### Avoiding Tax Season Fraud

IRS release - PORTLAND, Ore. – Each year, taxpayers’ personal information is compromised through phishing scams or by unscrupulous tax preparers. With tax season kicking off **Jan. 24**, IRS Criminal Investigation (IRS-CI) wants taxpayers to be aware of tax-related fraud. "In the midst of the pandemic that has greatly affected us all, there are those that are using it as an opportunity to illegally line their own pockets. IRS-CI is continually using all its resources at our disposal to protect the public from these fraudsters, but there are also things that you can do this filing season to protect your financial well-being," said Special Agent in Charge Bret Kressin, IRS-CI Seattle Field Office. "Now that tax season has begun, all taxpayers must be diligent in watching for signs of scams and fraud. Each year, dishonest tax preparers and others posing as financial "experts" take advantage of well-intentioned Americans looking to pay their taxes. Our office will continue partnering with IRS-CI to investigate these crimes and prosecute those responsible," said Scott Erik Asphaug, U.S. Attorney for the District of Oregon. Tips to avoid tax season fraud include: Choose a tax preparer wisely. Look for a preparer who is available year-round. Ask your tax preparer for their IRS Preparer Tax Identification Number (PTIN). All paid preparers are required to have one. Don't use a ghost preparer. They won't sign a tax return they prepare for you. Don't fall victim to tax preparers' promises of large refunds. Taxpayers must pay their fair share of taxes. Don't sign a blank tax return. Taxpayers are ultimately responsible for what appears on tax returns filed with the IRS. Make sure you receive your refund. Your refund should be deposited into your bank account, not your tax preparer's. The IRS will not

call you threatening legal action. If you receive a call like this, hang up. Don't respond to text messages, emails or social media posts claiming to be the IRS. They may contain malware that could compromise your personal information. Don't click links or open attachments in unsolicited emails or text messages about your tax return. These messages are fraudulent. Protect your personal and financial information. Never provide this information in response to unsolicited text messages, emails or social media posts claiming to be the IRS. The IRS Criminal Investigation Seattle Field Office is committed to protecting taxpayers from others cheating the U.S. tax system. Here are some examples of some of the most egregious criminals that have been recently investigated and brought to justice: Damian O. Barrett was sentenced to 54 months in federal prison for perpetrating a multi-year fraud scheme wherein he filed 745 false tax returns in 19 different states. Barrett used the names, social security numbers, and employer identification numbers of various individuals, some of whom were his clients, to submit these fraudulent returns. Elizabeth Munoz plead guilty for preparing and filing false fraudulent tax returns for clients and herself. Munoz advertised "Biggest Refund Guaranteed," using fraudulent tax schedules, tax credits, and filing statuses to carry out the refund fraud. Munoz faces a maximum sentence of three years in prison, a \$250,000 fine, and one-year term of supervised release. For more tips on choosing a tax professional or how to file a complaint against one, visit IRS.gov. Taxpayers who suspect tax violations by a person or business, may report it to the IRS using Form 3949A, Information Referral. Taxpayers can report phishing emails to phishing@irs.gov or IRS impersonation scams to TIGTA.gov. This year's tax season begins Monday, **Jan. 24** and con-

tinues through Monday, April 18 for most taxpayers. U.S. taxpayers are subject to tax on worldwide income from all sources and must report all taxable income and pay taxes according to the Internal Revenue Code. Taxpayers found to be committing fraud may be subject to penalties including payment of taxes owed plus interest, fines and jail time. IRS-CI is the criminal investigative arm of the IRS, responsible for conducting financial crime investigations, including tax fraud, narcotics trafficking, money-laundering, public corruption, healthcare fraud, identity theft and more. IRS-CI special agents are the only federal law enforcement agents with investigative jurisdiction over violations of the Internal Revenue Code, boasting a nearly 90 percent federal conviction rate. The agency has 20 field offices located across the U.S. and 11 attaché posts abroad.

