tires cause about \$8.5 million in damage each year on state highways. **Chains Required** - When driving in winter conditions you may see signs letting you know the current requirements for chains or traction tires. When signs go up, Oregon law requires identified vehicles to be chained up. Traction tires may be used in place of chains for some passenger vehicles that are not towing a trailer or another vehicle. In some cases, all vehicles may be required to have chains regardless of the type of vehicle or the type of tire being used. This year, the Oregon fine for failing to use chains or traction tires when required increased to

\$880 per violation. The 2021 Oregon Legislature raised the fine to encourage compliance and improve safety. For instance, when a truck loses traction and becomes stuck or crashes, it can delay dozens or hundreds of other travelers impacted by blocked lanes. Crashes on Oregon highways and freeways can block traffic for many hours depending on the location, weather conditions, severity of crash and availability of incident responders. The estimated cost of delays caused by trucks failing to follow Oregon chain laws is over \$8 million a year - to the motor carrier industry and other highway users. **Chain laws in effect year-round** - Chain and traction tire laws are in effect year-round in Oregon; however studded tires are only allowed from **November 1 through March 31**. Be ready, severe winter weather can hit without much notice, so be prepared to comply with Oregon chain and traction tire laws and associated posted signs. Attempted Murder, South Slough Search

CCSO release - At approximately 10:42 pm on Wednesday October 27th the Coos County Emergency Dispatch Center received an emergency call from a concerned citizen at the South Slough National Estuarine Research Reserve. This citizen located a female with blood and bruising on her face. Deputies responded to the scene and located a 43 year old female from North Bend. She

had been badly beaten and bludgeoned by her ex-boyfriend, 46 year old Robert Elliott Danford of North Bend. This assault occurred after Robert kidnapped the victim shortly following her shift at the North Bend 7-11. She is the petitioner on a restraining order that prohibited Robert from coming within 150 feet of her. The victim was able to escape into the woods where she hid for several hours. She sustained significant injuries to her face, eyes, neck, and brain. She was rushed to Bay Area Hospital and shortly after flown to Riverbend hospital in Eugene. Canine Deputies with the Sheriff's Office responded and searched the surrounding area; however they were unable to locate Robert, who was at one point armed with a knife. A detective from the Coos County Major Crimes team assisted Deputies on scene with the investigation. The Coos County Sheriff's Office currently hold's Probable Cause for the arrest of Robert Elliott Danford for charges including attempted murder, kidnapping, and assault. The

I am proud of their many accomplishments during their tenure and

look forward to hearing of their success as we continue to move forward here at Team North Bend. As we work together to recruit and appoint an interim police chief, I reached out to my counterpart at the City of Coos Bay yesterday. I requested his police department's temporary assistance in maintaining support services. The team will also work to set the tone to help our valued police department employees continue to be successful here at the City of North Bend. In doing so, North Bend will temporarily have some shared administration services with Coos Bay's Police Chief and two Captains until an interim Police Chief is named. Coos County District Attorney R. Paul Frasier also reached out today and offered his full support during this transition period. Building community and maintaining public trust for all remains our local government's primary mission. Therefore, North Bend will continue to move forward with plans for a 360-degree operational assessment of the police department, as requested by the City Council. The evaluation is expected to include on-site visits, significant analysis of current data, and a series of interviews with staff, government officials, and community members. The interim police chief and supervisory staff will have an opportunity to provide input into the request for

proposal document before being put out for bid. Studies of this nature are predisposed toward the identification of areas requiring improvement. Accordingly, they tend to present what needs work without fully acknowledging and highlighting the positive aspects of an organization. I know we have a great police department with dedicated personnel that wants to evolve into the best agency possible. The professional law enforcement study intends to help guide the administration and City Council forward in preparing a strategic plan for future growth and development, and address the long-standing concerns that have been discussed dating back to the public safety fee reduction in May 2020. Once we have a roadmap and the police department is stabilized, we can begin the collaborative process of recruiting and hiring a new police chief. North Bend's next police chief will be a proven leader who demonstrates a collaborative and team-oriented approach to leadership and service to the community, takes a proactive stance towards problem-solving, and understands and values the culture of North Bend, and knows its demographics, both culturally and socio-economically, as well as its challenges and issues. We will take our time finding the right candidate, and I will be looking for ways to engage our residents in the

