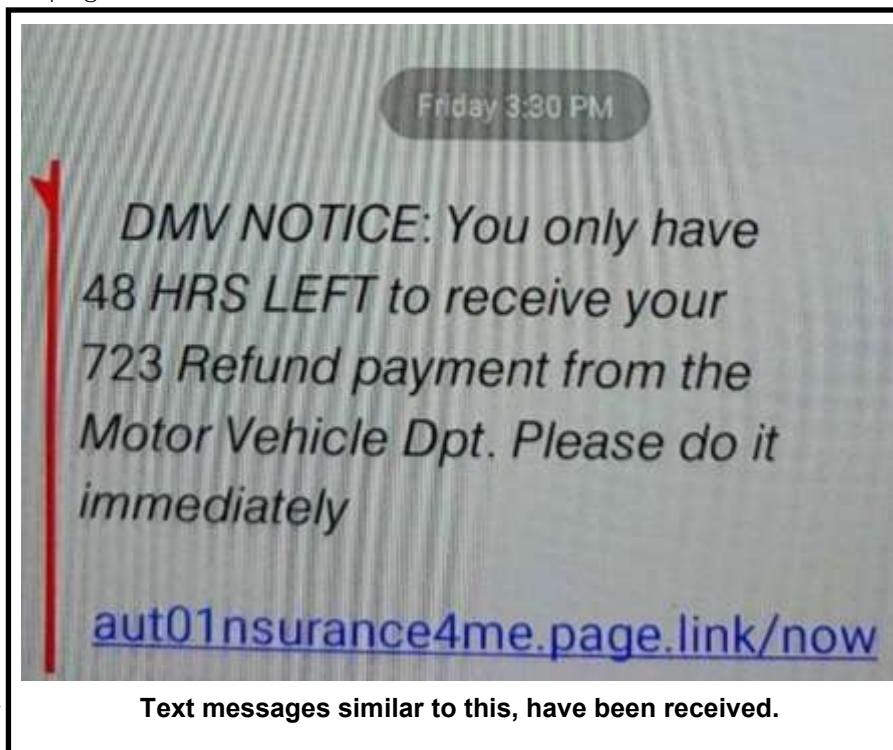

Scammers posing as Oregon DMV are busy this holiday season

SALEM -- Scammers posing as the Oregon DMV are texting cell phones claiming that a refund is available. It is a fake message and a phishing scam trying to get payment information from unsuspecting Oregonians. DMV urges customer not to click on any links and delete the message. "DMV does not text customers to let them know about a payment issue, or issue refunds via text message," says DMV Customer Services Manager Katie Hafner. DMV staff members are aware of the issue and are unable to provide any technical assistance with a customer's phone. If customers have questions about how to block a number, they should contact their cell phone provider. If you are issued a refund by DMV, you will receive it through the mail or directly back on your payment card. DMV will not text or call to inform you that you will be receiving a refund. This holiday season customers are encouraged to skip the trip and visit the DMV online at dmv2u.oregon.gov. Customers can go online to renew vehicle registration, notify DMV of a vehicle sale, renew or replace a license/ID card and more. For the latest DMV news, please visit www.oregondmv.com.

Renew license, ID, vehicle tags before end of moratorium

The Oregon law enforcement moratorium for expired vehicle registration, driver licenses and ID cards will end Dec. 31. If you need to renew, do it as soon as



you can – before an expected rush at the end of the year. Starting in November, DMV will mail about 300,000 Oregon residents who have expired vehicle registrations, urging them to renew before the end of the year. This mailing is in addition to the regular reminder DMV sends a few weeks before your vehicle's tags expire. DMV will not also send a second reminder for expired licenses, permits and ID cards, so please check your card to make sure it's still valid. "You might receive a reminder in the mail even if it doesn't seem to apply to you," DMV Administrator Amy Joyce said. "Did you sell your car? If you didn't notify DMV, we might still show you as the owner. Protect yourself from parking tickets and towing charges: go online and notify us of the sale." The current moratorium, passed by the 2021 Legislature, is the last of a series of

grace periods giving Oregonians more time to renew at DMV during COVID-19 restrictions. **DMV open online and in person with or without appointment** - "To help Oregonians get DMV services during the pandemic, we've added many new online options," Joyce said. "We have caught up with the COVID-19 backlog enough that about half our visits to field offices are by appointment, and the other half are standby." Whether you set an appointment or just stop by, you can get more than one DMV service in one visit. Before you go to a DMV office, visit [dmv2u](https://dmv2u.oregon.gov) to see if you can get your service online – or make sure you have what you need to bring to an office. [dmv2u](https://dmv2u.oregon.gov) is part of ODOT's commitment to put transformative technology to make Oregon's transportation system more efficient and user friendly.

