Stabbing Assault

A 20-year old male was arrested Wednesday, Dec. 1, about 9:45 p.m. on the charge of Assault in the First Degree following a reported stabbing at South 11th St. & Lockhart Ave. in Coos Bay. According to a news release from the Coos Bay Police Department, officers “responded to a report of a fight near the intersection of South 11th Street and Lockhart Avenue. The investigation revealed a fight broke out near the intersection that resulted in one person being stabbed. That person was treated at Bay Area Hospital for their injuries, which were not considered life threatening. The suspect, 20-year old Trevor Badial of Coos Bay, was located on Dec. 2nd. Badial was lodged at the Coos County Jail on the charge of Assault in the First Degree.” The investigation is on-going.

NB Male killed in Hwy. 213 Fatal, Clackamas Co.

On Saturday, December 4, 2021 at about 10:23PM, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to the report of a fatal motor vehicle collision involving a pedestrian on Hwy 213 near SE Otty Road. Preliminary investigation revealed a southbound Dodge Caravan, operated by Kendal Elizabeth Conley (50) of Milwaukie, struck a pedestrian, James Ross Barclay (67) of North Bend. Barclay sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. Conley was uninjured. Conley was arrested on charges of DUII and Criminally Negligent Homicide. Hwy 213 was closed for 3 hours.

Reported Bank Robbery

CBPD release - On 12/07/2021, at 1009hrs, the Coos Bay Police Department dispatch center received a call reporting a robbery at the U.S. Bank located at 400 Anderson Ave. Shortly after, the suspect, identified as 76-year-old Richard Freske, walked into the lobby of the Coos Bay Police Department to turn himself in. Coos Bay Officers were able to take Freske into custody without incident. During the course of the investigation, after reviewing state statute, and consulting with the Coos County District Attorney’s Office, it was determined that Freske had actually committed the crime of Disorderly Conduct in the second degree. Further, it was determined that Freske was dealing with mental health and other resource related issues. Ultimately, the Coos Bay Police Department contacted Mental Health Response Team and employed the services of the CBPD Community Resource Officer to determine the best location to take Freske as lodging at the Coos County Jail was not an available resource due to the level of crime committed. Freske was cited for Disorderly Conduct II.

Criminal Mischief

CBPD release - On 12/09/2021, at approximately 0715hrs, the Coos Bay Police Department dispatch center received a call of a male throwing trash into the roadway in the 600 block of Newmark Ave. A second call was received shortly after explaining that the male, later identified as 34-year-old Antonio Alamillamejia, had since broken one of the windows to the CCAT bus stop at that location. As officers arrived, Alamillamejia was in the process of breaking the glass front door of the Star of Hope, located at 657 Newmark Ave. Officers were able to take Alamillamejia into custody without incident. During the course of the investigation officers determined that Alamillamejia had

caused thousands of dollars in damage and committed the crimes of Criminal Mischief I, Criminal Mischief II, Offensive Littering, and Disorderly Conduct II. Officers requested the assistance of the Coos Bay Streets Department, CCAT, and Star of Hope staff to clean up the mess Alamillamejia had created. Alamillamejia was cited and released for the above listed crimes as lodging at the Coos County Jail was not available.

Bachelor Inn Fire

An early morning fire Tuesday, Dec. 14, gutted the insides of the Bachelor Inn Strip Club south of Coos Bay. Firefighters responded about 6 a.m. to the fire a block off Hwy. 101 in the Bunker Hill District of the Bay Area. Coos Bay Fire Chief Mark Anderson reported the building was engulfed in flames when they arrived. Assisting Coos Bay in fighting the fire were North Bend Fire Dept, Coquille Fire Dept. and Millington Rural Fire Dept. The Coos River Hwy. was closed while firefighters worked the fire. Eastside traffic was detoured down Olive Barber Road to Sumner Road and then north again on Hwy. 101.

Dr. Craig Jackson Homicide Reward

NBPD release - Wednesday, December 08, 2021 - The family of Dr. Craig Jackson is offering a reward in the amount of \$10,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of Dr. Craig Jackson of North Bend, on or about August 02, 2021. Anyone with knowledge concerning those responsible for Dr. Jackson’s death is encouraged to contact Coos Stop Crime at (541) 267-6666.

Robbery Suspect Arrested

CBPD release - On December 17, 2021 at approximately 1:59 a.m. Coos Bay Officers were dispatched to what was

reported as an armed robbery and burglary at a residence in the Empire Area of Coos Bay. The reporting party stated the male suspect forced his way into the home and threatened him with a firearm. He stated the male suspect demanded several items from him and then fled. The reporting person was familiar with the suspect and provided police with a description, as well as the name Ryan Nicholas. Officers from the Coos Bay Police Department as well as officers and deputies from the entire Coos County area began looking for the suspect. A Coos Bay Police Department K-9 Unit was deployed as well. Just after 3:00 a.m. North Bend Police Department located Nicholas, after it was reported that he had been involved in another robbery in the city limits of North Bend. Nicholas, a 30-year-old Coos Bay resident, was taken into custody and transported to Coos County Jail. He was charged with Robbery in the second degree and Burglary in the first degree. City of NB Authorizes Transfer of 9-1-1 Dispatch Services to Coos Bay