NB Interim Police Chief

City of North Bend release - On Tuesday, North Bend City Administrator David Milliron named retired Coos Bay Police Chief Gary McCullough as interim police chief and Cal Mitts as interim police captain. The new command staff takes the helm on Wednesday. McCullough is a North Bend resident who began his law enforcement career in 1993 as a reserve police officer for the

Coos Bay Police Department. He was sworn in as a full-time Police Officer in December of 1995 and promoted to Sergeant in 2002. In 2004, he was promoted to Captain, overseeing Patrol Operations and later Administrative Operations. In 2009, he was promoted to Chief of Police and faithfully served the department until retiring in June. During his career with Coos Bay, Chief McCullough has held the positions of Patrol Officer, Field Training Officer, Motorcycle Officer, Coos County Emergency Response Team member, Survival Skills Instructor, Patrol Sergeant, Operations Captain, and Administrative Captain. Chief McCullough has an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Criminal Justice from Columbia Southern University, is a graduate of the Oregon Executive Development Institute, and holds his Basic, Intermediate, Advanced, Supervisory, Management, and Executive Certificates with the Oregon Department of Safety Standards and Training. Chief McCullough has also been very active in the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police, holding various leadership and executive roles. "I have resided in North Bend for over 30 years, and I am looking forward to working with the men and women

that make up the North Bend Police Department, City Staff, City Council, and members of this community," McCullough said. Mitts retired in January after 25 years with the Coos Bay Police Department. He began his law enforcement career in 1994 as a Reserve Police Officer for Coos Bay and was sworn in as a full-time Police Officer in

December of 1995. In 2004, he was promoted to Sergeant and then in 2008 to Captain, where he led Patrol Operations. In 2012, he was chosen to lead the South Coast Interagency Narcotics Team (SCINT) as its Executive Director. During his career with Coos Bay and SCINT, Captain Mitts has held the positions of Patrol Officer, Detective, Narcotics Detective, Firearms Instructor, Patrol Sergeant, Operations Captain, and Executive Director. He was also a Coos County Emergency Response Team and Coos County Major Crimes Team member. Captain Mitts also served on the Women's Safety and Resource Board of Directors. Captain Mitts is a graduate of the Oregon Executive Development Institute and holds his Basic, Intermediate, Advanced, and Supervisory Certificates with the Oregon Department of Safety Standards and Training. "I am looking forward to working with the members of the North Bend Police Department and serving the community of North Bend," Mitts said. McCullough and Mitts are both military veterans; McCullough served in the United States Navy and Mitts in the United States Army. "Chief McCullough and Captain Mitts are professional law enforcement veterans with the highest leadership ability, dedication, and solid ethics," Milliron said. Among his tasks for North Bend, McCullough will assist the city in assessing future needs, developing long-term strategies

for the city's police department, and assisting in recruiting and onboarding a permanent chief who will lead North Bend into the future. McCullough said he is not seeking out the permanent chief position because he would like to focus on his family. "Once we have a roadmap and the police department is stabilized, we can begin the collaborative process of recruiting and hiring a new police chief, which could take up to a year," Milliron said. "I want to express my thanks and appreciation to Coos Bay City Manager Rodger Craddock, Coos Bay Police Chief Chris Chapanar, Police Captains Michael Shaffer and Tom Lindahl, and Coos County District Attorney R. Paul Frasier for their leadership and assistance during the past two weeks. Our strong, trusting, and authentic relationships came to light during this period of transition." 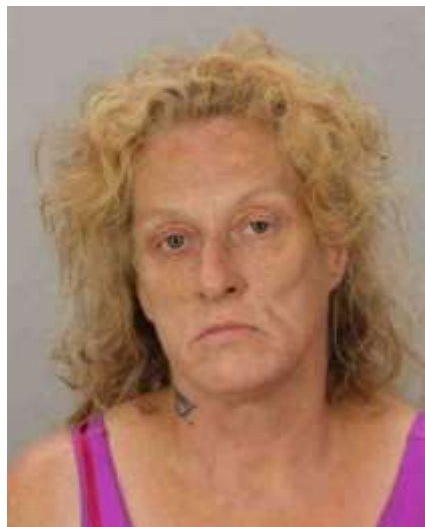