"Going forward, customers will continue to have the option of making an appointment online through [dmv2u](https://dmv2u.oregon.gov) or dropping by, as well as more choices online," Joyce said. "Anytime you need a DMV service, check [dmv2u](https://dmv2u.oregon.gov) first and see if you can save yourself time and a trip." **Consider getting Real ID now** - If you need to visit a DMV in person – especially to renew your license or ID card – it's a good time to get the Real ID option. Starting in May 2023, you will need a federally acceptable form of identification to fly – most common are a passport or the Real ID version of a DMV credential. Don't wait until 2023, when the rush will be on! Make sure you bring the documents you need to qualify for Real ID by creating a personalized checklist at oregon.gov/RealID.

time, place, and manner with regards to persons experiencing homelessness. As of July 1, Oregon House Bill 3115 makes it legal for the unsheltered to sleep on any public property that is open to the public unless cities and counties enact regulations that are “objectively reasonable as to time, place and manner with regards to persons experiencing homelessness.” Public property means “public lands, premises, and buildings, including but not limited to any building used in connection with the transaction of public business or any lands, premises, or buildings owned or leased by this state or any political subdivision therein.” The new legislation requires all Oregon cities and counties to update their ordinance language by **July 1, 2023**, to comply with newly-adopted state law and several court cases and opinions issued by the U.S. Department of Justice, specifically, • **Oregon House Bill 3115** – Provides that local law regulating sitting, lying, sleeping, or keeping warm and dry outdoors on public property that is open to the public must be objectively reasonable as to time, place, and manner for persons experiencing homelessness. Creates affirmative defense to charge of violating such local law that law is not objectively reasonable. Establishes a cause of action for a person experiencing homelessness to challenge the objective reasonableness of such local law. Authorizes court to award attorney fees to the prevailing plaintiff in such suit in certain circumstances. • **Oregon House Bill 3124** – Amended current Oregon Law by extending the time by which local law enforcement officials must post a written

notice before removing unsheltered individuals from an established camping site from 24 hours to 72 hours. Requires notice to be posted at all reasonably identifiable entrances to a camping site. Defines “personal property” as any item that can reasonably be identified as belonging to an individual and that has apparent value or utility. Clarifies requirements for the removal and storage of personal property, the disposal of unclaimed items that have no apparent value or are in an unsanitary condition, and the confiscation of weapons, drugs, or other items that appear to be stolen or evidence of a crime. Requires that unclaimed personal property at a camping site be given to a law enforcement official, social service, outreach agency serving homeless individuals, a local agency official, or a person authorized to issue a citation for illegal camping. Requires that unclaimed personal property be stored in a facility in the same community as the camping site from which it was removed and in a manner that is orderly and is made reasonably available for an individual to claim. Provides that any law or policy of a local government that is more specific or offers greater protections to homeless individuals subject to removal from an established camping site preempts contrary provisions of this Act. • **Martin v. City of Boise** – This landmark homelessness case from the Ninth Circuit impacted most western states with an intent to better support individuals experiencing homelessness. The court ruled that enforcement of ordinances prohibiting sleeping or camping on public property against homeless individuals is unconsti-

tutional when those individuals do not have a meaningful alternative, such as shelter space or a legal place to camp. The case was appealed to the Supreme Court, which allowed the decision to stand.

Honors for NBPD

City of North Bend report - The North Bend Police Department was notified that the “Entire Agency” and several other local area Law Enforcement Agencies would receive the “Critical Incident Award” from the Oregon Peace Officers Association at their awards banquet on November 19, 2021. This Awards Banquet is held annually at the Spirit Mountain Resort in Grand Ronde. The award is to recognize the North Bend Police Department members for their involvement in the Quadruple Homicide and Abduction incident on June 18, 2021. Every department member worked tirelessly from the initial call into our dispatch center until the suspect was later apprehended in Wisconsin. The department member’s hard work and dedication to bringing this incident to a resolution continues today as members follow investigations and evidence processing. Tele Communicators Mary Kelly Andrade and Holly Booras and Evidence Technician Aimee Elliot attended the banquet to accept this award on behalf of the Entire North Bend Police Depart-

ment. Our Thanks to each of them for representing our Department, City, and Community at this event.

Coos Co.