City of North Bend release - Citing critical staffing shortages and public safety concerns, Police Chief Gary McCullough and Fire Chief Jim Brown requested and received approval from the North Bend City Council to move forward with a proposal to transfer dispatch services to Coos Bay. Most North Benders are unaware there are only two Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) locations in Coos County that answer all 9-1-1 calls. One is at the Coos County Sheriff's Office in Coquille, the other at the Coos Bay Police Department. When callers in North Bend call 9-1-1, their calls are answered in Coquille, then depending on the type of emergency (e.g., police, fire, medical, etc.) are transferred to North Bend Police or another agency. There is a nationwide shortage of telecommunicators, which require state certification and between five and nine months of on-the-job training before they can dispatch solo. North Bend only has a single certified dispatcher per shift. Despite having top-notch staff, a single dispatcher cannot handle the volume of calls, radio traffic, multi-agency coordination efforts during significant emergency events. Coos Bay operates with as many as five dispatchers per shift and already dispatches multiple agencies, including the City of Coquille and Tribal Police. North Bend has evaluated nearly

NBPD Review

City of North Bend release - During Monday's North Bend City Council Work Session, Interim Police Chief Gary McCullough and Captain Cal Mitts gave a detailed progress update of the department since taking the helm in mid-October. Based on their presentation, the City Council agreed to withdraw its request for the City Administrator to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a 360-review of the police department. Based on the Chief's recommendations, the Council instead authorized the City Administrator to engage with the Oregon Association of Chiefs of Police and utilize its Agency Review Program to provide a professional review of North Bend police operations and management systems, using recognized law enforcement best practice standards. The City Council also authorized movement on an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) for Portland State University to conduct a compensation study and analysis of similar-sized agencies in Oregon, including associated incentives and benefits. Stolen Motorcycle Recovered

CBPD release - On 12/12/2021, at ap-

proximately 5:12 p.m., an officer from the Coos Bay Police Department observed a male, later identified as 22-year-old Trevar Reed, operating a dirt bike on the roadway on Southwest Blvd. Shortly after, the officer located Reed and the motorcycle on S. 17th St. and made contact. During the course of the contact and the subsequent investigation, it was learned that Reed was on parole, he had a suspended license, and the dirt bike had been reported stolen several weeks earlier to the North Bend Police Department. Ultimately, Reed was taken into custody for Parole Violation but lodging at the Coos County Jail was not available. Reed was cited for the suspended license and referred to the Coos County District Attorney for the Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle and Reed was released. The owner of the motorcycle was notified that his motorcycle was recovered.

126W Fatal Arrest

On 12-22-2021, the Oregon State Police arrested Shane Tyler McVay for Manslaughter 1, DUII and Recklessly Endangering. The charges resulted from the September 20, 2021 crash that resulted in the death of Emily Susman. McVay was lodged in the Lane County Jail.

Original release - On Monday, September 20, 2021 at approximately 7:14 AM, Oregon State Troopers and emergency

personnel responded to a four-vehicle crash on Hwy 126W near milepost 37. Preliminary investigation revealed a Kenworth log truck, operated by Shane McVay (64) of Eugene, was eastbound when the loaded trailer tipped over. The trailer struck a westbound Toyota Prius, operated by Sarah Susman (25) of Springfield and a Dodge Ram towing a boat, operated by Randall Tokich (70) of Eugene. The Dodge Ram then struck an eastbound Ford Mustang, operated by **Jordyn Tippett (20) of Coquille**. Susman sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. McVay and Tippett were transported to Sacred Heart Medical Center at Riverbend with injuries. Tokich had minor injuries.

Hwy. 242 Fatal, Coos Co.

On Thursday, December 23, 2021 at approximately 4:47AM, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a single vehicle crash on Hwy 242 at milepost 1. Preliminary investigation revealed a southbound silver Mazda MZ7, operated by a 16-year-old female of Broadbent, left the roadway and struck a tree. The crash is under investigation. The juvenile driver was transported to Coquille Valley Hospital and later life-flighted to Riverbend Hospital in Eugene by the U.S. Coastguard with serious injuries. Her 15-year-old female passenger sustained fatal injuries

Oregon Coast

Van Duzer Child Identified, Arrests Made

On December 10, 2020, Detectives from the Oregon State Police Major Crimes section responded to the H.B. Van Duzer Scenic Corridor in Lincoln County, Oregon, for the report of human remains discovered just outside the rest area. An individual walking in the area discovered the remains of a female child, concealed inside a duffel bag, then hidden in the forest. Based on the level of decomposition, it appeared she had been deceased between 30-60 days before her discovery. Investigators and experts at the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office, collected samples from the child's remains for DNA testing by a specialty DNA laboratory. Parabon Nano Labs extracted DNA from the samples submitted, and on October 4, 2021, notified OSP investigators they identified the deceased child. The deceased was identified as Haley Mae Co-blentz. She was nine years old at the time of her death. Haley was born in Colorado. She was living with her biological mother and mother's girlfriend in multiple places in Oregon and the Pacific Northwest since 2015. She was not reported as a missing person at the time of her death. On November 30, 2021, with the assistance of the Detroit FBI, OSP Investigators located Haley's mother, 29-year-old Shawna Browning, and 34-year-old Lauren Harrison in Detroit, Michigan. Investigators arrested Browning and Harrison and served a search warrant on their vehicle and hotel room. Browning and Harrison were arrested on a Lincoln County, Oregon warrant and charged with: Aggravated Murder ORS 163.095. Browning and Harrison were lodged in detention facilities in Wayne County, Michigan, and are being held without bail.