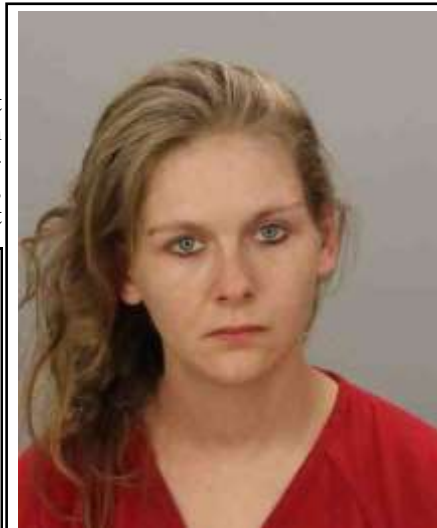

Crawford was arrested and transported to the Coos County Jail where she was held in lieu of \$25,000 bail.

50-Year Old Cold Case

the Sheriff's Office was able to put to rest a "cold-case" missing person report, identifying remains and giving closure to family members 50 years later. In 1971 Winston Arthur Maxey III left his home in Boise, Idaho at the age of 15 years old. After talking with a friend in Boise, Winston had learned there were job opportunities in Oregon and made a plan to hitchhike to the coast. He told his sister he was going to Coos Bay, and in the spring of 1971, 15 year old Winston left home. Family members reported they had never heard from Winston again, not knowing if he arrived in Oregon. In July of 1971, an unidentified deceased juvenile male was reported to the Coos County Sheriff's Office in the Engelwood area of Snedden Creek in

Coos Bay. Investigators tracked down all leads available at the time; canvassing the neighborhoods, asking the public for help and trying to build a timeline around the area and local events. Due to limited technology and the condition of the deceased, the state medical examiner was unable to determine the identity nor the cause of death. The deceased was buried in a local cemetery and listed as an unidentified male juvenile. The case remained open at the Sheriff's Office, among several other cases that are periodically revisited when time, evidence or technology might allow for a breakthrough. In 2017, Captain Looney and the county Medical Examiner exhumed the remains in order to obtain a DNA sample. Using a grant from the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office, DNA was registered through the NAMUS database and analyzed by Parabon Nanolabs. In May of 2021, Parabon Nanolabs was able to provide a DNA

profile of the unidentified male. While the profile didn't provide an immediate name, it did give significant data including ancestry, eye, skin and hair color, face morphology and a composite profile. The profile was used to search through sources for missing persons, cold cases and ancestry sites. In July of 2021, Parabon Nanolabs provided a further report, able to identify the family and to identify a male from the Idaho area which matched the genealogy and ancestry history from the first profile. Before closing the case, investigators needed to verify the identity of the missing person. Winston, before leaving Idaho, had unknowingly fathered a child. That child was ultimately given up for adoption and grew up in Idaho. Upon turning 18, Winston's daughter hired a private investigator to locate her biological parents. After learning of her biological parent's names, she contacted her biological mother, learning her father's name which had not been included on the birth certificate; Winston Arthur Maxey III. In 2016, Winston's daughter began pursuing avenues of locating her father, not knowing whether or not he was alive, and having no knowledge of his potential location. She set up a Facebook page, "Where in the world is Winston Maxey". She also filed an official missing person's report and began working with local law enforcement officials. After identifying Winston through Parabon, Coos County Detectives began contacting family members, requesting a secondary DNA profile from his sister to positively confirm his identity. After submission of the biological sister's DNA sample, Officials were able to confirm the identity of the 50 year old cold-case. Winston's daughter finally had answers about her father, and an understanding at least of where he had gone.