District Attorney’s Upset

Coos Co. District Attorney R. Paul Frasier is ticked off. He’s not the only District Attorney in Oregon upset after the Governor commuted sentences of youth who were “sentenced prior to the effective date of (2019) SB 1008 and did not benefit from its changes to our juvenile justice system.” In his 20-page news release, Frasier stated “I personally hoped that before any action was taken by the Governor, that the District Attorneys for the counties where the youth where adjudicated would be consulted as to the facts of the case and more importantly, to all the District Attorneys to notify the victims and their families that the Governor was considering commuting the sentence of the youth that had victimized them. Sadly my hope was misplaced.” Frasier says the Commutation Order includes the name of Raymond Perkins. He was 14 at the time he

killed Doctor Judith Elman on the beach north of Seven Devils Wayside. He also sexually assaulted her. He applied three-times for commutation from previous Governors, as well as Governor Brown, but was denied. Under the new order, "if granted parole, he could be released as early as next year." Frasier says his office will attend the parole hearing. Also on the list, Jerald Michael Brown who is currently 19-years old. He was convicted of Unlawful Sexual Penetration in the First Degree in 2017 involving a four-year old girl he baby-sat. The third person is Xavier Johnston. He was 19-years old when he was convicted of rape on two different occasions involving the same underage girl. He is scheduled for release next year. "As indicated, I do not know what process the Governor will use in deciding whether to commute the sentences of Mr. Brown or Mr. Johnston. It is my hope that the Governor will consider input from not only my office but from the victims of their crimes before deciding whether or not to commute the sentences of these individuals."

Domestic Violence

CBPD release - Coos Bay Police Department is seeking information from a potential witness of a Domestic Violence Incident that took place in the Parking Lot of CFN Fuel. On 11/06/21 Jeanette Dahm reported that she and her ex husband Robert Neilsen got into a dispute at around 1:30 PM while they were traveling through Coos Bay on their way home to Bandon. Ms. Dahm stated she and Mr. Neilsen were in her vehicle when they pulled into the CFN parking lot located at 525 N. Broadway, where the dispute escalated. Ms. Dahm stated she had pulled over at the location and told Mr. Neilsen to get out of her vehicle. However, Mr. Neilsen grabbed the keys from the ignition and got into the drivers side of the vehicle after he observed a man in a black lifted pickup truck nearby doing something with his cell phone. Ms. Dahm stated she had screamed for help, hoping to get someone's attention and believed that the man in the black truck may have been calling the police. The Coos Bay Police Department never received a call regarding the dispute. Mr. Neilsen was later located in Bandon and taken into custody on charges of Domestic Strangulation and Kidnapping in the first degree. Anyone who may have witnessed this dispute, or has knowledge of the identity of the potential male witness associated with the lifted black pickup truck is being asked to contact the Coos Bay Police Department at 541-269-8911.

Assault Mobilane

CCSO release - On 10/30/21 at approximately 5:20 P.M. a Coos County Sheriff's Deputy, Charleston Fire Personnel

and Bay Cities Ambulance responded to Mobilane Road in Coos Bay for a report of a subject needing medical attention. While on scene an assault was reported to law enforcement stemming from the medical emergency. During the course of the investigation, 69 year old David R. Steege of Coos Bay was arrested on the charges of Assault IV Domestic and Strangulation. Mr. Steege was transported to the Coos County Jail on the above charges where he is being held.

DUI/Manslaughter, Lakeside

CCSO release - On November 5th, 2021 at approximately 9:29 p.m. the Coos County Sheriff's Office Dispatch Center

received a 911 call reporting a pedestrian had been struck by a vehicle on North Lake Road near the Osprey Point R.V. Park in the city of Lakeside. Emergency responders including Lakeside Fire, Oregon State Police, Coos County Sheriff's Deputies and the North Bend Police responded to the scene. Ultimately life saving efforts were not successful and 43 year old Jessica A. Collins of Lakeside was pronounced deceased at the scene of the accident. During the course of an investigation the suspect vehicle was located and the driver of the vehicle, 43 year old Jason M. Berrier also of Lakeside was arrested on the charge of DUI by the Oregon State Police. The investigation continued well into the night and the following day resulting in Mr. Berrier being charged additionally with Manslaughter I. Mr. Berrier is currently being held in the Coos County Jail. If anyone has additional information about this case, they are encouraged to contact the Coos County Sheriff's Office at 541-3967800.