Storming the Capitol

A Bandon male wasn't the only Oregon Coast resident to participate in the storming of the U.S. Capitol on Jan. 6, 2021. Forty-six year old Jeffrey William Hubbard, of Lincoln City, was identified off surveillance video climbing through a window of the Capitol next to the Senate wing door and chanting "Stop the Steal" and "We Want Trump." Hubbard was arrested at his home Wednesday, Dec. 8, and appeared in U.S. District Court, Portland, that afternoon. He's accused of entering and

remaining in a restricted building or grounds, disorderly conduct in a Capital building, parading or demonstrating in a Capitol Building. He is the fifth person from Oregon and one of nearly 675 to face federal charges following the insurrection. Hubbard was released pending trial.

Tillamook Male Sentenced on Stolen Firearm Charges

PORTLAND, Ore.—A Tillamook, Oregon man was sentenced to federal prison today for stealing 15 firearms from a sporting goods store in Tillamook while on post-prison supervision. Robert Jon Gilliam, 52, was sentenced to 60 months in federal prison and three years' supervised release. Gilliam was also ordered to pay \$8,892 in restitution the insurance company who covered the sporting goods store's losses. According to court documents, in the early morning hours of May 8, 2020, Tillamook Police Department officers responded to a burglary at Tillamook Sporting Goods, a federal firearm licensee. A male caller saw a male run from the store, get into a green Subaru driven by a female, and drive away. A short time later, the female drove back into the parking lot and parked, but the male passenger was not in the care. The caller then watched as the male ran from the front of the store, again jumped into the vehicle, and drove away. On scene, police found the front glass doors of the store and several glass firearm display cases inside the store shattered. Officers observed blood near the broken glass and collected it for analysis. The store's surveillance video was not operable during the time of the burglary and the store's alarm was not triggered until police were in the building. On June 4, 2020, Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies recovered one of the stolen firearms while executing a search warrant. Three days later, on June 7, 2020, investigators exe-

cuted a search warrant on Gilliam's Tillamook residence. Officers observed

a green Subaru parked outside with dried blood on the inside of the front passenger door and on the car's exterior. Investigators submitted the blood sample from the store to the Oregon State Police Crime Lab. Forensic scientists matched

the sample to a known blood sample taken from Gilliam. On October 6, 2020, a federal grand jury in Portland returned a two-count indictment charging Gilliam with stealing firearms from a federal firearms licensee and illegally possessing a firearm as a convicted felon. On July 2, 2021, Gilliam pleaded guilty to both charges.

OSP, ODFW & USCG Team Up on Commercial Illegal Crab Take Case

OSP release - On Monday, December 6, 2021, an ODFW biologist was sampling commercially caught Dungeness crab at a seafood processing plant in Warrenton when they noticed numerous undersized crabs from one boat. The boat made a landing of 46,071 pounds of Dungeness crab, and the biologist's samples suggested there was a large quantity of undersized crab in the offload. Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife Troopers, along with 14 members of the United States Coast Guard Sector Columbia River, responded to the fish plant and started measuring the crab. In total, 11,778 pounds of crab were measured of

which 2,682 pounds (over 22%) of the sampled crab were determined to be undersized. The value for the crab at the time of landing was \$4.75 a pound, which would make the estimated value of undersized crab in this delivery to be over \$49,000. In addition to not being allowed to retain female crab, the commercial size for the taking of male Dungeness crab in Oregon is 6 ¼ inches and has been that size since 1948. The prohibition on the taking of female and undersized male crabs is a key strategy to maintain the sustainability of the Dungeness crab fishery. ODFW Marine Resources Program Manager Caren Braby said, "The sustainability of the Dungeness crab fishery is a point of pride and management success in Oregon. Intentional or neglectful harvest of small crabs is damaging to Oregon's sustainability brand, takes future crab from legal harvesters, and leads to irresponsible wastage of crab. We commend the efforts of the OSP and USCG to address this violation of fishery regulations and make clear that short crab brought in through the fishery will not be tolerated." The captain of the crab boat was cited and released criminally for Taking Undersized Commercial Dungeness Crab. In addition to being charged criminally, the captain can be assessed restitution for the damages associated with the taking of the undersized crab which can be up to twice the average market value. USCG Maritime Enforcement Specialist First Class Robert Grigsby said "Last week's operation with US Coast Guard Sector Columbia River Enforcement Department and Oregon

State Police, Fish and Wildlife Division, highlighted the opportunities where state and federal law enforcement entities can work together as a force multiplier towards the enforcement of state fisheries on the Oregon Coast. Working hand and hand with the OSP sends a bright signal to the crab fleet, that we are willing and able to help each other for the enforcement of laws that enable the sustainment of a fishery critical to the Oregon economy." Lieutenant Ryan Howell of the Oregon State Police added, "Without the willingness of the USCG members to jump in and assist, it would have taken a significant number of additional Troopers from other patrol areas to sample this offload. The Oregon State Police is extremely appreciative of all the support the USCG provides up and down the Oregon coast, especially as it relates to the enforcement efforts towards our commercial fisheries."