### NB Community Survey on Homelessness/ Camping

The City of North Bend recently conducted a survey of its citizens to receive feedback on the Homeless/Illegal Camping problems with the city. Over 968 responses were received producing 42 pages of various comments/suggestions to address a growing problem not only in the Bay Area, but throughout the State, Pacific Northwest and Nation. According to a synapse of the survey, Willingness to help address homelessness: More than 50% of respondents are supportive of emergency/short-term shelters, transitional housing, and places for RVs to camp; Few respondents are willing to pay increased fees or taxes to support programs that address homelessness; Some are willing to lobby their State Representatives –Rep. Boomer Wright & Sen. Dick Anderson. Also, of the 968 Responses: 82% Completion Rate; 65% live in North Bend (About

5% of North Bend's population); 16% are Business Owners/Operators; 77% are Property Owners; 21% are Renters; 2% are Unhoused. Responses collected throughout the month of November 2021 –coordinated with the Library, Devereaux Center, Water Board, and the two local high schools to get a broader range of input. In a breakdown of the survey: 94% agreed that Homelessness is a problem; 58% new someone who has experienced Homelessness; On camping on private property: 36% disapproved of camping in non-residential zones; 34% disapproved camping in residential zones; Of those who said camping was okay, they supported within a designated site; those not okay with camping identified sidewalks, parks, & residential zones. Overall Themes: NIMBY –Not In My Backyard (Town) Camping should be at a Designated Camp Site Enforcement concerns Safety / Sanitation concerns (for both the housed & unhoused) Property value concerns Implement permit parking program (public property) Implement a work program (work for shelter and food) City and local Churches should

### Reckless Endangering, Lane Co.

On January 23, 2022, at approximately 10:34 am The Oregon State Police began a pursuit with a black Nissan Pathfinder after the driver was observed assaulting a female passenger. The pursuit began in Eugene, entered Springfield, and then returned to Eugene. The vehicle drove onto a bike path behind the Valley River Mall endangering bicyclists and pedestrians while continuing to elude. Due to the ongoing danger to the community, an Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife pickup contacted the vehicle. The Pathfinder lost control and spun to a stop down an embankment. The male driver was taken into custody without further incident. The female passenger was found to be a missing 17-year-old juvenile, who was released to the Department of Human Services. The driver was identified as Timothy Wayne Emra (45) of Eugene. Emra was taken into custody for eluding, reckless driving, reckless endangering x9, felon in possession of a weapon, kidnapping, coercion, assault 4, PCS methamphetamine, DUII, criminal driving while suspended, tampering with physical evidence, and interfering. The Oregon State Police are seeking public assistance with information from individuals, who were on the bike path during the pursuit. ### Trying to Regulate Homelessness in North Bend

City Administrator Report - The North Bend City Council reviewed results (<https://bit.ly/3zSGyM5>) from its comprehensive survey on homelessness during its Monday work session. The city surveyed North Benders in response to changes in Oregon Law that legalized camping on public property statewide unless local jurisdictions enact regulations that are objectively reasonable as to time, place, and manner regarding persons experiencing homelessness. The new legislation defines public property as “public lands, premises, and buildings, including but not limited to any building used in connection with the transaction of public business or any lands, premises, or buildings owned or leased by this state or any political subdivision therein.” Every Oregon city and county must update its ordinance language by **July 1, 2023**, to comply with the new state law and several court

cases and opinions issued by the U.S. Department of Justice. Coos County and Coos Bay have already implemented their ordinances. North Bend developed a draft ordinance in coordination with Coos Bay that addressed “time” and “manner” but slowed the process on “place” until the community was aware of the new legislation and had a chance to provide feedback to the City Council. The overwhelming survey results (<https://bit.ly/3fzS4Tz>) are not surprising: NIMBY, an acronym for the phrase “not in my back yard.” A whopping 78 percent of respondents stated they wanted a designated camping site rather than in city parks or on public streets and sidewalks. Suppose the City of North Bend prohibited people from sleeping on public land altogether. In that case, the new legislation dictates it must first provide enough housing or emergency shelter beds for every person experiencing homelessness within its city limits. Since North Bend only encompasses 5.093 square miles, of which 3.92 sq. mi. is actual land, identifying a designated overnight camping site is no easy task. In response to citizen input, staff identified five possible solutions for Council consideration during Monday’s work session. All of the solutions required real thought by the governing body, and each has distinct pros and cons. Utilize the