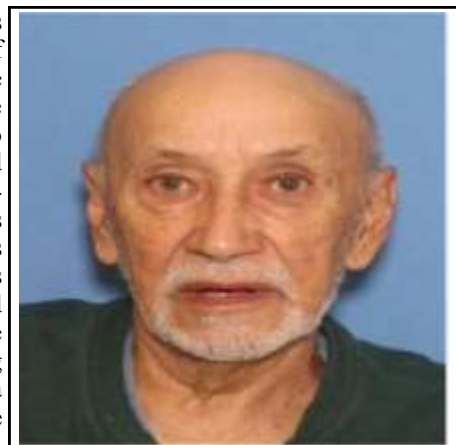
Missing Person

CCSO release - We would like to request public assistance if anyone knows the whereabouts or has seen Mr. Valle, missing since Sunday, Nov. 7. On 11-07

-2021 a 77 year old man, identified as Jessie Valle, went mushroom picking off of the Weaver Ridge Road area outside of Myrtle Point with some friends. Valle reportedly walked off on his own to check an area for mushrooms, but did not return. His friends searched for Valle for hours before contacting authorities for assistance. Currently the Coos County Sheriff's Office, the Douglas County Sheriff's Office and Search and Rescue assets from both agencies are actively searching for the missing man. Valle was last seen wearing a black ball cap, a black coat, and blue jeans. Because of his age and the current weather conditions, authorities are very concerned for Valle's wellbeing. Myrtle Pt. Search

CCSO release - It is with great sadness that I have to report the lost subject, 77 year old Jessie Valle was found after passing away at the scene of the search, less than 500 meters from the point last seen. It's believed Mr. Valle succumbed

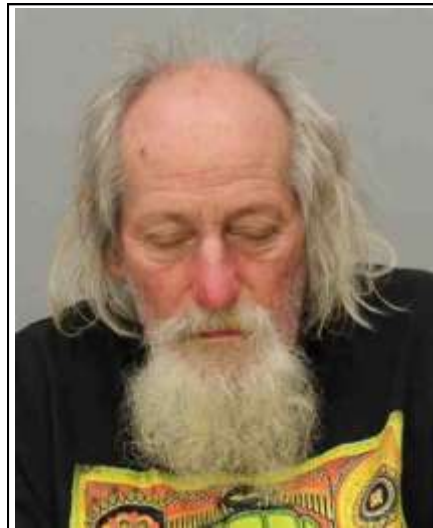

Fatal Hwy. 42 South, Coos Co.

On November 9, 2021, at approximately 4:30 P.M., OSP Troopers responded to a single-vehicle crash involving a submerged vehicle on U.S. Highway 42S near milepost 10 near Coquille. Preliminary investigation indicates a Nissan Armada driven by, Tina Schuhrke (53) of Langlois, was traveling east on highway 42S when she failed to negotiate a curve, crossed the westbound lane of travel crashed through a phone pole and guardrail before continuing down the embankment into the Coquille River. The vehicle was completely submerged in the river. OSP Was assisted by Coos County Sheriff's Office Marine Deputies, Bandon Police Department, Coquille Fire and Rescue, Coquille Ambulance, Brandon Fire and Rescue, Bandon Dive Team, Coos County chaplains, and the Oregon Department of Transportation.

Machete Assault

CCSO release - On Thursday, November, 25th, 2021 approximately 7:12 pm, Coos County Sheriff Deputies along with Oregon State Police responded to Sea Port R.V Park for a subject reporting he was cut with a machete. The victim reported 61 year old Kelly Tolle at-

tempted to stab him. Deputies located Kelly in Sea Port R.V Park. Kelly was placed under arrest for Assault in the Second Degree and Unlawful Use of a Weapon. The victim was transported to Bay Area Hospital for treatment. Kelly was transported to the Coos County Jail, where he was booked and lodged without further incident.

Domestic Menacing

CCSO release - On 11/28/21, Deputies were conducting follow up on a previous case on Melton Rd. in Bandon. During the course of the investigation Deputies found that the suspect, identified as 67 year old Michael B. Currie was not present at but had come to the residence numerous times along with calling and threatening the victim if she were to

Oregon Coast

Hwy. 6 Fatal, Tillamook Co.

On Sunday, October 31, 2021 at approximately 4:16 AM, Oregon State Police Troopers responded to the report of a two-vehicle head-on collision which occurred on Highway 6 near milepost 8. Preliminary investigation revealed a silver 2018 Ford F150 pickup, operated by Bradley Burton Harris (29) of Tillamook, was westbound when, for an unknown reason, the vehicle crossed over

into the eastbound lane and struck an oncoming Mazda MZ3. The black Mazda was operated by Humberto Maciel (47) of Tillamook. Both vehicles sustained heavy damage and came to an uncontrolled rest blocking the entire highway. Maciel was sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. His passenger, Breanna Maciel (19) was transported to Legacy Emmanuel Hospital by Life Flight helicopter with life threatening injuries. Harris fled the scene immediately after the crash but was located by police near the crash scene approximately four hours later. Harris was transported initially to Tillamook Regional Medical Center for injuries then later transferred to Legacy Emmanuel hospital as a trauma patient. Harris is the subject of an ongoing criminal investigation. Hwy 6 was closed for 6 hours.

Poaching, Lincoln Co.