Hwy. 101 Fatal, Clatsop Co.

On Saturday, December 18th, 2021 at about 6:11 PM, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to the report of a bicyclist hit by a vehicle on Hwy 101 near milepost 25. Preliminary investigation revealed Jesse Holmes (34) of Seaside, was traveling northbound in a gray Nissan Frontier when he failed to drive within his lane and struck a bicyclist, Zane Belshe (59) of Seaside, who was riding on the northbound shoulder. Belshe sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased at the scene. Highway 101 was closed for 4.5 hours following the crash.

Death Investigation on Capsized Vessel, Newport

On Friday, December 17, 2021 at approximately 9:50 AM, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel from the United States Coast Guard, Newport Fire Department, Newport Police Department and Pacific West Ambulance responded to a report of a capsized boat near Nye Beach in Lincoln County. Preliminary investigation revealed a 22-foot C-Dory was returning to port and capsized when it was struck by a breaking wave near the north reefs. The U.S. Coast Guard was able to recover three subjects from the water. They have been identified as Milton Bridges (60), Laura Bridges (59) and Cory Thompson (55) all of Mill City, OR. All three were transported to Good Samaritan Hospital. Thompson was pronounced deceased at the hospital.

Road Rage Central Coast

On December 13, 2021 at approximately 3:52PM, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a road rage incident on Hwy 101 in Depoe Bay near milepost 128. Preliminary investigation revealed a road rage incident was occurring between a white Chevy S10 pickup and a silver Honda. The incident culminated with the 64-year-old male operator of the Chevy pickup being struck by the Honda while standing outside of his pickup. He sustained serious injuries and was transported to Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital in Lincoln City. The suspect vehicle is believed to be a 2008-2015 silver Honda, possibly Accord. During the incident, it is believed to have sustained

damage to the passenger sideview mirror and potentially has damage to the hood. OSP is seeking witnesses to identify the vehicle and suspect involved. Seafood Processor Cited

A North Coast seafood processor was cited by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) for allegedly discharging wastewater into the Columbia River at Astoria. According to a DEQ release, Da Yang Seafood was fined \$105,000 for 32 violations between June 2018 and June 2021 at the company's facility on Pier 2 at the Port of Astoria. The processor was also fined in 2015 for discharging wastewater into Youngs Bay, and 2017 for discharging wastewater into the Columbia River.

West Coast Shark Attack

A 31-year old male was killed Friday morning, Dec. 24th following a shark attack off the coast of Morro Bay, CA. The victim was believed to be a bodyboarder. It's the first shark-related death in San Luis Obispo County in 18-years.

Quick action by a resident on Rhododendron Drive in Florence is being credited with saving the life of a female found floating in the Siuslaw River Dec. 23. According to a report, the U.S. Coast Guard Station Siuslaw River responded with a Ready Crew and located the individual struggling to stay afloat in the frigid waters. She was transported to the Coast Guard Station where EMTs took over and transported her to Peace Health Hospital.

Couple Thankful for Curry Co. SAR

A couple who spent the night in the cold-wet woods of Southern Curry Co. Dec. 21st, admitted to Search & Rescue personnel that they most likely would not have made it another night if not for volunteers who located them up steep-bushy terrain near the Winchuck River, east of Brookings. Fifty-six year old David Scoma and 54-year old Carrie Mullen went hiking the day before, but got lost in the woods. During a 9-1-1 cell phone call from Scoma to Curry Co. Sheriff's dispatch, an operator was able to get a general GPS location, but then call dropped. The couple's vehicle was located along side Peavine Road. SAR deployed about 1:30 p.m. An hour the two were located. Emergency personnel assessed them at the site , but they refused additional medical help and returned to their vehicle.

Salt was awarded the Angels of the Battlefield Award for helping save the lives of two hikers on Oregon's snow-covered Grayback Mountain in January 2021 by spending more than 12 hours tending to a severely injured hiker, and another hiker, until the pair could be rescued by the National Guard. Watch AST1 Salt's award presentation here: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=K0uVQyEHLml> Qual received the AFRAS Gold Medal Award for leading an early-morning September rescue for the master of the 44-foot fishing vessel Legend after the boat aground near the Yaquina Bay channel entrance near Newport, Oregon. Realizing that no rescue helicopters or boats were available due to on-scene conditions of 60 to 70-knot winds and less than 200 yards visibility, Qual dressed in full search and rescue gear, including an additional 20 pounds of rescue equipment, and led a Coast Guard beach rescue team in running approximately two miles down the beach to help the fisherman in distress. Battling high surf, wind-driven sand and hurricane force wind gusts, Qual finally succeeded in reaching the master. The beach rescue team was then able to pull Qual, with the master in tow, to shore using the swimmer tending line. Coast Guard cites fishing vessel operator for negligence on Columbia River, OR, navigation channel

ASTORIA, Ore. — The Coast Guard issued a Notice of Violation to the owner and master aboard a 48-foot commercial fishing vessel for negligence while operating in conditions of restricted visibility and a failure to maintain a proper lookout Monday in the vicinity of Buoy No. 8 of the Columbia River navigation channel. The commercial fishing vessel was operating outbound on the Oregon side of the Columbia River navigation channel as the 587-foot motor vessel Grand Race, a Ro-Ro cargo ship, was transiting inbound, also in the vicinity of Buoy No. 8. The commercial fishing vessel, without providing notice or sound signal to the inbound Grand Race, adjusted course to move to the Washington side of the channel; and, in doing so, cut across the bow of the Grand Race, creating serious risk of collision. This is an evident violation of Navigation Rule