rear parking lot of the Community Center while pursuing a joint partnership to renovate and retrofit the facility for a long-term solution of continuum services. Designate an existing city park for overnight camping; Purchase land away from residential and most commercial areas that can accommodate overnight camping; Designate specific streets throughout the city that can accommodate overnight camping; Lease space in the airport's 35-acre industrial park, which will be secure once its \$2 Million tree-clearing and fence project is complete; Council directed staff to work with the City Attorney to update its draft camping and towing ordinances and put them forth at the January 24 work session for discussion and possible adoption at the **January 25** Council Meeting. The Council consensus was a desire to lease or purchase land but utilize the Community Center parking lot in the short term at 2222 Broadway for overnight parking. The ordinance would take effect 30 days upon adoption. During those 30 days, staff would fence in the back lot of the North Bend Community Center, install gates and signage, implement a community communications strategy, secure portable toilets, and arrange for security to open and close the lot based on the schedule in the adopted ordinance.

### Working on the Homelessness Problem

City of North Bend release - Legislation proposed by Oregon Rep. Jason Kropf would build a pilot project to provide local coordination between cities and counties to tackle homelessness. The legislation would create regional collaboratives between cities and counties to address homelessness better. Coos County and the cities of North Bend and Coos Bay are among eight pilots being considered for the legislation, to be debated in the special legislative session next month. These pilot sites would each receive \$1 million, over two years, as seed money to set up the programs. Rep. Kropf is developing the bill and pilot project (see <https://bit.ly/3roQVn3>) with the League of Oregon Cities and the Association of Oregon Counties. While the pilot would not offer new services on its own, it would increase communication and coordination between municipalities and allow them to identify gaps in services. The program would come with four basic standards: working with regional partners, establishing oversight boards in the regions, developing a five-year strategic plan to identify service gaps, and finding ways to sustain funding beyond the two years the state will provide money. The regional collaboratives will further report back to the legislature on their progress. Last week, questions were raised at a housing legislative committee meeting on whether the

collaboratives would continue funding programs after state funding ended. Ariel Nelson, a lobbyist with the League of Oregon Cities, said addressing that issue is a crucial part of the conversation with members. The state funding is similar to seed startup money, she said, and ongoing funding could look different depending on which community the programs are operating in and what level of funding is required. In creating the legislation, Rep. Kropf aid cities are in an excellent position to address zoning and planning issues while counties provide health services. Combining the expertise of both could create stronger coordination with other groups like nonprofits and faith organizations. The eight collaboratives selected for the pilots are:

- Benton County/City of Corvallis;
- Coos County/City of Coos Bay/City of North Bend;
- Deschutes County/City of Bend;
- Hood River County/Wasco; County/Sherman County/City of The Dalles/City of Hood River/Mid-Columbia Community Action Council;
- Lincoln County/Lincoln City/City of Newport/City of Toledo;
- Polk County/Falls City/City of Monmouth/City of Independence/City of Willamina/City of Dallas/Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde/Mid-Willamette Valley Community Action Agency;
- Tillamook County/City of Tillamook/Bay City/City of Garibaldi/City of Rockaway Beach/City of Wheeler/City of Manzanita/Community Action Resource Enterprises Inc. (CARE);
- Umatilla County/City of Hermiston/City of Stanfield/City of Echo/City of Umatilla.

## Coos Co.

### Fatal Accident, Weyco 5000 Road

CCSO release - On January 2, 2022, at approximately 9:30 AM, a Deputy from the Coos County Sheriff's Office was notified of a vehicle in the river close to a mile past the Dellwood gate on the Weyerhaeuser 5000 road, Coos Bay. It was unknown whether or not any occupants were in the vehicle as it was upside down in the river. Because of the steep embankment and conditions of the river, the Deputy requested the assistance of additional Deputies from the marine division to put a boat in the water as well as Mast Bro. Towing to hoist the truck from the water. When the additional resources arrived on scene, the vehicle was able to be recovered with a combined effort. Unfortunately 36 year old Jose Perez- Ramirez and 36 year old Robert L. Poblano were found deceased, still in the cab of the vehicle. After an investigation, it was determined speed in

combination with unfavorable road conditions was the most likely cause of the crash. The Coos County Sheriff's Office would like to remind all residents of Coos County to take precautions when driving due to the extreme weather we have been experiencing. Roadways are still icy in certain places as well as high winds causing debris on many roadways.