On October 28, 2021, Oregon State Police received information about a deceased deer that was observed by a citizen approximately 150 yards North of Euchre Creek Road, Newport, Oregon. The reporting party stated they had first observed the deer during the day on October 26. An OSP Fish & Wildlife Sergeant responded to the area and located a deceased Blacktail doe that had been shot and left to waste. The Oregon State Police is requesting public assis-

Hwy. 101 Fatal, Tillamook Co.

On November 7, 2021, at approximately 4:00 A.M. Oregon State Police responded to the report of a single-vehicle crash that occurred on US Highway 101 near milepost 60 near Tillamook, Oregon. A preliminary investigation revealed a silver Subaru Impreza, operated by Anthony Ronald Cuarteros (26) of Portland, OR, was northbound in wet weather conditions when, for an unknown reason, the vehicle drove off the northbound shoulder into a deep drainage ditch. The vehicle continued in the drainage ditch for more than 200 feet, crossing over two raised driveway entries, until it came to an uncontrolled rest in the ditch directly in front of the Tillamook Country Smoker Factory Outlet Store. Anthony Cuarteros sustained serious injuries and was transported to an area hospital. The passenger, Janette Gaudalupe Medina (23), of Portland was pronounced dead at the scene. Passengers Alexander Bradley Cuarteros (22) of Portland and Damon Kyle Cornwell (25) of Beaverton were treated at the hospital for minor injuries. US Highway 101 was closed for approximately five hours. OSP was assisted by Tillamook County Sheriff's Office, Tillamook Police Department, Tillamook Fire and Rescue, Bay City Fire Department, and ODOT Incident Response.

Slow Roll Elude

Three law enforcement agencies were involved in an attempt to elude chase Tuesday, Nov. 9 in Reedsport. According to reports, 44-year old Donald Jay Gillispie was the driver who allegedly failed to originally stop at a stop sign. What followed; however, was a slow, slow pursuit throughout the city involving running stop signs, traffic lights, failure to yield to pedestrians and cruising through parking lots. He was eventually stopped on Hwy. 101 and taken into custody on a variety of charges including: Attempt to Elude, Reckless Driving, Resisting Arrest, Criminal Mischief, Failure to Perform Duties of a Driver, Reckless Endangering as well as Disobeying several Traffic Control Devices.

Illegal Elk Shooting North Coast

On November 15, 2021, an OSP Fish & Wildlife Trooper received a report of a cow elk that was found dead in a wooded area near Testament Creek Road off

Bald Mountain Road in Tillamook County. It was reported that hunters in the area heard approximately 14 shots in the early morning hours of opening the first season elk. The hunters then located the dead cow and reported it to OSP. Three vehicles seen leaving the area could possibly be related. The model year of the vehicles seen is an approximation, but they are believed to be a silver, lifted, 2005 Dodge Ram, a blue, 2010 Dodge Ram, and an older model maroon Ford F150. The Oregon State Police is seeking public assistance with information about this poaching case. Poaching, Tillamook Co.

On November 15, 2021, an OSP Fish & Wildlife was notified by an elk hunter of a poached deer off Ginger Creek Road. The deer was located at the end of a spur on BLM land near a common OHV staging area. The deer had been shot multiple times in the neck and torso. Only one backstrap was taken and the rest of the deer was dumped off the end of a spur road and left to waste. By the rate of decay, it is estimated to have occurred sometime between November 8-13,

2021. The Oregon State Police is seeking public assistance with information about this poaching case. Hwy. 101 Fatal, Lincoln Co.

On Sunday, November 21, 2021 at approximately 6:23 PM, Oregon State Police and emergency personnel responded to a report of a two-vehicle head-on collision on Highway 101 near milepost 152. Preliminary investigation revealed a southbound Toyota Corolla, operated by Michael Noel (59) of Waldport, crossed over the centerline and crashed head-on with a northbound Mercedes GLK SUV, operated by Lorrie Ann Owens (54) of Waldport. The Mercedes rolled into a roadside ditch, entrapping Owens and her passenger Norma Parry (78) of Waldport. Noel sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased at the scene. Owens and Parry were extricated and transported to Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital with injuries. Hwy 101 was detoured for approximately five hours.