9, pertaining to the safe and proper navigation of channels and fairways. Navigation Rule 9 states that vessels proceeding along a navigation channel shall keep as near to the outer limit of the channel which lies on the vessels starboard side and which also prohibits vessels from crossing a navigation channel if such crossing impedes the passage of a vessel which can safely navigate only within the channel. Upon determining the risk of collision, the pilot aboard the Grand Race repeatedly hailed the commercial fishing vessel on VHF-FM radio channels 13 and 16 and sounded the danger signal with no response from the commercial fishing vessel. This is an evident violation of Navigation Rule 5, pertaining to the master's responsibility to maintain a proper look-out by sight, hearing, and all available means. As a final measure to avoid collision, the pilot aboard Grand Race hailed the harbor pilot vessel Astoria for assistance. The Astoria was only able to establish communication and warn the commercial fishing vessel of the impending danger by shining a spot light directly on the vessel, gaining due attention resulting in the commercial fishing vessel altering course and avoiding collision. Navigation Rule 5 states that every vessel shall at all times maintain a proper look-out by sight and hearing as well as by "all available means". "All available means"

includes the effective use of available instruments and equipment, in addition to the use of both sight and hearing. This applies to information received by VHF from other ships. The recommended minimum penalty for a first offense of a commercial vessel operating or interfering with operations of a commercial vessel in a negligent manner that endangers life, limb, or property of a person is \$5,000. The maximum penalty for these violations is \$35,486. "In addition to the Dungeness crab fishery being the most valuable single-species fishery off the coasts of Oregon and Washington, it is also the most dangerous," said Lt. Carl Eschler, chief of the investigations division at Coast Guard Marine Safety Unit Portland. "Fishermen haven't even started pulling pots and retrieving their catch, and we have already had a near miss that could have resulted in multiple casualties. No matter how long you have been fishing, please don't get complacent. Maintain a proper lookout, monitor channel 16, and notify the Coast Guard as required prior to crossing a hazardous bar. The Coast Guard is here to assist, and given the choice, would much rather provide information to a vessel operator unfamiliar with local bar conditions or provide an escort across a hazardous bar than respond to a vessel in distress. The issuance of a civil penalty is one way for the Coast Guard to compel compliance and help to save lives." Coast Guard conducts numerous safety escorts, vessel tows during first week of Dungeness crab season

USCG release - SEATTLE — Coast Guard crews across the Pacific Northwest have towed 10 disabled or distressed commercial fishing vessels back to port in the first week of the Dungeness crab season which began Dec. 1. These tow operations, along with numerous safety escorts, have ensured the safe passage of several fishing crews and more than 100,000 pounds of crab, through hazardous bar conditions. Coast Guard crews stationed in Grays Harbor, Cape Disappointment, Coos Bay, and Chetco River, have contributed to the total of 10 tows. Other vessels have also been escorted across the bar. These safety escorts are conducted when dictated by hazardous conditions. The start of the Dungeness crab season has coincided with several bar restrictions as a result of rough conditions encountered at the bar. When a bar restriction is in place, the operation of recreational and uninspected passenger vessels of the length specified in the restriction is PROHIBITED unless specifically authorized by the Coast Guard. In the event that a commercial fisherman intends to cross a bar while hazardous conditions exist, the Coast Guard recommends following at a minimum the safety checklist items below and requires that commercial fisherman adhere to additional regulations while bar restrictions are in place (33 CFR 165.1196

and 165.1325). Check current bar conditions, weather forecasts, and tides tables; Check bar restrictions and notify the Coast Guard if intending to cross the bar if vessel length is less than the restriction length; DO NOT CROSS if a Captain of the Port (COTP) closure is in effect; If crossing a restricted bar after sunset and before sunrise, commercial fisherman MUST notify the Coast Guard. Notifications shall include: Vessel name; Vessel location; Number of persons on board; destination (inbound, outbound, etc.); Vessel limitations (steering, propulsion, etc.); Discuss escort options with the Coast Guard if necessary; Complete thorough inspection of spaces and ensure all doors and hatches are secure. Secure all loose gear on deck. After crossing the bar: Account for all personnel aboard the vessel; Report safe crossing to the Coast Guard; Commercial fisherman are required to wear personal flotation devices or immersion suits if on deck while crossing the bar during active bar restrictions. The use of a personal floatation is recommended at all times while on deck. If mariners are operating within closed spaces aboard a vessel, personal flotation devices must be readily available. "Coast Guard rescue personnel continue to put in long hours working in hazardous conditions to ensure the safety of the commercial fishing fleet," said Lt. Carl Eschler, chief investigations officer at Marine Safety Unit - Portland. "Although commercial fishing vessels are not prohibited from crossing a restricted bar, it should be noted that Coast Guard personnel stationed along the coast have used their professional maritime experience and knowledge of local

environmental conditions to place restrictions on the bar by determining that unsafe conditions exist."