### Hwy. 101 Fatal, Coos Co.

On Tuesday, January 4, 2022 at approximately 10:58 PM, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a vehicle vs. pedestrian crash on Highway 101 near milepost 239. Preliminary investigation revealed a southbound Toyota 4Runner, operated by a 17-year-old of Coos Bay, struck a pedestrian that was crossing the roadway. Weather and low visibility are being investigated as contributing factors. The pedestrian sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased. The name will be release when appropriate. The southbound lanes of Hwy 101 were closed for several hours. OSP was assisted by Coos Bay Fire and Rescue, Coos Bay Police, Coos County Sheriff's

Office and ODOT. **\*\*\*UPDATE\*\*\***The pedestrian has been identified as Sophia Romero (34) of Coos Bay.

### Shorepine Fire

CBFD release - On Wednesday evening, shortly before 7:30 pm, the Coos Bay Fire Department responded to the report of a fire in a home at 520 Shorepines Ave. Firefighters arrived to find heavy smoke coming from a single-wide manufactured home. Crews quickly deployed hose lines, entered the home, and extinguished the fire. The owner of the home was able to get herself and two dogs out of the home, but her two cats were overcome by the toxic smoke. The fire was limited to a bedroom, but heavy smoke caused damage throughout the residence. A working smoke alarm was instrumental in quickly notifying the occupant of the fire; helping her escape and getting fire crews responding in time to limit the property damage. An investigation into the cause of the fire revealed that an electrical heater had overloaded the electrical circuit. The 1974 home was not insured.

### Warrant Service

CBPD release - On 01/11/2022, at approximately 10:04 PM, the Coos Bay Police Department received a call of a male hitting things with a metal pipe or sword near the intersection of Ocean Blvd. and Newmark Ave. The reporting party said the male, who was later identified as Eithen Nordholm, was hitting a fence and had been in the roadway and almost hit by a vehicle. As officers arrived, Nordholm was in possession of what looked like a large metal pipe and two wooden staffs. Nordholm was found to have an active warrant for six criminal charges, including resisting arrest. While being taken into custody, Nordholm punched a concrete wall and continued to argue and yell at officers. Officers did not locate any damaged property in the area. Nordholm was issued a citation and released on his warrant as booking and/or lodging at the Coos County Jail was not available.

### Criminal Mischief in Bunker Hill

CCSO release - On January 14th 2022 at approximately 2:30 AM, the Coos County dispatch center received a call for an audible alarm at the Human Bean in the Bunker Hill area of Coos Bay. A Deputy responded to the business and found one of the windows had been shattered by a rock. While the deputy was on scene; it was learned that Coos Bay Police had received a call for a subject throwing a rock through a window at Fred Meyer a few minutes later. The Sheriff's Office and Coos Bay Police began searching the area for the suspect. 29 year old Jordan Skylar Jones was located near Coastal Spas in Bunker Hill and taken into custody for Criminal Mischief. During the investigation, it was determined several vehicles in the area where Jones was located had also been damaged. Jones was transported to the Coos County Jail and booked for 2 counts of Criminal Mischief in the first degree for causing damage to property exceeding \$1,000. The following day, 4 other businesses in the Bunker Hill area contacted the Coos County Dispatch center to report damage to property done in a similar manner as the night before. This investigation is still ongoing. Coos Bay Police is investigating several similar incidents within their city as well. The Coos County Sheriff's office was assisted by Coos Bay Police and North Coos Dispatch.

### Burglar Arrested

CBPD release - On 01/20/2022, at approximately 4:05 a.m., officers from the Coos Bay Police Department responded to the Coos Elderly Services building located at 390 S. 2nd St. after it was reported that the business had been burglarized and the suspect was still near the location. As officers arrived on scene, they found 41-year-old Lawrence Martinez leaving the location pushing a shopping cart with property in it. During the course of the subsequent investigation, officers discovered that the business had been burglarized and the property in the shopping cart, including personal information and property of Coos Elderly Services clients was stolen during the burglary. Martinez was arrested and transported to the Coos County Jail where he was lodged for Burglary II, Theft II, Criminal Mischief II and Identity Theft.