Coast Guard saves 5 after fishing boat sinks off Umpqua River

ASTORIA, Ore. — The Coast Guard rescued five people from a life raft late Monday, Nov. 15 after a fishing boat sank approximately 20 miles offshore

from the mouth of the Umpqua River. The captain aboard the 67-foot fishing vessel Desire, homeported in Neah Bay, Washington, used a VHF-FM marine-band radio to hail Coast Guard Sector North Bend watchstanders at about 9 p.m. Monday and report their vessel was taking on water. He also reported the five people aboard were preparing to abandon ship into a life raft. Additionally, Desire's registered emergency position indicating radio beacon was activated by contact with water and the vessel's location and owner information was transmitted to Coast Guard watchstanders at the 13th District Command Center in Seattle. Rescue helicopter crews from

the Coast Guard air facility in Newport and the Coast Guard air station in North Bend, and 47-foot Motor Lifeboat rescue boatcrews from Coast Guard Stations Siuslaw River and Umpqua River deployed to help the people in distress. Once on scene at about 9:30 p.m., the helicopter crews located the survivors in the life raft and deployed rescue swimmers to facilitate hoisting the survivors. The helicopter crew from Newport rescued three survivors, and the helicopter crew from North Bend rescued two survivors. The station's boatcrews remained on scene to assist as needed. "The fishing boat's crew all had survival suits, properly deployed their survival raft, and shot two flares to assist us in locating them," said Lt. Conor Regan, a helicopter pilot from Coast Guard Air Station North Bend. "Their overall preparation serves as an example for other mariners, as it was fundamental to the positive outcome of their potentially life-threatening situation." Additionally, Regan added that the EPIRB's transmission of information allowed watchstanders to corroborate details of the choppy radio distress hail and expedite rescue coordination. Following the successful hoists of all five people from the life raft, the survivors were taken to Air Station North Bend where their care was transferred to awaiting emergency services personnel. There are no serious injuries reported.

Watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Columbia River command center received a call from Pacific County Sheriff at 12:30 a.m. stating a 41-year-old man and a 13-year-old boy were aboard a boat when it capsized in the vicinity of Ellsworth Creek Preserve. The crew landed at 2 a.m. and transferred him to awaiting emergency medical personnel. The man was showing signs of hypothermia when he was picked up by EMS. His current condition is unknown.

Coast Guard deploys helicopter crews to assess waters, assist residents of flooding RV park in Tillamook, OR

ASTORIA, Ore. – The Coast Guard responded Friday, Nov. 12, to reports of approximately 50 people trapped in a flooding recreational vehicle park along Neskowin Creek in Tillamook. Local fire department personnel were coordinating the response and a Tillamook County dispatcher requested Coast Guard air assistance to evacuate the individuals due to rising waters and a threat of mudslides. It was reported that approximately 50 adults live in the affected area, and there were no reported injuries. An MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew from Coast Guard Sector Columbia River in Warrenton, and an MH-65 Dolphin helicopter crew from Coast Guard Sector North Bend in North Bend have deployed to help assess the situation and

vehicle crash involving a pickup truck and a sedan on Hwy 126 W at milepost 39 near Noti, Oregon. Preliminary investigation revealed that a white 2018 Toyota Tundra, operated by Gabriel Hostetler (42) of Beaverton, OR was traveling westbound on Hwy 126 W near milepost 39 when it made an unsafe pass and collided head-on with a silver 2000 Toyota Echo in the eastbound lane. The Toyota Echo was operated by Mark Knight (62) of Eugene, OR. Both vehicles came to rest in the eastbound lane. Knight was pronounced deceased on scene and Hostetler was uninjured. Eastbound lanes of Hwy 126 W were closed for 4 hours due to the investigation. OSP was assisted by Lane Fire/Rescue, the Oregon Department of Transportation, and the Lane County Sheriff's Office.

Rolling Smell of Pot

This story comes out of Albany. Not sure if it is a case of right time, right place, or just dumb luck. On Nov. 3rd, a detective with the Linn Interagency Narcotics Enforcement Team was southbound on I-5 when he came upon a 26-foot long U-Haul box truck. He immediately recognized the strong odor of

marijuana. The detective radioed ahead and had the truck stopped. Vidal Gonzales-Tetlcel, Hermiston, and Jose Guadalupe-Alatorre, Redway, CA, stated they were hauling furniture; however, that was not the case. The marijuana odor was too overwhelming. Inside the truck officers discovered large black plastic garbage bags of marijuana and grow equipment. The plants weighed in at an estimated 2,800 lbs. Officers estimated the overall value at \$2.2 million.

Illegal Marijuana Grow, Marion Co.

The Oregon State Police's NW Region Marijuana Team in cooperation with the Marion County Sheriff's Office served a search warrant at an illicit indoor marijuana grow near Jefferson, Oregon. The team seized 2,158 live plants, 196 pounds of packaged/bulk marijuana, and \$25,560 US currency. The grow operators, Lily An Lee (54) and Yong Sheng Huang (54), both of Talbot, were lodged at Marion County Jail and are charged with ORS 475B.349 – Unlawful Manufacture of Marijuana Item, ORS 475B.337 – Unlawful Possession of Marijuana Item, and Oregon HB 3000



(2021), Sect. 41 – Unlawful Production of Marijuana. This case originated from citizen complaints. These types of illegal marijuana grows impact communities all across Oregon and contribute to criminal enterprises. Many other dangerous and illegal activities go hand in hand with these types of illegal grows, such as numerous water diversion issues and dangerous living conditions.