USCG Rescue Deception Pass

SEATTLE – The Coast Guard and multiple local responders rescued more than 20 people from the water in Deception Pass Saturday morning during a scheduled marine event organized by a local paddlecraft organization. At approximately 9:30 a.m. Saturday, multiple reports of distress alerted 13th Coast Guard District watchstanders to several kayak and paddlecraft users capsized during The Deception Pass Challenge, a paddling and rowing race through Deception Pass. It was reported that 75 people were participating in the race, and it was estimated that 15-20 people were in the water due to high winds during the event. Additionally, it was reported that many participants were in need of assistance getting back to shore. The Coast Guard Cutter Adelle and crew, an 87-foot patrol boat, was already on scene and other nearby Coast Guard rescue units responded by air and sea, including Coast Guard Station Bellingham, the crew aboard the Coast Guard Cutter Sea Lion, also an 87-foot patrol boat, and a helicopter crew from Coast Guard Air Station Port Angeles. Additionally, a Skagit County Marine unit and two North Whidbey Fire Marine Rescue units also responded to the distress. Once on scene, the Adelle crew recovered five people from the water and assisted 20 kayakers to safety. The Sea Lion crew recovered two people from the water and assisted 10 kayakers to safety. On-scene rescue units contin-

ued to search for people in distress until the event's coordinator accounted for all participants. "This incident highlights the outstanding interagency teamwork we have here in the greater Puget Sound's search and rescue system," said Capt. Patrick Hilbert, the commander of Coast Guard Sector Puget Sound. "It also reinforces the importance of wearing a life jacket and constantly assessing the increased risks posed by the weather and water conditions that are always changing here in the Pacific Northwest." Always check and monitor the marine weather forecast before any trip out on the water. High winds and increasing seas are good reasons to postpone being out on the water. No injuries or casualties were reported from the event.

Capsizing off Central Coast

Two were rescued another died during a capsizing off the Central Oregon Coast Friday, Dec. 17. According to a report from the U.S Coast Guard, the 22-foot long boat capsized about one mile north of the Yaquina Bay jetty at Newport. A male and female were rescued from the cold waters, but a third individual, a male, was unresponsive and declared deceased when brought to shore.

USCG Helps Locate Missing Hikers

NORTH BEND, Ore. -- A Coast Guard Sector North Bend MH-65 Dolphin rescue helicopter crew assisted the Lane County Sheriff's Department in locating two 19-year-old males Saturday, Jan. 1 reported missing after hiking near Swastika Mountain about 32 miles east south-east of Eugene. Watchstanders at the Sector North Bend command center received an agency assistance request from the Oregon Office of Emergency Management that two individuals went camping on the mountain on or around Christmas Day and did not return from their trip on Wednesday, Dec. 29. Lane County sheriffs dispatched ground parties to search after receiving a report that two hikers went missing on New Year's Eve. Due to recent heavy snowfall in the area covering the mountain roads, Lane County requested Coast Guard helicopter support in locating the individuals. The MH-65 aircrew hoisted the

two men and transferred them to awaiting Lane County sheriffs at Eugene Airport. During the search for the two men, the aircrew identified two additional persons in distress and passed their position to Lane County, who believed they were within range of their land party. The two hikers reported no medical concerns. "These young men did a lot of things right to give themselves the best chance of being rescued," said Lt. Maggie Champin, MH-65 aircraft commander, Sector North Bend. "By writing 'SOS' in the snow, staying near their vehicle and staying near logging roads, we were able to find them relatively quickly. We recommend hikers carry personal locator beacons while out in the back country."

were able to establish probable cause for the arrest of 65 year old Norbert Huntley for 2 counts of Unlawful Delivery of Heroin, based on activities that were taking place at the residence. On Thursday, December 2nd, at approximately 5:30 PM, detectives culminated the investigation with a traffic stop of Huntley on Interstate 5 near Yoncalla. Drug detection K-9 "Trapper" was allowed to check the exterior of the vehicle and he alerted to the presence of narcotics inside. Shooting on Hwy. 38, West of Drain

Officers learned a male had been struck by a bullet while driving on Hwy 38, west of Drain. Meth & Heroin Bust Douglas Co.

On Saturday, December 4th, at approximately 2:00 AM, detectives with the Douglas Interagency Narcotics Team (DINT) intercepted a large shipment of methamphetamine coming into our community. A traffic stop was initiated on a vehicle at milepost 98 on Interstate 5 northbound, returning from California. DINT detectives had reason to believe the vehicle contained large amount of narcotics, and a roadside search was conducted, revealing approximately 3.5 pounds of suspected methamphetamine, 21.4 grams of suspected heroin, and small amounts of suspected LSD and fentanyl. The driver of the vehicle, 37 year old Rodger Akins of Roseburg, was arrested and lodged at the Douglas County Jail on charges of Unlawful Possession and Delivery of Methamphetamine, and Unlawful Possession of Heroin.