After exhaustive follow up and dogged determination, the Sheriff's Office is working with the family to produce a death certificate and to return the remains to the family in Idaho.

Hwy. 42 Fatal, Coos Co.

On Monday, October 18, 2021 at approximately 12:43 PM, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two-vehicle crash on Highway 42 near milepost 6. Preliminary investigation revealed an eastbound Dodge Ram, operated by Daniel Taylor (37) of North Bend, crossed into the westbound lanes and struck a Peterbilt CMV towing a loaded chip trailer, operated by Calvin Mitchell (52) of Coos Bay. Taylor sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Mitchell received minor injuries. Hwy 42 was closed approximately 6 hours. OSP was assisted by Coos County Sheriff's Department, Coquille Police Department, Coquille Fire Department, Greenacres Fire Department, Coquille Ambulance, Southern Oregon Public Safety Chaplains and ODOT.

Assault Mobilane

of a subject needing medical attention. While on scene an assault was reported to law enforcement stemming from the medical emergency. During the course of the investigation, 69 year old David R. Steege of Coos Bay was arrested on the charges of Assault IV Domestic and Strangulation. Mr. Steege was transported to the Coos County Jail on the above charges where he is being held.

Oregon Coast

Mapleton Standoff

On 10/02/21 just prior to 8:30pm the Lane County Sheriff's Office received the report of a domestic dispute at a residence involving a firearm in the 87000blk of Rice Rd. in Mapleton. The caller stated that 28 year old Jazmine Thein used a firearm to shoot at her brother. Her brother was able to flee to a neighbor's house. Deputies arrived and were able to confirm that Thein was still inside the residence. Over the course of the next several hours deputies worked to negotiate and de-escalate the situation so that she could be taken into custody safely. Shortly after 6:00am deputies found her deceased in a bedroom from what appeared to be a self-inflicted gunshot. No shots were ever fired by deputies during this incident.

Sailboat Capsizes

A husband and wife were killed when their 42-foot sailboat capsized off the North Oregon Coast. The vessel was found Sunday evening, Oct. 3, south of the Nehalem Jetty near Nedonna Beach in Tillamook Co. A female was found unconscious on the beach, but she did not survive. Her husband was found

deceased inside the cabin. Names have not been released pending notification of next of kin.

Leaven No Trace Founder Arrested

The founder of the Leaven No Trace volunteer environmental cleanup effort was arrested Oct. 6 in Florence after city officials discovered self-made trash filters on four stormwater discharge pipes leading to the Siuslaw River. Raymond Jerome Furr (aka Raymond Block), was charged with two-counts of Criminal Mischief and lodged in the Lane Co. Jail at Eugene. City officials allege the filter devices posed a risk of failure to roadways and the falling of trees created by erosion. Furr has been at odds with other coastal law enforcement agencies and his signature trash bags with a smiley face have been seen by many as well as stacks of discarded tires.

North Coast Poacher Nabbed

It often takes public assistance to catch a criminal. On October 11, 2021, a large Black-tail buck was reported injured in the reporting party's yard within the city of Astoria. Sgt. Warwick responded and determined the deer was mortally wounded, so he had to put it down. Upon skinning the deer for salvage, it was discovered that the deer had been shot