Illegal Marijuana Grown, Jackson Co.

On October 28, 2021, the Oregon State Police Southwest Region Drug Enforcement Section team served a search warrant in the 12000 block of Modoc Rd. Central Point, Oregon, for illegal marijuana manufacturing. Law enforcement encountered 62 large, outdoor grow-houses which contained both illegal marijuana plants (1,193) and previously

harvested, drying marijuana. In total, 18,360 gross pounds of illicit marijuana, including the marijuana plants and processed marijuana located on the property, were seized and destroyed. Also seized in the operation were over \$80,000.00 US Currency and four firearms. Multiple occupants on the property were detained, identified, and interviewed during the investigation. The OSP SWR DES team was assisted by law enforcement officers from the Josephine Marijuana Enforcement Team (JMET) and the Rogue Area Drug Enforcement (RADE) team in Josephine County. Additional resources were provided in support of the investigation by the Illegal Marijuana Enforcement Team (IMET) of the Medford Police Department-Jackson County Sheriff's Office.

Epic Amount of Illegal Marijuana

On November 18, 2021, the Oregon State Police Southwest Region (SWR) Drug Enforcement Section (DES) team served a

search warrant in the 1300 block of Antelope Rd. White City, Oregon. The location consisted of 5 industrial-sized warehouses zoned for commercial use. Over 100 individuals were initially detained, identified, interviewed, and released. Several of the individuals were migrant workers living on-site in subpar living conditions without running water. During the operation, which spanned over two days, an epic amount of illegal, processed marijuana and a firearm were seized. The DES Team's conservative estimation on the amount of processed marijuana seized was approximately 500,000 lbs., which depending on where it would be exported to, has a conservative street value of somewhere around \$500 million. This is a very involved investigation and will be ongoing for several weeks. OSP will be releasing more information when available. The OSP SWR DES team was assisted by the Josephine Marijuana Enforcement Team (JMET) of Josephine County, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Medford Office, the Basin Inter-

agency Narcotics Team (BINET) of Klamath County, the Illegal Marijuana Enforcement Team (IMET) of the Medford Police Department-Jackson County Sheriff's Office and Jackson County Fire District No. 3.

State Trooper Critically Injured Hwy. 30, Columbia Co.

Thursday, November 11, 2021, at around 3:31 P.M., OSP Troopers were involved in a police incident involving a fleeing suspect on Highway 30 milepost 31 west of St. Helens, when the suspect vehicle rammed an OSP Patrol car and struck an OSP Trooper. The Trooper was taken by ground ambulance to Emanuel Hospital in critical condition. The investigation is being handled by the Columbia County Sheriff's Office. The Oregon State Police will not be releasing any information about the incident. The identity of the OSP Trooper is not being released at this time.

Injured OSP Trooper Update

The Oregon State Police Trooper, who was injured in the police incident on highway 30, has been identified as Trooper John Jeffries. Trooper John Jeffries started with the Oregon State Police in March of 2021, after retiring from the FBI after 20 years of service. Trooper Jeffries is currently duty stationed at the St. Helens worksite. Trooper Jeffries and his wife have spent the last 25 years in Portland, Oregon where they raised their two sons. Trooper Jeffries has spent his life in service to the public. The Oregon State Police asks that you respect the family's privacy at this time. We also ask for your prayers for Trooper Jeffries, his family, his friends as well as the entire OSP family.

Update on Critically Injured OSP Trooper, Hwy. 30

It has been almost a week since Veterans Day, the day Oregon State Police Trooper John Jeffries was critically injured after being struck by a vehicle while protecting his community. During the past six days, Trooper Jeffries has been receiving excellent care from his medical team at Legacy Emmanuel Medical Center in Portland. As a result of the severity of John's injuries, it will take additional time for his medical team to determine the extent of those injuries and his prognosis for recovery. OSP Troopers seize Cocaine, Heroin, and pills and more

On October 31, 2021, at about 10:30 A.M., an Oregon State Police Trooper stopped a black Chevy Camaro on Interstate 5 northbound near milepost 174 for

a traffic violation. During the contact, the Trooper observed signs of criminal activity, and a probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted. During the search, approximately 7 pounds of Cocaine, 9.8 pounds of Heroin, and 1315 grams of pills, believed to contain Fentanyl, were located inside the vehicle. An Oregon State Police drug detection K-9 assisted during the investigation. The driver, identified as Timoteo Salomon Evora-Vigil, (21), from Gilroy, CA was arrested for Unlawful Delivery and Possession of Cocaine, Heroin, and a Schedule II Controlled Substance.