Douglas Co. Drug Dealer Sentenced to Federal Prison

EUGENE, Ore.—A Winston, Oregon man was sentenced to federal prison today for possession with intent to distribute methamphetamine, which he had been selling in and around Douglas County, Oregon. Steven Dwayne Lander, 60, was sentenced to 120 months in federal prison and five years' supervised release. According to court documents, over the course of several months, the Douglas County Interagency

Narcotics Team (DINT) and the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) investigated Lander and his drug dealing in Douglas County. Following extensive surveillance, arrests of his customers and associates, and the monitoring of his movements, investigators executed multiple search warrants on Lander and his properties. More than 15 pounds of methamphetamine and a half pound of heroin were seized from his storage unit, vehicle, and person. Lander has prior felony convictions for delivering and manufacturing controlled substances and illegally possessing a firearm as a convicted felon, and was previously sentenced to more than four years in prison. On November 8, 2019, Lander was charged by criminal complaint and he was indicted on November 20, 2019. On November 7, 2021, Lander pleaded guilty to possession with intent to distribute methamphetamine. Acting U.S. Attorney Scott Erik Asphaug of the District of Oregon made the announcement. This case was investigated by DEA and DINT. It was prosecuted by Jeffrey S. Sweet, Assistant U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon, in close coordination with Douglas County Senior Deputy District Attorney Allison D. Eichmann.

WINSTON, Ore. - A Roseburg woman died this morning in a single vehicle crash on Willis Creek Road near Winston. On Thursday, December 9, 2021, shortly after 8:00 am, 9-1-1 dispatchers received a report of a single vehicle crash in the 3400-block of Willis Creek Road. Deputies arrived on scene to find a 2000 GMC Envoy approximately 10' off of the eastbound shoulder. Fire and EMS on scene determined the female driver, 23-year-old Roseburg resident

Samantha Star Cole, had died at the scene. Deputies determined Cole had been traveling northbound on Willis Creek Road, when for an unknown reason, the vehicle went off of the roadway striking a tree. The crash remains under investigation and anyone with information is asked to contact the Sheriff's Office at (541) 440-4471 referencing case #21-5473. Next of kin has been notified.

Winston Male Arrested in Fatal Accident

WINSTON, Ore. - A Winston man has been arrested on charges related to the fatal vehicle crash that occurred on Willis Creek Road on Thursday, December 9, 2021. Preliminary indications were that Samantha Star Cole was the only occupant of the vehicle and was believed to be the driver. However, while conducting the follow up investigation, deputies and detectives received information that 32-year-old Andrew James Lott of Winston, may have been in the vehicle at the time of the crash. On Friday, December 10, 2021, detectives located and interviewed Lott at a residence on Willis Creek Road. During the interview, Lott admitted to driving the vehicle at the time of the crash, while Cole was a passenger. Lott stated he and Cole were involved in a disturbance when he took his hands off the steering wheel and reached over into the passenger compartment grabbing onto Cole. The vehicle left the roadway and struck a tree. Lott stated he crawled out of the vehicle and knew Cole was injured. Lott made no efforts to summon emergency help and hid nearby. Lott was arrested and lodged at the Douglas County Jail on the following charges: Criminally Negligent Homicide; Fail to Perform the Duties of a Driver to an Injured Person. Authorities are searching for 37 year old Jobee Baumgardner, 33 year old Renell Baumgardner, 14 year old Caleb Baumgardner, 6 year old Colton Baumgardner, and 14 year old Thomas Blanton. The group left the Springfield area yesterday at about 10:30am to go play in the snow. They planned to return by 8:00pm. They advised that they would likely go to the area of Hoodoo (near Santiam Pass on Hwy. 20) or Salt Creek Sno Park (near Willamette Pass on Hwy. 58). The group is believed to be traveling in a blue/gray 2018 Chevrolet Silverado pickup bearing OR Plate #475KVB. They are believed to have experience in the snow but were likely not intending to stay overnight. Searchers are working with cellular providers to try and narrow the search area. Killing of Bald Eagle

OSP Fish & Wildlife Troopers from the Springfield Area Command are seeking the public's assistance in the identification of a person(s) who are responsible for killing a Bald Eagle in the Junction City area. On November 30, 2021, a citizen reported finding a dead Bald Eagle in the Cox Butte area west of Junction City, Oregon. Bald Eagles and other raptors are protected in Oregon. They commonly inhabit the Willamette Valley and are an important part of the wildlife ecosystem. It is illegal to harass, injure or kill a Bald Eagle. The penalties for killing an eagle can be a maximum fine of \$6250.00 and a sentence of up to a year in jail. Additionally, upon conviction, the court can order the person who illegally kills a Bald Eagle to pay an additional \$5000.00 in damages. Hwy. 126W Fatal, Lane Co.

On Tuesday, December 14, 2021 at approximately 7:40 AM, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a two-vehicle crash on Hwy 126W at milepost 29. Preliminary investigation revealed a westbound Dodge Caravan, operated by Alfred Santos (62) of Eugene, collided head-on with an eastbound Toyota Camry, operated by Zakkary McCann (29) of Mapleton. McCann sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. A passenger in the Toyota Camry, Kussaundra Stevenson (25) of Mapleton, received minor injuries. Santos was transported to the hospital with serious injuries. Hwy 126W was closed for approximately 4 hours. OSP was assisted by Western Lane Ambulance, Lane County Sheriff's Office, Lane Fire Authority and ODOT.