### Warrant Arrest Leads to Identity Theft Charges

CBPD release - On 01/19/2022, at approximately 1121hrs, an officer from the Coos Bay Police Department located and arrested 34-year-old Antonio Alamillo-Mejia for outstanding warrants he had for his arrest. As he was being taken into custody, it was discovered that he was in possession of numerous credit,

bank, and other cards and property that did not belong to him. Ultimately, Alamillo-Mejia was transported to the Coos County Jail where he was lodged for the warrants and 14 counts of Identity Theft.

### NBPD Calls

NB City Administrator report, 605 calls went through the North Coos Dispatch Center associated with the NBPD for the two weeks of January 10-22, 2022. Of those calls: 442 were given a log number (assigned to calls where an officer responded and spoke to a person or patrol checked an area but did not end up writing a report); and 70 were given a case number (assigned when action is taken and a report is generated in the record management system, e.g., person arrested, issued a citation, traffic crash, etc.) For this period, NBPD had: Criminal Trespass calls 24; Disorderly Conduct calls 13; Suspicious Conditions calls 55; Suspicious Vehicle Calls 15; Suspicious Subject calls 18; Domestic Dispute calls 2; Dispute calls 9; Unauthorized Use of Vehicle calls 13; Vehicle Break-ins 4; Assist DHS Child related calls 17; Assist Public calls 10; Abandoned Vehicle calls 6; Burglary Calls 5; Theft Calls 9; Assault 1; Suicidal Subjects 5; Burn Info calls 24; Totals 230. As you can see, NBPD personnel have been busy responding to the needs of the public.

### Burglar Arrested

CCSO release - On January 25, 2022, at about 9:49 AM, a citizen drove by 93281 Woodruff Lane in Coos Bay and observed a male pulling a wagon which was full of property. The citizen had personal knowledge of the area and the people who lived there and knew the home the male was walking away from was owned by a person who was out of the area. The Coos County Sheriff's Office was contacted. Deputies responded and contacted the male who was identified as 31 year old Scott Peterson. An investigation ensued and it was found that the address which Peterson was walking away from, 93281 Woodruff Lane, had been burglarized. It was suspected that the wagon Peterson was pulling contained property from that address. Based upon several other pieces of evidence, Peterson was arrested for Burglary I and Theft I as well as a probation violation and transported to jail. A sergeant from the Coos County Sheriff's Office applied for and was granted a search warrant for the wagon. Property from the burglarized address was recovered as well as a firearm. Peterson will be charged with Burglary I, Burglary II, Theft I and Felon in Possession of a Firearm. The investigation is continuing.

## Oregon Coast

### Credit Union Robbery Central Coast

No one was hurt when a masked male robbed a Central Oregon Coast bank of an undisclosed amount of cash on Wednesday, 5. According to reports, the lone individual passed a note demanding money be placed into a bag at the TLC Credit Union, 1624 No. Coast Hwy., Newport. No weapon was ever seen. After emptying the drawers, the white male, described as being in his 30s, approximately 5-6, thin build, blond hair, wearing a black jacket and blue jeans, quickly left. He wore a green or yellow bandana over his face. A search of the area turned up no suspects.

### Tsunami Warning Issued, then Cancelled

OEM release - The National Tsunami Warning Center issued a tsunami advisory Saturday morning, January 15, for the coast of Oregon, Washington and California, due to a large undersea volcanic eruption near Tonga. Residents in coastal areas were advised to move off beaches and out of harbors and marinas.