Steals Vehicle at Gunpoint

The Lane County Sheriff's Office is searching for the suspect in a carjacking incident that occurred overnight in the 77000blk of Mosby Creek Rd. Just before midnight Friday morning, a citizen reported that he went to check on the occupant of a crashed vehicle. The driver of the crashed vehicle pointed a black gun at the citizen and stole the citizen's blue 2005 Dodge Dakota pickup (pictured). Shot his Wife

Eugene at about 12:16pm near the Dollar General store on River Rd. Both robbery suspects were present and taken into custody without incident. The suspects were identified as 23 year old Cruz Sanchez and 19 year old Priscilla Luna. Sanchez faces charges including Robbery in the 1st Degree, Menacing, Assault in the 2nd Degree, Unlawful Use of a Weapon, Felon in Possession of a Firearm, Theft in the 2nd Degree, and Criminal Mischief in the 3rd Degree. Luna will be charged with Robbery in the 1st Degree and Theft in the 2nd Degree. They were both lodged at the Lane County Jail.

Oregon hunters raising the stakes on poachers

SALEM, Ore. — Poachers are busy day and night in Oregon. Three cases around Halloween have OSP Troopers asking the public for information on these incidents, while Oregon hunters raise reward amounts to \$3,500 for those who do. Troopers discovered all three poaching scenes after alert members of the community reported hearing shots fired or finding a carcass. The Oregon Hunters Association (OHA) is offering \$500 for reports that lead to an arrest or citation in the deer case, and \$1,500 for each of the elk cases. Or reporters can opt for four ODFW hunter preference points instead of cash. On Oct. 30, a member of the public called 911 to report someone was shooting at a deer from Interstate 5, in Douglas County, near the crest of Roberts Mountain. The incident happened on the east side of the freeway, at about 5:00 p.m. The man then pulled over, retrieved the deer, put it in his truck, and left the scene traveling northbound on I-5 about 15 minutes later. Troopers were able to retrieve a photo of his pickup and would like to hear

from anyone who might know the driver. It is a newer model burgundy or maroon GMC Sierra (or similar model) 4-door truck with black rims and a black step bar. The truck left the area northbound on I-5 at about 5:15 p.m. The reward for information that leads to an arrest or citation stands at \$500 from OHA or four ODFW hunter preference points. On Oct. 28, around 2:30 a.m. neighbors in the Fernhill Road area in Columbia County heard shots fired. They reported the incident to OSP. The following morning troopers located a bull elk that had been shot on private property and left to waste in a field near

Fernhill Road and Cook Road. The carcass was located about fifty yards from Fernhill Road. The reward for information that leads to an arrest or citation stands at \$1500 from the OHA Columbia and Tualatin Valley chapters or four ODFW hunter preference points. On Oct. 23, a bull elk shot near Mist. Troopers located what was left of a bull elk carcass, near Lane Creek Mainline off the Columbia River Mainline. They estimate the elk had been poached between Oct. 22 and the morning of Oct 23. The incident occurred near milepost 21 on a Weyerhaeuser drive-in permit area in Columbia County. Four quarters of meat were taken but the rest was left to waste. The reward for information that leads to an arrest or citation stands at \$1500 from the OHA Columbia and Tualatin Valley chapters or four ODFW hunter preference points. In 2020, OHA distributed more than \$20,000 in rewards from the Turn In Poachers (TIP) fund. ODFW gave out 135 hunter preference points for those who preferred hunting opportunity over financial reward. "We rely on members of the public to call the TIP Line if they see or suspect illegal activities," she said, "We have a better chance of catching poachers when law enforcement and the general public work as a team. We thank the members of the public who called OSP when they heard shooting and urge anyone with more information to step forward and provide information on these cases." There are 128 Fish and Wildlife troopers across the state; not nearly enough to patrol more than 90,000 square miles of Oregon land, as well as inland and marine waterways. OHA Vice President Steve Hagan is enthusiastic about the move to increase reward amounts. "We want to catch these guys," he said. "Columbia County and Tualatin Valley chapters are contributing \$1,000 each for these two elk to try to catch whoever did this." This campaign is a collaboration among hunters, conservationists, landowners, and recreationists. Our goal is to increase reporting of wildlife crimes through the TIP Line, increase detection by increasing the number of OSP Fish and Wildlife Troopers and increase prosecution. Oregon Hunters Association manages the TIP Fund. This campaign helps to protect and enhance Oregon's fish and wildlife and their habitat for the enjoyment of present and future generations.