OSP Seeks Witnesses

On Wednesday, December 15, 2021, Oregon State Police Troopers responded to assist Grand Ronde Tribal Police with a vehicle pursuit of a black Honda Civic eastbound on Hwy 18. The suspect was involved in a Theft and Unlawful Entry into a Motor Vehicle in Lincoln City. As Grand Ronde Police pursued the vehicle, the suspect attempted to run multiple officers off the road and drove into oncoming traffic. This reckless driving behavior ultimately caused Grand Ronde Tribal Police to terminate the pursuit. Oregon State Police Troopers, who had been staged at milepost 34 to assist with the pursuit, observed the suspect traveling at a high rate of speed. The suspect vehicle then veered into the westbound lane in order to pass a vehicle and collided head-on with a silver Honda Civic. Immediately following the crash, the suspect driver, identified later as William Hall (29) of Salem, fled on foot. Troopers pursued Hall who ran north towards Hwy 18B where Hall stopped a white SUV and attempted to enter the vehicle but was unable to do so. The foot pursuit continued, and Troopers were able to take Hall into custody without further incident a short distance further. Hall is facing multiple criminal charges including Assault III, Driving While Suspended-Felony, Felony Hit and Run, Attempt to Elude-Felony, Theft II, Theft III, and Unlawful Entry into a Motor Vehicle. Additional charges may be pending. Oregon State Police investigators are seeking witnesses to the crash and the driver of the vehicle Hall attempted to enter on Hwy 18B. Illegal Marijuana Grow in Union Co.

On December 16, 2021, Detectives from the Oregon State Police Drug Enforcement Section as well as Troopers and other area law enforcement executed a search warrant at a La Grande area storefront named Highway 30 Cannabis which is located at 1709 Adams Ave, La Grande, OR. Law enforcement also served a secondary search warrant at an address of 61074 Stackland Road in Cove, OR which is related to the storefront operation. This long-term investigation began after tips were called into law enforcement about the unlawful distribution of marijuana products from the business listed as Highway 30 Cannabis. Through multiple investigative techniques, law enforcement found that the business was not operating as a licensed dispensary through the State of Oregon. Investigators sought a search warrant for the crimes of Unlawful Possession of Marijuana, Unlawful Manufacturing of Marijuana Item, Unlawful

Delivery of Marijuana Item, Laundering a Monetary Instrument, and Engaging in a Financial Transaction in Property from Unlawful Activity. Multiple items of evidentiary value were seized during the search warrants and an investigation is ongoing at this time. No arrests were made at the time of the search warrant service, however, arrests and charges are anticipated at a later date and time. The Oregon State Police was assisted in the investigation by members of the La Grande Police Department, Baker City Police Department, and Homeland Security Investigations.

Hwy. 58 Fatal, Lane Co.

On Friday, December 17, 2021, James Cam Johnson IV (31) was arrested and lodged in the Lane County Jail in connection with a May 30, 2021 motor vehicle crash that resulted in a triple fatality. Johnson was charged with Manslaughter 2nd x 3, Assault 3rd, Assault 4th x 2, Criminal Mischief 2nd and DUII. was transported by air ambulance to the hospital with serious injuries. Cary was not transported but later went to the hospital for treatment. Johnson was transported to the hospital. Investigation is continuing and names will be released when appropriate.

Guilty Verdict in Southern Oregon Homicide/Arson

On January 16, 2019, the Illinois Valley Fire District and Arson Investigators from the Oregon State Police responded

to a residential fire at 150 E River Street in Cave Junction. Investigators found the deceased body of then, 66-year-old Donald M. Thomas in the burned residence. The Oregon State Police Criminal Division responded to investigate the death of Mr. Thomas. The investigation went cold until November 2019, when Clabelle Compton came forward. She provided a statement, naming all the individuals involved. On November 26, 2019, investigators located and interviewed the four suspects. The suspects were arrested for Arson, Burglary, and the Murder of Mr. Thomas. One of the suspects, Justin Mason (31), plead guilty and is currently serving his sentence. On December 14, 2021, the two-week trial ended, and the jury found Richard M. Webb (39) guilty on all four charges: Arson in the First Degree, Murder x 2, and Burglary in the First Degree. The other two suspects, Kenny Webb (37) and Dakota Crow (26) have trials set for next year.

Burglar Arrested, Lane Co.

Deputies responded to the Elmira area this morning in an attempt to locate the suspects in a burglary that occurred a few miles to the north. The suspects are believed to have stolen numerous items including power tools, a welder, and a chop saw before driving away in a flat-bed pickup. A Lane County Sheriff's

Deputy located the suspect vehicle as it drove through Veneta and turned towards Eugene. Deputies also learned that the suspect vehicle had been stolen from the Eugene area recently. Deputies coordinated with other responding units to prepare spike strips in the event the vehicle chose to flee. Once resources were in place, deputies attempted to initiate a traffic stop. The suspect vehicle fled but was quickly disabled by awaiting spike strips that had been deployed further up the road. The occupants, 34 year old Roger Dale Painter, and 52 year old Phillip Allen Nelson, were taken into custody without injury. In addition to the numerous other items of stolen property found in the vehicle, deputies located and recovered a 12-gauge shotgun that had also been taken in the burglary. Painter and Nelson were transported to the Lane County Jail. Painter was lodged on charges including: Burglary in the 2nd Degree, Theft in the 1st Degree, Reckless Driving, Reckless Endangering, Attempt to Elude by Vehicle, Possession of a Stolen Vehicle, Felon in Possession of a Firearm, and an unrelated arrest warrant. Nelson is not believed to have been directly involved in the burglary at this time. He was lodged at the Lane County Jail on an unrelated arrest warrant.