Waves of 1 to 3 feet along the coast of Oregon and Washington were expected. The first waves arrived at the Oregon Coast around 8 a.m. and could have continued for up to 24-hours. "Stay away from port harbors and low-lying beaches because those strong currents can still cause a lot of damage, and you could be potentially risking your life," Oregon Office of Emergency Management Geologic Hazards Coordinator Althea Rizzo said. Rizzo added it is important to know if your home, work, school, etc., are in a tsunami inundation zone. ### Gold Beach Male Sentenced for Child Pornography

MEDFORD, Ore.—A Gold Beach, Oregon man was sentenced to federal prison today for receiving and possessing child pornography. Timothy Shaw Lair, 38, was sentenced to 60 months in federal prison and five years' supervised release. According to court documents, in July 2019, investigators from McMinnville Police Department notified the FBI after discovering an internet protocol (IP) address in Gold Beach that had accessed and downloaded child pornography. In November 2019, FBI agents executed a search warrant on the resi-

dence associated with the IP address and discovered child pornography on a computer in Lair's rented bedroom. A forensic examination of Lair's digital devices revealed dozens of images and videos depicting child sexual abuse. On December 4, 2019, a federal grand jury in Medford returned an indictment charging Lair with receipt and possession of child pornography and, on August 23, 2021, he pleaded guilty to both charges. U.S. Attorney Scott Erik Asphaug of the District of Oregon made the announcement. This case was investigated by the FBI with assistance from the McMinnville Police Department and Curry County Sheriff's Office. Assistant U.S. Attorney Judith R. Harper prosecuted the case. Anyone who has information about the physical or online exploitation of children are encouraged to call the FBI at (503) 224-4181 or submit a tip online at tips.fbi.gov. Federal law defines child pornography as any visual depiction of sexually explicit conduct involving a minor. Child sexual abuse material depicts actual crimes being committed against children. Not only do these images and videos document victims' exploitation and abuse, but when shared across the internet, child victims suffer re-victimization each time the image of their abuse is viewed. ### USCG Helps Locate Missing Hikers

NORTH BEND, Ore. -- A Coast Guard Sector North Bend MH-65 Dolphin rescue helicopter crew assisted the Lane County Sheriff's Department in locating two 19-year-old males Saturday, Jan. 1 reported missing after hiking near Swastika Mountain about 32 miles east-southeast of Eugene. Watchstanders at the Sector North Bend command center received an agency assistance request from the Oregon Office of Emergency Management that two individuals went camping on the mountain on or around Christmas Day and did not return from their trip on Wednesday, Dec. 29. Lane County sheriffs dispatched ground parties to search after receiving a report that two hikers went missing on New Year's Eve. Due to recent heavy snowfall in the area covering the mountain roads, Lane County requested Coast Guard helicopter support in locating the individuals. The MH-65 aircrew hoisted the two men and transferred them to awaiting Lane County sheriffs at Eugene Air-

port. During the search for the two men, the aircrew identified two additional persons in distress and passed their position to Lane County, who believed they were within range of their land party. The two hikers reported no medical concerns. "These young men did a lot of things right to give themselves the best chance of being rescued," said Lt. Maggie Champin, MH-65 aircraft commander, Sector North Bend. "By writing 'SOS' in the snow, staying near their vehicle and staying near logging roads, we were able to find them relatively quickly. We recommend hikers carry personal locator beacons while out in the back country."

### Coast Guard seeks legal action against credentials of 2 Portland based mariners

SEATTLE — The Coast Guard has initiated administrative action related to the mariner credentials of two jet boat operators involved in a collision that occurred on the Willamette River on June 4, 2021. The jet boats, Peregrine Falcon and Osprey, collided near Hog Island as the vessels came around a bend in the channel where an obstruction prevented the vessel captains from seeing each other and resulted in a failure of the operators to take adequate action to avoid collision. Investigators from Marine Safety Unit (MSU) Portland identified violations of the Inland Navigation Rules, specifically rules which establish a consistent way for vessels to navigate safely and avoid collisions when operating in the vicinity of a blind curve. These factors led to the collision that

resulted in damage to both vessels and injuries to multiple passengers. Title 46 of the Code of Federal Regulation § 5.5 states in part that the administrative actions against a merchant mariner credential or endorsement are remedial and not penal in nature. Coast Guard administrative actions are intended to help maintain standards for competence and conduct essential to the promotion of safety at sea. "The Coast Guard regularly has inspectors go aboard commercial vessels to ensure they are built to and maintained in accordance with certain standards," said Lt. Carl Eschler, chief investigator, MSU Portland. "The Coast Guard is responsible for issuing credentials to mariners to ensure the operators in commercial service have the knowledge required to operate safely. Our investigators also look into marine casualties involving commercial vessels and issue enforcement when appropriate, through letters of warning, civil penalties, or suspension and revocation. The Coast Guard wants everyone to have fun on the water and do so in a safe manner."