with an arrow or bolt. On October 12, 2021, Senior Trooper Schuerger responded to the location where the deer had been located, and after a lengthy search, found some dried blood on a trail. The blood trail led to another residence and the owner was contacted. The resident was able to provide a detailed description of a suspicious male, along with a photo, who had been in the yard looking around the evening before with night vision binoculars. The resident was able to further describe the suspect's vehicle. With the residents' description, a suspect was developed, who had previously (5 years prior) been arrested for shooting a deer in town. On several occasions, the suspect was seen in the area looking for the deer. At 1:00 A.M. on October 17, 2021, the suspect's vehicle was spotted in the area by an Astoria Police Officer who then called Senior Trooper Schuerger. Senior Trooper Schuerger along with the Astoria Police Officer responded and contacted the suspect. The suspect admitted to having a deer down that he had just shot but denied having shot the deer earlier in the week. The suspect led officers to the downed deer, so it could be salvaged. The suspect eventually admitted to having shot the other deer on October 11 and was unable to find it. The suspect, James Lee Ogier Jr. (25), was arrested and lodged by Clatsop County Sheriffs

on multiple unrelated charges. Sr. Trooper Schuerger also cited Ogier criminally for Unlawful Take Deer x2, Hunting Prohibited Method (crossbow) x2, Hunting Prohibited Area (city limits) x2, Hunting in Violation of Criminal Trespass, and Hunting Prohibited Hours. The suspect's crossbow, spotlight, and night vision binoculars were seized as evidence. On October 18, 2021, a resident reported an arrow, which turned out to be another hunting bolt, stuck in their wooden fence in the same neighborhood where Ogier had been arrested.

Suspect pleads guilty to 2016 laser strike on Coast Guard aircrew

SEATTLE — A Port Angeles-area man pleaded guilty Monday at the U.S. District Court in Tacoma for aiming a laser pointer at a Coast Guard Air Station Port Angeles aircrew in 2016. Randall Muck, 35, pleaded guilty to the lesser offense of assault on a federal officer under Title 18 U.S. Code Section 111a. Muck was sentenced to 90 days of home confinement with electronic monitoring, one year of probation and a \$1,000 fine. Muck illuminated an MH-65 Dolphin rescue helicopter crew with a green laser light while the aircrew was on final approach to Air Station Port Angeles on Sept. 26, 2016. At the time, the crew of four returned to base with no injuries reported. Coast Guard Investigative Service agents identified Muck as the

subject following incriminating statements he made at work. Muck's girlfriend witnessed the act from their residence and provided corroborating information. The case was referred to the Department of Justice Western District of Washington on Feb. 26, 2018 and presented to a grand jury on May 16, 2019. "These types of incidents can be very dangerous to the safety of our aircrews and disrupts our ability to respond as a search and rescue asset," said Cmdr. Mark Hiigel, former commanding officer of Air Station Port Angeles. "In this particular case, the aircrew was medically grounded for approximately two hours. This resulted in Naval Air Station Whidbey Island and Sector Columbia River, located in Warrenton, Oregon, covering our area of responsibility until the Port Angeles aircrew was medically cleared. We need the general public to understand that the dangers of playing with green laser lights goes beyond medical risks to our aircrews, it places all mariners at risk due to delayed response times should they become in distress." Laser pointers can cause great danger to Coast Guard air and boatcrews due to glare, afterimage, flash blindness, or temporary loss of night vision. Coast Guard flight rules dictate that aircraft must abort their mission if a laser is shined in the eyes of an aircrew member. Aiming a laser pointer at an aircraft or vessel is a felony crime under 18 U.S. Code Section 39A, which states whoever knowingly aims the beam of a laser pointer at an aircraft in the special aircraft jurisdiction of the United States, or at the flight path of such an aircraft, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than 5 years, or both. It is also

a crime under 18 U.S. Code Section 111 to forcibly assault, resist, oppose, impede, intimidate, or interfere with a federal officer while engaged in the performance of official duties. The Port Angeles Police Department, Coast Guard Investigative Service and Federal Bureau of Investigation assisted with the investigation. the North Umpqua River approximately 2.5 miles north east of the Umpqua Hot Springs on the North Umpqua Trail. Deputies and searchers responded and determined the body was that of Branda Hoyle. The Douglas County Medical Examiner's Office is investigating the death. At this time there are no indications of foul play and prolonged exposure to the elements are considered to be the highest concerning factors. A large scale search operation had been underway since her disappearance, but revealed no clues as to her whereabouts. Douglas County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue crews requested and received assistance from the Oregon State Police, Jackson County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue, Lane County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue, the Oregon State Search and Rescue Coordinator and the United States Coast Guard. Efforts included ground searchers, mountain rescue searchers, K9 teams, 4x4 teams and air resources to include aircraft and drones. Pacific Corp and the US Forest Service also provided support.

**Elk Left to Waste,

**Marijuana Bust
Douglas Co.**

On Tuesday, October 5th, 2021, members of the Douglas Interagency Narcotics Team executed a search warrant at a large scale illicit marijuana growing operation in the 9000 block of Days

Creek Cutoff Road in Canyonville. The activity was being conducted on two parcels of historical farmland along the South Umpqua River just a few miles east of Canyonville. There were two residences involved along with numerous outbuildings, RV's, and barns. The operation consisted of more than 100 "hoop house" style greenhouses, most of which were full of illegal marijuana. Police officers contacted and interviewed numerous individuals at the scene, most of which were low level immigrant workers who were released. 31 year old Carlos Flores Santacruz, who lives at the site, was arrested and lodged at the Douglas County Jail on charges of Unlawful Possession and Unlawful Manufacture of Marijuana. In total, DINT seized over 66,000 live marijuana plants, and over 11,000 pounds of processed marijuana. Approximately two weeks ago in a related investigation, DINT seized over 56,000 live marijuana plants at a nearby location in the 4,000 block of Tiller Trail Hwy. The two locations are similar in nature and operated by the same individuals. The investigation is ongoing and further arrests are anticipated. This operation, like many others in southern Oregon, was designed to look like a legal hemp cultivation business since it is difficult to distinguish between legal hemp, and illegal marijuana. Black market marijuana producers regularly hide behind the legal hemp market as camouflage for their illicit activity. Hemp producers are required to be permitted, and are regulated by the Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA). None of the locations mentioned today had legitimate hemp permits through the ODA. Marijuana can also be legally grown in Douglas County through the Oregon Medical Marijuana Program. OMMP permit holders are allowed to grow small amounts of marijuana for personal use, based on medical need. There were no OMMP permits for these sites. Recreationally, any location

in Oregon is allowed to grow 4 marijuana plants, also for personal use. However, locations like the ones described above are illegally growing tens of thousands of marijuana plants at a time and selling them on the black market for

millions of dollars. These illicit marijuana operations have sprung up recently in southern Oregon causing numerous problems for our communities and the neighboring areas. These operations are largely operated and controlled by notorious foreign drug cartels. Additionally these operations are causing significant environmental damage due to the volume of fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, the buildup of garbage, and even the high volume of human feces. These operations are often illegally overutiliz-

Jury Scam

DOUGLAS COUNTY, Ore. - It seems to make its rounds every few months. The phone rings, it is answered and the person on the other end of the telephone identifies themselves as a law enforcement officer and tells the person that they have missed jury duty, failed to pay some fines, or they have a warrant for their arrest. Eventually, the caller states it can be cleared up by paying fees or fines in the form of Western Union, pre-loaded debit cards or gift cards. **HANG UP! IT IS A SCAM!** The Sheriff's Office has been receiving calls from members of the community reporting they have received such calls from people claiming to work for the Sheriff's Office. Some names they are providing are actual names of Sheriff's Office staff members. It is critically important for our community to be aware of these tactics and to share them with their friends and family members, especially those who may be vulnerable to falling victim to the scams, such as the elderly members of the community. "It is important for retailers to inform their staff members about the scam and to ask them to be watchful for people who may be making the transactions in relation to the scam", said Lt. Brad O'Dell. Posting information about these scam tactics at cash registers or check-out points may also be helpful. Law Enforcement will not call people to let them know they have a warrant, rather they will make personal contact. If you believe you have fallen victim to this scam, please contact the Douglas County Sheriff's Office at 541-440-4471.