The investigation revealed the incident stemmed from a conflict with two individuals who appear to be known to each other and there is no known ongoing threat to the public. The involved victim sustained minor, non-life threatening injuries and the suspect has been taken into custody. The investigation is still active and more information will be released when available.

When they arrived, deputies heard a gunshot from inside the trailer where they were contacting an individual; which prompted a several hour stand-off. Several law enforcement officers responded to the area and attempted to have the occupants to exit the trailer peacefully. Area residents and a nearby school were notified of the situation, which was confined to the trailer unit, and asked to avoid the area. The Sheriff's Office Tactical Response and Crisis Negotiations Teams were activated and continued to diffuse the situation. After no response from the individuals inside, tactical action was taken which resulted in a female exiting the trailer a few minutes later. The female, identified as 30 year-old Callista Mayfield of Roseburg, was taken into custody without incident. Deputies continued making attempts to have the male, 42-year-old James Robert Young of Roseburg, exit the trailer. During an interview following her arrest, the female indicated to law enforcement that Young had taken

Preliminary investigation revealed an eastbound white 2004 Chevrolet Silverado, operated by Jasper June Keeney (18) of Sweet Home, lost control while negotiating a curve and rolled into the eastbound ditch, coming to rest on its top. Keeney suffered fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased on scene. Highway 20 was closed for 4.5 hours following the crash.

On January 24, 2022 at about 12:48 P.M., Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to the report of a two-vehicle crash on Highway 199 near milepost 10. Preliminary investigation revealed that a white Toyota Corolla, driven by Eddie Bartley (72) of Grants Pass was driving north on Highway 199 and crossed into the oncoming, southbound lane of travel for unknown reasons. ### **I-5 Fatal, Jackson Co.**

On Monday, January 24, 2022 at approximately 12:25 AM, Oregon State Police Troopers and emergency personnel responded to a single vehicle crash on Interstate 5 near milepost 24. Information provided indicated the subject had an active warrant from Pierce County, Washington for homicide and was traveling in a 1999 GMC Suburban with California plates. Oregon State Police located a vehicle matching the description at the southbound Manzanita Rest Area. With the assistance of the Josephine County Sheriff's Office, Troopers and Deputies attempted contact with the vehicle at the rest area but when approached the suspect fled south on Interstate 5 at a high rate of speed. A Trooper attempted to deploy spike strips to disable the vehicle, but the suspect saw the spike strips thrown and swerved aggressively to avoid them. The speed and evasive maneuver caused him to lose control of the vehicle and crash into the concrete center divider. Edwards was taken into custody without further incident. Edwards was evaluated at the scene by AMR and then transported to Three Rivers Community Hospital. Following evaluation, he was interviewed by FBI agents and later lodged at the Josephine County Jail on the outstanding warrant. Local charges will be forwarded to the Josephine County District Attorney for consideration.

### **Fatal Hwy. 26, Baker Co.**

On December 16, 2021, a California Highway Patrol officer located Jeremy Lacy driving on Highway 299, east of Eureka. Jeremy Lacy was taken into custody without incident. Eileen Lacy was located a short time later and taken into custody without incident. The Lacy's were transported to the Humboldt County Jail where they were lodged on the warrants. The Klamath County Major Crime Team consists of the Oregon State Police, the Klamath County Sheriff's Office, the Klamath Falls City Police Department, Klamath County Community Corrections, and the Klamath County District Attorney's Office. The Klamath County Major Crime Team would like to express their gratitude to the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office and the California Highway Patrol for their assistance in this long and difficult investigation.

fled but was quickly disabled by awaiting spike strips that had been deployed further up the road. The occupants, 34 year old Roger Dale Painter, and 52 year old Phillip Allen Nelson, were taken into custody without injury.