Marijuana Operation south of Creswell

On 10/19/2021 The Lane County Sheriff’s Office along with several local fire agencies responded to an address in the 81000blk of Hwy. 99 south of Creswell regarding a structure fire. While on scene authorities observed evidence indicating the location to be involved in a large-scale criminal marijuana manufacturing and trafficking operation. Deputies applied for and were able to obtain a search warrant to seize evidence related to this operation. Deputies executed the search warrant on the morning of 10/20/21 and seized a very high volume of marijuana. Over 2,000 marijuana plants were seized in addition to over 200lbs of pro-

cessed, ready-to-sell marijuana. The local street market value of the marijuana seized is estimated at over two million dollars. This value if sold outside the State of Oregon could easily be tripled. Evidence was also obtained that this was an unlicensed, non-medical marijuana operation. This investigation is ongoing and formal charges have not yet been filed. The Lane County Sheriff’s Office would like to thank the Oregon State Police Northwest Region Marijuana Team for their assistance with this investigation.

Big Meth Bust

EUGENE, Ore.—On September 15, 2021, a coordinated law enforcement operation targeting the leader and several associates of a Lane County drug trafficking cell led to the seizure of 384 pounds of metham-

phetamine, the largest single methamphetamine seizure in Oregon State history and valued at over a million dollars. The operation, led by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) with assistance from the Springfield Police Department, Eugene Police Department, and Linn Interagency Narcotics Enforcement Team (LINE) came after the cell’s leader, Martin Manzo-Negrete aka Javier Cardenas-Manzo, a 47-year-old Eugene resident, was charged by federal criminal complaint with possessing with intent to distribute methamphetamine. Manzo-Negrete has a long history of drug trafficking and previously served 14 years in federal prison. Manzo-Negrete was arrested during the operation and made his first appearance in federal court on September 16, 2021. He was ordered detained pending

further court proceedings. Four of Manzo-Negrete’s associates were also arrested and are facing federal drug charges. They include Eugene residents Gustavo Manzo-Mares, 45; Candice L. Barrett, 52; John C. Willis, 59; and Nathan Lee Daniels, 46. A fifth associate, Frank Buehler, 52, also of Eugene, has been charged, but remains at large. As part of the operation, law en-

forcement executed federal search warrants at multiple locations in Lane County. In addition to methamphetamine, they seized 14 firearms—some of which were stolen—and more than \$76,000 in cash. DEA and the Eugene Police Department Street Crimes Unit began investigating the Manzo-Mares cell in October 2020 for its role in trafficking large quantities of methamphetamine from California to Oregon for resale in and around Lane County. The drug trafficking organization transported large quantities of methamphetamine by car from Southern California to Oregon. Once in Oregon, the drugs were stored, divided, and then distributed into the community. Acting U.S. Attorney Scott Erik Asphaug of the District of Oregon made the announcement. This case was investigated by the DEA with assistance from Springfield Police Department, Eugene Police Department Street Crimes Unit, and LINE. Assistant U.S. Attorney Joseph H. Huynh is prosecuting the case. A criminal complaint is only an accusation of a crime, and defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.

Shots Fired, Lane Co.

On 10/11/21 just after 6:30am the Lane County Sheriff's Office received more than one 911 call regarding an incident that occurred in the 3800blk of Richland St. in Springfield. Deputies learned that there had been a traffic crash followed by some sort of dispute. Area residents reported hearing what sounded like gunshots just before the involved parties fled the location. Some of the involved are believed to have fled on foot while others possibly fled in vehicles. Deputies located evidence on scene indicative of a vehicle crash. Deputies also located at least one shell-casing from a small caliber handgun. Deputies are looking to contact the occupants of two vehicles that may have been in the area around the time of the incident. The first vehicle is described as a newer white sedan. The second is described as a gray Toyota Tacoma with a canopy and roof

rack. Anyone with information regarding this case is asked to contact the Lane County Sheriff's Office at 541-682-4150 opt. 1.
